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THE COMMUNITY AND THE REGULATIONS ON TRADE IN WILDLIFE

Legislative measures

Awaiting the entry into force of the « Gaborone » Amendment, which would allow Community accession to CITES , the Commission is implementing CITES on a voluntary basis. Nevertheless, the Community has been implementing CITES since 1 January 1984 with Council Regulation (EEC) No 3626/82 and Commission Regulation (EEC) No 3418/83 and its modifications and updates.

A new and more complete regulation was adopted on 9 December 1996 and came into force on 1 June 1997 (Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 and Commission Regulation (EC) N° 939/97) . These regulations have been amended subsequently as a follow-up of COP10. The Commission published also a number of regulations containing suspensions of import of certain species of wild fauna and flora on the basis of Article 4(6) of Regulation 338/97.

1. Mesures législatives

Adaptation de l'Arrêté Royal du 20.12.1983 relatif à l'application de la Convention sur le commerce international des espèces de faune et de flore sauvages menacées d'extinction (CITES), et ses modifications, en fonction des dispositions du Règlement (CE) N° 338/97 du Conseil du 9 décembre 1996 relatif à la protection des espèces de faune et de flore sauvage par le contrôle de leur commerce et des dispositions du Règlement (CE) N° 939/97 de la Commission du 26 mai 1997 y portant modalités d'application.

Fin 1998 cette adaptation est toujours en cours.

La liste des experts figurant à l'article 2 de l'Arrêté ministériel du 30 avril 1987 portant reconnaissance d'experts dans le cadre de l'application de la CITES a été réexaminée en vue d'une mise à jour. Cette liste a été finalisée début 1999 et l'arrêté signé par le Ministre le 10 mai 1999 a été publié au Moniteur belge du 14 octobre 99.

2. Mesures réglementaires

Suite à l'adoption des nouveaux règlements CE, l'Administration des Douanes et Accises a revu l'entièreté de ses instructions en matière de CITES. L'instruction "Mesures de Protection - Faune et Flores sauvages" DD. 114.233 du 27.2.98 est le document de base destiné à tous les douaniers chargés des contrôles aux postes frontaliers. Cette instruction a été modifiée et/ou complétée à deux reprises (21.8.98 et 28.8.98).

La technique du contrôle est exposée dans un Module du Manuel de contrôles (CD 950.10). Il s'agit du Module III "Contrôles en matière de CITES" D.C.F. 166.577 du 17.9.98 modifié le 20.11.98.

3. Mesures administratives

3.1. Informatisation

Au courant de la seconde partie de 1997 et de la première partie de 1998, l'Organe de Gestion belge a été l'organisateur de plusieurs réunions regroupant certains pays membres de la Communauté Européenne intéressés par une utilisation conjointe du programme informatique CITES italien qui s'était avéré très performant et prometteur. Bien qu'au départ l'intérêt fut grand, il est apparu assez vite que des problèmes d'ordre pratique empêchaient un démarrage rapide de cette initiative. Quand à la longue la France et la Belgique sont restés seuls candidats pour se joindre aux italiens, le projet fut reporté indéfiniment.

Dès qu'il fut clair que l'utilisation par la Belgique du programme italien devenait hypothétique, des contacts ont été établis avec l'Organe de Gestion néerlandais en vue d'une utilisation de leur programme. Un accord de principe a été obtenu des autorités des Pays-Bas pour obtenir ce programme et ceci à titre gratuit. L'installation de ce programme fut prévue pour début 1999, après acquisition du matériel informatique nécessaire.

3.2. Information

150 exemplaires du rapport annuel 1996 ont été distribués le 4.6.1998. Le même nombre d'exemplaires du rapport annuel 1997 a été distribué le 3.5.1999. Afin de limiter l'envoi du rapport 1998 aux seuls destinataires vraiment intéressés, une note a été incluse dans cette dernière expédition priant les intéressés de retourner à l'Organe de Gestion le talon réponse au cas où ils voudraient toujours recevoir dans l'avenir ce rapport. Seulement 7 réponses positives ont été reçues!

Afin d'expliquer les nouveaux règlements de la Communauté Européenne, une réunion fut organisée fin 1997 réunissant les membres de l'association Andibel, regroupant plus de 90% des commerçants d'animaux de Belgique.

Une circulaire avec le même objectif a été préparée et largement diffusée à plus de 200 destinataires.

En vue d'améliorer la connaissance des obligations dans le cadre des différentes réglementations et dispositions d'application, plusieurs circulaires ont été distribuées, s'agissant p.ex. des demandes de certificats et permis, de l'utilisation des étiquettes lors de l'échange de matériel scientifique, du marquage des spécimens de tortues de l'annexe A....

3.3. Documents délivrés

En 1997, pour la partie FAUNA au total 3796 permis/certificats furent délivrés et utilisés. Pour 1998 ce chiffre est de 2355. Ces chiffres sont de 112, respectivement 168 pour 1997 et 1998 pour la partie FLORA

DENMARK

Legislative measures:

The Danish Statutory Order (Miljø- og Energiministeriets bekendtgørelse nr. 499 af 27. maj 1997 om beskyttelse af vilde dyr og planter ved kontrol af handelen hermed (Washingtonkonvention/CITES)) regulating Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 of 9 December 1996 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein, in Denmark entered into force 19 June 1997.

An amended version of the statutory order is expected by the end of this year.

Regulatory measures:

The physical control at the border is carried out by the customs in co-operation with the National Forest and Nature Agency and inspectors from the Plant-Directorate.

The National Forest and Nature Agency carry out the internal control with trade and possession in co-operation with the police.

Annex I & II gives an overview of rejections of applications, seizures and fines in the period 1993-1998.

Administrative measures:

The Plant-Directorate is responsible for the daily administration of live plants.

The National Forest and Nature Agency are responsible for the daily administration of the fauna and parts and products from flora.

BIENNIAL REPORT OF FINLAND

on the protection of endangered species of wild fauna and flora by
regulating their trade.

Finland has taken in 1997 - 1998 following legislative, regulatory and administrative measures to enforce the provisions of the Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97.

Legislative measures

The Nature Conservation Act came into force on 1 January 1997. Section 44 of this Act deals with "International Trade in Endangered Species": What is provided in Council Regulation (EC) No. 338/97 on the Protection of Species of Wild Flora and Fauna by regulating trade therein shall apply to the import, export, re-export and transit transporting, sale, offering for sale, keeping for commercial purposes, display to the public for commercial purposes and transporting for sale of the animal and plant specimens, or parts or derivatives thereof, referred to in said Regulation.

The Ministry of the Environment was designated as the administrative authority under the European Community Regulation referred to in paragraph 1. The Finnish Environment Institute, however, was designated as the competent authority referred to in the regulation in all matters concerning the issue of permits and certificates. The Finnish Museum for Natural History of the University of Helsinki was designated as the scientific authority referred to in said Regulation.

The Ministry of the Environment shall, as necessary, issue more detailed provisions on the implementation of the European Community Regulation referred to in paragraph 1. The Ministry may assign to the Finnish Museum of Natural History expert duties related to the implementation of said Regulation.

It is the duty of Customs to enforce Community Regulations on importation, exportation, re-exportation and transit transport.

The amendment of Section 44 dealing with "Designated Customs Offices" (according to Article 12 of Council Regulation 338/97) took effect on 4 June 1998. The decree naming designated customs offices for import and export of animals and plants took effect on 15 October 1998.

The decision of the Ministry of the Environment on the action plan on the importation and exportation of endangered species of fauna and flora is under preparation.

Regulatory measures:

Customs and police have each prepared their own internal regulations for the implementation and enforcement of the Council Regulation.

Administrative measures:

Contact persons in every Regional Environment Centre and Customs District Office have been assigned to assist in the implementation of the Council Regulation. Training seminars are arranged annually by Customs and the Ministry of the Environment. Also, border veterinarians and phyto-sanitary inspectors belong to the contact network.

Local game management associations in the implementation of the Council regulation in the relation to the trade of legally hunted specimens, parts and derivatives thereof of brown bear, lynx and wolf.

Finland took part in the European Union CITES Information campaign from May 1997 to May 1998 directed to the general public, traders, police, customs and administration in accordance with the Council Regulation Article 15.1.

National information has been prepared by the Management Authority of Finland and Customs and made available to the public in accordance with Article 12.5 of the Council Regulation.

RAPPORT NATIONAL FRANÇAIS BIENNAL 1997-1998

1- Mesures réglementaires

L'arrêté du 1^{er} mars 1993 fixant les modalités d'application de la convention sur le commerce international des espèces de faune et de flore sauvage menacées d'extinction a été abrogé et remplacé par l'arrêté du 30 juin 1998 fixant les modalités d'application de la convention sur le commerce international des espèces de faune et de flore sauvages menacées d'extinction et des règlements (CE) n° 338/97 du Conseil européen et (CE) n°939/97 de la Commission européenne.

Un arrêté interministériel relatif aux prêts, dons et échanges à des fins non commerciales entre des scientifiques ou institutions scientifiques, est en cours d'élaboration: il vise à appliquer l'article 7.4 du règlement (CE) 338/97.

2- Mesures administratives

2.1 Informatisation

Au cours des années 1997 et 1998, l'Organe de gestion français a assisté à plusieurs réunions organisées par l'Organe de gestion belge, en compagnie d'autres Etats membres de l'Union européenne intéressés par une utilisation conjointe du programme informatique CITES italien, qui s'avérait performant. Divers problèmes pratiques, particulièrement d'ordre financier, se sont rapidement posés et ont freiné cette initiative. La France et la Belgique restant finalement les seuls Etats membres adhérant à cette idée, celle-ci n'a pu aboutir à ce jour.

Une solution alternative est à l'étude en liaison avec les Douanes.

2.2 Actions de formation

En 1997 et en 1998 un séminaire de formation approfondie d'une semaine sur la CITES et sur les règlements (CE) n°338/97 et (CE) n°939/97 a été organisé par l'Organe de gestion français: ces formations, destinées aux agents de contrôle (Douanes, Services Vétérinaires, Office National de la Chasse), sont suivies par 60 personnes chaque année.

Environ 10 formations d'une demi-journée à une journée, portant sur le même sujet, ont également été dispensées par l'Organe de gestion à des agents de contrôle débutants.

2.3 Informations

En 1997, plusieurs milliers de plaquettes d'information ont été mises à disposition du public. Plusieurs centaines d'affiches ont été diffusées dans les aéroports, les Directions des Services Vétérinaires et les cabinets vétérinaires.

En 1998, un guide à l'usage des professionnels du tourisme a été élaboré par WWF France et TRAFFIC Europe avec le concours financier du Ministère de l'aménagement du territoire et de l'environnement, et distribué aux principales agences de voyage.

2.4 Délivrance de documents

En 1997, environ 17000 permis et certificats ont été délivrés; en 1998, ce chiffre est monté à 23000.

1 Gesetzgeberische Maßnahmen / Legislative Measures

1.1 1997

1.1.1 Dritte Verordnung zur Änderung der Bundesartenschutzverordnung vom 6. Juni 1997

Durch die Dritte Verordnung zur Änderung der Bundesartenschutzverordnung (BArtSchV) erfolgte eine Anpassung an die zum 1.6.1997 in Kraft getretene Verordnung Nr. 338/97 des Rates vom 9. Dezember 1996 über den Schutz von Exemplaren wildlebender Tier- und Pflanzenarten. Durch diese Regelung wurden insbesondere nationale Ein – und Ausfuhrregelungen, die mit dem neuen EG-Recht nicht mehr vereinbar waren, aufgehoben und die Arten der Anhänge A und B der neuen EG-Artenschutzverordnung zu besonders geschützten Arten nach dem Bundesnaturschutzgesetz (BNatSchG) erklärt.

Im Einzelnen erfolgten folgende Änderungen:

- Unterschutzstellung der in Anhang a und B der EG-Artenschutzverordnung aufgeführten Arten als besonders geschützte Arten nach nationalem Recht;
- Aufhebung der zusätzlichen Ein- und Ausfuhr genehmigungspflichten sowie der Vermarktungsregelung für die der EG-Verordnung unterliegenden Arten;
- Streichung der nationalen Ein- und Ausfuhr genehmigungspflicht für nicht-europäische Arten (einschließlich Streichung der Anlage 2 BArtSchV);
- Aufhebung der nationalen Ein- und Ausfuhr vorschriften für die durch die Bundesartenschutzverordnung geschützten Tiere und Pflanzen gegenüber EU-Mitgliedstaaten, die eine Vermarktung der Art zulassen;
- Unterschutzstellung der Arten des Anhangs IV der FFH-Richtlinie;
- Anpassung der Listen an die Anhänge der neuen EG-Artenschutzverordnung;

Diese Änderungen dienten als Übergangsregelung bis zum Inkrafttreten des Entwurfs einer Novelle des Bundesnaturschutzgesetzes, die bereits alle notwendigen Regelungen zur Anpassung an die EG-Artenschutzverordnung enthielt.

1.2 1998

1.2.1 Zweite Änderung des BNatSchG vom 08. Mai 1998

Das Bundesnaturschutzgesetz (BNatSchG) in der Fassung der Bekanntmachung vom 12.3.1987 (BGBl. I S. 889), enthält neben strikten Zugriffsverboten insbesondere Verbote für den Besitz und das Inverkehrbringen von besonders und streng geschützten Tier- und Pflanzenarten.

Durch das 2. Gesetz zur Änderung des BNatSchG vom 8.5.1999 erfolgte sowohl die überfällige Umsetzung der FFH-Richtlinie, sowie eine endgültige Anpassung des 5. Abschnittes des Bundesnaturschutzgesetzes an die novellierte EG-Artenschutzverordnung Nr. 338/97:

- Streichung nationaler Ein- und Ausfuhrvorschriften im Hinblick auf die abschließende Regelung im EG-Recht;
- Beschränkung der Vermarktungsregelungen auf nicht der EG-Artenschutzverordnung unterliegende Arten, da auch hier eine abschließende Regelung für Verordnungsarten im EG-Recht normiert ist;
- Änderung der Zuständigkeitenregelung (Zuständigkeiten des BfN für Bescheinigungerteilung im Zusammenhang mit der Einfuhr);
- Anpassung der Ordnungswidrigkeiten- und Strafvorschriften.

1.2.2 Kostenverordnung vom 1. April 1998

Die im April 1998 in Kraft getretene Kostenverordnung zum Bundesnaturschutzgesetz (BNatSchG) regelt die Erhebung von Gebühren im Vollzug der Artenschutzgesetze und -verordnungen. Die Gebührenhöhe richtet sich nach den einzelnen Gebührentatbeständen und ist der nachstehenden Tabelle auszugsweise zu entnehmen:

In besonderen Fällen, kann eine Gebührenbefreiung gewährt werden, nämlich bei Ein-, Aus- oder Wiederausfuhr von Exemplaren für Zwecke der wissenschaftlichen Forschung und Lehre, insbesondere wenn diese zur Erhaltung der betreffenden Art beiträgt, und um solche Exemplare, die für wissenschaftliche Arterhaltungszuchtprogramme ein- oder ausgeführt werden. Der Antrag auf Gebührenbefreiung ist grundsätzlich formlos zu stellen. Der Nachweis für das Vorliegen der Voraussetzungen der Kostenbefreiung ist vom Kostenschuldner zu erbringen. 2.2 Ergänzende Regelungen /Additional national regulations

2.2.1 Besitzverbote und Ausnahmen / prohibitions on possession and exemptions

Nach § 20f Abs. 2 Nr. 1 BNatSchG ist es verboten, Tiere und Pflanzen der besonders geschützten Arten in Besitz oder Gewahrsam zu nehmen, in Besitz oder Gewahrsam zu haben oder zu be- oder verarbeiten (Besitzverbote).

Die Verbote gelten nicht nur für alle nach § 20a Abs. 1 Nr. 7 BNatSchG **besonders geschützten Arten**, sondern nach § 20f Abs. 2a BNatSchG auch für folgende **nicht besonders geschützten** Tier- und Pflanzenarten:

1. für Felle der Sattel- und der Mützenrobbe sowie der daraus hergestellten Waren, die entgegen Art. 1 und 3 der Richtlinie 83/129/EWG des Rates vom 28. März 1983 nach dem 30. September 1983 eingeführt wurden - ausgenommen sind Waren, die von der traditionellen Jagd der Inuits (Eskimos) herrühren - und
2. für Tiere und Pflanzen, die durch eine Rechtsverordnung nach § 26 Abs. 3a BNatSchG bestimmt sind (d.h. nichtheimische, nicht besonders geschützte Arten, für die Besitz- und Vermarktungsverbote wegen der Gefahr einer Verfälschung der heimischen Tier- und Pflanzenwelt oder der Gefährdung des Bestands oder der Verbreitung heimischer wildlebender Arten oder von Population solcher Arten erforderlich sind).

Ausnahmen gelten - soweit sich aus einer Rechtsverordnung nach § 26 Abs. 2 BNatSchG nichts anderes ergibt - für Tiere und Pflanzen der besonders geschützten Arten, wenn sie entweder **rechtmäßig**

- **der Natur entnommen** wurden

3.2 Beschlagnahmen, Verwarnungen, Bußgelder und Straftaten / *confiscations, cautions, fines and penal sanctions*

3.2.1 Bundesmaßnahmen / *Measures on federal level*

Das Bundesamt für Naturschutz (BfN) hat im Jahre 1996 insgesamt 1951 Verfahren, im Jahre 1997 insgesamt 2588 Verfahren registriert, die wegen Verstoßes gegen das Bundesnaturschutzgesetz von Bundesbehörden eingeleitet wurden. Im wesentlichen handelt es sich dabei um Aufgriffe an den Außengrenzen Deutschlands, insbesondere auf den Flughäfen Frankfurt am Main, München, Berlin und Düsseldorf. Wenn geschützte Tiere oder Pflanzen, oder deren Teile und Erzeugnisse ohne die erforderliche Dokumente ein- bzw. ausgeführt werden, werden diese von den Zollstellen beschlagnahmt, in der Regel den Beteiligten weggenommen und einem Dritten überlassen. Darüber hinaus werden Verfahren aufgeführt, die von Bundesbehörden erst im Inland ermittelt wurden und nicht auf einer Beschlagnahme durch den Zoll an den Außengrenzen beruhen (1996: 67; 1997: 57 Verfahren). Auf die Beschlagnahme folgt spätestens nach sechs Monaten die Einziehung, d.h. der Eigentumsübergang des Exemplars auf den Bund, es sei denn, die Beschlagnahme ist wegen rückwirkender Erteilung der erforderlichen Dokumente oder aus anderen Gründen aufzuheben. Parallel zu dem Beschlagnahme- und Einziehungsverfahren laufen Ermittlungen wegen des Verdachts einer Straftat oder einer Ordnungswidrigkeit, die von den jeweils zuständigen Stellen abgeschlossen werden. Bei Ordnungswidrigkeiten verjährt die Tat in drei, bei Straftaten in fünf Jahren. Bußgelder bis zu DM 100.000,- und Strafen bis zu einem Freiheitsentzug von fünf Jahren bilden den gesetzlichen Rahmen (§§ 30,30a BNatSchG).

3.2.1.2 Verstöße im einzelnen / special cases

Folgende gravierende Verstöße wurden festgestellt und geahndet:

Lebende Vögel:

- Aus Südamerika wurde über mehrere Jahre hinweg insgesamt weit über 100 lebende Kolibris und sollten hier an Liebhaber verkauft werden. Der Schmuggler wurde zu einer Freiheitsstrafe von einem Jahr auf Bewährung verurteilt.
- Wegen des ungenehmigten Anbietens von vom Aussterben bedrohter Arten wurde ein Tiervermittler zu einer Freiheitsstrafe von sechs Monaten auf Bewährung und einer Geldbuße in Höhe von DM 4.000,- verurteilt.
- Ein tschechischer Staatsbürger wurde zu einem Jahr auf Bewährung wegen gewerbsmäßiger Vermarktung von Graupapageien mit Ursprung Zaire verurteilt. Eine Durchfuhr im T 1 - Versandverfahren von Belgien in die Tschechische Republik wurde vorgespiegelt.
- Sieben Monate auf Bewährung erhielt ein französischer Staatsbürger, der 1998 vier in Plastikröhren eingezwängte Rabenkakadus aus Thailand einschmuggelte.
- Wegen des Einfuhrschnittmuggels von 2 Hyazintharas aus Paraguay wurde ein Strafbefehl von DM 4.800,- DM ausgesprochen. Mit Hilfe des Koordinators des Europäischen Erhaltungszuchtpfrogramms (EEP) für diese Art konnten beide Tiere umgehend im Rahmen des EEP vermittelt werden. Beide Tiere befinden sich bei guter Gesundheit.

Lebende Reptilien:

- Deutsche, die den internationalen Reptilienschmuggel im Zeitraum von 1995 bis 1996 aus Madagaskar, Südafrika und USA mit vom Aussterben bedrohten Arten (Anhang A: z. B. *Sanzinia madagascariensis*, *Acronotophis spp.*, *Geochelone radiata*) im Wert von über DM 800.000,- organisierten, konnten verhaftet werden. Aufgrund der notwendigen Rechtsanpassung an das geänderte EU-Artenschutzrecht wurde leider nur ein Strafbefehl über DM 30.000,- rechtskräftig. Ein Mittäter wurde in den USA zu einer Freiheitsstrafe von 40 Monaten verurteilt.
- 7 Monate auf Bewährung wurden ausgesprochen wegen illegaler Reptilieneinfuhren zu gewerbsmäßigen Zwecken. 97 Grüne Baumpython (*Chondropython viridis*), 5 weitere Riesenschlangen sowie 20 Warane verschiedener Arten (*Varanus spp.*) waren in einem Fahrzeug versteckt; der Täter hatte die Exemplare auf dem Luftweg aus Indonesien in die Tschechische Republik transportiert und anschließend versucht, sie im Pkw versteckt, auf der Landstraße nach Deutschland einzuschmuggeln.
- Weiterhin auffällig sind die Schmuggelversuche aus Osteuropa, insbesondere Polen, Tschechische Republik und Slowakei, aber auch aus Jugoslawien. Erschreckend ist dabei die hohe Anzahl der geschmuggelten lebenden Reptilien, z.T. auch Papageien und Affen, und ihr tierschutzwidriger Transport. Folgende gravierende Verstöße wurden in 1996 festgestellt:
 1. 424 Reptilien aus der Slowakei: Geldstrafe: DM 8.000,- ;
 2. 328 Schildkröten aus Serbien, insgesamt über mehrere Jahre hinweg: Geldstrafe über 3.000;
 3. 3.377 Reptilien, darunter über 2.000 Rotwangenschmuckschildkröten, aus Polen;
 4. 757 Reptilien (475 Landschildkröten) aus der Tschechischen Republik;
 5. 144 Landschildkröten und 212 Papageien, u.a. Goffini-, Palm- und Molukkenkakadu aus der Tschechischen Republik, Geldstrafe: 11.000,-;

6. ca. 100 Reptilien und 22 Äffchen, die sich in zwei Koffern verpackt im Transit in die Tschechische Republik befanden. Aufgrund der extremen Transportbedingungen verendeten 50 % der Affen trotz sofortiger fachkundiger Betreuung.

Der Hauptbeteiligte im 2. Verfahren wurde zu zwei Jahren auf Bewährung verurteilt, die Hauptbeteiligten im 3. und 4. Verfahren zu einem Jahr und zehn Monaten ohne Bewährung bzw. die Mittäter jeweils zu einem Jahr auf Bewährung.

Da es sich in einigen Verfahren, z.B. im 6. Verfahren um osteuropäische Staatsbürger handelt, die zum Teil auch als Kuriere eingesetzt werden, besteht die Gefahr, daß sie sich der deutschen Gerichtsbarkeit entziehen. Nur in wenigen Fällen werden sie sofort inhaftiert, so daß sich die Strafe oft auf die vom Zoll einbehaltene Sicherheitsleistung beschränkt.

Dendrobatenschmuggel:

Immer wieder werden organisierte Schmuggelversuche aufgedeckt, bei denen scheinbar ahnungslose Privatpersonen als Kuriere eingesetzt werden, um Pfeilgiftfrösche/Dendrobaten aus Costa Rica dem Liebhabermarkt in Deutschland und der EU zuzuführen. Zum Transport werden vorbereitete Reisetaschen mit doppeltem Boden verwendet. Bislang konnten Bußgelder von DM 800,- bis DM 5.000,- (365 Dendrobaten) durchgesetzt werden.

Kakteenschmuggel:

Darüber hinaus wurden zahlreiche Verstöße durch Kakteenliebhaber festgestellt. Die Kakteen werden in Mexiko illegal der Natur entnommen und nach Deutschland eingeschmuggelt. Zahlreiche Ermittlungsverfahren wurden durch Zollfahndungssämter geführt. Verurteilungen bis zu einer Geldstrafe in Höhe von DM 18.000,- wurden ausgesprochen. In weniger gravierenden Fällen hat die Staatsanwaltschaft Verfahren gegen Zahlung einer Geldbuße, z.B. in Höhe von DM 2.500,- eingestellt.

Teile und Erzeugnisse:

Im Bereich der **Teile und Erzeugnisse** werden insbesondere **Elfenbein** und Elfenbeischnitzereien vom asiatischen und afrikanischen Elefanten ungenehmigt eingeführt; je nach Umfang wurden Strafen von DM 500,- bis DM 5.400,- ausgesprochen. Im Vergleich zu den Vorjahren wurden Produkte der **Meeresschildkröte** vermehrt geschmuggelt. Strafen von DM 200,- bis über DM 1.000,- wurden verhängt.

Zu einem Jahr auf Bewährung und einer Geldstrafe in Höhe von DM 9.000,- wurde ein Präparator bestraft wegen des unerlaubten Handels mit gefrorenen zur Präparation bestimmten Exemplaren, insbesondere von Greif- und Eulenvögeln, im Wert von DM 80.000,-.

Ansonsten wurden je nach Menge folgende Strafen ausgesprochen:

- Greifvogel- und Eulenpräparate: Strafen von DM 1.000,- bis DM 2.600,-
- Reptilien (Krokodil, Waran, Schlangen): Strafen von DM 300 bis DM 3.000,- als Tasche, Börse, etc.
- Großkatzen: Strafen von DM 450,- bis 900,-
- Bären: Strafen von DM 400,- bis 600,-

3.2.1.3 Bußgeldeinnahmen 1995 bis 1998 / revenues from fines in 1995 - 1998

Neben den Strafen durch Staatsanwaltschaften und Gerichte erteilt das Bundesamt für Naturschutz Bußgelder wegen ungenehmigter Ein- oder Ausfuhren. Einen Überblick über die seit 1995 bis 1998 eingegangenen Buß- und Verwarnungsgelder kann die folgende Tabelle geben.

3.3 Verwertung durch Bundesbehörden / disposal of confiscates specimens by federal authorities

3.3.1 Allgemeines / general remarks

Die von den Hauptzollämtern beschlagnahmten und rechtskräftig eingezogenen Exemplare werden auf der Grundlage von erlassenen Richtlinien verwertet. Die Regelungen stellen sicher, daß eingezogene Exemplare entsprechend den Vorschriften des Übereinkommens (Art VIII Abs. 4 WA i.V.m. Res. Conf. 10.7) und der Gemeinschaft (Art. 16 Abs. 3 VO (EG) Nr. 338/97 verwertet werden.

Für die Unterbringung lebender Tiere und Pflanzen, die rechtskräftig durch Bundesbehörden eingezogen wurden, ist das Bundesamt für Naturschutz (BfN) zuständig. Darüber hinaus leistet das BfN Amtshilfe für Landesbehörden wie den Staatsanwaltschaften. Bereits bei der Wegnahme durch den Zoll ist es erforderlich, daß kurzfristig eine Unterbringungseinrichtung ermittelt wird, damit die Mitgeschöpfe artgerecht gehalten werden. Oft sind tierärztliche Maßnahmen notwendig, um die Folge der teilweise tierquälerischen Transportbedingungen und des Transportstresses zu beheben.

Die Verwertung von **Teilen und Erzeugnissen** wird, abhängig vom Schutzstatus der jeweiligen Art, durch das Bundesamt für Naturschutz oder die Zollverwaltung selbst durchgeführt. Solche Exemplare werden vor allem an interessierte wissenschaftliche Einrichtungen und Museen, aber auch an Schulen zu Lehr- und Ausstellungszwecken als Dauerleihgabe abgegeben.

Nach der rechtskräftigen Einziehung der beschlagnahmten Exemplare entscheidet das BfN über die weitere, endgültige Verwendung. Als Unterbringungseinrichtung kommen Zoologische Gärten, Vogelparks, Aquarien, Botanische Gärten und auch sachkundige private Halter und Züchter in Frage.

Die Abnehmer der lebenden Exemplare verpflichten sich in einem Überlassungsvertrag, für die Gesundheit und das Wohlbefinden der Exemplare Sorge zu tragen. Das Eigentum an diesen Exemplaren bleibt bei der Bundesrepublik Deutschland. Der Empfänger hat Veränderungen anzugezeigen und darf die überlassenen Tiere und Pflanzen nur nach Zustimmung des BfN abgeben.

An den Nachzuchten erhält der Verwahrer Eigentum.

In einzelnen Fällen werden lebende Tiere auch in ihre Ursprungsländer zurückgeführt oder nach einer Aufzuchtphase mit Unterstützung von Naturschutzverbänden und anderen Behörden in geeigneten Biotopen wieder ausgewildert.

1997 und 1998 wurden für ca. 1300 lebende Tiere und ca. 1300 lebende Pflanzen geeignete Unterbringungseinrichtungen gefunden. Schwerpunkt bei den Tieren war der Bereich der Reptilien mit 724 Exemplaren, der Dendrobaten mit 374 sowie der Bereich der Papageien mit 131 Tieren. Bei den Pflanzen lag der Schwerpunkt im Bereich der Kakteen. Insgesamt wurden 317 Überlassungsverträge (1997: 173; 1998: 144) geschlossen.

Folgende Verwertungsfälle sind wegen ihres Umfangs oder ihrer Spezialität herauszustellen:

3.3.2 Besondere Verwertungsfälle in 1997 / special cases in 1997

- Mit Unterstützung einer Landesbehörde konnten 55 lebende **griechische Landschildkröten** (*Testudo hermanni*), die auf dem Landweg aus der Tschechischen Republik eingeschmuggelt wurden, artgerecht untergebracht werden. Die Tiere waren im Reisegepäck in einem Bus versteckt, eine Zuordnung des Gepäcks zu einer oder mehreren Personen war nicht möglich.

- Im Auftrag der Staatsanwaltschaft wurden 97 **Grüne Baumpython** (*Chondropython viridis*), 5 weitere **Riesenschlangen** sowie 20 **Warane** verschiedener Arten (*Varanus spp.*) in geeigneten Haltungen, vor allem Zoologischen Gärten, untergebracht.
- Auf einem großen deutschen Flughafen wurden bei der Einreisekontrolle im Gepäck einer Person insgesamt mehr als 330 **Pfeilgiftfrösche** (*Dendrobates spp.*) entdeckt. Der Schmuggler hatte die Tiere in Kunststoffboxen verpackt und unter dem doppelten Boden einer Sporttasche versteckt. Aufgrund der sehr schlechten Transportbedingungen verendeten mehr als 50 % der Tiere, für die übrigen konnte eine artgerechte Unterbringung gefunden werden.
- In einem zweiten Fall eingeschmuggelter Pfeilgiftfrösche wurden 190 Tiere durch ein Zollamt beschlagnahmt. Auch diese Tiere konnten artgerecht untergebracht werden.
- Ebenfalls im Auftrag der Staatsanwaltschaft wurden insgesamt 53 lebende **Graupapageien** (*Psittacus erithacus*) in geeigneten Haltungen untergebracht.

3.3.3 Besondere Verwertungsfälle in 1998 / special cases in 1998

- Insgesamt 18 **Kolibris** (*Trochilidae spp.*) wurden im Auftrag einer Staatsanwaltschaft artgerecht in einem Zoologischen Garten untergebracht. Die Tiere waren durch einen deutschen Staatsbürger illegal aus Südamerika nach Deutschland gebracht worden und sollten hier an Liebhaber verkauft werden.
- Insgesamt 576 höchstgeschützte **Kakteen** wurden im Rahmen eines Ermittlungsverfahrens beschlagnahmt und konnten in geeignete Einrichtungen vermittelt werden. Die Pflanzen waren durch die Beteiligten illegal aus Mittel- und Südamerika importiert worden.
- 190 lebende griechische **Landschildkröten** (*Testudo hermanni*), die illegal aus Südosteuropa eingeschmuggelt worden waren, konnten im Auftrag einer Staatsanwaltschaft in geeigneten Haltungen untergebracht werden. Weitere 45 Tiere, die an der deutsch-polnischen Grenze beschlagnahmt wurden, wurden ebenfalls artgerecht untergebracht.

3.3.4 Übersicht über Verwertungen des BfN 1997 und 1998 / disposals in 1997 and 1998

1997 und 1998 wurden vom BfN 134 Überlassungsverträge abgeschlossen, durch die ca. 1.300 Exemplare aus den Asservatenkammern an interessierte Einrichtungen gegeben wurden. Darüber hinaus werden zu wissenschaftlichen oder zu Ausstellungszwecken, mit dem Ziel die Öffentlichkeit auf das Washingtoner Artenschutzübereinkommen hinzuweisen und darüber zu informieren, Exponate leihweise zur Verfügung gestellt.

ON CITES IMPLEMENTATION IN GREECE

Regulation 338/1997 Article 15. 4 (e)

1. INTRODUCTION

The International Convention for the Trade of Endangered Species was ratified by the Hellenic Parliament in 1992 (Law 2055 / 1992). However, Greece has been implementing CITES since its creation complied with relative articles based on the National legislation and especially on the Law No 86 / 1969 and since 1982 through the EC regulation 3626/1982. Immediately upon signing the Greek Authorities started the actual implementation while the ratification provided a further impetus for improvement. In July 1998, the Parliament approved three Articles (57,58,59) in the Law 2637/92 determining in detail the way of complete implementation.

2. THE LAW 2637/1998

Two specific Articles included in this Law in order to amend existing legislation or introduce new measures on wild life trade and exploitation as well as the establishment of scientific and administrative authorities for their implementation.

2.1. Article 57

- a.** Prohibits any import, export, re-exports, re-imports, re-trade, sale, purchase, advertising, rendering, commercial exploitation, possession, exposition and transportation without a license of any samples of wild fauna and flora and their part processed or not.

- b. Determines the conditions and species of wild fauna and flora under which a license may be obtained.
 - c. Provides for the payments required for obtaining a license.
 - d. Establishes a special registry for the professional trader of wild fauna and flora.
 - e. Sets up a scientific Committee of Trading Wild Fauna and Flora composed of prominent scientists.
 - f. Enforces the procedures for the authorities entitle to receive and take care of the living samples of wild fauna.
 - g. Calls for the preparation of special research and management projects on wild fauna and flora and their habitats.
 - h. Endows programs for the public awareness on items related to the protection of wild fauna and flora and their habitats.
 - i. Sets up programs for receiving guard and care fore species of wild fauna.
 - h. Provides for the expenses for transporting, receiving, care and sending back to their origin the species of wild fauna imported illegally.
 - k. Established penalties for any violation of the determined rules.

2.2. Article 58

- a. Protects, oversees and controls the wild life habitats
- b. Provides for the illegitimate imports, transportation and placing in the market of all the protected species living, non-living or processed.

- c. Determines the legal actions against the violations against the illegitimate processions, transportation, collection and marketing of protected species.
- d. States the procedure for controlling the movement of people within or close to protected areas and the actions against violations.

2.3. Article 59

- a. Calls for the procedure for prohibiting the movement in the forest road network in order to protect the wild flora and fauna.
- b. Determines the specific fines against the violations of the above.

3. MINISTERIAL DECISIONS

Furthermore, we issue the following Ministerial Decisions for Specific items like:

3.1. Ministerial Decision No. 373986/ 24.12.1998 for setting up the “Scientific Authority of CITES” composed of prominent scientist related to our issue.

3.2. Ministerial Document No. 475/121/A0019/16.10.1998 for the reduction of the ports of entry of CITES species and products.

Beyond the above we issue:

3.3. Ministerial Decision on “Trade of Wild Fauna and Flora” it arranges the details for implementing the Convention. (No. 331794/ 12.3.99)

3.4. Ministerial Decision on the “Registry of Traders of Wild Fauna and Flora. (No. 331739/ 26.2.99)

4. OTHER ACTIONS

4.1. Establishment of the exclusive CITES Office of the Directorate General of Forests and Natural Environment.

Despite the personnel shortage a Special Office was created within our service with exclusive mission, the CITES implementation. The office was manned by experienced, personnel competent in foreign languages and equipped with all required materiel for completing their duties.

4.2. Informative actions

In order to make the Regional Services (Forestry, Custom, Veterinary) on the full legal procedures of CITES implementation and their scientific and technical background, we have arranged for personnel training conducts. For your information two seminars are settled up in the nearest future (21 – 24 of September 1999 in Thessaloniki and 5 – 8 of October 1999 in Athens). The CITES Secretariat and the European Commission will be invited to participate with experienced officers in the first one.

4.3. Legal Actions

With the help of Regional Services we have launch a campaign for localizing and confiscating illegal specimens and arranging for their repatriation. We have also exercise now more severe control on specimens legally imported to avoid possible illegitimate trade or exploitation

Ireland

COUNCIL REGULATION (EC) No. 338/97 of 9th DECEMBER 1996 ON THE PROTECTION OF PECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA BY REGULATING TRADE THEREIN

BIENNIAL REPORT FOR IRELAND UNDER ARTICLE 15(4) C

PERIOD : JUNE 1997 to MAY 1999

The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) has been signed by Ireland but cannot be ratified under current wildlife legislation. The Minister for Arts, Heritage Gaeltacht and the Islands, who has responsibility in the area, has published on 29th June 1999 the Wildlife (Amendment) Bill, 1999. This substantial legislative proposal for the protection and conservation of wild life and their habitats provides inter.alia. the necessary provisions to enable ratification of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) by Ireland. A copy of the Bill and the accompanying Explanatory Memorandum is enclosed for information.

The Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES) is directly implemented in Ireland under the provisions of Council Regulation (EC) No. 338/97 and Commission Regulation (EC) No. 393/97 of 26th May 1997, as amended. These Regulations were implemented in Ireland with effect from the 1st June 1997 and was accompanied by a countrywide publicity programme which drew substantially on the material and assistance provided by the Commission for this purpose. Publicity material was made available to NGO's and other interested parties and notices regarding the restrictions placed on trade in endangered species placed in the main international airport.

Enforcement and Training

Additional Conservation Rangers recruited to assist in the implementation of the Wildlife Act, 19976 and EU conservation and wildlife related Directives will also assist in the enforcement of the CITES provisions. Training programmes commencing in September 1999 for new and existing staff will feature CITES related modules dealing with regulatory and administrative provisions. Preliminary discussions in relation to developing co-operation in training and enforcement programmes with the Customs authorities are continuing.

Green Parrot Programme: Customs Investigation Bureau have bought three and intend buying additional units to assist in identification and enforcement purposes. National parks and Wildlife are also considering purchase of this programme.

The National Parks and Wildlife Division of Dúchas – The Heritage Service acts as the Management and Scientific Authorities for the implementation of the Regulations.

ITALY

1. INTRODUCTION

This report has been prepared by the Italian CITES Service of Corpo Forestale dello Stato (CFS), structure functionally depending on Minister of Environment – Conservation and Nature Department.

The Italian ratification of CITES took place in 1975 through Law nr.874/75. The Convention of Washington - CITES has been implemented in Italy since December 31st , 1979 by decree of the Minister for Foreign Commerce in agreement with the Minister of Agriculture and Forests and with the Minister of Finance, later on substituted by decree on December 31st , 1983 to grant the provisions of Reg. EC 3626/82.to apply CITES over the European Community.

In order to enforce the CITES in our Country, Law nr.150/92 was issued, integrated and modified by the Law nr.59/93. This provides specific sanctions to prosecute any breaches of the CITES and it also provides specific rules to control the ownership and the trade of animals and plants in our country. To enforce Law nr.150/92 many interdepartmental decrees have been issued. Through the mentioned decrees specific Customs Operative Teams, manned with personnel from the National CFS were established. Some modification were introduced to the Law 150/92 by the Law nr.426/98 called "New actions for the environment".

Since June 1997 the European Community has decided to protect the biological diversity of animals and plants in more resolute way by Reg.(EC) 338/97. This Regulation has abrogated the former Reg. (EC) 3626/82 , widening control over autochthonous species. The following Reg.939/97 has set up new specific inspections and certificates. In Italy, the entire subject is in the hands of Governmental Authorities.

1.1. Law 150/92 concerning "Rules and regulations to control the International trade of endangered species of animals and plants"

As expounded above, in Italy the enforcement of Convention of Washington - CITES is charged by Law 150/92, partly modified by Law 59/93 and Law 426/98.

This law provides:

- to sanction any breaches provided by the EC Regulation;
- to oblige the notification of detention of specimens of flora and fauna species listed on Annex I°-CITES and to the enclosed C, part 1, Reg. EC 3626/82;
- to oblige the notification of captivity birth of animal species listed in Appendix I° and II° of CITES;
- the temporary and final arrangement for the specimens distrained;
- to designate the Ministry of Environment as Management Authority;
- to establish a new National Scientific Authority;
- to establish special Operative Teams composed of CFS personnel specialised on fauna and flora species controls;
- the monitoring of mortality for specimens during international transit;
- the establishment of Scientific Register provided by CITES, art.VII par.6;
- to define a specific "payment" for CITES certifications charged to applicants;
- to assign a specific budget in the State balance to face any cost concerning the management of CITES provision; into this budget flow all payments made for the certifications mentioned above;
- to issue specific rules to manage and hold dangerous specimens.

2. LEGAL MEASURES FOR NATIONAL ENFORCEMENT OF EC 338/97 REGULATION

It is common knowledge that European Community Regulation are directly and obbligatory applicable in each Member State. It is avoid from the normative authority of Reg. (EC) 338/97 the penalties determination for breachs content in art. 16 of the mentioned Regulation.

Law 150/92 is still enforceable and represents the only one normative reference to establish, if an action is illegal or behaviours are classifiable as crimes, as well as the penalties are concerned. There are only some breaches provided in art.16 of Reg. (EC) 338/97 that are excluded from penalties system of Law 150/92, like omitted or false notification at the importation, concerning specimens of species included on Annex D (art.16 par. 1 lett. e), and communication of rejection of a permit or certificate application.

In Italy the CITES and European Regulation 3626/82 have been implemented by Law n. 150/92 and subsequent amendments, Laws nr.59/93 and nr. 426/98; this legislation has introduced other sanctions and stronger penalties for contravention concerning the sale and the movement of CITES species.

By promulgation of REG(EC)338/97 the EC 3626/82 has been abrogated and new breaches were introduced.

At national level no specific legislative action has been yet issued to enforce the 338/97 Reg. EC but a new bill, entirely covering the REG(EC)338/97, is under the examination of the Ministry of Justice for the final approval by the Government Authority.

3. MEASURES OF APPLICATION AND REGULATIONS

The application in customs areas

Since 1992, carrying out the Law 150/92, which deals with the Washington Convention (CITES) rules, special Operative Teams – composed of CFS personnel specialised on fauna and flora species controls- have been working at Italian customs qualified for import and (re)export of CITES specimens (see list below).

This innovative territorial organisation allowed to enforce the REG(EC)338/97 Reg. from the beginning, as far as checking, customs formalities and specialised personnel are concerned.

Therefore, for Italy it is essential to maintain and develop an adequate control system for fauna and flora specimens and their derivatives imports and (re)exports. For this purpose an operation plan, involving all national qualified Administrations, has been settled, to draw up an operative manual for Customs personnel and CFS operative teams dealing with specific control procedures to be followed for CITES specimens, identification of possible illegal CITES actions in order to file the customs software network and to develop an effective co-operation among Customs personnel and CFS staff.

The application on national territory

At national level Law 150/92 makes provisions for the obligation of declaring specimens bred in captivity listed in Annex A and B of Reg. (EC) 338/97.

In application of both Reg. (EC) 338/97 and Reg. (EC) 939/97, the Management Authority has checked and issued certificates for the following animal species listed in Annex A in application of art. 8 of Reg. (EC) 338/97. For the specimens bred in captivity , in application of Reg. 338/97 and national law n. 150/92, the Scientific Authority has started a control procedure with the application of DNA analysis in cooperation of the CITES Service of CFS.

Regarding possession and sale of manufactured specimens, worked and acquired before the 1 of June 1947, since the application of art. 8.3 d) exemption of Reg(EC)338/97 was partially in contrast with national legislation, the competent legislative office was consulted to clarify this problem. It was stated the complete application of the above mentioned article provisions, so the information was provided to the interested Commercial Associations. To classify the specimens as "worked and acquired before the 1 of June 1947 (art. 2, lett.W Reg(EC)338/97) of the CITES Service of C.F.S. collaborate with Museum Istitution and the National Monuments and Fine Arts Office.

Results from control activity

Law 150/92 determines specific penalties to prosecute illegal trade of flora and fauna species, remitting any action of control to the National CFS.

During 1998 have been confiscated 21.016 specimens, of which 89% Mammals, 10% Reptiles and 1% amongst Birds, Invertebrates and Plants, as listed below:

The national legislation provides to send back alive specimens to the exporting country or to grant them public or private suitable and reliably facilities.

At this purpose it is under approval the construction of a Rescue Centre, at a structure of CFS, to take care of specimens confiscated in accordance with Reg. (EC)338/97.

For dead specimens, their parts or derivatives, the CFS – CITES Service –keep them for scientific purpose, entrusting them to the Universities, Museums, Environment and Nature Organisation or for use of the Ministry of Environment – Conservation and Nature Department and CFS – CITES Service, to train personnel employed to the inspections.

4. ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES

Qualified Authorities

Up to June 1st 1997, when Reg. (CE)338/97 and Reg. (CE) 939/97 became operative, administrative and scientific authorities in accordance with Article IX of the Convention were:

- Ministry of Environment - Conservation and Nature Department is charged by Law 150/92 art.8 to manage the Convention of Washington by means of the CFS personnel and facilities;
- National Forest Corp(CFS) –CITES Service- for certifications and other controls in accordance with D.M.31.12.1983 and the L.R. N.150/92;
- Ministry for Foreign Trade - Import-Export Department , for the import-export permits issue in accordance with D.M. 31.12.1983;
- Scientific Commission for the application of CITES, in accordance with the article 4 of the L.R. N°150/92, and sited at the Ministry of Environment who constituted the Scientific Authority in accordance with art.1, subsection 1, letter f of the Convention.

With the abrogation of Reg. (CEE) 3626/83 by the Reg. (CE) 338/97, the provisions of D.M. 31.12.83 were no more enforceable. Waiting for a new administrative measure establishing the designation of Authorities for the issue of import-export permits, certificates of re-exporting and

certificates according to art.10 of Reg. (CE) 338/97, Ministry of Foreign Trade and CFS – CITES Service, kept on managing the matter.

Organisation and structure of CFS. CITES Service

Present CFS organisation, responsible for the issue of permits and inspections in accordance with the EC regulation, is composed of the following offices:

- N° 23 Offices (CITES Permits Service of CFS) distributed all over the Country. The duties of that personnel are the issuing of CITES certifications and inspections over the territorial jurisdiction. In the Italian Regions with political autonomy in certain matters, these duties are carried out by personnel of the Regional or Provincial Administrations delegated by Ministry of Agriculture;
- N° 15 Custom Operative Teams (CFS CITES Operative Teams) whose personnel check and verify import-export and re-export of vegetables and animals specimens and their derivatives; these teams are located at the pertinent Customs offices;
- N°1 Custody Office for non alive specimens and their derivates confiscated by the Authorities. This office is located at the Multifunctional Centre of Civil Defence in Castelnuovo di Porto (Rome);
- N°1 Central Office for the National Co-ordination located in Rome (Direzione Generale delle Risorse Forestali , Montane e Idriche) with national and international tasks for inspections and issuing permits and co-ordination for all the CITES Service activities.

Organisation of CITES Scientific Authority

The CITES Scientific Authority in Italy, established by the L. 150/92 for the enforcement of CITES, represents also the Scientific Authority by the article 13, par. 2 of Reg. (CE) 338/97. This Office, named CITES Scientific Commission, is located at the Ministry of Environment – Conservation and Nature Department and is led by a representative of the Ministry of Environment. The Commission is formed by 15 members nominated by decree of the Ministry of Environment, in accordance to the suggestions from Scientific and Environment Organisations. The Commission gives his opinion when required, in accordance with the EC regulations, on the issuing of import and (re)export permits submitted to the CITES Service of CFS and to the Ministry for Foreign Trade. While for the specimens of species included in Annex A, the opinion of the Scientific Commission is always required, for the specimens of species in Annex B, are considered valid the former opinion expressed for specific combination Species/Country of origin.

The Commission, in accordance with the articles 24 and 26 of Reg. (CE) 939/97 expresses opinions about the birth in captivity of animals and artificial reproduction of plants. Members of the Commission can join the personnel of CFS in controlling the breeding farm and, if necessary, draw blood samples for the genetic analysis to verify parental relationships.

The members of Scientific Commission participates to the Scientific Consulting Group in accordance with Reg. (CE) 338/97.

5. INFORMATION TO THE PUBLIC

In June 1997, an information campaign started in Italy co-ordinated by TRAFFIC with two information points located at the most important Italian airports: Milan-Malpensa and Rome-Fiumicino. These information points include exhibit panels with important information about CITES and some relevant endangered species of wild fauna and flora. The campaign was presented by a conference with the Minister of Environment and the President of WWF Italy TRAFFIC Office. Similar information initiatives were carried out in some of the most important structures of the Italian scientific disclosure such as Genoa Aquarium, Rome Zoological Garden, Natural History Museum of Piombino, Zoology Museum of Rome, Natural Science Museum of Bergamo.

With regard to the information to commercial operators, it has been organized a Seminary about the new regolamentation, with the contribution of the Italian Leathers Associations, Furriers, Shoe Manufacturers, Tanners, Leather Wholesalers, and with the partecipation of C.F.S. CITES Service of Rome. Furthermore, information was guaranteed to commercial operators with diffusion of specific circular note about the provisions of new Comunitary Regolamentation. In particular, besides the above mentioned Associations, Italian Federation of Textiles Workers, Association of Industry of Woollen Manufacturer, National Federation Wood Dealers, Assocoral (producers of coral and cameos) Assoerbe (association of producers medical products and herbals), Italian Association of Fishes and Aquariums, General Federation of Italian Landowners, Unaflor and Coldiretti (producers plants, etc.), collector Association that follow animal breeding or Cactacee and succulent cultivation were informed as well.

Besides, the CITES Service of C.F.S. provided information by means of shows, with distribution of informative material and projection of films concerning CITES and the EC Regulations, inside national exhibition of naturalistic rilevation. Also it was realized an itinerant show by means of C.F.S. tir, inside of which a space to EC Regolamentations, with exposition of confiscated animals and plants was reserved.

6. OPERATIVE MEASURES

Use of the forms required by Reg. (EC) 939/97

Since September 1997 the new forms have been coming into use according to Reg. EC 939/97 and the informatic procedure for the issue of permits and certificates has been modified and integrated in order to agree with the new EC Regulation.

In Italy the issue of permits and certificates requests a payment of IL.20.000 per each. It is also possible to add an enclosed per each permit or certificate in case of dispatch of different species of animals or plants at maximum of three species per enclosed.

The Ministry of Environment – Conservation and Nature Dept. – carries out for printing of forms while the CFS – CITES Service and the Ministry for Foreign Commerce carry out for distribution among the commercial operators and users.

Issue of permits and certificates for imports and (re)exports

The issue of permits and certificates is carried out by CFS and the Ministry of Foreign Commerce. CFS issues the following permits:

- Import permits for specimens of species listed in Annex A of the Reg.338/97;
- Import permits for non commercial trade in specimens of species listed in Annex B of the Reg.338/97 with no commercial aims;
- Import permits for commercial and non commercial purposes in potted plants listed in Annex B of the Reg.338/97 no commercial purposes;
- Export permits for non commercial purposes of species listed in Annex A,B,C of Reg.338/97.
- Re-Export permit for specimens of species listed in Annex A, B, C of Reg.338/97.

Moreover the CITES Operative Teams of CFS, receive, in accordance with art. 14 Reg. 939/97, import notification of specimen of species listed in Annex C, D Reg. 338/97.

During 1998 the CITES Service of CFS issued more than 16,000 certificates while in the first six months of 1999 it issued about 12,000.

Ministry of Exterior Trade issued the following certificates:

- Import permits for commercial use of specimens of animal specie born under captivity and for potted plants listed in Annex A of Reg. 338/97
- Import permits for commercial use of specimen of species listed in Annex B of Reg.338/97, excluded object with personal or domestic use (for live specimens is necessary a previous approval of the CFS)
- Export permits for commercial purposes of specimens of species listed in Annex A, B, C of Reg. (CE)338/97 (needs a previous OK of the CFS).

The only exception is represented by the necessary sanitary certificates for the exportation of potted plants of species listed in Annex B and C of Reg. (CE) 338/97. The National Phytosanitary Service issues these certificates.

Issue of Certificates issue to enforce art. 10 Reg. (EC) 338/97

CFS issues certificates in accordance with Art. 5, Art.8 and Art.9 of Reg. (CE) 338/97 with previous consultation (if required) of the Italian CITES Scientific Authority.

Use of genetic analysis to verify parental relationships

Since the Reg. (CE) 338/97 and 939/97 have entered into force, genetic analysis has been often used for determining the parental relationships (especially for Falconiforms, Psittaciforms and Primates). In 1997 the Ministry of Environment stipulated a convention with INFS (National Institute for Wild Fauna) for the use of specific methodologies for genetic analysis applicable to different species listed in Annex A ,B of Reg. (CE) 338/97. Moreover has been created a Computer Data Bank of the analysed samples. The Scientific Authority has implemented a report with all data concerning animals bred in captivity and their parental relationships and information about breeders.

Marking of crocodilian (Order Crocodylia) skins

From 1st January 1999, Italy applied art. 35 and 36 of Reg. (CE)338/97 concerning the marking of Crocodile skins destined to re-exportation. CFS-CITES Service uses tags in accordance with Ris. Conf. 9.22 on which is written CITES-CFS-ITALIA followed by a progressive number of 7 cifre. The same number is also reported in the certificate accompanying the specimen.

Marking of animal specimens listed in Annex A

To comply with the Art. 34 of Reg.(CE) 939/97 the Scientific Authority supported by CFS specialised personnel, carrying out controls and – where lacking in – to mark with microchips or irremovable rings all animals listed in Annex A, bred in captivity, before the issue of the CITES certification.

Registry of Scientific Institutes

During 1998-1999 Italy provided to the definitely adjustment of the dispositions of art. VII, par.6 of CITES and Art.7, par.4 of Reg.(CE)338/97.

19 public museums, have been registered for exchanges, loans or donation of CITES in the Scientific Institutes Registry at the Ministry of Environment – Department of Conservation of Nature.

The references of these Istitutes were trasmitted to General CITES Segretariat and to the European Commission. At the same time, auto-adesive labels were produced, according to the indications of All. IV of Reg. (EC)939/97, they was numerated and trasmitted to the Scientific Istitution that were identified as qualified to use exemption of Art. 7.4 of Reg. (EC)338/97. These reports have been sent in electronic form, according to WCMC indication.

Annual reports in application of art 15, par 4, lett a, Reg. 338/97

Annual reports with all the information about permits and certificates issued each year by the Italian Government to allow importation and re-exportations of CITES animal and plant specimens has been sent to the World Conservation Monitoring Centre of Cambridge (UK).

Monitoring of mortality

Customs Personnel of CITES Operative Teams of CFS in collaboration with border veterinary offices monitor the mortality of specimens of species listed in Annex A e B during international transports. The mortality reports are sent every six months to the Ministry of Environment-Department of Conservation of Nature and from there to CITES Secretariat.

Software procedure for permits and licences issue

The issue of permits and certificates is managed by a national computer system updated and integrated with an automatic filling procedure for import notification, at the 23 CITES Certification Service Offices of CFS and at the 15 CFS Operative Teams located at the Custom's Offices qualified for CITES controls.

Training Courses and Updating

On May 1997 the CFS – CITES Service has built up a training course for all personnel of CITES Services and CFS CITES Operatives Teams. During the 1998 and 1999 further updating meetings took place in order to clarify and examine any new specific matter.

Creation/Acquisition of materials to work for CITES Regulation

During 1998 the CFS – CITES Service has been implemented a CD – ROM managing the EC Regulation, the CITES instructions and provisions to allow the personnel involved to work easily. It has been also distributed materials and guides drawn up by Traffic Europe as requested from European Commission.

7. INITIATIVES AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO INCREASE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF CONVENTION OF WASHINGTON – CITES ABROAD

Participation to European and international meeting

Between 1997 and 1999 Italy actively participated, giving scientific and technical support, to the following European and International meeting concerning CITES and Community Regulation:

- June 1997: X Conference of the Parties, Zimbabwe. Italy, United Kingdom and Russia have been chosen to represent Europe in the CITES permanent Committee.
- November 1997: VIII Plant Committee (Chile); IX Meeting of the INTERPOL group concerning crimes versus Wild Fauna and Flora, Lion (France); II Meeting of the WCO/CITES Working group, Brussels (Belgium).
- May 1998: XIV Meeting of the Fauna Committee, Caracas (Venezuela).
- June 1998: Meeting on Medicinal Plants, London (England).
- October 1998: Meeting of the European Regional group on Flora, Desna (Czechoslovakia).

Italian software for CITES activities

CFS – CITES Service has developed a software to issue permits and certificates and capable to manage all matters about flora and fauna trade enforceable all different European Countries.

At this purpose, Italy has offered the use of software to other Member States for free. As a result, many Countries (France, Belgium, Luxembourg, Austria, Spain, Sweden) expressed interest for, but after some meetings amongst interested States to define and analyse how to fit the software in each specific Country, the technical difficulties gone out and the consequent expensive cost to allow the procedure run, discouraged many of them. Only France and Belgium have been continued to be interested in the procedure, even if the final cost is really to expensive.

8. SCIENTIFIC ACTIVITY: CITES PROJECTS IMPLEMENTED AND FINANCED BY ITALY

Research of Aloe vera wild growth

Italian Ministry of Environment, in collaboration with United Kingdom and Morocco, thinks it opportune to elaborate a research project about the possible existence of wild population of *Aloe vera*, because Italy is one of the more important consumer of by-products of specimens of this species, principally used by the cosmetic industry. Such a project was totally financed by the Italian Ministry of Environment, and has the following goals:

- To estimate both the actual geographical distribution and wild population sizes;
- To develop an updated report about the extinction threats of *Aloe vera* in the likely countries of origin;
- To study the population genetic of its populations, both for the wild populations and for potted ones, using DNA analysis.

Study on Genetic structure of some species of orchids

The study has been implemented by University of Aquila covering the specie *Cypripedium calceolus*. It took place over four Italian sites plus one in Moravia (Czech Rep) and it has been shown a worrying genetic erosion that point up the need to investigate deeply the specie all over in Europe.

- L'Organisation mondiale des douanes ayant renforcée ses activités dans le domaine du

contrôle du Commerce CITES, l'année 1998 a connu une collaboration renforcée de l'Administration des Douanes, dont un agent représente dorénavant le Luxembourg au « comité d'application de la législation /EU enforcement group ».

- Un cours de formation CITES destiné aux administrations concernées eut lieu du 9 au 13 novembre 1998, à l'Administration des Douanes Luxembourgeoises, avec une trentaine de participants. Ce cours connut beaucoup de succès. Il fut tenu par la section 'Finances/Cites' de l'école Administrative de l'Allemagne (au prix de revient) et organisé en collaboration avec l'Institut de Formation Administrative et l'Administration des Douanes. Le cours visait à familiariser tous les agents concernés avec la nouvelle réglementation de 1997/98 et avec son application. Afin de garantir une formation continue, il est nécessaire de répéter régulièrement ces cours (base annuelle). Ce cours sera répété en 1999 (11.- 15. Octobre) et pour l'an 2000, aussi un cours d'identification additionnel est prévu. Le programme pédagogique 'ARCHE' développé par l'institut allemand fut mis à la disposition des intéressés.

Legislative Measures

As with Regulations (EEC) No 3628/82 and 3418/83 the Regulations are implemented in so far as the protection of species considered exotic in the Netherlands is concerned under the Endangered Exotic Animal and Plant Species Act. This Act has in its current form been in force since 1995. The regulations relating to the application of this Act include:

Regeling aanwijzing beschermde uitheemse dier- en plantensoorten 1997

(Regulation on the designation of protected exotic animal and plant species)

Regeling vrijstelling beschermde uitheemse dier- en plantensoorten 1997

(Regulation on the exemption of protected exotic animal and plant species)

Regeling administratie van handel in uitheemse dier- en plantensoorten

(Regulation on the administration of trade in exotic animal and plant species)

Regeling aanwijzing douanekantoren Wet budep (Regulation on the designation of customs offices for the Endangered Exotic Animal and Plant Species Act), and

Besluit beschermde uitheemse diersoorten 1994 (Decree on protected exotic animal species).

Species other than the bird species listed in the Annex to Regulation (EC) No 338/97 that are considered exotic in the Netherlands are protected under the Nature Conservation Act. The regulations relating to the application of this Act include:

Besluit beschermde inheemse dier- en plantensoorten (Decree on protected native plant and animal species).

Vrijstellingsregeling gekweekte beschermde plantensoorten (Exemption scheme for cultivated protected plant species)

In so far as the bird species listed in the Annex belong to European bird species they are protected in the Netherlands under the 1936 Birds Act.

Enforcement/regulatory matters

Responsible for the enforcement of CITES in the Netherlands are the Customs, the General Inspection Service (of the Ministry of Agriculture, Nature Management and Fisheries) and the Police (including the Central Bureau of Criminal Investigations).

A CITES project group, comprised with representatives of these organisations and the Public Persecutor Office, co-ordinates enforcement and training.

Details on seizures by in 1997 and 1998 of CITES specimens are submitted separately. The data have been compiled by the Dutch Customs Service, the General Inspection Service and the Central Bureau of Criminal Investigations of the Police/Interpol.

The majority of confiscations (especially by Customs) concern personal goods, many souvenirs.

Procedures for disposal of confiscated animals

The LASER-NW Service of the Ministry of Agriculture, Nature Management and Fisheries is responsible for holding of confiscated specimens. Live animals and plants are mostly cared for by zoos, rescue centres, birdparks, aquariums and botanical gardens.

Administrative measures

Designated Authorities:

The CITES Management Authorities are:

- Ministry of Agriculture, Nature Management and Fisheries, LASER-ZW, Dordrecht (permit section).
- Ministry of Agriculture, Nature Management and Fisheries, Department of Nature Management, The Hague (policy section)
- Ministry of Agriculture, Nature Management and Fisheries, Plant Protection Service (for phytosanitary certificates).

The CITES Scientific Authority is designated under article 9a of the Endangered Species Act as the "Commissie bedreigde dier- en plantensoorten". It consists of 9 experts (with relation to several botanic and zoological gardens, research institutes and rescue centre). Its Secretariat is based in Leiden.

In 1998 preparations were made for introduction of a cost-covering fee-system. This system has started in January 1999 and has resulted in a small decline in the number of permits since then.

Other actions taken to enhance effectiveness of national implementation

Training

- Regular enforcement trainings are being organised by the General Inspection Service (with help of many experts involved) for Customs and Police officers.

Oversees training

- In December 1997 a combined training seminar (legislation, administrative measures, enforcement) was organised on Aruba with participants from the Netherlands, Netherlands Antilles, Aruba and the CITES secretariat. The training gave a new impulse to CITES implementation after Aruba joined CITES in 1995 and the Netherlands Antilles adopted legislation in beginning of 1998.

BIENNIAL REPORT

ON THE LEGISLATIVE, REGULATORY AND ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES TAKEN TO ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THE WASHINGTON CONVENTION (CITES)

1997 - 1999

- PORTUGAL -

In accordance with Article VIII, paragraph 7(b) of the Washington Convention, each Management Authority must present a report, every two years, on the legislative, regulatory and administrative measures taken to enforce the provisions of CITES (Decree-Law No 50/80 of 23 July 1980).

To comply with the aforementioned Decree-Law, this report therefore gives details of the following:

Legislative measures - legal provisions currently in force in Portugal;

Regulatory measures - authorities competent to carry out the different CITES functions;

Administrative measures - steps taken by the National Management Authority to enforce the provisions of the Washington Convention.

1. LEGISLATIVE MEASURES

a) National legislation

The following Decree-Laws and Ordinances are currently in force in Portugal:

- Decree No 50/80 of 23 July 1980 approving, for ratification, the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora, signed in Washington in March 1973.
- Decree-Law No 114/90 of 5 April 1990 transposing Regulation No 3626/82 to national legislation. This Decree-Law stipulates, in particular, competent authorities, offences and ports of entry of specimens included in the Appendices to the Convention (see p. 7).
- Ordinance No 359/92 of 10 November 1992 prohibiting individuals from keeping species included in Appendix II to CITES: *Primates, Canidae, Ursidae, Felidae, Crocodylia, Boidae, Elapidae* and *Viperidae*.
- Ordinance No 117/98 of 2 March 1998 updating CITES documents and the list of permits, certificates and notifications.

b) Community legislation

The following Regulations are in force at European Union level and directly applicable in Portugal:

- Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 of 9 December 1997 on the protection of species of wild fauna and flora by regulating trade therein;
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 939/97 of 26 May 1997 laying down detailed rules concerning the implementation of Regulation (EC) No 338/97;
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 2307/97 of 18 November 1997 laying down the protected species included in each CITES and European Union Appendix;
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 767/98 of 7 April 1998 amending Regulation (EC) 939/97;

- Commission Regulation (EC) No 1006/98 of 14 May 1998 amending Regulation (EC) 939/97;
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 2214/98 of 15 October 1998 amending Regulation (EC) 338/97;
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 2473/98 of 16 November 1998 suspending the introduction into the Community of specimens of certain species of wild fauna and flora;
- Commission Regulation (EC) No 250/1999 of 2 February 1999 amending Regulation 2473/98.

2. REGULATORY MEASURES

The authorities involved in enforcing CITES in Portugal are:

1. INSTITUTE FOR THE CONSERVATION OF NATURE - National Scientific Authority;

This authority is responsible, within the national territory, for issuing reports relating to:

- Imports, exports and re-exports of species protected by CITES;
- Facilities for accommodating specimens included in Appendix A to the Convention;
- Donations of confiscated specimens.

The Scientific Authority is also responsible for certifying that a given specimen was born and bred in captivity, or artificially propagated, for proposing amendments to Appendices B, C and D and for participating in the European Union Scientific Review Group.

2. INSTITUTE FOR THE CONSERVATION OF NATURE - National Management Authority:

- Lisbon office,
- Oporto office.

3. MADEIRA WILDLIFE PARK - Regional Management Authority for the Madeira Archipelago;

4. REGIONAL DIRECTORATE FOR THE ENVIRONMENT IN THE AZORES - Regional Management Authority for the Azores Archipelago;

These Management Authorities are responsible, within the national territory, for:

- Granting CITES permits;
- Supervising airports, seaports, importers, shops, zoos, etc.;
- Drawing up experts' reports;
- Inspecting facilities intended to accommodate live animals;
- Establishing partnerships and working in co-operation with other supervisory authorities, in particular, the Directorate-General for Customs, the Directorate-General for Forests, the Directorate-General for Economic Inspection, the

Directorate-General for Veterinary Medicine, the police and the Republican National Guard.

As well as these authorities, the INSTITUTE FOR THE CONSERVATION OF NATURE has a Legal Service which, insofar as CITES is concerned, is responsible, in particular, for investigating offences, imposing penalties and replacing and/or preparing legislation.

3. ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES

Informing importers of new regulations - the main importers on the national register were sent details of the new CITES licensing rules, as stipulated by Community Regulations (EC) 338/97 and 939/97.

"Management of CITES Licensing" course, which took place in the Serras de Aire e Candeeiros Wildlife Park from 24 to 28 November 1997 and was aimed at countries from Portuguese-speaking Africa (PALOPs). Representatives from Angola, Mozambique, Guinea-Bissau, Cape Verde and São Tomé and Príncipe attended.

They were introduced to the Institute for the Conservation of Nature database and taught how to issue, display and amend import and export permits and re-export certificates, how to update databases and how to formulate queries for preparing reports.

The participants were given copies of this CITES database and each delegate was also presented with a suitable printer for issuing CITES licences.

Issuing new forms for import permits, certificates and notifications, in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 939/97.

Updating the CITES database, developed by the Institute for the Conservation of Nature (Application of Conventions and Information Technology Divisions): licensing import notifications and listing import notifications by computer; restructuring licensing procedures in accordance with the new permit and certificate forms, as stipulated by Regulation (EC) 939/97. Updating the lists of species in the CITES and EU Appendices; in particular, including species in Appendix D.

Revision of Decree-Law No 114/90 of 5 April 1990 - The National Management Authority, in cooperation with the Legal Service, revised the Decree-Law that currently regulates the enforcement of the Washington Convention in Portugal. This document was submitted for ministerial approval.

This revision will include amendments required following the approval of Regulation (EC) No 338/97, amendments to penalties and amendments to ports of entry. Attention must also be drawn to the following amendments:

- Enlargement of the supervisory body - the newly-created Directorate-General for the Environment was appointed Management Authority for supervision. It has about 50 supervisors, at national level, in the field of the environment;
- Possibility of making it a crime illegally to import or keep specimens of species included in Appendix A to the Regulation.

CITES exhibition at Lisbon and Oporto airports - CITES exhibitions were set up at these two airports. The exhibition at Oporto airport is permanent and contacts are now being made with the aim of setting up a permanent exhibition at Lisbon airport also, where a temporary

exhibition was held from 22 December 1997 until 30 September 1998 only (therefore including the whole period during which EXPO 98 was open to the public in Lisbon).

"Technical Meeting on Publicly Exhibiting Live Wild Animals", Vila Nova de Gaia Municipal Biological Park, 22 and 23 October 1998. This meeting was organised by the National Management Authority, in cooperation with the Directorate-General for Veterinary Medicine (Animal Welfare Division) and with the Directorate-General for Forests (responsible for species of game) with the aim of clarifying the situation of zoos, aquariums and other such institutions in Portugal, as well as that of national and international associations for breeders of wild birds.

Donation of confiscated specimens - in accordance with Article 16 (3) (a) of Regulation (EC) 338/97, any confiscated specimen shall be entrusted to a Management Authority which, following consultation with the relevant Scientific Authority, shall place or otherwise dispose of the specimen in conditions which it deems to be appropriate and consistent with the provisions of the Convention. The Management Authority has therefore been donating CITES specimens, in particular:

Live animals to relevant collections and, in certain cases, to international programmes for breeding in captivity - Jardim Zoológico de Lisboa e de Aclimatação em Portugal, S.A., Maia Zoological Garden and Vila Nova de Gaia Municipal Biological Park;

Embalmed specimens for exhibition - Coimbra Zoological Museum;

Tortoise shells and raw ivory tusks to renew items in the National Museum of Ancient Art / José de Figueiredo Institute.

INFORME BIENAL CITES DE ESPAÑA PARA EL PERIODO 1997 - 1998

El presente Informe consta de tres apartados.

En el primero de ellos, sobre medidas legislativas, se han incluido las disposiciones legales con rango de Ley Orgánica, aprobadas por las Cortes españolas, o equivalentes, como los Reglamentos Comunitarios, aprobados por el Consejo de la Unión Europea, que se incorporan al derecho interno español con rango de Ley Orgánica.

En el segundo apartado, sobre medidas reglamentarias, se han descrito las normas reglamentarias que constituyen actos del Gobierno, como los Reales Decretos, Ordenes Ministeriales y Resoluciones.

En el tercer apartado, sobre medidas administrativas, se contemplan las medidas e iniciativas de distinto carácter adoptadas y llevadas a cabo por las Autoridades CITES españolas para la mejor aplicación y difusión del Convenio.

1.- MEDIDAS LEGISLATIVAS:

En el ámbito legislativo se han adoptado dos disposiciones de excepcional importancia:

- **Reglamento CE 338/97 del Consejo, de 9 de diciembre de 1996, relativo a la protección de especies de la fauna y flora silvestres mediante el control de su comercio. (Modificado por el Reglamento CE 2307/97 de la Comisión, de 18 de noviembre de 1977).**
- **Reglamento CE 939/97 de la Comisión, de 26 de mayo de 1997, por el que se establecen disposiciones de aplicación del Reglamento CE 338/97.**

Ambos reglamentos, que se incorporan al Derecho interno español de forma automática y son de directa aplicación, resultan una herramienta muy eficaz y completa para la aplicación del Convenio CITES de forma armonizada y homogénea en el ámbito del Mercado Único Europeo, y consigue objetivos de protección de las especies, a través de su regulación comercial, más exigentes que el propio Convenio, aumentando el número de especies objeto de protección así como su protección efectiva.

2.- MEDIDAS REGLAMENTARIAS:

- **Real Decreto 1739/1997, de 20 de noviembre, sobre medidas de aplicación del Convenio CITES y del Reglamento (CE) 338/97 relativo a la protección de especies de la fauna y flora silvestres mediante el control de su comercio:** Ha sido dictado para adaptar el marco reglamentario español a la nueva legislación comunitaria, citada en el apartado anterior. Deroga de forma expresa el R.D. 1270/85, hasta entonces vigente. En dicho Real Decreto se designan las autoridades administrativas y científicas responsables de la aplicación del Convenio.

Las Autoridades Administrativas son dos: la Secretaría General de Comercio Exterior, que actuará como Autoridad administrativa principal, y el Departamento de Aduanas e Impuestos Especiales, que actuará como Autoridad administrativa adicional. Ambas Autoridades pertenecen al Ministerio de Economía y Hacienda.

Por su parte, la Dirección General de Conservación de la Naturaleza, del Ministerio de Medio Ambiente, actuará como Autoridad científica.

- **Resolución de 5 de mayo de 1998, de la Dirección General de Comercio Exterior, por la que se designan los Centros y Unidades de Asistencia Técnica e Inspección del Comercio Exterior (SOIVRE), habilitados para la emisión de los permisos y certificados contemplados en el Reglamento (CE) 338/97 y se establece el modelo de “documento de inspección de especies protegidas”.** Esta Resolución se dicta en desarrollo del Real Decreto 1739/1997.
- **Real Decreto 1649/98, de 24 de julio, que desarrolla el Título II de la Ley 12/995, relativo a las infracciones administrativas de contrabando.** Este real Decreto desarrolla el Título II de la Ley Orgánica 12/95 que regula las infracciones administrativas de contrabando, en particular, la determinación de las sanciones, la aplicación de los criterios de graduación y establece un procedimiento general para la imposición de las correspondientes sanciones. Por ello, este Real Decreto constituye la herramienta que desarrolla lo previsto en el Reglamento Europeo, especialmente en cuanto a sanciones y confiscación.

3.- MEDIDAS ADMINISTRATIVAS:

- **Difusión de la nueva reglamentación entre los operadores comerciales y organismos de control.** Se ha editado un cuaderno que recopila los Reglamentos comunitarios con los anexos actualizados, así como las demás disposiciones reglamentarias que afectan al comercio de especímenes, con el fin de difundir y facilitar el cumplimiento de las nuevas disposiciones. Este cuaderno se ha distribuido ampliamente entre los importadores y exportadores de especies de fauna y flora y autoridades administrativas y policiales. Así mismo, se ha colaborado con la Comisión Europea en la traducción de la “Guía de Referencia; Normativa de la Comunidad Europea sobre comercio de fauna y flora silvestres” y se ha distribuido la misma ampliamente entre los sectores comerciales afectados, Organizaciones No Gubernamentales y Departamentos de la Administración.
- **Gestión del Control administrativo de la cría en cautividad de especies protegidas por el Convenio CITES y la normativa comunitaria.** Durante el año 1998 se ha puesto en marcha un sistema informático armonizado entre los doce Centros de Inspección de Comercio Exterior y la Subdirección General, que conforman la Autoridad administrativa, para registrar regularmente los criadores, las crías obtenidas, las marcas utilizadas, la documentación del plantel reproductor parental y cuantos datos son de interés para conjugar un control eficaz con una tramitación rápida que permite agilizar la obtención de la documentación CITES necesaria para el comercio con países terceros. Este sistema es igualmente aplicable a los viveros registrados.
- **Emisión de nuevos formularios de Permisos y Certificados CITES.** De acuerdo con los nuevos Reglamentos comunitarios adoptados, España ha emitido los nuevos modelos

de documentos y lo ha comunicado a la Secretaría CITES, para su transmisión a las Partes mediante Notificación, así como a todos los organismos de control y policiales españoles encargados de la vigilancia de la aplicación del Convenio CITES.

- **Elaboración de un archivo de imágenes CITES.** Durante 1998 se ha procedido a la adquisición de equipos fotográficos digitales en los Centros de Inspección de Comercio Exterior habilitados para el tráfico CITES, con el propósito de elaborar un archivo de imágenes de especímenes de especies protegidas por el Convenio y por la legislación comunitaria. El archivo se está llevando a cabo en forma digitalizada, lo que permite compartir las imágenes obtenidas a través de un sistema informático sencillo y aumentar progresivamente las imágenes que se van obteniendo y clasificando a través de las inspecciones rutinarias que se llevan a cabo antes del despacho aduanero.
- **Colaboración con la Secretaría CITES y otros organismos en la elaboración de Fichas de identificación de especies.**

Durante 1997, la Autoridad científica española ha desarrollado un importante trabajo básico para la elaboración de las “Fichas de identificación de especies maderables incluidas en CITES” que fue remitido a la Secretaría CITES. El trabajo fue coordinado por la Dra. Margarita Clemente Muñoz y en el colaboraron el Dr. Miguel A. Vales (Instituto de Biodiversidad, Cuba), Dr. Luis García Esteban Prof. Dr. Antonio Guindeo Casasús, Tec. Lidia García Esteban (Escuela Técnica Superior de Ingenieros de Montes de Madrid) y prestaron muestras de madera y/o información: Prof. Dr. P. Baas, Rijksherbarium/Hortus Botanicus, Leiden; Dr. A.M.W. Mennega, Utrecht University, Faculty of Biology, Herbarium Division; M. Sc. Josefina Barajas Morales, Instituto de Biología, Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México; Dr. J. Ilic, CSIRO Forestry and Forest Products, South Clayton MDC, Victoria; Jodrell Laboratory, Kew Botanical Gardens; Autoridad Administrativa de Costa Rica y Dora Mora de Retana, Jardín Botánico de Lankester, Costa Rica. En el trabajo se reúne información sobre los siguientes aspectos para **22 especies maderables** incluidas en CITES: familia a la que pertenece la especie; apéndice; nombre científico; sinónimos científicos; nombres comerciales (aquellos más utilizados en el comercio internacional); nombres comunes; partes que están bajo control CITES; características de comercialización; distribución geográfica; características macroscópicas de la madera; especies similares; utilización; características microscópicas de las maderas; características de los árboles; tabla comparativa de diferencia con las especies similares. Se enviaron así mismo diapositivas de las maderas a nivel macroscópico y a nivel microscópico (secciones longitudinal, transversal y tangencial). Además se prepararon dos anexos, el Anexo I incluye una relación de especialistas en anatomía de maderas y que podrían facilitar el trabajo de identificación a las autoridades CITES en caso de conflicto. El Anexo II recoge las principales especies maderables tropicales sujetas a comercio, para cada una de las cuales se incluye su nombre comercial, nombre científico y zona de origen.

Además, se ha recogido una completa colección de muestras de las especies maderables incluidas en CITES gracias a la colaboración de las Partes que son área de distribución de las mismas con las que se preparara en un futuro una colección de preparaciones microscópicas de referencia.

La Autoridad administrativa ha facilitado a la Secretaría CITES la colección de fotografías de **conchas y corales** que figuran en la publicación: “Guía de Identificación de Conchas y Corales” (V. Roncero, 1996), para su empleo en el Manual de Identificación.

Igualmente ha puesto a su disposición las fotografías y el texto de una Guía de Identificación de Mariposas, que incluye fotografías de mariposas de todas las especies incluidas en los apéndices del Convenio así como las más frecuentes en el comercio internacional, para su empleo en la elaboración del Manual de Identificación.

- **Primer Master en “Gestión, Conservación y Control de Especies Sometidas a Comercio Internacional”.** Se desarrolló en la Universidad Internacional de Andalucía (Baeza) del 13 de Abril al 4 de Julio de 1998. El objetivo del curso era proporcionar una formación universitaria en materia de control y conservación de especies comerciales de alto nivel, especialmente dirigida a postgraduados procedentes de Autoridades administrativas y científicas CITES así como ONG y otros sectores interesados. En él participaron veinticinco alumnos, procedentes de las Autoridades administrativas, científicas y organizaciones no gubernamentales de Brasil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Ecuador, España, Guinea Ecuatorial, México, Paraguay, Perú, República Dominicana, Uruguay y Venezuela.

El curso fue impartido por 57 profesores procedentes de 14 países. Junto a las Autoridades españolas Científicas (Ministerio de Medio Ambiente) y Administrativas (Ministerio de Economía y Hacienda) participaron como profesores entre otros: personas procedentes de las Autoridades científicas o administrativas de Argentina, Austria, Paraguay, Suiza y Venezuela; de la Secretaría CITES, la Comisión Europea, la Secretaría de Recursos Fitogenéticos de la FAO, UICN, TRAFFIC, WCMC y Adena-WWF.

Los alumnos recibieron 400 horas de clases teóricas y prácticas que abarcaron todos los temas administrativos y científicos necesarios para una buena implementación de CITES. Parte de las prácticas fueron realizadas en el Jardín Botánico de Córdoba, Zoo de Barcelona, Zoo de Jerez, Aduana de Algeciras, Parque de Hornachuelos y los Villares, Parque Natural de Cazorla y Facultad de Farmacia de Granada. También se realizó una visita al Parque Nacional de Doñana. Todos los alumnos superaron los exámenes correspondientes y se encuentran desarrollando en sus respectivos países las Memorias correspondientes para acceder al título definitivo. Los trabajos propuestos están todos ellos relacionados con temas CITES y su desarrollo será una aportación interesante para los países de donde proceden los alumnos y para el propio Convenio.

El desarrollo del Master fue posible gracias a la Universidad Internacional que lo organizó, al generoso patrocinio del Ministerio de Medio Ambiente español y la colaboración del Ministerio de Economía y Hacienda de España (Dirección General de Comercio Exterior), la contribución de las Partes a través del Comité Permanente CITES, la Secretaría CITES, Unione Nazionale Industria Conciaria de Italia, Jardín Botánico de Córdoba/Universidad de Córdoba, Zoo de Barcelona, Fundación C&M, International World Conservation Trust. También hay que señalar la aportación de diversos materiales y bibliografía por parte de la Secretaría CITES, la Comisión Europea, las Autoridades científicas de Alemania, Canadá, Reino Unido y PROFEPA de México.

- **Cursos de formación.**

En 1997 se organizaron dos cursos de una semana de duración cada uno de “Actualización de conocimientos para inspectores de los Centros de Inspección de Comercio Exterior” cubriendo aspectos de legislación y procedimiento sancionador, identificación de especies, métodos de control de cría en cautividad y de viveros registrados. A estos cursos asistieron todos los Inspectores de los 30 Centros de Inspección que hay en España.

Durante 1997 y 1998, se han impartido 4 cursos de formación para Especialistas del Servicio de Protección de la Naturaleza de la Guardia Civil, organismo responsable de la vigilancia de la aplicación del Convenio. También se organizaron charlas informativas para la policía municipal de Madrid.

Sweden

CITES Biennial report according to Regulation 338/97 Article 15.4 (c)

As a result of our membership to the European Union there was a dramatic shift of legislation for implementation of the CITES Convention from 1st of January 1995. From that date Sweden implemented EU regulations 3626/82 of 31 December 1982 and 3418/83 of 28 November 1983 on the implementation of CITES in the Union. On 1st of June 1997 these regulations were replaced by Council Regulation (EC) No 338/97 and Commission regulation (EC) No 939/97.

The national legislation for the implementation of CITES and EU regulations in Sweden was to start with the Act regarding measures concerning Animals and Plants that belong to Protected Species of 1994 and the Statuary Order regarding measures concerning Animals and Plants that belong to Protected Species of 1994 which both came into force on the date of Sweden's entry into the European Union. In January 1st 1999 the Act regarding measures was replaced by the Environmental Code and on 1st July 1998 the Statuary Order regarding measures was replaced by a Statuary Order regarding Protection of Species. There also is a Swedish Board of Agriculture's Directive regarding Measures concerning Animals and Plants that belong to Protected Species. Furthermore there is a Swedish National Environmental Protection Agency's Directive regarding Protection of Species from the 21 of April 1999.

Besides implementation of CITES the new Swedish legislation is implementing parts of the Council directive of 2 April 1979 on the conservation of wild birds 79/409/EEC and the council directive 92/43/EEC of 21 May 1992 on the conservation of national habitats and of wild fauna and flora. Other national legislation including legislation for enforcement of CITES are:

- Act regarding Transport, Storage and destruction of Import Regulated Goods (1973:980)
- Hunting Act (1987:259)
- Fishery Act (1993:787)
- Smuggling of Goods Penalty Act (1960:418)

Regulations concerning stricter national measures for reptiles and reexport in our former legislation have been abolished.

In the new legislation the National Environmental Protection Agency has been pointed out by the Government to be responsible for the central supervision of the CITES regulations and our County administration has the regional and local supervision. We hope that this will give a significative progress in the implementation of CITES regulations especially the control of commercial activities according to article 8.1 in the Council Regulation (EC) no 338/97. Details about seizures by police and customs can be found in our annual report. The police have expressed their concern about the costs that have arisen for seizures of live animals.

Since spring 1999 CITES questions are dealt with by the Animal Welfare Unit of the Board of Agriculture. The scientific authority- the Swedish Environmental Proteciton agency also have reorganized and CITES questions are dealt with by the Management of wildlife and protected areas unit.

There is a unique co-operation between NGO's and authorities in a contact group for CITES and flora- and fauna enforcement questions. The group that meets about four times a year consists of representatives from WWF and Birdguard Group from the Swedish Ornithological Society, representatives from the CITES management and scientific authorities (Swedish Board of Agriculture and Swedish Environmental Protection Agency) Swedish Museum of national History, Ministry of Environment, Board of Customs, Police and Office of the public prosecutor.

In November 1996 we arranged an European training seminar on implementation of CITES in Jönköping, Sweden. Circa 60 persons from authorities in Sweden as Customs, Plant Protection Service, Swedish Coast Guard, and regional police authorities including national criminal investigation department, office of the Public prosecutor, WWF, Identification experts, Swedish Association of Zoological parks, Environmental Information Centre, Swedish Museum of National History and Swedish Environmental Protection Agency. The seminar was held by the Management authority, Board of Agriculture. Participants from neighbouring countries as Norway, Denmark, Estonia and also more far away countries as United Kingdom, Malta and Germany took part in the training seminar. Staff from the CITES Secretariat and the Commission were engaged in teaching.

In May 1999 we had two two-days training seminars mainly for teaching our county administration but also representatives from enforcement bodies such as customs, police and prosecutors our new Swedish implementing CITES legislation. We had one seminar in Stockholm with over 100 participants and one seminar in Jönköping with more than 60 participants. At these seminars the Central Customs Authority informed us that they have a tip telephone - a CITES free phone - where anonymously reports on suspected CITES crimes can be made.

1998 UK BIENNIAL REPORT ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CONVENTION ON INTERNATIONAL TRADE IN ENDANGERED SPECIES OF WILD FAUNA AND FLORA (CITES)

This report has been produced in accordance with Article VIII, para 7(b) of the Convention and Article 15.4(c) of Council Regulation 338/97. It contains information on the legislative, regulatory and administrative measures taken by the UK to enforce the Convention. It covers the period from 1 January 1997 to 31 December 1998.

LEGISLATIVE MEASURES

CITES has been implemented in the UK since 31 October 1976. From 1 January 1984 until 31 May 1997 CITES was implemented throughout the European Union by EC Regulations 3626/82 and 3418/83 and a number of subsequent amending regulations.

New EC regulations, replacing 3626/82 and 3418/83 came into force on 1 June 1997. These strengthened and extended existing import and export controls. The new regulations are Council Regulation 338/97 and the implementing Commission regulation 939/97. A number of subsequent amending regulations have since been adopted, some of which have themselves been replaced. The regulations are listed below:-

Council Regulation 338/97 (Main Wildlife Trade Regulation)

amended by **938/97** (makes minor amendments and replaces Annex D)

amended by **2307/97** (replaces all the Annexes)

amended by **2214/98** (amends the entry for American mahogany)

Commission Regulation 939/97 (Implementing Regulation)

amended by **767/98** (makes various additions and amendments)

amended by **1006/98** (clarifies controls on personal effects)

Commission Regulation 2551/97 (Stricter Domestic Measures)

replaced by **2473/98** (replaces 2551/97)

amended by **250/99** (amends entries concerning certain tortoise species)

New national enforcement regulations also came into force on 1 June 1997. These are the Control of Trade in Endangered Species (Enforcement) Regulations 1997 (Statutory Instrument 1997 No 1372). These include stronger penalties for contravention of internal controls over the sale and movement of CITES species. They replace the Control of Trade in Endangered Species (Enforcement) Regulations 1985 (Statutory Instrument 1995 No 1155).

ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES


Administration

The CITES Management Authorities in the United Kingdom are the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland (DANI) for Northern Ireland and the Department of the Environment, Transport and the Regions for the rest of the UK. The Scientific Authorities are the Joint Nature Conservation Committee (JNCC) for fauna and the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew for flora. Contact details are listed in Annex B.

Licensing

Licensing work is carried out by DETR staff in Bristol and DANI staff in Belfast. A restructuring of licensing will result in the Belfast work moving to Bristol by the year 2000. Over 90% of all licenses are issued from the Bristol office. The number of import, export and re-export licenses issued is dropping - 16,500 in 1997 and 15,500 in 1998 - see table A below.


Table A - Number of licenses issued - 1993 to 1998



95% of the applications referred to the Scientific Authorities are returned within 3 days. Over 90% of all complete applications are processed within 3 weeks.

The movement of live Annex A specimens and commercial use including display of pre-Convention and captive-bred Annex A species requires certification from the Management Authority. Until June 1997 these were issued under article 6 of 3418/83, since then they have been issued under article 10 of 338/97. The numbers issued are shown on table B below. The growth is due to the registration of existing specimens under the new regulations.

Table B - Number of Sales Certificates issued - 1997 to 1998



A new computer system (UNICORN) was introduced in 1997 to coincide with the new European Regulation. UNICORN has a direct link with both scientific authorities and with the CITES enforcement team at Heathrow airport. This link enables the applications to be processed more quickly by the management and scientific authorities. UNICORN also enables the printing of permits and the charging for licences to be processed electronically.

UK Chairmanship of the CITES Standing Committee

At the Tenth Conference of Parties, Zimbabwe, June 1997, the UK was elected to serve as Chair of the CITES Standing Committee until the next Conference of Parties.

Fortieth Meeting of the CITES Standing Committee

The fortieth meeting of the CITES Standing Committee was hosted by the UK. The meeting was held in London from 3-6 February 1998 and marked the twenty-fifth anniversary of CITES.

Publicity

The UK has continued with the successful CITES "Check it Out" campaign to raise awareness of CITES controls. The campaign is aimed at holiday makers and business travellers. Check it Out material is distributed by banks, travel companies, bureaux des changes and airport retailers with foreign currency, travellers cheques, aeroplane tickets and other goods. Campaign posters are displayed at major UK airports. A significant amount of funding for the Check it Out campaign was provided by private sector sponsorship.

The UK also produced a Check it Out radio advert which was distributed to approximately 250 UK radio stations.

Funding for Research Projects and Conservation Work

During 1997 and 1998, the UK has provided financial assistance to a number of CITES-related research projects, conservation schemes and enforcement initiatives. CITES projects supported by the UK during the reporting period include the following:

- Support for IUCN elephant and rhino specialist groups
- Support for IUCN Sustainable Use Network
- Tiger conservation work through groups such as 21st Century Tiger and Global Tiger Forum
- Research on yellow and brown-headed tortoises in Malaysia
- Research collecting data on Andean cats
- Traditional Medicine study and seminar
- Support for Lusaka Agreement on co-operation on wildlife law enforcement in Africa
- Research by WWF Marine Medicinals Conservation Officer in Hong Kong on Seahorses
- Support for African elephant range state dialogue meeting in Arusha

In addition the UK has also provided financial support for delegates assistance, Customs secondment, technical support for the Tenth Conference of Parties and for the Fortieth Standing Committee meeting.

Training initiatives

October 1997 : 9th annual Police Wildlife Liaison Officers Conference held at Dyfed Powys Police HQ, Carmarthen. Attended by 150 delegates, mainly drawn from police and other enforcement agencies, NGOs and other Government Departments.

November 1997: Wildlife Inspectors Seminar held in Birmingham to train the Department's part-time consultant Wildlife Inspectors.

January 1998: 1st annual Open Partnership for Action Against Wildlife Crime (PAW) Seminar attended by approximately 70 representatives of conservation NGOs, sustainable users wildlife groups, Wildlife Inspectors and PAW members.

March 1998: EU Wildlife Law Enforcement Workshop held in London as part of the UK's presidency of the EU. Attended by representatives from enforcement agencies, enforcement practitioners throughout Europe, NGOs, Wildlife Inspectors and other Government Departments.

June 1998: UK Caribbean Overseas Territories CITES Training Seminar held in Grand Cayman aimed at improving implementation of CITES in UK Overseas Territories in the region. Attended by the CITES Secretariat, HM Customs and Excise and UK Management and Scientific Authorities.

October 1998: 10th annual Police Wildlife Liaison Officers Conference, held at Ministry of Defence Police HQ in Wethersfield, Essex. Attended by 230 delegates drawn from enforcement agencies (as above).

In addition DETR has carried out a number of training presentations for the police, RSPCA and HM Customs and Excise as well as contributing to the National Police Training Course developed by Warwickshire Constabulary.

REGULATORY MEASURES

Enforcement

HM Customs and Excise (HMCE) enforce import and export controls at UK ports under the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979. HMCE are assisted by DETR's Wildlife Inspectorate on some cases. Annex A contains information from HMCE on the origin (tables 1 and 2) and type (table 3) of specimens confiscated during 1997 and 1998 .

DETR and WWF UK contribute to the costs of a TRAFFIC Enforcement Assistance Officer. This project has provided extra support and assistance for DETR as well as for the Police, HM Customs and Excise, and for other NGOs involved in supporting wildlife law enforcement.

Important cases

1. Conspiracy to sell rhino horn

In February 1998 four people were convicted of conspiring to commit CITES offences by attempting to sell 240 kilos of raw rhino horn. The horns were seized from an antiques storage facility in London, and were valued at £2.8 million.

The owner of the horn was sentenced to 15 months imprisonment (to run concurrently with a sentence he was already serving), and the horn was forfeited. His accomplices received sentences of 9 months imprisonment, and 80 and 120 hours community service.

The principle defendant appealed against his sentence and the forfeiture of the horn. The Court of Appeal upheld the prison sentence, but ordered that the horn should be returned to its owner. Steps have been taken to minimise the risk of the horn subsequently finding its way onto the market, and to enable it to be identified if it does.

2. Sale of illegally imported rare birds of prey

In April 1997, one person was sentenced to eight months imprisonment for the illegal sale of Eleonora's falcons. These falcons are given greater protection by the EU Regulations which implement CITES, which prohibit the sale of the species unless permission has been obtained from the Management Authority.

It was found that the birds had been stolen as eggs, from cliffs in Majorca. Six birds were sold for £4,000 and were claimed to be bred in captivity; a further six birds were seized by the Police.

3. Sale of endangered animal products

Over 50 different species of endangered animals were seized in a raid on a taxidermy shop in London in March 1998. The Police warrants were executed following a tip-off from a member of the public.

The Metropolitan Police are continuing their investigations into this case.

4. Trade in endangered bird species

More than 100 endangered birds, including three Lears Macaws, were seized when HM Customs and Excise carried out a raid on premises in the north of England in June 1998.

Investigations into this case are continuing, but it is believed that there may be links with international dealers and collectors.

5. Shahtoosh shawls

138 Shahtoosh shawls were seized in a raid on premises in London in February 1997. Their estimated value is £353,000. This case arose out of the Metropolitan Police's ongoing operation to crack down on the sale of traditional medicines containing endangered species derivatives.

Investigations into this case are continuing.

In 1997 the total number of seizures was 532.





Table 2. 1998 Origin of Seizures by CITES Region
