EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

An important part of the Community's contribution to the overall aim of developing and consolidating democracy and the rule of law and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms is to help those who have felt compelled to leave their homes in the face of serious threats to their personal safety.

Similarly, it is essential that aid instruments be developed that cater to the needs of the communities receiving these people, possibly in another country, and of those to which they return.

Budget headings B7-302 and B7-312 are specifically geared to aiding uprooted people (refugees, displaced persons and returnees) in Asia and Latin America by creating optimum conditions for their integration or reintegration.

Overall, mass migrations have fallen off in recent years (major political and economic crises in Asia and Latin America have been less serious, or at least not worse) and third countries' ability to take in newcomers has been exhausted. It would therefore seem reasonable to envisage directing the use of these budget headings in the next few years to operations for these people's return, reintegration and rehabilitation and the reconstruction of their communities.

The aim of such operations is to span the intervening phase between humanitarian crisis-response and rehabilitation or development cooperation.

They therefore form part of a sequence of action in which coordination with the other aid instruments, and with Member States' own policies, retains high priority.

Regulation (EC) No 443/97, which lays down arrangements for implementing the operations, will expire on 31 December 1999 and therefore needs to be extended for another year.

THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN UNION,

- Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Community, and in particular Article 179(1) thereof,
- Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,¹
- Acting in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 251 of the Treaty,²

Whereas:

- (1) Council Regulation (EC) No 443/97 on operations to aid uprooted people in Asian and Latin American developing countries will expire on 31 December 1999.
- (2) It would appear appropriate to extend this Regulation until 31 December 2000 and at the same time to amend the financial reference amount and the relevant period referred to in Article 6(1) of Regulation (EC) No 443/97,

HAVE ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. The second subparagraph of Article 14 of Council Regulation (EC) No 443/97 is replaced by the following:

"It shall apply until 31 December 2000."

2. Article 6(1) of Council Regulation (EC) No 443/97 is replaced by the following:

"1. Community financing of the operations referred to in Article 1 shall cover a period of five years (1996 to 2000).

The financial reference amount for the implementation of this programme for the period 1996 to 2000 shall be EUR 280 million.

Annual appropriations shall be authorised by the budgetary authority within the limits of the financial perspective."

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following that of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

4. DESCRIPTION OF OPERATION

4.1.General objective of the operation

An important part of the Community's contribution to the overall aim of developing and consolidating democracy and the rule of law and respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms is to help those who have felt compelled to leave their homes in the face of serious threats to their personal safety.

Similarly, it is essential that aid instruments be developed that cater to the needs of the communities receiving these people, possibly in another country, and of those to which they return.

The general objective is to maintain support for viable projects promoting the self-sufficiency and the social and economic reintegration of refugees, displaced persons, returnees and former combatants. The operations therefore include mine clearance, campaigning against sexual violence, action to help people recover their possessions and property rights, legal assistance in cases of human rights violations against displaced persons, support for local host communities and resettlement areas to promote acceptance and integration of the uprooted people, assisting them in returning to and settling in their countries of origin or the host country, and, if necessary, fostering reconciliation.

Operations cover the period from 1 January to 31 December 2000.

8. FRAUD PREVENTION MEASURES

With the setting-up of the Joint Relex Service ("Service Commun Relations Extérieures", or SCR), administrative monitoring of contracts and payments is centralised at Commission headquarters in Brussels.

Implementation of projects is checked at each stage of the project cycle (selection, contracts, performance of contracts, payments) by Commission officials in Brussels and the delegations. These checks respect contractual obligations and the principles of cost/benefit analysis and sound financial management.

In addition, officials from the SCR, DG XX and the Court of Auditors carry out audits and checks, including some on the ground, on the expenditure authorised under the programme and the satisfactory implementation of operations. Financial audits have been carried out systematically, particularly in the course of the project, to back up fraud prevention arrangements.
