## COMMUNICATION FROM THE COMMISSION TO THE COUNCIL

concerning the request by the Republic of Vanuatu to benefit from the provisions of Article 46 S 3, within the system for the stabilization of export earnings instituted by the Second Lomé Convention.

- 1) By letter dated 26 March 1981, the ACP Group informed the Communities of a request by the Republic of Vanuatu to benefit from all-destinations coverage for its exports of those commodities eligible under Stabex.
- 2) In support of its request, the Government of Vanuatu likens its situation to that of neighbouring islands which benefit from all-destinations coverage.
- 3) Article 23 provides that the Stabex provisions shall operate to stabilize earnings "derived from the ACP states' exports to the Community ...".
- 4) Article 46 § 3 provides that "in the case of certain ACP States which do not send the bulk of their exports to the Community, the Council of Minnisters may decide, by way of derogation from Articles 24 and 30, that the system shall apply to their exports of the products in question whatever their destination".
- 5) The provisions of Article 46 § 3 can therefore be seen as granting an important derogation to the general intent of the system, and should consequently be applied with restraint.
- 6) The attached table shows the trend of exports in the three major export commodities covered by Stabex during the period 1977 to 1981. It can be seen that on average the following proportions of total exports in each commodity have been sent to the Community:

- copra 89 %

- cocoa beans 90 %

- coconut oil 100 %

7) On the basis of the evidence provided by this table, the bulk of Vanuatu's exports are already covered by the normal provisions governing Stabex.

## IN CONCLUSION

It is proposed that at the meeting of the Council of Ministers ACP/EEC the Council of the European Communities adopt the position that it is inappropriate to grant the benefits of the provisions of Article 46 § 3 to the Republic of Vanuatu.
