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PROPOSAL FOR A COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC) AMENDING REGULATION (EEC) No 1717/80 LAYING DOWN FOR 1980 CERTAIN MEASURES FOR THE CONSERVATION AND MANAGEMENT OF FISHERY RESOURCES APPLICABLE TO VESSELS FLYING THE FLAG OF. NORWAY

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### EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Following the extension of the Danish fishing zone off the east coast of Greenland to the North of 67° N on 1 June 1980, consultations took place on 16 July 1980 between the Community and Norway at the request of the Norwegian authorities under the fisheries agreement between the Community and Norway concluded on 27 June 1980.

During these consultations the Community Delegation undertook to recommend to its authorities that Norwegian fishermen should be authorized to fish for capelin in the waters referred to above during the remainder of the current year.

At the same time the two delegations held consultations on the subject of TACs for certain common stocks of fish in the light of new scientific reports from ICES. These talks concluded with the delegations under-taking to recommend their authorities to increase the TACs and the reciprocal quotas for stocks of haddock and whiting in the North Sea.

Following new reports from ICES on herring stocks in the Skagerrak and the Kattegat, consultations took place on 17 July 1980 between the Community, Norway and Sweden. These consultations resulted in an agreement between the delegations to recommend their authorities to increase TACs of this stock and the quotas for each of the parties.

The purpose of the Regulation now being proposed is to authorize fishing for capelin by Norwegian vessels in the Community fishing zone and to modify the quotas for herring, haddock and whiting allocated to Norwegian vessels as agreed during the consultations.

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# Frogosal for a COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC)

amending Regulation (EEC) No 1717/80 laying down for 1980 certain measures for the conservation and management of fishery resources applicable to vessels flying the flag of Norway

#### THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 43 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission, Having regard to the opinion of the European Parliament (1),

Whereas, following the decision of the Danish Government to extend the fishing zone off the east coast of Greenland to the north of 67° N, fishing activities in those waters shall be subject to the relevant Community rules;

Whereas, at the request of the Norwegian authorities, consultations were held between the Community and Norway within the tramework of the Agreement on fisheries concluded between the two parties on 27 June 1980, with a view to determining the conditions under which certain Norwegian fishing activities could be carried out in those waters 1

Whereas the continuance of fishing activities by Norwegian vessels in those waters should be authorized during 1980; whereas, therefore, Council Regulation (EEC) No 1717/80 of 27 June 1980 laying down for 1980 certain measures for the conservation and management of fishery resources applicable to vessels flying the flag of Norway 2 should be amended so as to include a quota for capelin;

NO L 168, 1.7.1980, p. 9 Whereas, in the light of new scientific views on the total allowable catches (TACs) for certain fish stocks common to the Community and Norway or to the Community, Norway and Sweden, consultations took place between the parties concerned; whereas, during those consultations, the delegations agreed to recommend to their authorities that the TACs for these stocks and the reciprocal quotas be increased;

Whereas the conslusions of these consultations should be implemented by adjusting the quotas allocated to Norwegian vessels for herring stocks in the Skagerrak and for haddock and whiting in the North Sea by Regulation No (EEC) No 1717/80,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

#### Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 1717/80 is hereby amended as follows:

"3. Vessels referred to in paragraph 1, except those fishing for capelin and those trahing in ICES division III a), shall transmit to the Commission the information specified in Annex IV. This information shall be transmitted in accordance with the rules laid down that year."

2. Article 3 (1) and (2) shall be replaced by the following:

<sup>1</sup>1. Fishing within ICES sub-area XIV and ICES division V a) and NAFO sub-area 1, under the quotas established in Article 1, shall be subject to the holding on board of a licence issued by the Commission on behalf of the Community and to the observance of the conditions set out in the licence.

However, as regards capelin fishing, the abovementioned rules shall apply only as from 1 October 1980.

2. Licences for the purposes of paragraph 1 shall be issued subject to the condition that the number of licences shall not exceed:

- 13 for fishing Greenland halibut and redfish,

- 26 for fishing northern deep-water prawn (Pan falus boreaiis) within ICES sub-area XIV and in NAFO sub-area 1,

I. Article 2 (3) shall be replaced by the following:

- 168 for capelin fishing north of 67° N in ICES sub-area XIV and ICES division V a).

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However, the number of vessels fishing simultaneously for northern deep-water prawn may not exceed:

- 14 as an average calculated per month for the whole year, the maximum being 19 vessels per month, in NAFO sub-area 1,
- nine as an average calculated per month for the whole year, the maximum being 15 vessels per month, in ICES sub-area XIV.

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3. Annex I shall be replaced by the Annex to this Regulation.

## Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall apply from 1 January until 31 December 1980.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
