OPINION OF THE COMMISSION on the amendments proposed by the European Parliament to the Council's common position on the

proposal for a COUNCIL DIRECTIVE

amending Directive 94/58/EC on the minimum level of training of seafarers

(presented by the Commission pursuant to Article 189 c (d) of the EC Treaty)

OPINION OF THE COMMISSION

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(presented by the Commission pursuant to Article 189 c (d) of the EC Treaty)

At its plenary session of 28-29 January 1998, the European parliament approved, subject to a number of amendments, the text of the common position adopted by the Council on 20 October 1997^1 with in view to adopting Council Directive 98/.../EC of... amending Directive 94/58/EC on the minimum level of training of seafarers.

Parliament's three amendments are given in annex.

Pursuant to Article 189 c (d) of the EC Treaty, the Commission has re-examined its proposal and decided not to accept the amendments for the following reasons:

Amendment n° 1 is not necessary since the wording of Article 5d(1) proposed by the Council is exactly reflecting the text of Regulation I/9 - paragraph 1 of the revised STCW 95. Therefore in accordance with the principle to stick to the provisions of the STCW 95 the text as it stands is sufficient.

Amendment $n^{\circ} 2$ adds to paragraph 4 of article 5h a text which is taken from the nonmandatory Part B of the STCW Code which serves as a guidance to national Administrations. The text, as it stands in the common position, corresponds to section A VIII/1/3 and the addition requested by this amendment corresponds to B VIII/1/1. In the previous discussions in the Parliament and the Council it has been agreed that the recommended part B of the Code should not become mandatory under the Articles of the amending Directive. The question of the non-mandatory guidance is dealt in recital 7 of the Common position which refers to Part B of the STCW.

Amendment n° 3 deals with the watchkeeping provisions which are not part of the existing Directive 94/58. As discussed in the context of the global compromise in the Council it was agreed to maintain the spirit of Directive 94/58 dealing with training and certification standards of seafarers.

However article 5h (fitness for duty) of the common position includes the main issue of the watchkeeping provisions dealing with the rest periods of watchkeepers.

Accordingly, the Commission confirms its agreement with the Council's common position of 20 October 1997.
