### **FOREWORD**

This is the annual report of the European Social Fund for 1987 presented by the Commission to Parliament and the Council.

This report has been drawn up at a time when the Community is engaged in the process of reforming the structural Funds, which constitutes one facet of the strengthening of economic and social cohesion required by Articles 130 A to E of the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community. For the purposes of implementing this policy the Community has obtained new budgetary resources. In return for accepting the new responsibilities conferred on it by the Single European Act, and in accordance with the interinstitutional agreement on budgetary discipline and the improvement of the budgetary procedure, the Community must also ensure that the best possible use is made of the resources allocated to the structural Funds.

It is therefore against a background of stricter budgetary discipline and with a determination to promote transparency that the Commission presents this report.

As far as the structure of this report is concerned, certain changes have been made as compared with 1986. Some sections have been made more detailed in the light of recent experience in managing the European Social Fund, the aim being to fulfil the requirements arising in the context of the reform of the structural Funds. Certain items of information have also been added in response to requests from various sources, which the Commission has met by incorporating more extensive annexes.

### INTRODUCTION

In 1987, Social Fund action was carried out against the background of an employment situation that was still difficult. Although the level of employment has risen slightly, both young people and adults continue to be seriously affected by unemployment while the most disadvantaged groups on the labour market are increasingly severely affected.

The appropriations available for commitment in 1987 (appropriations entered in the budget, amounts carried over from the previous year, amounts released in respect of unused sums, amounts resulting from exchange rate changes, transfers) totalled 3 565.8 million ECU, representing 6.32% of the budget (as compared with 6.35% in 1986). This represents an increase of 494.7 million ECU (+16.11% over the previous year.

The volume of applications for 1987 rose by 14.2% in relation to 1986 (from 5 206 million ECU to 5 972 million ECU).

The volume of applications in respect of operations for young people under 25 amounted to 4 039.5 million ECU (67.7% of the total) compared with 1 705 million ECU in respect of operations for adults over 25 (28.5% of the total), and 227.5 million ECU for specific operations (3.8% of the total).

As far as absolute priority regions are concerned, the volume of applications amounted to 2 805.7 million ECU (47% of the total), an increase of 42% as compared with 1986 (1 974 million ECU). The increase in the volume of applications between 1986 and 1987 can therefore be ascribed to applications in respect of the absolute priority regions, and more especially those relating to young people.

The volume of applications submitted corresponded to 167% of total available resources, a rate equivalent to that recorded in 1986 (168%). The relationship between available resources and volume of applications has therefore stabilized.

The Commission decided on the applications for assistance after consulting the European Social Fund Committee and in accordance with the guidelines for the management of the Fund for the financial years 1987 to 1989<sup>(1)</sup>.

Under the rules at least 75% of all available appropriations must be allocated to operations for young people under 25, 44.5% of the appropriations available for operations referred to in Article 3(1) of Decision 83/516/EEC on the tasks of the European Social Fund<sup>(1)</sup> must be allocated for employment in absolute priority regions, and priority must be accorded to operations conforming to Community goals as regards employment and vocational training (see vocational training policies for the 1980s<sup>(2)</sup>.

Priority was accorded to applications amounting to 4 118 million ECU; the remaining applications amounting to 1 854 million ECU were classified as inadmissible, not eligible or non-priority.

The total amount of assistance approved for 1987 applications was 3 150.06 million ECU. It should also be noted that nearly all the remaining appropriations were used for 1988 applications, since the Commission decided to grant partial approval in advance for certain 1988 applications<sup>(3)</sup> so as to ensure full utilization of the appropriations released in respect of sums approved and not used for earlier applications. The ultimate rate of utilization for commitment appropriations was 98.82%.

As far as the approval decision for 1987 applications is concerned, the 3 150 million ECU approved was apportioned as follows:

2 361.10 million ECU, representing 75% of appropriations committed, was allocated to operations for young people under 25 years of age.

691.50 million ECU, representing 22% of appropriations committed, was allocated to operations for persons over 25 years of age.

In view of the imbalance between the volume of applications for assistance submitted and available appropriations, a linear reduction was applied. The result of this operation in relation to priority applications was that 95% of the amount requested for young people was approved in the case of the absolute priority regions and 99% in the case of the other regions, whilst the corresponding figures for people over 25 years of age were 48% and 56%.

In the case of specific operations, for which a budget of 125.9 million ECU had been put aside, applications amounted to 223 million ECU and approval was granted in respect of 97.46 million ECU, a utilization rate of 77.4%.

An amount of 1 371.5 million ECU was allocated to operations in absolute priority regions (Greece, the autonomous regions of Andalucia, Canarias, Castilla-Leon, Castilla-La-Mancha, Extremadura, Galicia, Murcia, Ceuta and Melilla, the French Overseas Departments, Ireland, the Mezzogiorno, Portugal and Northern Ireland). This amount represents 44.9% of the appropriations allocated under the terms of Article 3(1) of Decision 83/516/EEC.

Lastly, it should be stressed that the Fund administration processed 8 821 applications for assistance compared with 6 449 in 1986.

The total payment appropriations available amounted to 2 753.79 million ECU as against 2 625.45 million ECU in 1986. Of this amount 2 715.28 million ECU was utilized; 6.15 MECU's have been cancelled and the balance of 32.36 MECU's were carried over to the following year.

A considerable improvement can be seen in the rate of payments as compared with 1986. This result was achieved thanks in part to increased computerization, but thanks in part also to the payment of advances on approvals in respect of 1988 applications granted in 1987.

### I. THE EMPLOYMENT SITUATION IN THE COMMUNITY IN 1987

### Employment and unemployment

The employment situation in the Community continued to improve in 1987. For the third year running, the rate of employment growth rose: +0.6% in 1985; +0.8% in 1986; +1.0% in 1987. This trend does, however, cover a wide range of situations in the Member States and Community regions. Adjustments on the labour market are moving at varying rates depending on the macroeconomic policies followed and the structure of industrial production.

The most visible evidence of the overall balance of employment resulting from the interaction of labour supply and demand is the level of unemployment. Labour supply and demand move according to their own rationales, however, and unemployment is no longer the only form of adjustment between them: account must also be taken of the new paths into working life for young people, part-time work, temporary work and early retirement. It is thus becoming increasingly difficult to describe the labour market in terms of one or two simple indicators.

Part-time working is rapidly growing in importance and is currently the most prevalent form of work-sharing. The term "employment" now covers a wide range of situations from skilled, secure and well-paid jobs to others of an altogether more insecure character.

The services sector remains the most dynamic, offsetting the steady decline in agricultural and industrial employment. It should also be noted that the growth of wage- and salary-earning employment so characteristic of the earlier period has slowed down radically: it is jobs in small businesses which are proving most durable.

In line with the improvement in the employment situation, the growth of unemployment has come to a halt in recent years. The unemployment rate as a percentage of the working population was 10.9% in 1985, 10.8% in 1986 and 10.6% in 1987 for the Community as a whole.

This trend can in large part be ascribed to the slowdown in the growth of the working population. In the medium term, the ongoing process of restructuring and the existence of substantial pools of unused human resources - the labour market "reserve" - will continue to affect the labour market unfavourably.

Unemployment is not evenly distributed either across the Community or across the social spectrum. Certain groups are more vulnerable than other young people, women, older workers and those with limited skills.

Over the Community as a whole, the extent to which unemployment is concentrated on a limited number of groups (very substantial increase in the length of unemployment, difficulties encountered by young people and the unskilled in their search for jobs) and regions (backward regions ari declining industrial regions) has increased significantly.

The level of unemployment amongst young people and older, long-term unemployed workers, and in the backward regions and declining industrial regions accounts for the structural Funds reform policy presented to the Council by the Commission (see Chapter II, point 1).

### Policy developments

The direction taken by employment policy in the Community is founded on the Council resolution of 22 December 1986 on an action programme on employment growth. This resolution identifies four priority areas:

- a) promoting new business and employment growth;
- b) more efficient labour markets;
- c) training;
- d) the long-term unemployed.

In particular, the Commission adopted in May 1987 a memorandum on action to combat long-term unemployment, in response to the wishes expressed in the resolution of 22 December 1986 and reflecting the importance attached to the problem of long-term unemployment at Community level.

This memorardum stresses the steady worsening of the long-term unemployment problem.

The Commission looks at the development of the problem and assesses the effectiveness of the measures adopted by national governments. This leads to discussion of a number of topics, more especially the policies and measures needed to combat long-term unemployment.

The Commission will be drawing up a Community action programme to reduce long-term unemployment on the basis of the outcome of discussions within the Council.

### II. MEASURES EXIATING TO THE STRUCTURE AND MANAGEMENT OF THE FUND

1. COMPREHENSIVE PROPOSAL PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 130 D OF THE EFC TREATY CONCERNING THE REFORM OF THE STRUCTURAL FUNDS (COM(87) 376 FINAL 2)

Acting on the basis of Article 130 D of the Treaty, the Commission has put before the Council a proposal for a Regulation on the tasks of the structural Funds and their effectiveness and on coordination of their activities between themselves and with the operations of the EIB and the other financial instruments.

The aim of this proposal is to make such changes to the structure and operational rules of the structural Funds (European Agricultural Guidance and Guarantee Fund (Guidance Section), European Social Fund, European Regional Development Fund) as are necessary to clarify and rationalize their tasks in order to contribute to the strengthening of the Community's economic and social cohesion and, in particular, to reduce the gap between its different regions and the backwardness of the least favoured regions.

### 1.1. Features of the proposed reform

### 1.1.1. Five priority objectives

The Commission has selected five priority objectives on which the activities of the Funds, the EIB and the other financial instruments should be concentrated:

- (1) The objective of getting the less developed regions to catch up is designed to help boost productive investment and raise productivity growth in these regions to a level above the Community average.
- (2) The objective of converting the declining industrial regions concerns a large number of regions, employment areas and urban communities throughout the Community which are hard hit by crisis in the old-established industries. The sudden collapse of certain sections of industry in the Community is rapidly destroying the economic base of these areas and making it necessary to convert to new activities which offer alternative employment.
- (3) and (4) Combating long-term unemployment and facilitating the occupational integration of the young are priority objectives which reflect the need, in the current economic and social climate, to help particularly vulnerable sections of the population. The action taken to help them must focus on the appropriate situation of such persons throughout the Community. In that way, the Community hopes to give practical shape not only to a form of solidarity but also to efforts to utilize its human resources to the full.

(5) The adjustment of agricultural structures and the development of rural areas are two aspects of a single objective closely linked to the reform of the common agricultural policy.

### 1.1.2. Demanding eligibility criteria

The concentration of Community resources which thus stems from a political choice of a limited number of priority objectives will be reinforced by the selection of demanding eligibility criteria. These are in some cases geographical and in others functional.

### Geographical concentration

The less-developed regions covered by the first objective are those whose per capita GDP, at administrative level NUTS II<sup>(1)</sup>, is less than 75% of the Community average.

The declining industrial regions likely to benefit from Community support for conversion are those experiencing a high unemployment rate and serious industrial problems. Community assistance will be targeted on a defined geographical area to ensure that resources are used in a concentrated and effective manner.

The development of rural areas affected by the reform of the common agricultural policy will be promoted taking into account, in all their diversity, the problems of converting agricultural activities, the spatial constraints on economic activity in general and environmental needs.

### Functional concentration

The other objectives apply to all twelve Member States. The pursuit of these objectives will have to be related to precise criteria reflecting the functional priorities of the aims to be achieved. Measures to combat long-term unemployment and place young people in employment must be rigorously selected - this is vital to ensure that Community action will have the expected effects.

### 1.1.3. Adequate financial resources

Concentration of Community measures is a necessary but not sufficient condition for stronger economic and social cohesion. Another vital need is to increase available finance and to spend the money in a more effective way. To deal with the problems arising, the Commission proposes that Fund resources be doubled and rules and techniques adopted to ensure better use of the appropriations.

The Commission's proposals for doubling resources take account of considerations specific to each objective.

### a) Helping structurally backward regions to catch up

Fund assistance to achieve the first objective must reach the critical mass needed to arrest the gradual deterioration of the last ten years and to develop the real potential of the backward regions.

Whatever indicators are used, it is clear that disparities in standards of living and labour productivity have increased since the early 1970s. Investment has developed less favourably in poor countries than on average for the Community. Indeed, the overall volume of investment in the less prosperous countries of the Community has declined since 1979.

.Looking towards the future, we see that the Community's labour force will have grown by about 6.7 million by 1995, and that more than half of these extra workers will come from the backward regions.

### b) Assisting conversion in declining industrial regions

According to Commission estimates, a large number of Community regions are suffering from serious industrial decline, with major effects on their economic and social fabric. Situations vary widely, since the most acute problems may affect only individual employment areas or parts of urban communities.

Because of the need for further adjustment in the industrial sector, new areas will be affected, and other industrial subsectors will have to be restructured.

Restructuring is now a highly topical issue. It requires substantially increased financial means, especially in view of the prospect of further extensive labour shedding, in particular in steel and shipbuilding, with other industrial sectors likely to be added. The Community must therefore reinforce support and conversion measures.

# c) Helping the long-term unemployed and placing young people in tobs

There are between 5 and 6 million jobless from all age groups and all the Member States who have been out of work for over a year. Moreover, 5.5 million young people under 25 are out of work, many of whom have had no proper work experience since leaving school several years earlier or have no vocational skills.

It is very expensive to put a person back to work after a long period of unemployment; it is also very expensive to provide two years of training to give a young person a skill. The Community would like to demonstrate its solidarity with both long-term and young jobless. The Commission, having assessed the very high cost involved, feels justified in proposing a substantial increase in resources to meet these objectives.

# d) Assisting the adjustment of agricultural structures and the development of rural areas

In view of the process of structural readjustment in agriculture associated with reform of the CAP, and of the need for rural development incentives, a much stronger financial effort is clearly called for, in the form of socio-structural measures closely linked with changes in products produced by farmers. At the same time, the Community must take on a key role in conversion and the economic stimulation of rural areas, both within and outside backward regions. The new role, which will not neglect the requirements of environmental protection, will mean wider coverage of rural development needs, especially as regards infrastructure and the promotion of activities other than agriculture.

Training needs will grow in the same way. As reform of the CAP leads to a further decline in the agricultural workforce or to greater specialization, increased needs for training will emerge: retraining in the first case, adjustment of skills in the second.

# 1.1.4. A new way of operating: complementarity, partnership and programming

The Commission takes the view that, in accordance with the subsidiarity principle, one major feature of Community action through the structural instruments must be that it should seek to complement the national measures being taken. It should be a response to needs put forward by the Member States, backed up by appropriate analysis and evidence. In the light of the priorities which the Community sets and the limited budgetary resources it can mobilize, the Commission must be able to engage in close consultation with the Member States so as to arrive at a division of tasks between the Community and the national level.

The Commission hopes that the process of consultation just mentioned will form the foundation for genuine partnership at all levels, from the planning of operations through the various stages of implementation and right down to the assessment of results.

Programming should make it possible to give Community action the necessary depth and breadth, while at the same time allowing greater flexibility. Community operations spread over a number of years, with joint action by the Funds, the EIB and the other financial instruments, will be better able to respond to changing economic and social realities.

### 1.1.5. Simplifying procedures and improving coordination

Taking all the Funds together, the Commission is currently managing more than 7 000 million ECU in commitment appropriations every year. The fresh grant applications submitted every year by the Member States, taken together with the innumerable payment claims, some of them relating to very small projects of the order of 1 000 ECU, amount to several tens of thousands of cases handled each year by the Commission departments.

These applications are drawn up according to very different criteria and requirements; they are by no means equal in importance from the point of view of their economic impact or their political significance; but every one of them means that something is expected of the Community.

The purpose of the reform of the structural Funds which has been outlined here is to enable the Community better to respond to that expectation. This will also mean simplifying the working of the various structural assistance instruments.

Management by objectives, programming, and the establishment of partnership between the Commission and the national, regional and local authorities are moves in this direction.

Coordination of this kind must go on at all levels of Community action, particularly on the ground. The Commission therefore considers that regional and local authorities and local business should in future be involved to a greater extent in the management of Community measures.

The reform of the structural Funds should serve to improve the positive image of the Community among the authorities concerned, business leaders and the public in general. This can be done only through clear political choices which reflect a fair distribution of Community support, combined with more streamlined organization, and through operational assistance in a simplified form.

Improvements to the widely varying arrangements for making commitments, for example, which in turn determine payments, will permit better organization of the Commission's work. The switch to management based on more operational programmes offers an opportunity in this regard for improving the procedures for the commitment of appropriations. However, this requires better monitoring of the obligations of the Member States. The Commission will therefore move towards a system which will preserve both a sufficient measure of flexibility and a minimum degree of discipline in the submission of grant applications, particularly in order to avoid an excessive bunching of commitment and payment operations at the end of the financial year.

Finally, to ensure better consistency between the activities of the structural Funds, the Commission intends to incorporate in the body of legislation governing them the principle that the Community's financial entitlements and obligations should be expressed in ECU, so as to move towards general implementation of the budget in ECU, except where there are specific reasons for doing otherwise.

2. COMMISSION DECISION OF 29 APRIL 1987 ON THE GUIDELINES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE EUROPEAN SOCIAL FUND IN THE FINANCIAL YEARS 1988 TO 1990(1)

Under Article 6 of Decision 83/516/EEC on the tasks of the European Social Fund<sup>(2)</sup> the Commission was required to adopt the Fund management guidelines for 1988, 1989 and 1990 before 1 May 1987. In accordance with the rules in force, the Member States and the Social Fund Committee were consulted on a preliminary draft of the guidelines. Parliament expressed its views in a resolution adopted on 13 March 1987.

The Decision was taken without prejudice to the reform of the European Social Fund which is necessary following on the Single European Act and the framework Regulation on the reform of the structural Funds (see point 1).

2.1. Broad lines of the priorities for the management of the Fund

The guidelines for 1984 to 1986, retained for the years 1985-87, took account of transitional difficulties in adjusting to the new Fund rules adopted in 1983. The guidelines for the financial years 1986-88<sup>(3)</sup> were drawn up on a stricter basis to ensure a greater qualitative and geographical concentration of assistance. Following the introduction of these guidelines, it was important that Member States and potential beneficiaries should be able to rely on as stable a base as possible. This need for continuity was the most important consideration in drawing up the guidelines for 1987-89<sup>(4)</sup> and for 1988-90.

### 2.2. Selection criteria

The changes as compared with the 1987-89 guidelines are as follows:

- 2.2.1. To discontinue the derogations applied to Spain in 1986 and 1987, except for the exemption from the condition relating to new technology.
- 2.2.2. To discontinue throughout the Community assistance for the recruitment to, or setting up of, additional jobs in the context of local employment initiatives. Assistance for vocational training projects does, however, remain available in this context.
- 2.2.3. To discontinue the assistance given towards employment aids in the context of the reorganization or redistribution of working time.
- 2.2.4. To extend to unemployed young people aged under 25 the assistance available to unemployed adults over 25.

Thanks to this change, the guidelines take account from 1988 of objectives 3 and 4 given to the ESF in the framework of the policy of economic and social cohesion, i.e. the reintegration of the long-: term unemployed and the integration into employment of young people (see point 1).

### 2.3. Geographical concentration

- 2.3.1. Article 7(3) of Decision 83/516/EEC requires that 44.5% of commitment appropriations for operations carried out within the framework of Member States' employment policies<sup>(1)</sup> should be devoted to the promotion of employment in the absolute priority regions. The remaining appropriations are to be concentrated on operations to promote employment in other areas of high and long-term unemployment and/or industrial and sectoral restructuring; these regions are specified in the guidelines.
- 2.3.2. For the financial years 1984 and 1985, regional concentration was at the rate of 64% of the active population of the Community of Ten. 11% of which was in the absolute pricrity regions. This rate fell short of meeting the real need to concentrate the allocation of Fund support, as was demonstrated by the imbalance between amounts

requested and amounts available which forced the Commission to impose a very severe reduction on the amounts requested in priority applications. One of the reasons for this budgetary situation was the excessive number of priority regions. Furthermore certain of the regions accorded priority enjoyed employment rates and per capita GDP higher than the Community average.

For these two reasons, it was essential to move during as short a period as possible to a lower concentration rate.

During the debate in the European Parliament on 14 March 1985 on the 1986-88 guidelines, the Commission representative stated that a rate of 50% seemed a reasonable objective<sup>(1)</sup>.

For 1986, the regional concentration rate was set at 57% of the active population of the Community of Ten, including 11% in the absolute priority regions. In practice, however, the changes to the rules and guidelines following enlargement (absolute priority for seven regions and two towns in Spain and the whole of Portugal, simple priority for the remaining Spanish regions) led to a geographical concentration rate in 1986 of 63% of the Community of Twelve's active population, including 17% in the absolute priority regions.

2.3.3. For the 1987 financial year, the Commission settled upon a rate of 57.5%, knowing that this was only a step in the direction of stricter concentration. For the 1988 financial year, it moved to a rate of 50%, a reasonable enough objective given the present budgetary position.

3. COMMISSION DECISION OF 29 JULY 1987 ON THE RATES OF ASSISTANCE FROM 1987 EUROPEAN SOCIAL FUND TOWARDS EXPENDITURE ON RECRUITMENT, SETTING UP A 1987 EMPLOYMENT PREMIUMS (87/436/EEC)(1)

In this Decision the Commission determined the rates of assistance from the European Social Fund per person and per week towards expenditure on recruitment, setting up and employment premiums in the 1988 financial year, as referred to in Article 1(c) of Regulation (EEC) No 2950/83 $^{(2)}$ . These amounts relate to full-time wage subsidy, setting-up or recruitment operations. As regards part-time operations, the amounts are calculated in proportion to the number of hours worked on the basis of 40 hours per week.

### 4. COURT OF JUSTICE (employment grants case)

Case 84/85 - United Kingdom v. Commission

On 1 October 1987 the Court of Justice delivered its judgment in Case 84/85 United Kingdom v. Commission.

By application lodged at the Court Registry on 2 April 1985, the United Kingdom brought an action under the first paragraph of Article 173 of the EEC Treaty for a declaration that Commission Decision C(84) 1941 of 19 December 1984 was void, in so far as it purported to apply reductions totalling UKL 13 083 004 to recruitment and employment grants from the European Social Fund to the United Kingdom in respect of measures for young people under 25.

Article 2 of Regulation No 2950/83 provides that, for expenditure on employment grants, assistance is to be granted in the amount of 15% of the average gross wage of industrial workers in the Member State concerned. According to the second paragraph of that Article, "before 1 August each year the Commission shall determine the amounts of assistance to be granted per person and per unit of time for each Member: State in the following financial year and shall publish them in the Official Journal of the European Communities".

By virtue of Article 10(3) of the Regulation, for the financial year 1983 that date was put back to 1 December 1983.

On the basis of the abovementioned Council measures the Commission determined, by Decision 83/621/EBC of 30 November 1983, the amounts of assistance from the Fund towards expenditure on recruitment and employment without specifying whether these related to full-time or part-time jobs.

The Commission took the view that aid was due in proportion to the time worked per week.

The Court interpreted Decision 83/621/EEC as meaning that no reduction was envisaged therein in respect of part-time work. Even if the Commission was entitled to decide that the amounts determined were to apply only to a full-time working week, it could not adopt such a decision retroactively without infringing the principle of the protection of legitimate expectations (the restrictive interpretation has this effect). The Court therefore declared Commission Decision C(84) 1941 of 19 December 1984 void in so far as it purported to apply reductions of UKL 13 083 004 to grants from the Social Fund to the United Kingdom.

### III. FINANCING AND BUDGET

### COMMITMENTS

### 1.1. Available appropriations

The 3 565.80 million ECU available for commitment appropriations in 1987 exceeded the amount available in 1986 by 494.7 million ECU (+16.11%). This total was largely made up of appropriations under Chapters 60 and 61 of the general budget of the Communities (2 602.49 million ECU). It also included a further 963.31 million ECU made up as follows:

- 547.92 million ECU carried over from the previous financial year;
- 460.10 million ECU released from amounts not used and made available again to the Community, arising from final payment applications submitted by the Member States, mainly at the end of the year (claims for payment relating to 1986 commitments);
- 20.29 million ECU released as a result of the impact of currency alignments on commitments made during the year (Articles 600, 601 and 610);
- overall reduction of 65 million ECU transferred to finance the "negative reserve" set up in Chapter 100 of the general budget of the Communities.

The apportionment of the available resources to the various budgetary headings was changed in the course of the year by internal transfers under Chapter 60 and by a transfer from one chapter to another, the effect of which was to transfer to Chapter 60 commitment appropriations in excess of those which could be allocated under Chapter 61 (specific measures) on the basis of the criteria of admissibility and eligibility. These transfers were made in accordance with the percentages laid down in Article 7 of Decision 83/516/EFC.

Discounting changes arising from the management of operations, the Fund budget represented 3 565.80 million ECU, or 6.32% of the overall Community budget in 1987 (as against 6.35% in 1986). Moreover, the resources derived from appropriations released for re-use (460.10 million ECU), carryovers (547.92 million ECU) and exchange-rate variations (20.29 million) represented approximately 29% of the total funds available to the ESF and almost 40% of its budget allocation.

### 1.2. Utilization of appropriations

Of the appropriations available in 1987 (3 565.80 million ECU), an amount of 3 523.58 million ECU was committed (as against 2 523 million ECU in 1986), while an amount of 42.22 million ECU remained available and was cancelled at the end of the year. At 98.82%, therefore, the utilization rate for commitment appropriations was far better in 1987 than in 1986 (32.16%).

This better utilization of commitment appropriations is explained by the fact that in 1987, the appropriations released from commitments from the previous year were re-used by 31.12.1987 instead of being carried over to the following year as in the past. The Commission decided in December 1987 to re-use an amount of 323 million ECU. This advance decision giving partial approval concerned 1988 applications for assistance for operations beginning on 1 January 1988.

The 42.22 million ECU which remained available and was cancelled at the end of the year corresponds to a reserve needed to offset any exchange-rate changes affecting all the year's commitments, the balance of which would be unfavourable vis-à-vis the ECU. This reserve was also necessary for new commitments of a technical nature, thus enabling payments to be made for certain dossiers for which amounts had been released in error.

### 2. PAYMENTS

### 2.1. Appropriations available

Appropriations available for 1987 amounting to 2 753.79 million ECU were mainly made up of the annual budget allocation (2 542.26 million ECU), plus 301.53 million ECU carried over from 1986, from which an amount of 90 million ECU was withdrawn because it was transferred to Chapter 100 ("negative reserve"). The total amount available was a little less than 5% higher than in 1986 (2 625.45 million ECU), but almost 83% higher than 1985 (1 505.5 million ECU).

Overall, taking transfers into account, the payment appropriations available were apportioned as follows on the basis of the budget articles representing the various groups of commitments still to be settled:

### 2.2 Utilization of appropriations

Of the 2 753.79 million ECU available by way of payment appropriations, 2 715.28 million ECU were used (as against 2 321.25 million ECU in 1986), whilst 32.36 MECU's were carried over to the following year (301.54 MECU's in 1986) and 6.15 MECU's were cancelled. Thus the volume of payments in 1987 exceeded that of the previous year by almost 17% and that of 1985 by almost 92%. The utilization rate in relation to available appropriations was 98.6% (88.41% in 1986).

This particularly high rate of utilization is due — in spite of the relatively high volume released for reuse and cancellation (674.70 million ECU in total) — in particular to the decision at the end of the year giving advance and partial approval in respect of certain applications for assistance submitted by the Member States for 1988. This decision made it possible to use not only most of the commitment appropriations made available from amounts released for reuse (323 million ECU), but also an additional volume of payment appropriations corresponding to the advances to be paid on the commitments entered into at the end of the year (161.5 million ECU).

The rates of payment and utilization of available appropriations are very high compared with previous years.

### 2.3 Payments made

Of the total paid (2 715.28 million ECU), 1 748.73 million ECU were used in respect of advances for commitments entered into during the year, while 966.55 million ECU was paid in settlement of commitments entered into prior to 1987. Of this total, final payments for commitments entered into in 1986 amounted to some 520 million ECU (as against 320 million ECU in 1986 for 1985 commitments and 22 million ECU in 1985 for 1984 commitments). Taking account of the amounts released as well (460.10 million ECU), 1986 commitments settled during 1987 amount to 979.98 million ECU (or 38.6% of the total amount committed in 1986).

### 2.4 Pattern of payments

The following table gives details, in absolute figures and percentage terms, of the payments made in the last three years with a breakdown between advances and commitments made during the year and other payments (final payments, second advances in respect of specific operations):

The figures given in the above table confirm, both in absolute and percentage terms, the high rate in 1987 of payments other than advances and bear witness to the reversal since 1986 of the trend of the preceding years. This effort is being maintained in order to avoid creating the conditions which might once again give rise to old commitments (see Chapter IV).

### 2.5 Commitments still to be paid

The effort made in 1986 to settle old commitments was continued in 1987 with the following results (in million ECU):

(b) commitments settled in 1987,

Total commitments settled ..... 1 641.25 million ECU

(c) amounts still to be paid at end 1987 in respect of commitments made before 1987 (c = a - b) ....... 243.88 million ECU

The amounts of commitments still to be paid on 31 December 1987 may be broken down as follows by year of commitment:

- commitments entered into between 1984 and 1986 (ordinary outstanding commitments). 325.45 million ECU

It can be seen from these results that management efforts in 1987 were on the same lines as those undertaken successfully in 1986. In this last year, 73% of the outstanding commitments had been settled. Thus, at the end of 1987, the outstanding commitments, although they have not yet disappeared entirely, had nevertheless virtually been absorbed.

However, the volume of commitments still to be paid on 1 January 1988 is not limited to the 343.88 million ECU corresponding to commitments made before 1987. To this amount must be added the commitments entered into in 1987 relating to the balance after payment of advances. These are commitments made in 1987 amounting to 1 727.54 million ECU in respect of which final payment claims will be submitted ten months after the end of the operations and by 31 October 1988 at the latest. Accordingly, commitments still to be settled on 31 December 1987 amounted to 2 071.42 million ECU as compared with 1985.14 million ECU on 31 December 1986. In spite of the decisions approving 3 150.06 million ECU for 1987 dossiers and the advance decision of partial approval for 323 million ECU for 1988 dossiers, the level of ordinary outstanding commitments was practically the same on 31 December 1987 as at the end of 1986.

### 3. RECOVERY OF DEBTS

Orders for recovery are issued by the Fund administration as soon as a debt is established. The ESF has been the subject of criticism in the matter of recovery mainly on two grounds:

- high number of debts to be recovered;
- difficulties in identifying recorded revenue corresponding to recovery orders issued regularly.

This situation is now being improved thanks in particular to increased use of computers. This is why, in accordance with an undertaking made in connection with the discharge procedure for 1986, the Commission is able to present a table showing - by number and amounts - the recovery orders issued by the ESF administration in 1986 and 1987 (exchange rate on 31 December 1987):

This table shows, among other things, that most recovery orders issued every year relate to dossiers approved two years before that. Thus, two-thirds (in number and amounts) of the recovery orders issued in 1986 concerned 1984 dossiers. Similarly, more than 55% of recovery orders issued in 1987 related to 1985 dossiers.

The reason for this concentration of recovery orders on dossiers dating from two years beforehand is to be found in the dual period laid down in Decision 83/673/EEC. Under Article 6 of that Decision, Member States which have not submitted final payment claims by 31 October of the year in question have an additional period of three months in which to submit a general statement of expenditure justifying the advance paid to them immediately after the approval of their applications for assistance. Consequently, if on the 31st of January of the year following that in which the application for final payment should normally have been submitted, no

general statement of expenditure has been received by the Commission or if the documentation presented does not indicate any expenditure of a level or nature justifying the advance, recovery orders are immediately issued.

As regards the recovery orders issued in 1986 for dossiers approved in 1985 and 1986, these involved reimbursements made by the Member States concerned without delay and, in any event, as soon as they realised that the operations approved could not be carried out.

The recovery orders relating to dossiers prior to 1984 (back to 1980) generally correspond to dossiers in respect of which the expenditure presented and deemed justified is less - on examination of the application for final payment - than the amount of the advance paid, thus giving rise to a debt to be recovered.

It should be pointed out that in accordance with a provision in the general budget of the Communities, 1988 appropriations resulting from the recovery of debts may be re-used in the same way as any other revenue, both as commitment appropriations and payment appropriations.

### IV SETTLING OF OUTSTANDING COMMITMENTS SINCE 1 JANUARY 1986

### 1. THE OUTSTANDING COMMITMENTS ON 1 JANUARY 1966

The outstanding commitments of the European Social Fund on 1 January 1986 amounted to 2 890.62 million ECU. These outstanding commitments which include all the commitments made by the Commission since 1978 in respect of the Member States outstanding on 1 January 1986, were roughly equal to the entire ESF budget for 1986.

Graph No 1 shows the trend from 1978 to 1 January 1986 of payments still to be made on previous commitments on 1 January of each year. These constitute what are known as the outstanding commitments which build up until the beginning of each financial year during which steps are taken to eliminate or at least reduce it. The outstanding commitments peaked on 1 January 1986 at 2 890.62 million ECU.

The question that has to be asked is how the ESF could reach this volume of outstanding commitments on 1 January 1986. The figure rose from 1 341 million ECU on 1 January 1980 to 2 890.62 million ECU on 1 January 1986, an increase of 115.55%.

First of all, it is necessary to point out that a commitment decided for a specific year may be settled (paid or released) during that year (in the new fund, almost an average of 50% of advanced payments) and the following years, without their being a specific time limit in which to do so. this situation can, and indeed did, lead to an excessive accumulation of outstanding commitments if there is not a strict management of the process of settling commitments with the shortest possible schedules. A further requirement is that the ESF should have sufficient payment appropriations at the right time and the material and human resources to do so.

A close examination of graph no. 1 shows three significant jumps up to 1 January 1986. The outstanding commitments increased by 27.9% in 1982, 39.6% in 1983 and 12.4% in 1985.

On the one hard, it is true that these three variations may be partly explained by a major increase in the commitments entered into during those three years. Compared with the years immediately before, the commitments entered into increased by 51.7% in 1982, 24.2% in 1983 and 18.1% in 1985.

However, in the long term, beyond a specific year and regardless of the volume of undertakings entered into, the question must be approached in terms of good or had management of settlements, having regard to the basic objective factors, in particular the payment appropriations available each year and the management capacity of a fund, as indicated above. In fact, all types of resources are needed to overcome the structural imbalance between commitments on the one hand and payments on amounts released (cancellation or re-use) on the other.

If we refer to the three years 1982, 1983 and 1985 in which the major increases in the accumulated outstanding commitments occurred, more specific explanations corresponding in general terms to those which have just been identified may be put forward.

As regards 1982, the most influential factor is the considerable increase (51.7% over 1981) in commitments entered into by the Fund in the course of the year.

In 1983, alongside the sharp increase in commitments entered into (24.2%), the decisive factor in the accumulation of the outstanding commitments was the rate of utilization of available payment appropriations (60.65%), the lowest during the period under consideration and, consequently, the lower rate of settlement for payment of prior commitments.

In fact, a good proportion of payment appropriations not used in 1983 were carried over to 1984 in which, with a 89.94% utilization rate of available payment appropriations and a level of new commitments slightly below that of 1983 (1 854 million ECU compared with 1 877 million ECU), the outstanding commitments increased by only 1%.

Finally, in 1985, in spite of a relatively high rate of utilization of available payment appropriations (93.86%), the dertermining factor explaining the sharp increase in outstanding commitments was the insufficiency of available payment appropriations, 1 505.5 million ECU, lower than the 1 787.85 million ECU in 1984.

Consequently, there are many, interlinked causes for the increase in the outstanding commitments. However, what they all come down to is a failure to manage the settlement of commitments. Resolving the situation requires strict management of the settlement process with sufficient means.

Faced with this situation which placed a heavy burden on the management and finances of the Fund, the Commission decided in 1986 to set up a plan specifically to eliminate the outstanding commitments.


Table No 1 and the accompanying graph show the structure of the outstanding commitments in relation to the year of commitment up to 1.1.1986.

There are two main groups of outstanding commitments:

- (1) 1 022.31 million ECU of commitments outstanding up to 1984 which may be regarded as exceptional;
- (2) 1 868.31 million ECU of commitments made under decisions in 1984 and 1985, which constitute what could be termed an ordinary outstanding commitment stemming from the normal operation of the Fund.

#### 2. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PLAN TO ELIMINATE THE OUTSTANDING COMMITMENTS

The aim of the plan was to eliminate in three years all commitments outstanding on 1 January 1986 and to reduce the commitments outstanding overall to levels that are acceptable as regards the management, finance and credibility of the fund.

Accordingly, it was at first necessary to have available an additional 500 million EC in payment appropriations for 1986. The budgetary authority made this amount available to the Commission to ensure that the three-year operation got off to a good start.

The internal management of the Fund was reinforced with the cooperation of the Member States with a view to eliminating these amounts more rapidly than originally planned, either through payment or the release of amounts for non-performance of the operation or refusal to pay, giving rise to the cancellation or re-use of the appropriations thus released.

They payment of assistance the request for which was submitted after the expiry of a certain period (18 months or 10 months after the end of the operation according to successive rules) is excluded.

The first positive results of this effort were noted when closing the accounts for 1986.

On 1 January 1987 the total of 2 890.62 MECU had been reduced to 810.75 MECU, a 72% reduction in the cutstanding commitments noted on 1 January 1986. The effort was continued in 1987 and on 31 December 1987, only 81.91 million ECU remained compared with the 2 890.62 million ECU on 1.1.1986, in other words only 2.8% of the earlier figure. In 24 months, 2 808.71 million ECU had been eliminated, in other words 97.2% of the total (see graph No 2).

These 81.93 million ECU can be broken down as follows:

- 18.45 million ECU of outstanding commitments made prior to 1984;
- 24.28 million ECU of outstanding commitments arising in 1984;
- 39.20 million ECU of outstanding commitments arising in 1985.

The elimination of 97% of the outstanding commitments was achieved by means of both payments and cancellations with the following results:

It can therefore be noted that the Member States have not made full use of all their possibilities as regards the use of appropriations allocated to them. This suggests that given major problems on the labour market and the very limited resources available, other deserving measures could not receive ESF support.

However, in 1986 and 1987 it was possible to extend a proportion of the appropriations released thanks to the procedure for carrying over one year's appropriations, which can be used on condition that the supporting documents arrive in time for them not to be cancelled. Proof of the extension of commitment appropriations is indicated by the level of funds available in 1987 in comparison with the appropriations entered in the budget.

The total amount of available commitment appropriations is made up as follows:

#### 3. CLEARING OF THE OUTSTANDING COMMITMENTS BY MEMBER STATE

Table No 2 below shows the results of the clearing by Member State.

Only ten Member States were, of course, affected by this measure.

It should be noted that the average Community cancellation rate with respect to the total commitments outstanding was 45% and that five Member States exceeded this average. Table No 2 shows the trend in the elimination of these commitments over the period covered.



#### 4. SITUATION OF OUTSTANDING AMOUNTS

At the end of 1985, the amount of outstanding commitments was 2 890.62 ECU, 1 676.31 million ECU of which represented commitments entered into prior to 1985 and 1 214.31 million ECU commitments entered into in 1985, i.e. 58% and 42% of the total.

At the end of 1987, there had been a major change in the situation. Not only had the total commitments outstanding decreased by more than 28% at 2 071.42 million ECU (exceptional outstanding commitments for the years prior to 1986 plus ordinary outstanding commitments from 1986), although there had been a sharp increase in annual commitments, but commitments entered into before 1987 now amounted to only 343.88 ECU with an amount of 1 727.54 million ECU representing commitments entered into during that year, i.e. 17% and 83% respectively of the total.

The breakdown by Member State is given in Annex C3.

#### 5. THE EUROPEAN SOCIAL FUND AND THE FUTURE

The clearing and elimination described above leads us to the following conclusions with respect to the financial aspects:

- (a) the operability of the ESF is assured as of 31 December 1987;
- (b) in these conditions the ESF was able to accomplish its aims, particularly to meet the challenge arising from the reform of the structural funds;
- (c) it is essential to safeguard the goal which has been achieved and to ensure, particularly in view of the reform of the structural funds, of the operability of the ESF;
- (d) lastly, with the success of the clearing plan, the ESF accomplishes one of the goals set out in COM(87)100 making a success of the Single Act, namely the elimination of undesirable budgetary practices.

#### V. APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANCE

1. APPLICATIONS SUBMITTED FOR 1987

#### A. Number of applications

The number of applications presented for 1987 was 8 821 as against 6 449 in 1986. This is an increase of 36.86% and is mainly due to:

- the development of new operations, especially in the new Member States;
- the separation of operations previously grouped together which has made it particularly difficult to examine them;
- the breaking down of major national programmes into a number of regional applications.

## B. <u>Volume of applications</u>

In 1987 the amount requested totalled 5 965.98 million ECU (rate in March 1987) an increase of 14.60% against 1986.

Changes in the volume of applications vary according to Member State, category of persons, regions of absolute priority, priority regions and other regions:

#### 3. ELIGIBILITY OF APPLICATIONS IN 1987

In examining the conformity of the operations with the rules in force, Fund officials checked with particular care that the following criteria were met:

- 1 type of operation as laid down in Article 1(2) of Decision 83/516/EEC;
- 2 operations specified in Article 3(1) and (2) of the same Decision;
- 3 cutegories of beneficiaries of operations and definition of operation in accordance with Article 4(1) to (3) of the same Decision;
- 4 eligible costs together with the categories of beneficiaries and types of operation in accordance with Article 1(a) to (c) of Council Regulation (EEC) No 2950/83.

5 - financing and amount of assistance in relation to the higher rate of intervention for regions, the level of private participation and the income derived from certain operations.

Applications were examined in particular for their content as regards:

- allowances to cover wages of trainees during training;
- cost and number of instructors in relation to number of trainees;
- duration of practical on-the-job training in relation to theoretical training;
- calculation of amortization;
- use of raw materials.

Out of a total of 8 821 applications, 1 783 were considered "partially eligible" and 534 as "non-eligible". Thus an amount of 448.12 million ECU was classified as non-eligible representing 7.50% of the total of 5 971.89 million ECU.

#### 4. EXAMINATION OF APPLICATIONS AS REGARDS PRIORITY

The examination of applications for priority grading was carried out in accordance with the Commission Decision of 30 April 1986 on the guidelines for the management of the European Social Fund in the financial years 1987 to 1989 (85/261/EEC)<sup>1</sup>.

The departments took particular care to ensure that the conditions laid down in point 1 of the general guidelines were met:

- priority regions and areas
- long term unemployment
- qualitative and quantitative conditions with a view to granting priority
- to vocational training operations.

Out of a total of 8 821 applications, 1 781 were classified as partially or non priority. Thus out of a total of 5 965.98 million ECU in financial assistance requested, an amount of 1 310.83 million ECU, or 21.95% was classified as partially priority or non priority.

#### APPLICATIONS FOR ASSISTANCE APPROVED IN 1987

The Commission adopted three approval Decisions¹ covering various eligible and priority operations. The applications for assistance were approved by budget item according to point 1.7 of the guidelines for the management of the European Social Fund in the financial years 1987 to 1989. The reduction had to be calculated in proportion to the priority amount for each budget item and Member State since there were insufficient commitment appropriations to finance all the priority applications. The linear reduction amounted to 704.56 million ECU calculated in relation to the amount of 3 757.17 million ECU in respect of priority general operations, an average of 18.76%. The specific operations which were considered eligible (priority and non-priority) were approved without reduction.

The Commission approved an amount of 3 150.06 million ECU covering 6 983 applications, equal to 8 054 regional operations. These figures are set out in various tables in the Annexes.

Annexes Al (A.1.1 to A.1.12) contain the breakdown of information regarding applications for assistance which were submitted, rejected and approved in 1987.

Annexes B (B.1 to B.4) contain the breakdown of expenditure considered eligible in respect of applications for assistance approved in 1987.

This report does not contain an analysis and detailed explanation of all the information which is contained in the Annexes, but it highlights three subjects:

- (a) divergences between operations approved in 1987 as regards eligible expenditure:
- (b) the high proportion of beneficiaries accounted for by a limited number of applications for assistance in 1987;
- (c) presentation of essential topics concerning innovatory operations.

re a. Divergences between operations approved as regards per capital eligible expenditure

Over the years the Commission has noted broad divergences in the real costs of European Social Fund eligible operations. To illustrate this point, the Fund staff worked out a system for the comparison of various costs in relation to various data bases. By way of illustration, the report contains a short extract from the calculation which demonstrates the divergences between the Member States, the various categories of persons concerned and the type of operation.

Tables B.1-B.4 and the related graphs set out the calculation and eligible expenditure per beneficiary.

- . category of beneficiary and area
- . type of operation and area.

The divergences noted can be accounted for in the following way.

- . The relationship between the volume of applications concerning vocational training and recruitment aid differs depending on the Member State. Recruitment aid is based on a standard rate which depends on the gross average earnings of workers in the Member State. This implies an initial divergence between expenditure of the order of 1 to 8.
- Vocational training operations are of varying quality, since the guidelines call for much stricter conditions in the case of the more developed Member States. The requirement for new technologies is not applied in absolute priority regions. Further, the cost of training in new technologies is very high.
- . Another difference stems from the inclusion of wage costs representing on average half the cost of an operation. In Member States where wage costs are higher, the average costs are also generally higher.
- . These macro-economic trends, which can account for some differences between the Member States, give no indication of the differences between individual applications within a Member State. These differences are to be found in the structure of expenditure presented for financing, which varies depending on the quality of the training, its duration, the proposed sector and the categories of people taken into account.

re b. High proportion of beneficiaries accounted for by a limited number of applications

Analysis of the applications for assistance in terms of concentration rate shows that,
83.89% of beneficiaries are covered by 735 applications, representing 9.125% of the number of applications approved. In terms of the amount approved, this 9.125% of applications accounts for 69.83% of the total assistance granted. In contrast, 2.87% of beneficiaries are covered by 4 632 applications, representing 57.51% of the number of applications approved and accounting for 7.73% of the assistance approved.

This situation varies from one Member State to another, but the trend is to be found throughout the Community. Vocational training and employment training programmes affecting a large number of beneficiaries are, as a rule, national programmes carried out by public or private bodies in the context of the Member State's labour market policy.

To go a little further in examination of the data, it can be seen that 2 198 dossiers, 27.29%, cover 94.12% of beneficiaries and 86.31% of the total amount approved.

This trend is certainly an indication that the greatest share of the amount approved and the number of beneficiaries of eligible and priority operations are today the subject of central and/or regional planning of operational measures. With a view to rationalizing management at Community level, it is certainly desirable to follow up this trend towards concentration by incorporating a large number of small projects in long-term planning.

 $\ensuremath{\text{re}}\ c.$  Main topics for specific innovatory operations meeting Community objectives

For the first time, the Commission annual report includes an extended review of immovatory operations to provide specific and clear information on the various topics for innovatory measures.

1. 685 specific operations were submitted to the Commission. As in previous years, the decisive factor for the selection of applications for assistance was their immovatory nature, a fundamental condition of eligibility for Fund assistance.

For the examination, the topics used until 1986 were modified in the light of experience. Still proceeding from the principle that innovation may be found in the content, methods or organization of operations, the topics were redefined in accordance with the most important areas of innovation in previous years. The topics were grouped according to three main objectives (see point 4).

About 50% of the applications submitted were partially or totally accepted, representing 4.68% of the total amount requested by the Member States. After examining the projects, a number could not be classified as specific operations; they were either withdrawn by the Member States or, after consultation with the national authorities, transferred to other sectors of the Social Fund where they met the conditions of eligibility and priority.

Further, the Commission maintained its principle of financing specific operations for their entire duration only, the better to assess their innovatory character. The derogation from this rule which had been applied by the Commission in 1985 to the 10 Member States at the time in the second year of operation under the Fund rules revised in 1983, was granted to Spain and Portugal for the 1987 financial year, which was the second year of membership of the Community for those two countries.

2. Conditions governing priority are established under points 1 to 5 of the Commission guidelines for the management of the Social Fund in 1987 to 1989.

A number of bodies failed to meet the priority criteria, particularly the clauses providing for a maximum of 100 beneficiaries per project and 40 hours of training in new technology.

Non-priority projects accounted for 24.13 million ECU. Due to their innovatory character, they obtained financing, since sufficient appropriations were available to enable the Commission to approve Fund assistance for all eligible applications regardless of their priority status.

3. The number and classification of applications for assistance submitted to the Commission by the Member States are shown in the tables in Armex A.1.4, pages 5-6.

Assistance approved in respect of young people and adults by Member State was as follows:

Again this year the Commission noted a marked increase in the volume of applications from the Member States in respect of specific operations. However, the increase was less pronounced than in previous years (9% compared with 1986).

- 4. As mentioned in paragraph one, the applications eligible for assistance were classified according to three main objectives, and within each objective according to the working topics linked to the most important areas of innovation:
- A. Experimenting with new job profiles
  - new skills on occupations in new technologies
  - new occupations not in new technologies
  - new skill requirements in the "environment", "culture" and "sport and leisure" sectors
  - new profiles adapted to the specific needs of small and medium-sized undertakings
  - adapting traditional occupations and techniques to current market conditions.
- B. Changing the process of integrating specific groups into society and jobs'
  - specific operations for marginal groups (young people and adults)

  - social and occupational integration of women social and occupational integration of handicapped people
  - social and occupational integration of ethnic and cultural minorities.

#### C. Restructuring of vocational training

- adapting occupational integration assistance to meet needs
- new integrated approaches for projects
- new skill requirements for development agents
- new approaches by local employment initiatives
- new forms of transnational organization of vocational training.

#### A. Experiments with new job profiles

This type of experiment has been made necessary by technological development and rationalization of production and/or management methods. Starting with existing qualifications it will be necessary to establish new job profiles by introducing new technical skills to be acquired, skills covering a number of fields or by grouping skills considered complementary for the exercise of the new occupation. The demand for skilled workers emanates from firms which in many cases have initiated internal training which has proved inadequate for their needs as regards quantity and quality. At the same time such training is not offered by current initial and continuing training programmes. The content and methods are worked out and assessed jointly by those responsible for training, the firms or sectors concerned and sometimes with the university or technology institute.

Two examples where the job profiles have been matched to industry's requirements as regards technological innovation have been developed, one by the Piedmont region in Italy and the other by local authorities in the north-east of the United Kingdom. The former entails training technicians in the use of lasers for thermo-mechanical operations (welding, thermal processing, cutting of ceramics, etc.). The second is part of an operation to develop a telecommunications system in the region through setting up networks for office automation, robotics and data processing in cooperation with the Community ESPRIT and ERITE programmes. A group of young people was trained in the technology of analogue and digital transmission, optical fibres and satellite microwave networks.

Among the examples of new jobs created by the juxtaposition of one or more complementary skills, reference should be made to the French pilot training project (Micro-Light Aircraft crop-spraying techniques) organized by the Ministry of Agriculture, which will introduce it into the initial and continuing training system if successful. This new job profile combines aeronautics technology, plant health, micro-light aircraft crop-spraying techniques and the checking of results. There are job openings in the short term in agriculture and related agricultural activities.

Certain occupations have given rise to the creation of new job profiles covering a broad spectrum of skill levels, concerning, in particular, the environment, culture, sport and letsure sectors. For example Germany, where public opinion and the regional authorities are very aware of pollution problems, has presented several applications for specific operations covering training for jobs concerning the protection of the environment. One concerns marginal persons and integrates a number of types of training of different but complementary levels and duration, in order to operate a social ecology centre in Bremen comprising one research unit and one unit to carry out projects. The qualifications concern the occupations of managers of information and communication systems (Informations— und Kommunikationsfachwirt), ecological town planners, removation specialists (ökologischer Stadtgestalter—Sanierer), biological market gardeners and whole-food cooks (Vollwertkoch).

# B. Changing the process of integrating specific groups into society and iobs)

Imnovation generally concerned educational and organizational aspects of projects. In practice, the occupational integration of these groups is largely conditioned by their social integration; consequently the content, teaching material and methods are determined more by consensus and cooperation between the institutional and private partners than by the application of technological progress. The preferred aspects in the design of operations mainly concern orientation and occupational guidance for the individual, the validation of their skills and personal development, and the acquisition of job search techniques. It was noted, particularly in the case of operations for the marginal groups, that the occupations were mainly selected from the manual and operative trades. The new information technologies are used as an educational support. In terms of skills, they are not systematically integrated in the training content (hence the large number of non-priority applications) and in any case it seldom goes beyond the initiation level. On the other hand, in the case of disadvantaged groups (women, disabled people, ethnic and cultural minorities) the most innovative applications experiment with new content for training in existing occupations which integrate the aspects linked to the modernization and rationalization of production and management methods.

#### Marginal groups

There has been a marked increase in the number of applications for assistance for specific operations. Applications are no longer limited to persons for whom occupational integration or reintegration has become difficult due to the inadequacy of their skills. They are increasingly aimed at groups which combine a number of hardicaps (family background, psychological problems which have disrupted normal schooling leading to a feeling of failure and discouragement, inability to draw up a plan for work or life in general linked to taking a series of small jobs, delinquency, drugs, etc.). Member States are experimenting with a variety of measures to promote occupational integration or reintegration, particularly for drug addicts.

An example is given of an original scheme implemented by an association to assist former drug addicts in the Ardèche area of France. The scheme provides for intensive training in high-risk sports such as climbing, supplemented by thorough physical training and subjects specifically related to mountains (for example, meteorology, geology, fauna and flora) to prepare participants for occupations in mountain areas (guides, ski instructors, construction and maintenance of cable cars and ski runs, line-men for Electricité de France, geographical surveys for the National Geographical Institute) with the cooperation of the Fédération Française de la Montagne and the support of the Ministry for Health, Youth and Sports and the Ministry for Justice. The aim of the scheme is to restore mental and physical health and to provide an occupation by imparting skills recognized by the profession for valid jobs that are usually closed to non-mountain people.

#### Disadvantaged groups

As stated earlier the occupational goals for these groups are more ambitious and call for higher qualifications.

#### Women

This year innovation is focused on training girls and women for occupations applying the new technologies other than the traditional office occupations and which call for a good level of general, technical occupational training. The content is defined in close cooperation with industry to ensure that trainees can become directly employed in posts vacant on account of the general lack of skilled workers. They are in modular form to enable participants to attain the level of skill corresponding to their abilities and motivation.

Three projects embodying this approach have been developed. The first is in the Den Bosch Technology Centre in 's Hertogenbosch (the Netherlands), which offers specialized courses for computer technicians, numerical control machine operators and operators of computer-aided design and production. The second, organized by the Buckinghamshire county authorities in the United Kingdom, retrains women for employment as advanced technicians in information technology, in software production, and the conception, development and production of specialized software. The third is organized by Rouen University in France and consists of a training programme offering three levels of qualifications as maintenance technicians in the field of computers, automated machines and electronics.

#### Disabled people

Also in this category, innovation has moved towards updating education and content of training in line with technological process and/or the redefinition of occupational skills.

An association in Hoensbroeck (Netherlands) has developed a teaching method and content for training adapted to labour market requirements to bring physically handicapped people of differing educational levels and occupation up to a level of training equivalent to middle level vocational education in electronics, design of tools, precision engineering and administration. This calls for the adaptation of structures, especially instructors' abilities, and the content of training in order to integrate new technologies such as computer-aided design and production and numerical control.

Another interesting experiment is carried out by an association in Courtrai, Belgium in conjunction with a British association in Liverpool. It introduces into Belgium new equipment calling for advanced technology which both provides educational support and acts as a work tool for severely physically handicapped people. This is the Head-Start-Work-Station consisting of a microcomputer programme to react to instructions issued by movements of the head. A group of handicapped people has been trained to use this equipment and to practise a variety of office jobs. It was associated with the preparation of the training programme and the campaign to make employers aware of the possibilities of introducing the system in local firms. The Belgian and British associations are in continuous contact with organizations for the disabled in other Member States to extend the application of this project in the context of a transmational action.

#### Ethnic and cultural minorities

The Commission received few requests for specific operations in this category.

The projects selected include that of a German organization which experiments with a new method to promote social and occupational integration of young people of foreign origin who are unemployed in the Marmheim and Rhine-Ruhr areas. There are two main aspects to the project. The former consists of setting up 48 training posts for young Turks, Greeks and Italians in small firms whose owners belong to the same community. They follow skilled training for a period of three years in catering. wholesale and retail trade, hairdressing and travel agencies. A training agreement was concluded with the German entrepreneurs under which they provide all the aspects of training not covered by the foreign entrepreneurs (for example, supplying "German" products to food shops, new technologies module). The second aspect concerns the training of foreign entrepreneurs as instructors, especially through the acquisition of teaching skills and ability to organize and develop a training plan for the trainees and to learn the German language. An official instructor's diploma is awarded. The educational training is completed by management training including the new technologies and marketing to stabilize the undertaking and guarantee the quality of training offered young trainees.

To sum up actions A and B in this chapter, note should be taken of the tendency towards the polarization of operations for particularly disadvantaged groups on the one hand, and operations concerning experiments with advanced skills on the other. The operations to promote occupational integration for marginal groups with little schooling seldom concern advanced skills. The most important potential for innovation lies in the educational aspects, namely individualization and modernization of training and the introduction of information technology as a teaching tool, and in the organizational aspects covering the process of integration in stable employment. On the other hand, in the case of non-marginal groups, the significant immovative elements generally concern updating the content and method of training for existing occupations and in changes brought about by technological progress, experimentation with training for new qualifications and even new occupations. In this case, the prerequisite for eccess to training is a relatively high level of initial training; consequently this type of training is mainly addressed to women job-seekers who do not have any major difficulty in finding employment.

#### C. Restructuring vocational training

In addition to immovations concerning certain occupational sectors or categories, other innovative schemes have been set on foot to improve the operation of training systems and structures and the promotion of employment, for example concerning guidance, training and placement staff, development agents, transnational organization of vocational training. Initiatives may be taken at national or regional level.

The potential or need for innovation in certain areas (adjustment of occupational integration structures, local employment initiatives, new qualifications for development agents, integrated approaches) would seem to have declined except in the newer Member States (Greece, Spain and Portugal). On the other hand, there has been a marked increase in immovative schemes concerning transnational organization of vocational training.

#### New qualifications for development agents

Two interesting examples with different objectives and methods may be noted.

The first takes place in Greece on the initiative of the Greek Local Development and Self Administration Society (EETAA). It seeks to train unemployed university graduates in new communications technologies and in the organization and operation of press offices and local radio stations to enable them to promote local development. This operation is underprised by the development programme for local press offices and radio stations in Greece. These people will work in close contact with local development advisors stationed under the Integrated Mediterranean Programmes (Imps) so that their action to increase awareness will link up local development initiatives with the strategy and development opportunities opened up by the IMPs.

The second scheme, carried out by the Paris-Nord University in France, experiments with training for development agents specializing in the promotion of a multicultural society and the economic integration of the various communities. It is directed to members of the ethnic and cultural groups who can provide proof of university training and work experience in the social field. It involves economic and cultural institutions and associations of foreign origin. The training content differs from existing programmes in its emphasis on the acquisition of the ability to give an impetus to local situations and promote local development projects, to act as mediators between the various parties concerned on the spot.

#### New forms of international organization of vocational training

In 1987, the schemes were remarkable for their broader geographical scope. Whereas in previous years transmational training activities were usually organized bilaterally, this year they tended to take place in several Member States on the basis of a training and educational objective defined jointly by the parties concerned. Some of the schemes stemmed from a Community programme. None of the training programmes, however, has yet led to the award of an official diploma common to the Member States concerned. Transnational training in the context of setting up a European telemedicine network is an illustrative example. It involves interactive training in new communications techniques and procedures and the management of data banks in the medical field, with the participation of the radio medical consultation centres in France, Spain, Greece and Italy for merchant shipping and fisheries. The aim is to enable medical, paramedical and operational staff in the national centres to gain experience of cooperation on radio medical consultation and assistance at sea. The common training bases were developed in 1986 by the more advanced Spanish and French centres. In 1987 they were extended to Italian and Greek centres. Training will provide the basis for the third stage of cooperation in the preparation and dissemination of a modular training programme for staff responsible for medical care on board ship.

The transfrontier schemes constitute a special type of transnational scheme, in other words they take place on either side of an internal frontier and their goals and resources are the product of cooperation between regional and local authorities in the two frontier regions. The Commission recognized their importance for regional development in its recommendation to the Member States of 9 October 1981 referring to their responsibility for resolving specific problems affecting internal frontier regions. Once again this year transnational projects outnumbered transfrontier projects.

One of the most innovative projects in this field was submitted by the local authorities of the frontier areas of Twenthe in the Netherlands and Rheine in Germany, the aim of which is to develop joint training in advanced production techniques. The two areas were faced with a lack of skills in integrated techniques which should supplement existing techniques used in the metalworking and textiles industries. They set up an association consisting in particular of a German-Dutch pilot group composed of 10 multidisciplinary experts. The content of the training was worked out in cooperation with industry, in the form of modules adapted to the needs of German and Dutch trainees. The training modules

will be tried out on a bi-national group of 90 trainees. They will serve to introduce instruction in advanced numerical control systems in existing training in turning and milling, welding, pneumatic and hydraulic piping and weaving. After assessment the final and common product of training will be useable by firms in the two frontier areas and will facilitate mobility for their workers, who will be able to start work on completion of training.

#### VI. APPLICATIONS APPROVED IN 1987 FOR 1988

Before 21 October 1987, the Member States had submitted applications amounting to 6 196.65 million ECU in respect of the 1988 financial year.

The Commission decided to approve part of the applications in December 1987 with a view to the reutilization of amounts released from commitments in respect of 1986. 1

The distribution of amounts approved for the 12 Member States, broken down by budget item, is set out in Annex A.2.

Detailed explanations will be given in the 1988 Annual Report.

#### VII. KUROPRAN SOCIAL FUND COMMUTTURE

On 26-27 February 1987 the European Social Fund Committee held a plenary meeting in Brussels with the following agenda:

- examination of applications for European Social Fund assistance for 1987;
- guidelines for the management of the European Social Fund for 1988 to 1990.

The Committee was also consulted by written procedure on the following topics:

- amount of assistance for recruitment aid, installation and recruitment to jobs which fulfil a public need in 1988;
- the 1988 preliminary draft budget.

#### VIII. CONCLUSION

Following the action to simplify and reorganize the accounts which took place in 1986 and 1987, it is possible to conclude that the Social Fund can achieve the objectives established for it by the reform of the structural funds, namely, in the first place to concentrate on two main areas: combating long-term unemployment and facilitating the occupational integration of young people; in the second place to apply the rules of regional eligibility: to assist regions to make up for the lag in development, to promote conversion in industrial regions in decline and develop rural areas.

In the forthcoming years the Social Fund will enter a new stage in which in-depth action will be taken to give this structural instrument a new start on a solid foundation so that it can play a major role in improving occupational opportunities and contributing to the policy of economic and social cohesion.

#### BELGIUM

# 1. 1987 Approval Decision

In 1987 Belgium submitted applications for assistance totalling 92.13 million ECU, 33.73% more than in 1986. Priority was accorded for an amount of 65.46 million ECU and finally, after an across the board reduction of 10.46 million ECU, 55.50 million ECU were committed in respect of this country, namely 60.2% of the amount request and 1.76% of the total amount approved.

The average unit cost per person in relation to the amounts requested was 1 698 ECU, 138.39% of the Community average, and in relation to the amounts approved it was 1 609 ECU, or 157.75% of the Community average. The breakdown of costs per person in relation to eligible amounts distributed by area and point of the guidelines is set out in Annex B (B1-B4).

Belgium submitted 366 applications, an increase of 22.8% over 1986, of which 291 were approved in favour of 34 489 beneficiaries.

# Outstanding commitments on 1 January 1986

On 1 January 1986 Belgium had 125.53 million ECU commitments pending settlement, that is 4.34% of the total volume (2 890.62 million ECU) of which 34.47 million ECU corresponded to commitments entered into prior to 1984.

## Elimination of the outstanding commitments noted on 1 January 1986 and 1 January 1988

As shown in the following table and the graph, on 1 January 1987 only 29.19 million ECU were outstanding: in 12 months the figure recorded on 1 January 1986 had declined by 76.75%.

On 1 January 1988 only 7.75 million ECU remained compared with 125.53 million ECU on 1 January 1986, a decrease of 93.82%, of which 1.09 million ECU corresponded to commitments entered into before 1984 and approved in 1983 and which can still be presented for final payment.

During the period 1 January 1986 to 1 January 1988, elimination through payments represented 56.24% on 1 January 1986, namely a total of 143.38 million ECU and elimination through cancellation represented 38.32% of the outstanding commitments (see following table for adjustments due to differences in exchange rate and funds released for re-use).

Lastly, the total new outstanding commitments on 1 January 1988 were 44.94 million ECU, following the accumulation of outstanding commitments still to be settled arising from 1986 and 1987 decisions. It represents 2.2% of the total for the Community as a whole (2 071.44 million ECU).



#### **GERMANY**

#### 1. 1987 Approval Decision

In 1987 Germany submitted applications for assistance totalling 356,37 million ECU, 8.85% more than in 1986. Priority was accorded for an amount of 185,87 million ECU and finally, after an across the board reduction of 31.44 million ECU, 161,62 million ECU were committed in respect of this country, namely 45-4% of the amount request and 5-13% of the total amount approved.

The average unit cost per person in relation to the amounts requested was 1 953 ECU, 159.17% of the Community average, and in relation to the amounts approved it was 1 996 ECU, or 195.69% of the Community average. On 1 January 1986 Germany had 146.87 million ECU commitments pending settlement, that is 5.08% of the total volume (2 890.62 million ECU) of which 50.12 million ECU corresponded to commitments entered into prior to 1984.

# 3. Elimination of the outstanding commitments noted on 1 January 1986 and 1 January 1988

As shown in the following table and the graph, on 1 January 1987 only 26.64 million ECU were outstanding: in 12 months the figure recorded on 1 January 1986 had declined by 81.86%.

On 1 January 1988 only 3.95 million ECU remained compared with 146.87 million ECU on 1 January 1986, a decrease of  $9^7.31\%$ , of which 1.11 million ECU corresponded to commitments entered into before 1984 and approved in 1983 and which can still be presented for final payment.

During the period 1 January 1986 to 1 January 1988, elimination through payments represented 71,75% on 1 January 1986, namely a total of 163.81 million ECU and elimination through cancellation represented 26.45% of the outstanding commitments (see following table for adjustments due to differences in exchange rate and funds released for re-use).







#### FRANCE

#### 1. 1987 Approval Decision

In 1987 France submitted applications for assistance totalling 653,15million ECU, 10.36% more than in 1986. Priority was accorded for an amount of 489,95million ECU and finally, after an across the board reduction of 108,63 million ECU, 387,01 million ECU were committed in respect of this country, namely 59.3% of the amount request and 12,2% of the total amount approved.

The average unit cost per person in relation to the amounts requested was 1 677 ECU, 136.67% of the Community average, and in relation to the amounts approved it was 1 707 ECU, or 167.35% of the Community average. 

# 1. 1987 Approval Decision

In 1987 Italy submitted applications for assistance totalling 1.195,54million ECU, 9.05 % more than in 1986. Priority was accorded for an amount of 779,02 million ECU and finally, after an across the board reduction of 134,21 million ECU, 649,02 million ECU were committed in respect of this country, namely 54 .3% of the amount request and 20,6% of the total amount approved.





# COMMISSION DECISION

# of 30 April 1986

on the Guidelines for the Management of the European Social Fund in the financial years 1987 to 1989

(86/221/EEC)

# THE COMMISSION OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Decision 85/516/EEC of 17 October 1983 on the tasks of the Euroepan Social Fund (1), and in particular Article 6 thereof,

Having regard to the opinion of the Committee of the European Social Fund,

Whereas the Commission adopts, before 1 May of each year and for the three following financial years, the Fund Management Guidelines for determining those operations which reflect Community priorities as defined by the Council and in particular the action programmes in the area of employment and vocational training;

Whereas the Member States have been consulted and the Parliament has expressed its views in the resolution of 11 March 1986,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

# Sole Article

The Guidelines of the Management of the European Social Fund for 1987 to 1989 as annexed to the present decision.

## ANNEX

#### General

- 1.1. Fund assistance will be concentrated on operations to further employment in:
- 1.1.1. the absolute priority regions as defined in Article 7 (3) of Council Decision 83/516/EEC;
- 1.1.2. areas of industrial and sectoral restructuring made up of zones assisted or proposed by the Commission to be assisted from the non-quota section of the European Regional Development Fund or assisted under Article 56 of the ECSC Treaty (see attached list);
- 1.1.3. areas of high and long-term unemployment drawn up by reference to unemployment rates and gross domestic product (see attached list).
- 1.2. Priority operations limited to the absolute priority regions are indicated by the letters 'AR'; those limited to these regions and the regions listed in the Appendix are marked 'R'; priority operations without regional limitation are marked 'N'.
- 1.3. Persons unemployed for more than 12 months are considered to be long-term unemployed.
- 1.4. Priority will be given to vocational training operations which:
- 1.4.). equip trainees with the skills required for one or more specific types of job;
- 1.4.2. have a minimum duration of 200 hours apart from whatever preparatory training which may be included;
- 1.4.3. include 40 hours devoted to training broadly related to new technologies, which are counted in the calculation of the minimum duration of training; this will not apply to operations for the mentally disabled:
- 1.4.4. in the case of operations intended to further employment in Greece and Portugal, and in Spain for 1987, the minimum duration laid down in 1.4.2 shall be reduced to 100 hours and the requirement related to new technologies in 1.4.3 shall not apply.
- 1.5. Priority will be given to theoretical instruction forming part of apprenticeship training only in the absolute priority regions or elsewhere where it concerns the disabled and the members of the families of migrant workers.
- 1.6. Priority will not be given to assist the salary costs of public agents in the case of operations for instructors, vocational guidance or placement experts or development agents.
- 1.7. Applications will be approved by budget item. Where appropriations are insufficient to cover priority operations, a linear reduction will be applied, calculated in proportion to the financial volume of remaining applications by each Member State. This system will also apply to a surplus of non-priority operations. In the application of the reduction, preference will be given to:
- 1.7.1. operations forming part of an integrated programme involving assistance from two or more Community financial instruments, in particular Integrated Mediterranean Programmes (N);
- 1.7.2. operations of vocational training leading directly to specific jobs in enterprises employing less than 500 persons and linked with the application of new technology which is the subject of Community Programmes of Research and Development (N);
- 1.7.3. operations particularly dependent on Fund assistance for their implementation (N).
- 1.8. Decisions on applications for assistance will be consistent with Community policies and will take account of compliance with Community rules.
- 1.9. When implementing the Guidelines, the Commission shall have regard to the adjustment problems of Spain and Portugal, especially as far as national legislation is concerned; in particular, it shall take account of the economic and social situation of Portugal.

- 2. Priority operations for young people under 25
- 2.1. Vocational training for persons under 18 years of at least 800 hours duration including work experience of at least 200 hours but not exceeding 400 hours and offering substantial prospects of employment (R); for operations intended to further employment in Greece and Portugal, and in Spain for 1987, the minmum work experience required shall be 100 hours.
- 2.2. Vocational training for persons whose qualifications have through experence proved to be inadequate or inappropriate preparing them for skilled jobs requiring the use of new technology (N) or in occupations offering substantial prospects of employment (AR). The requirement for new technology shall not apply in 1987 for Spain.
- 2.3. Recruitment to or setting up of additional jobs of indeterminate duration (R) or to additional jobs of at least six month duration which fulfil a public need (AR).
- 2.4. Vocational training, recruitment to or setting up of additional jobs through employment initiatives taken by local groups, with the assistance, as appropriate, of local or regional authorities, and in the context of a local expansion of employment opportunities (N).
- 3. Priority operations for persons over 25
- 3.1. Vocational training of the long-term unemployed geared to their needs and including motivation and guidance and offering substantial prospects of employment (R).
- 3.2. Vocational training for staff of undertakings with fewer than 500 employees requiring retraining with a view to the introduction of new technology or improvement of management techniques (R); by derogation from 1.4.2 a minimum duration of 100 hours will be required.
- 3.3. Recruitment or setting up of the long-term unemployed to additional jobs of indeterminate duration or to additional jobs of at least six months duration which fulfil a public need (AR).
- 3.4. Vocational training, recruitment to or setting up of additional jobs through employment initiatives taken by local groups, with the assistance, as appropriate, of local or regional authorities, and in the context of a local expansion of employment opportunities (R).
- Priority operations which have no age requirements
- 4.1. Operations forming part of an integrated programme involving assistance from two or more Community financial instruments (N).
- 4.2. Operations carried out jointly by bodies in two or more Member States (N).
- 4.3. Vocational training linked to operations to restructure industrial undertakings because of technological modernization or fundamental changes in demand in the sector concerned; the restructuring must substantially affect the skills requirements and affect at least 15% of the workforce within a period of two years. The training may relate to workers being retrained for continued employment in the undertaking, or those becoming redundant and needing jobs elsewhere (R). Priority will be given outside the priority regions where the restructuring affects the skills requirements of at least 25% of the workforce and is located in an area of particularly high unemployment or where the public authorities have introduced exceptional measures to support vocational training or job creation (N).
- 4.4. Operations of vocational training leading directly to specific jobs in enterprises employing less than 500 persons and linked with the application of new technology which is the subject of Community Programmes of Research and Development (N).
- 4.5. Recruitment to additional full-time or part-time jobs linked to the reorganization or redistribution of work, as agreed between the social partners (N).
- 4.6. Vocational training, recruitment to or setting up of additional jobs for women in occupations in which they are under-represented (N).
- 4.7. Operations for migrant workers and members of their families:
- 4.7.1. to assist their integration into the host country with vocational training combined with language training (N), for persons over 25 years, this training is limited to the three years following immigration;
- 4.7.2. to maintain knowledge of the mother-tongue and provide vocational training combined, if necessary, with refresher language courses when they wish to return to the labour market of their country of origin, this applying solely to nationals of Member States (N).
- 4.2. Operations for disabled people capable of working in the open labour market (R).

- Vocational training of a least 400 hours duration for persons with a minimum of three years work. experrience for employment as instructors, vocational gidance experts, placement experts or development agents (for the promotion of local initiatives):
- 4.9.1. in the absolute priority regions (AR);
- 4.9.2. elsewhere to further the employment integration of migrant workers, the employment of women and the employment of the disabled (N).

#### 5. Specific innovatory operations

Innovatory operations for not more than 100 persons which represent a potential basis for future fund assistance. These should test new approaches to content, methods or organization of operations eligible for fund assistance (N). The limitation of 100 persons will not apply to operations coming within Integrated Mediterranean Programmes.
