Face à ce fléau, les médecins et les systèmes de santé sont confrontés à des problèmes sociaux, éthiques et politiques. 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



The organisation collaborated with relevant key persons among local authorities and local ASO (AIDS Service Organisations) and sought collaboration with personnel and owners of various bars and other places of entertainment which appeal to the target group. 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

Each individual part of the project provides a clear map of discrimination cases in each country and legal services delivery there. The final report provides clear policy guidance. Both the initial individual reports from each country and the final comprehensive report provide assistance at the individual Member State level and across the Community in understanding both the current situation and alternative possibilities for legal support in relation to discrimination issues.
