Granting of aid from the EAGGF Guidance Section - Second instalment 1977

On 21 December 1977 the Commission of the European Communities granted aid amounting to 139 650 639 u.a. to 422 projects under the second instalment for 1977.

The aid granted was as follows:

In Germany aid was granted for 92 projects (amounting to DM 77 486 569), of which the 34 projects to improve production structures made up the largest proportion, i.e. DM 42 102 435.

A total of 22 projects related to improvements to farm roads in Bavaria (20 projects) and Schleswig-Holstein (2 projects), and amounted to DM 17 656 189.

Eight projects amounting to DM 14 846 460 related to hydraulic engineering and land improvement work in Schleswig-Holstein (5 projects) and Lower Saxony (3 projects).

The remaining four projects, amounting to DM 9 599 786, were "miscellaneous" projects. They related to the creation and improvement of ponds in Bavaria (2 projects), reafforestation in Lower Saxony (one project) and the extension and alteration of a training centre for agricultural technicians in Lower Saxony (one project).

Of the 58 projects relating to marketing and amounting to DM 35 384 134, DM 14 243 135 was given to the 17 projects in the milk products sector. These involved improvements and extensions to dairies and cheese factories in Baden-Württemberg (5 projects), Bavaria (4 projects), Berlin (one project) and Lower Saxony (one project), the establishment of distribution facilities (one project), the specialization of a cheese factory (one project) and the construction of central storage installations (2 projects) in Baden-Württemberg, and the regrouping of the production capacity of a cheese factory (one project) and the extension of a central laboratory (one project) in Bavaria.

In the meat sector there were two projects: aid from the Fund amounted to DM 971 055 divided between the construction of slaughterhouses in Hesse and the extension and improvement of a cutting plant in Schleswig-Holstein.

A total of DM 2 452 647 was granted to the fruit and vegetable sector for nine projects. Seven of these were in Lower Saxony and concerned the construction of fruit sorting centres (2 projects) and fruit storage plants (5 projects). The two remaining projects related to the extension and improvement of a canning and bottling factory in Baden-Württemberg (first and second stages).

DM 10 870 598 were granted to the wine sector for 17 projects whose main object was the extension and improvement of wineries in Baden-Württemberg (14 projects) and Rhineland-Palatinate (one project). Two projects in Baden-Württemberg related to the reconstruction of a winery.

Thirteen projects came into the "miscellaneous" category and received aid totalling DM 6 846 699. These were for the construction or extension of silos for high-grade cereals in Baden-Württemberg (7 projects) and the construction of storage and marketing facilities for nursery plants in Schleswig-Holstein (4 projects). The two remaining projects were in North Rhine-Westphalia and related to the construction of a plant for dehydrating sugar-beet chips and manufacturing calcium fertilizer at Kalkor-Appeldorn, and the extension of marketing facilities for cut flowers and ornamental plants at Neuss, Minden and Münster (3 sites for the same project).

In Belgium there were 48 projects (representing a total of Bfrs 364 037 442), of which 26 were for the improvement of production structures and received aid amounting to Bfrs 231 301 686.

Seventeen projects, amounting to Bfrs 200 497 300, concerned improvements to farm roads in the Provinces of Antwerp, Brabant (2), East Flanders, Hainaut (2) and Liège and drainage work in the Provinces of Brabant (2), East Flanders, Hainaut (2), Liège (4) and Limburg.

Eight projects (amounting to Bfrs 29 708 166) concerned the improvement of run-off and drainage channels in the Provinces of Antwerp, Brabant and Namur (one project), East Flanders (4) and Hainaut (2). The remaining project, which received Bfrs 1 096 220, related to the installation of a water distribution network at Wuustwezel (Antwerp).

Of the 22 marketing projects (amounting to Bfrs 132 735 756), the milk sector had four amounting to Bfrs 29 588 210: improvement or expansion of dairies at Dison (Liège), Schoten (Antwerp) and Wingene (West Flanders) and construction of a cheese factory at Bruges (West Flanders).

The largest share went to the meat sector, which had seven projects amounting to Bfrs 50 013 594. These concerned the construction or extension of slaughterhouses and/or meat processing plants at Erembodegem (East Flanders), Geel (Antwerp), Herchie (Hainaut), Oudenaarde (East Flanders) (2 projects), Soignies (Hainaut) and Wandre (Liège).

Four projects in the fruit and vegetable sector received aid amounting to Bfrs 20 919 061: extension of a vegetable freezing centre at Staden (West Flanders) and a factory for canning fruit and vegetables at Rijkevorsel (Antwerp), modernization of a vegetable canning factory at Kortemark (West Flanders) and improvement of a fruit auction hall at Borgloon (Limburg).

The seven remaining projects were "miscellaneous" projects amounting to Bfrs 32 214 891 and related to the construction of feedingstuffs factory at Wichelen (East Flanders) and the expansion of a cereal cooperative at Soignies (Hainaut), a cereal store at Huise (East Flanders), a poultry slaughterhouse at Aalst (East Flanders), a flax seed treatment plant at Ichtegem (West Flanders), a fish processing plant at Ostend (West Flanders) and a plant for the production of deep-frozen and smoked fish at Bruges (West Flanders).

In Denmark, of the 28 projects aided for a total amount of Dkr 39 356 812, two related to the improvement of production structures and received aid amounting to Dkr 1 082 500: the construction of shrimp trawlers in Greenland, one for the port of Godhavn and the other for the port of Jakobshavn.

One project only, for Dkr 1 837 500, fell into the mixed category; it related to the construction of a shrimp trawler for the port of Godthab in Greenland, which would be equipped for cooking and freezing the shrimps.

Twenty-five marketing projects received Dkr 36 436 812. In the milk sector five projects shared Dkr 5 312 314: the modernization or extension of dairies in Jutland at Hoven and Lønborg (one project), at Ødsted, Sønder Onsild and Tørring and at Hørsholm in Zealand.

The nine projects in the meat sector received Dkr 19 037 540 and related to the extension and/or modernization of slaughterhouses or meat processing plants, four in Jutland and one in Zealand.

In addition, one project concerned five slaughterhouses in Jutland, a second twelve slaughterhouses in Jutland and Funen, a third eight slaughterhouses in Jutland and Zealand and the last nine meat processing plants throughout the country.

The single project in the fruit and vegetable sector related to the expansion and modernization of a centre for the storage and market preparation of fruit, vegetables and flowers at Slagelse (Zealand), representing Dkr 635 500.

The 10 remaining projects were "miscellaneous" projects amounting to Dkr 11 451 458: the construction, extension or modernization of feedingstuffs factories and/or cereal stores, four in Jutland, one in Zealand and one in Funen; the construction of four feedingstuffs distribution centres in Jutland (one project), the extension of a central depot for agricultural raw materials at Høng (Zealand), the construction of a fish processing plant at Glyngere (Jutland) and the purchase of 15 000 containers for the distribution of pot plants from Jutland and Funen.

In France there were 36 projects (totalling FF 135 668 939), of which 28 concerned the improvement of production structures and received aid amounting to FF 118 956 874.

Of these 28 projects, five (FF 9 917 604) concerned improvements to farm roads in the departments of Côtes-du-Nord, Creuse, Loire, Lozère and Puy-de-Dôme. Six projects, amounting to FF 37 781 915, related to hydraulic engineering: two in Loiret, one in Nord, two in Nord-Pas-de-Calais (Wateringues area) and one in Puy-de-Dôme.

The 17 remaining projects were "miscellaneous" projects amounting to FF 71 257 355: supply of drinking water in Creuse, Deux-Sèvres, Doubs, Ille-et-Vilaine, Lozère and Manche; rural electrification schemes, roadworks and drainage in Allier (Val de Cher); restocking of vineyards in Gard (3), Hérault (4) and Vaucluse.

The only "mixed" project concerned the construction of an oyster farm at Yves (Charente-Maritime) and received aid amounting to FF 2 050 000.

Of the seven marketing projects amounting to FF 14 662 065, the meat sector had two projects receiving FF 3 406 261: construction of a meat curing plant at St Méen-le-Grand (Ille-et-Vilaine), extension of a similar plant at Pontivy (Morbihan) and construction of a market for calves at Guerlesquin (Finistère). The single project in the fruit and vegetable sector related to the restructuring of a pineapple cannery at Morne-Rouge (Martinique) and received aid amounting to FF 2 939 435. The three projects in the wine sector, which received aid amounting to FF 7 516 368, concerned: the modernization of ten wine cooperatives at Bagnols-sur-Cèze (Gard), the construction of a bottling plant and the modernization of two wine cooperatives at Faugères-Laurens (Hérault) and the modernization of five wine cooperatives at Céressou (Hérault). The last project, which received FF 800 000, concerned the construction of an egg packing centre at Yvetot (Seine-Maritime).

In Ireland, of the 29 projects totalling £Ir 4 469 946, eight were to improve production structures and amounted to £Ir 710 391. All were for the construction of fishing boats for the ports of Killibegs (4), Burtonport (Donegal), Balbriggan, Howth and Skerries (Dublin).

Four mixed projects, amounting to £Ir 697 198, concerned the construction of an oyster farm at Cork Harbour and the construction or extension of feedingstuffs factories in the counties of Cork (2), Carlow, Kildare, Kilkenny, Laois and Tipperary (one project).

Of the 17 marketing projects representing £Ir 3 062 357, 11 projects in the milk sector received £Ir 1 503 298 in aid: construction or extension of dairies or creameries in the counties of Cork (2), Galway, Kilkenny, Louth, Monaghan, Tipperary and Westmeath; extension of a cheese factory at Newmarket (Cork); extension at Mallow (Cork) and modernization at Rathmore (Kerry) and Dublin (one project) of granulated chocolate factories.

The two projects in the meat sector amounted to £Ir 1 325 114 and concerned the expansion of meat processing plants at Cloghran (Dublin) and Ravensdale, Dundalk (Louth).

The four remaining projects were "miscellaneous" projects representing £Ir 233 945: construction at Galway and Rossaveel (Galway) (one project) and extension at Finglas and Ushers Island (Dublin) of fish processing plants, and the construction of plants for the production of blood plasma and haemoglobin at Rathculiheen (Waterford).

Italy had 115 projects totalling Lit 29 984 644 313, of which 58 projects to improve production structures amounted to Lit 15 092 858 108.

Of these 58 projects, five concerned the improvement of the farm road network in the provinces of Naples, Potenza (3) and Bologna amounting to Lit 5 232 541 687, and three involved waterworks in the provinces of Bologna, Ferrara and Padua amounting to Lit 430 071 666.

The remaining 50 projects were "miscellaneous" projects amounting to Lit 9 430 244 755; the construction or improvement of water and/or electricity supply networks and/or reforestation work and/or land improvement and/or waterworks in the provinces of Genoa, da Spezia (3), Savona (2), Imperia, Bergamo, Padua, Vicenza, Venice (2), Treviso, Forli (2), Modena (2), Ravenna (2), Reggio Emilia, Persaroe, Urbino, Florence, Grosseto (2), Sienna (3), Matera, Rieti, Bari, Parma (2), Ferrara and Terni; improvement to olive groves in the province of Florence; the replanting of specialized vineyards in the provinces of Pistoia, Chieti, Pescara and Pavia; improvement to chestnut plantations in the provinces of Forli and Ravenna (one project) and hazelnut plantations in Ancona, Ascoli Piceno, Macerata and Pesaro (one project), construction of a seed selection establishment at Jolanda di Savoia (Ferrara); the construction of crop and/or animal husbandry research centres in the provinces of Savona, Rovigo, Ancona, Ascoli Piceno, Macerata, Persaro, Perugia (2) and Treviso, centres for the development and promotion of agricultural cooperation in Sicily and Sardinia (one project), a vocational training centre at Chieri (Turin) and a meteorological centre at S. Michele all'Adige (Trento).

The two mixed projects received Lit 2 013 909 542: improvement and construction of rural water supply networks and expansion of a dairy in the province of Vicenza (one project), and construction of two centres for the marketing of agricultural products and the cooperative buying-in of agricultural raw materials in the provinces of Rome and Bari (one project).

Of the 55 marketing projects representing a total of Lit 12 877 876 663, the milk sector had two projects amounting to Lit 316 492 716: the provision of facilities for the storage and refrigeration of milk in the provinces of Belluno, Padua, Treviso, Venice and Verona (one project) and in the province of Arezzo. The meat sector received aid amounting to Lit 3 114 141 001 for eight projects: construction or expansion of slaughterhouses and/or meat processing plants and/or cold stores at Bologna, Piacenza and in the provinces of Forli, Reggio di Calabria, Cosenza and Trapani and ham factories in the provinces of Parma and Reggio Emilia.

The fruit and vegetable sector had 17 projects amounting to Lit 3 263 036 568: construction or extension of depots or markets for fruit and/or vegetables in the provinces of Trento (3), Bolzano (6), Bologna, Modena, Rome (2) and Lucca, a chestnut marketing centre at Caprese Michelangelo (Arezzo), a canning factory in the province of Ravenna and a centre for marketing table grapes and producing grape juice at Naro (Agrigento). The wine sector received Lit 2 287 464 110 for 11 projects: construction, expansion or improvement of wine cooperatives in the provinces of Pordenone, Pesaro (2 projects), Grosseto, Trapani, Rome, Viterbo, Taranto and Lecce (one project); construction of a bottling centre at Rimini (Forli); extension of four wine cooperatives and a bottling centre in the province of Ravenna (one project) and creation of wine sales points in the province of Alessandria.

The remaining 17 were "miscellaneous" projects amounting to Lit 3 896 742 268: construction, expansion and/or modernization of oil mills in the provinces of Arezzo, Viterbo and Rome; marketing centres for agricultural products in the province of Arezzo, at Orvieto (Turin) and Terni (2 centres, one project), in the provinces of Ancona, Ascoli Piceno, Macerata and Pesaro (4 centres, one project) and in the province of Treviso; centres for processing and marketing fishery products in the provinces of La Spezia and Livorno; a factory for poultry and rabbit feedingstuffs at Udine; a centre for drying and storing cereals and maturing cheese at Piacenza; a centre for storing, treating and marketing gladioli in the province of Arezzo; tobacco drying centres in the provinces of Arezzo and Perugia (one project) and Lecce; a centre for marketing agricultural products at Modena and a slaughterhouse and pigmeat processing plant at Castelnuovo Rangone (Modena) (one project); a wine cooperative and an oil mill at San Marzeno di San Guisepe (Taranto) and a cereal mill at Modena.

In the Netherlands, among the 14 projects totalling Fl 23 454 275, the only project to improve production structures was for farm road improvement schemes in the Ade-Kadewater-schap (drainage area), amounting to Fl 316 734.

The four mixed projects, representing Fl 1 714 449, concerned the construction of a central laboratory and pilot plant for milk products at Woerden (South Holland), the purchase of equipment for a milk testing station at Gouda (South Holland), the construction of a storehouse for fishing gear and the fitting out of a quay at Oudeschild- Texel (North Holland) and the construction of a storehouse with office for fishing gear at Katwijk-aan-Zee (South Holland).

Of the nine marketing projects amounting to Fl 21 423 092, the milk sector received Fl 1 156 264 for one project: facilities for the delivery of condensed milk products for feeding calves at Veghel (North Brabant). The meat sector had three projects amounting to Fl 4 337 400: construction of slaughterhouses at Apeldoorn (Gelderland) and Someren (North Brabant) and increasing the slaughter capacity at Apeldoorn.

The five remaining projects were "miscellaneous" projects representing FL 15 929 428: the construction at Bunschoten (Utrecht) and expansion at Spakenburg (Utrecht) of fish processing plants, the construction of processing plants for shellfish and crustaceans at Ijerseke (Zeeland) and Westkapelle (Zeeland) and the restructuring of a starch factory and the installation of equipment for the production of protein and protein-rich by-products at Veendam (Groningen).

The United Kingdom had 60 projects amounting to £ 6 809 311. Six of these, amounting to £ 332 566, involved the improvement of production structures. All related to the construction of fishing boats for the ports of Aberdeen, Buckie (Banffshire), Eyemouth (Berwickshire), Falmouth (Cornwall), Lochinver (Sutherland) and Ollaberry (Shetland).

Five mixed projects received £ 356 542 for: the construction at Bridgwater (Somerset) and the modernization and expansion at Omagh (Co. Tyrone) of factories for feedingstuffs, the supply of equipment for drying and storing cereals and for mixing feedingstuffs at Cloughmills (Co. Antrim), the construction of an exhibition hall for animals and an agricultural training centre at Builth Wells (Powys) and the construction of a mussel dredger and a fish processing plant at Caernarfon (Gwynedd).

Of the fifty marketing projects totalling £ 6 166 453, the milk sector had eight projects representing £ 561 437: construction, expansion or modernization of dairies or creameries in Cheshire, Clywd (2), Humberside, Londonderry, Morayshire and Northumberland; extension and alteration of granulated chocolate production plant in a dairy at Holme Moore (North Humberside).

The most important share went to the meat sector, which received £ 4 273 001 for 22 projects: the construction, extension and/or modernization of slaughterhouses and/or meat processing plants in Co. Antrim, Co. Armagh, Avon, Ayrshire, Bedfordshire, Buckinghamshire, Cambridgeshire, Dyfed, North Humberside, Kent, Kincardineshire, Co. Londonderry, West Midlands, Norfolk, Northamptonshire (2), Suffolk, Co. Tyrone (2) and Wiltshire; construction of a slaughterhouse with a protein recovery plant at Cardington (Bedfordshire); modernization and expansion of processing plant in four slaughterhouses, three in England and one in Scotland (one project).

Two projects in the fruit and vegetable sector received £ 72 400: the extension of vegetable processing plant at Ballymoney (Co. Antrim) and of plant for extracting and processing apple juice at Killyman (Co. Tyrone).

The seventeen remaining projects, accounting for £ 1 213 065 were "miscellaneous" projects: construction in Somerset and Co. Tyrone and extension in Derbyshire, Devon, Lancashire, East Lothian, Norfolk, Oxfordshire, Sussex (2), and North Yorkshire of plants for processing poultry or turkeys, the construction of a fish processing factory at Symbister (Shetland) and the equipping of fish processing factories in Aberdeenshire (2), Berwickshire, Cornwall and on the island of Lewis.

Octroi du concours du F.E.O.G.A.

Section Orientation - 2ème tranche 1977

La Commission des Communautés Européennes a octroyé un concours de 139.650.639 UC à 422 projets le 21 décembre 1977, au titre de la seconde tranche 1977.

Le concours octroyé se répartit de la manière suivante :

L'Allemagne compte 92 projets (pour un montant de 77.486.569 DM), dont 34 projets d'amélioration des structures de production, représentant la part la plus importante, soit 42.102.435 DM.

Vingt-deux projets concernent l'amélioration de la voirie rurale en Bavière (20 projets) et dans Le Schleswig-Holstein (2 projets) et représentent la somme de 17.656.189 DM.

Huit projets, pour un montant de 14.846.460 DM, portent sur des travaux hydrauliques et d'amélioration foncière dans Le Schleswig-Holstein (5 projets) et en Basse-Saxe (3 projets).

Les quatre projets restants, représentant 9.599.786 DM, sont des projets "divers". Ils concernent la création et l'aménagement d'étangs en Bavière (2 projets), des travaux de reboisement en Basse-Saxe (1 projet) ainsi que l'agrandissement et l'adaptation d'un centre de formation et de perfectionnement pour techniciens agricoles en Basse-Saxe (1 projet).

Sur les cinquante-huit projets de commercialisation représentant la somme de 35.384.134 DM, un montant de 14.243.135 DM revient au secteur "produits laitiers" pour 17 projets. Il s'agit de l'extension et de la rationalisation de laiteries et de fromageries en Bade-Wurtemberg (5 projets), en Bavière (4 projets), à Berlin (1 projet) et en Basse-Saxe (1 projet), de la création d'installations de distribution (1 projet), de la spécialisation d'une fromagerie (1 projet) et de la construction d'installations de stockage centralisées (2 projets) en Bade-Wurtemberg, ainsi que, en Bavière, du regroupement des capacités de production d'une fromagerie (1 projet) et de l'extension d'un laboratoire central (1 projet).

Le secteur "viande" compte deux projets : le concours du Fonds s'élève à 971.055 DM, répartis sur la construction de boucherie en Hesse et sur l'agrandissement et la rationalisation d'un atelier d'équarrissage dans Le Schleswig-Holstein.

Un montant de 2.452.647 DM est accordé au secteur "fruits et légumes" pour 9 projets, dont 7 en Basse-Saxe qui concernent la construction de centres de calibrage de fruits (2 projets), ainsi que des installations de stockage pour fruits (5 projets). Les deux projets restants concernent l'extension et la rationalisation d'une conserverie en Bade-Wurtemberg. (1ère et 2ème phase).

Dans le secteur "vin" 17 projets se partagent un montant de 10.870.598 DM. Ils ont principalement pour objet l'extension et la modernisation de caves en Bade-Wurtemberg (14 projets) et en Rhénanie-Palatinat (1 projet). Deux projets en Bade-Wurtemberg concernent la reconstruction d'une cave.

Treize projets sont classés dans le secteur "divers" et dotés d'un concours de 6.846.699 DM.

Il s'agit de la construction ou de l'extension d'installations de stockage pour céréales de qualité en Bade-Wurtemberg (7 projets) et de la construction de locaux de stockage et de commercialisation pour plantes de pépinières dans le Schleswig-Holstein (4 projets).

Les deux projets restants se situent en Rhénanie du Nord-Westphalie et concernent la construction d'une installation de déshydratation de cossettes de betteraves et de fabrication d'un amendement calcaire à Kalkor-Appeldorn, d'une part, ainsi que l'agrandissement d'installations de commercialisation de fleurs coupées et de plantes d'ornement à Neuss, Minden et Munster (3 localisations pour le même projet), d'autre part.

La Belgique compte 48 projets (représentant un total de 364.037.442 BFR) dont 26 projets d'amélioration des structures de production bénéficiant d'un concours de 231.301.686 BFR.

Dix-sept projets, représentant 200.497.300 BFR, concernent des travaux d'amélioration de la voirie rurale dans les provinces d'Anvers, Brabant (2), Flandre orientale, Hainaut (2), et Liège; accompagnés de travaux d'assainissement dans les provinces de Brabant (2), Flandre Orientale, Hainaut (2), Liège (4) et Limbourg.

Huit projets (pour un montant de 29.708.166 BFR) concernent uniquement des travaux d'amélioration des voies d'écoulement et de drainage dans les provinces d'Anvers, Brabant et Namur (1 projet), Flandre Orientale (4) et Hainaut (2). Le projet restant qui bénéficie de 1.096.220 BFR porte sur la mise en place d'un réseau de distribution d'eau dans la commune de Wuustwezel (prov. d'Anvers).

Sur les 22 projets de commercialisation, représentant 132.735.756 BFR, le secteur laitier compte quatre projets pour un montant de 29.588.210 BFR : rationalisation ou extension de laiteries à Dison (prov. de Liège), Schoten (prov. d'Anvers) et Wingene (Flandre Occid.) et construction d'une fromagerie à Bruges (Flandre occid.).

La part la plus importante revient au secteur "viande" avec sept projets représentant 50.013.594 BFR. Il s'agit de la construction ou l'extension d'abattoirs et/ou d'unités de transformation de la viande à Erembodegem (Fl. Or.) Geel (Anvers), Herchies (Hainaut), Audenarde (Flandre orientale) (2 projets) Soignies (Hainaut) et Wandre (Liège).

Les quatre projets du secteur "fruits et légumes", représentant 20.919.061 BFR, portent sur l'extension d'un centre de surgélation de légumes à Staden (Flandre occid.) et d'une conserverie de fruits et légumes à Rijkevorsel (Anvers), la modernisation d'une conserverie de légumes à Kortemark (Flandre occid.) et la rationalisation d'une criée aux fruits à Borgloon (Limbourg).

Les sept projets restants sont des projets "divers" représentant 32.214.891 BFR et portant sur la construction: d'une fabrique d'aliments du bétail à Wichelen (Flandre Orientale) et l'extension: d'une coopérative céréalière à Soignies (Hainaut); d'un centre de stockage de céréales à Huise (Flandre Orientale), d'un abattoir de volailles à Alost (Fl. Orient.); d'une exploitation de traitement des graines de lin à Ichtegem (Fl. occidentale); d'une installation de traitement du poisson à Ostende (Flandre Occidentale) et d'une installation pour la production de poissons surgelés et de poissons fumés à Bruges (Flandre occidentale).

Au Danemark parmi les 28 projets représentant un total de 39.356.812 DKR, deux projets portent sur l'amélioration des structures de production pour un montant de 1.082.500 DKR : la construction de chalutiers-crevettiers au Groenland, l'un pour le port de Godhavn et l'autre pour le port de Jacobshavn.

L'unique projet mixte pour un montant de 1.837.500 DKR porte également sur la construction d'un chalutier-crevettier pour le port de Godthåb au Groenland, mais qui sera équipé pour la cuisson et la congélation des crevettes.

Parmi les 25 projets de commercialisation représentant 36.436.812 DKR, cinq projets intéressent le secteur laitier pour un montant de 5.312.314 DKR; la modernisation ou l'agrandissement de laiteries dans le Jutland à Hoven et Lønborg (1 projet), à Ødsted, à Sønder Onsild et à Tørring et, en Seeland, à Hørsholm.

Le secteur "viande" compte 9 projets représentant 19.037.540 DKR et portant sur l'extension et/ou la modernisation d'abattoirs ou d'unités de transformation de la viande dont, 4 dans le Jutland et un en Seeland.

En outre, un projet concerne 5 abattoirs situés dans le Jutland, un autre conserve 12 abattoirs situés dans le Jutland et en Fionie, un troisième 8 abattoirs situés dans le Jutland et en Seeland et le dernier 9 unités de transformation de la viande situées sur l'ensemble du pays.

L'unique projet du secteur "Fruits et légumes" porte sur l'agrandissement et la modernisation d'un centre de stockage et de conditionnement de fruits, légumes et fleurs à Slagelse (Seeland) et représente 635.500 DKr.

Les 10 projets restants sont des projets "divers" représentant 11.451.458 DKR. Il s'agit de : la construction, l'extension ou la modernisation d'unités de production d'aliments du bétail et/ou de stockage de céréales, dont 4 dans le Jutland, un en Seeland et un en Fionie; la construction de 4 centres de distribution d'aliments du bétail situés dans le Jutland (1 projet), l'agrandissement d'un entrepôt central pour matières premières agricoles à Høng (Seeland); la construction d'une unité de transformation du poisson à Glyngere (Jutland) et l'achat de 15.000 conteneurs pour la distribution de plantes en pots provenant du Jutland et de Fionie.

La France compte 36 projets (pour un montant total de 135.668.939 FF) dont 28 projets d'amélioration des structures de production bénéficiant d'un concours de 118.956.874 FF.

Parmi ces 28 projets, 5 (représentant 9.917.604 FF) concernent l'amélioration de la voirie rurale dans les départements des Côtes-du-Nord, de la Creuse, de la Loire, de la Lozère et du Puy-de-Dôme.

Six projets, pour un montant total de 37.781.915 FF, portent sur des travaux d'aménagement hydraulique : deux dans le Loiret, un dans le Nord, deux dans le Nord-Pas-de-Calais (région des Wateringues) et un dans le Puy-de-Dôme.

Les 17 projets restants sont des projets divers représentant 71.257.355 FF: travaux d'alimentation en eau potable dans les Départements de la Creuse, des Deux-Sèvres, du Doubs, de l'Ille-et-Vilaine, de la Lozère et de la Manche, accompagnés de travaux d'électrification, de voirie rurale et de drainage dans le Département de l'Allier (Val de Cher); Replantation de vignobles dans les départements du Gard (3) de l'Hérault (4) et du Vaucluse.

L'unique projet mixte concerne la construction d'un complexe ostréicole à Yves (Charente Maritime) et représente 2.050.000 FF.

Sur les 7 projets de la commercialisation, représentant 14.662.065 FF, le secteur "viandes" compte 2 projets bénéficiant de 3.406.262 FF : création à St Méen-le-Grand (Ille-et-Vilaine) et extension à Pontivy (Morbihan) d'unités de production de charcuterie- salaisons et construction d'un marché de veaux à Guerlesquin (Finistère). L'unique projet du secteur "fruits et légumes" porte sur la restructuration d'une conserverie d'ananas au Morne-rouge (Martinique) et bénéficie de 2.939.435 FF.

Les trois projets du secteur "vin", pour un montant de 7.516.368 FF, concernent : la modernisation de 10 caves coopératives dans la région de Bagnols-sur-Cèze (Gard); la construction d'un chai d'embouteillage et la modernisation de 2 caves coopératives dans la région de Faugères-Laurens (Hérault); la modernisation de 5 caves coopératives dans la région du Céressou (Hérault). Le dernier projet, qui bénéficie de 800.000 FF, concerne la construction d'un centre de conditionnement d'oeufs à Yvetot (Seine-Maritime).

L'Irlande compte 29 projets bénéficiant de 4.469.946 IRL, dont 8 projets d'amélioration des structures de production (pour un montant de 710.391 IRL) qui concernent tous la construction de bateaux de pêche pour le port de Killibegs (4) et de Burtonport (Co. Donegal), Balbriggan, Howth et Skerries (Co. Dublin).

Quatre projets mixtes, bénéficiant de 697.198 IRL, concernent la construction d'un complexe ostréicole à Cork Harbour et la construction ou l'extension de fabriques d'aliments du bétail dans le Comté de Cork (2) ainsi que dans les comtés de Carlow, Kildare, Kilkenny, Laois et Tipperrary (1 projet).

Sur les 17 projets de commercialisation (pour un montant de 3.062.357 IRL) le secteur "produits laitiers" bénéficie de 1.503.298 IRL pour 11 projets: construction ou extension de laiteries ou de crémeries dans les Comtés de Cork (2) Galway, Kilkenny, Louth, Monaghan, Tipperary et Westmeath; extension d'une fromagerie à Newmarket (Co. Cork); extension à Mallow (Co. Cork) et modernisation à Rathmore (Co. Kerry) et à Dublin (1 projet) de fabriques de granulés de chocolat.

Les deux projets du secteur "viande" bénéficient de 1.325.114 IRL et concernent l'extension d'installations de traitement de viande à Cloghran (Co. Dublin) et à Ravensdale, Dundalk (Co. Louth).

Les quatre projets restants sont des projets "divers" (pour un montant de 233.945 IRL) et portent sur la construction à Galway et à Rossaveel (Co. Galway) (1 projet) et l'extension à Finglas et à Ushers Island (Co. Dublin) d'usines de traitement de poisson, ainsi que sur la construction d'installations de production de plasma sanguin et d'hémoglobine à Rathculiheen (Co. Waterford).
