2. SUBJECT OF THE COMMISSION'S PROPOSAL

The aim of the proposal is to amend Decision No 2085/97/EC to extend the Ariane programme through 1999 in order to ensure continuity in the Community's activities in the field of books and reading until the "Culture 2000" programme comes into force, which it should do on 1 January 2000.

3. COMMENTS ON THE COMMON POSITION

3.1. Brief general remarks on the common position

In its common position the Council approved the Commission's amended proposal, which included the sole amendment proposed by Parliament.

3.2. Amendments proposed by Parliament on first reading

The common position takes over the sole amendment presented by Parliament at first reading, which would increase the overall financial package for the programme from EUR 7 million to EUR 11.1 million.

4. CONCLUSIONS

The Commission considers that the Council common position will ensure continuity in the Community's activities in the field of books and reading until the "Culture 2000" programme comes into force, which it should do on 1 January 2000.
