STABEX

STABEX

(a) Purpose of the system

- 1. The system for the stabilization of export earnings from agricultural commodities, Stabex, was set up with the aim of limiting the harmful effects of losses in the ACP States' earnings from their agricultural exports to the Community resulting from a drop in prices or production. Stabex is not designed to stabilize prices by market intervention.
- 2. The transfers (i.e. the payments made under Stabex) are used to finance programmes and projects in the sector where the losses occurred or, in the interests of diversification, in other sectors. Under the third Lomé Convention there are stricter rules and administrative practices concerning the monitoring of the allocation of transfers and the use to which they are actually put.
- 3. Transfers made to ACP States that are not classed as least developed countries may, in certain circumstances, be reimbursable.

(b) Regional score

4. As a general rule only ACP exports to the Community are covered by Stabex but the system does provide for two possible extensions of the geographical coverage to include exports to other ACP States and to all destinations.

(c) Products covered

- 5. Stabex now covers agricultural products only (iron ore was covered under the first two Lomé Conventions).
- 6. The number of products covered has risen from 29 under Lomé I to 49 under Lomé III (see Annex 1).

Virtually all the agricultural commodities exported by the ACP States are now covered, the notable exceptions being sugar and meat, for which there are special protocols.

(d) Calculating transfers

- 7. To establish the basis for a transfer, export earnings from the product concerned in the year of application are compared with the "reference level" the average of export earnings over the four previous years.
- 8. However, certain conditions have to be fulfilled for there to be entitlement to a transfer..

First, the loss should not have been caused as a result of a deliberate policy of the ACP country in question; only losses that the country has truly "suffered" give rise to transfers.

- 9. Second, there are a number of technical criteria that have to be satisfied:
 - (i) exports of the product concerned must constitute a significant proportion of the ACP State's exports. This is calculated on the basis of the country's "dependence" (earnings from exports of the product in question in the year preceding the application year as a percentage of total exports), which has to be above a certain threshold (6% generally, but 1.5% in the case of the least developed countries);
 - (ii) the loss of earnings must constitute a certain percentage of the reference level, that is, the fluctuation in earnings must reach a certain threshold, known as the "fluctuation threshold" (again 6% or 1.5%);
 - (iii) sometimes losses in earnings from exports to the Community are offset by earnings from exports of the same product to other destinations. In this case only the "all destinations" loss gives the right to a transfer.

(c) Financial resources

- 10. Under the third Lomé Convention 925 million ECU has been allocated to cover Stabex commitments. This is divided into equal annual instalments.
- 11. These financial resources are topped up by repayments of transfers made under previous Conventions and by interest earned by investment of some of the Stabex money in the financial market.
