opening and providing for the administration of autonomous community tariff quotas for certain agricultural and chemical products (1990)

(presented by the Commission)

EXPLANATORY MEMORENDUM

- 1. Subsequent to requests made by various Member States, the Services of the Commission have examined, in conjunction with the Government experts concerned, the question of opening, from 1 January 1990, of autonomous tariff quotas for certain agricultural and chemical products.
- 2. Following this examination, which took place during the "ECONOMIC TARIFF" Group meetingsheld on 8 September 1989, it has been determined that the opening of tariff quotas for the following products could have the agreement of the Member States without disturbing the markets for such products:

∫ and 20 October

- sour cherries, marinated in alcohol
- tellurium metal
- poly-alpha-olefin

For certain of these products, the quota volumes are provisional and setting them at the level indicated does not rule out their adjustments during the procedure.

This is the purpose of this proposal.

COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC) No

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THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 28 thereo.

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas production in the Community of certain agricultural and chemical

products is currently unable to meet the specific requirements of the user is currently industries in the Community; whereas, consequently, Community supplies of products of this type currently depend to a considerable extent on imports from third countries; whereas the most urgent Community requirements for the products in question should be met immediately on the most favourable terms; whereas lower duty Community tariff quotas should therefore be opened within the limits of appropriate volumes for a period covering the year 1990; whereas, in order not to upset the balance of the markets for these

products, the volume of certain of these Community tariff quotas should be set at provisional levels which cover immediate requirements;

whereas, the setting of the quota

volumes at this level does not rule out an adjustment during the year;

Whereas it is necessary, in particular, to ensure for all Community importers equal and uninterrupted access to the said quotas and to ensure the uninterrupted application of the rates laid down for the quotas to all

imports of the products concerned into all Member States until the quotas have been used up;

Whereas it is appropriate to take the necessary measures to ensure efficient Community administration of these tariff quotas while offering the Member States the opporturity to draw from the quota volumes the necessar quantities corresponding to actual imports; whereas this method of administration requires close cooperat on between the Member States and the Commis ion and the latter must in particular be able to monitor the rate at which the quotas are used up and inform the Member States accordingly;

Whereas since the Kingdom of Belgium, the Kingdom of the Netherlands and the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg are united within and jointly represented by the Benelux Economic Union, all transactions concerning the administ ation of the quantities draw by that economic union may be carried out by any one of its members,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

1. From 1 January to 31 December 1990, the customs duties applicable to imports into the Community of the products listed below shall be suspended at the levels and within the limits of the Community tariff quotas shown below:

2. Within the limits of these tariff quotas Spain and Portugal shall apply customs duties calculated in accordance with the relevant provisions of the 1985 Act of Accession.

Article 2

The tariff quotas referred to in Article 1 shall be managed by the Commission, which may take any appropriate administrative measures to ensure that they are managed efficiently.

Article 3

Where an importer presents a product covered by this Regulation for release for free circulation in a Member State, applying to take advantage of the preferential arrangements, and the entry is accepted by the customs authorities, the Member State concerned shall, by notifying the Commission, draw an amount corresponding to its requirements from the appropriate quota volume.

⁽¹⁾ Checks on their prescribed end-use shall be carried out pursuant to the relevant Community provisions.

Requests for drawings, indicating the date on which the entries were accepted, must be sent to the Commission without delay.

Drawings shall be granted by the Commission in chronological order of the dates on which the customs authorities of the Member States concerned accepted the entries for release for free circulation, to the extent that the available balance so permits.

If a Member State does not use a drawing in full it shall return any unused portion to the corresponding quota volume as soon as possible.

If the quantities requested are greater than the available balance of the quota volume, the balance shall be

allocated among applicants pro rata. The Commission shall inform the Member States of the drawings made.

Article 4

Each Member State shall ensure that importers of the products in question have equal and continuous access to the quotas for as long as the balance of the relevant quota volume so permits.

Article 5

The Member States and the Commission shall cooperate closely to ensure that this Regulation is complied with.

Article 6

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 January 1990.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
