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At its sitting of 25 May 1989 the European Parliament delivered its opinion at first reading on the Commission proposal for a Council directive on batteries and accumulators containing certain dangerous substances.

At the sitting of 10 October 1990 the President of Parliament announced that the common position had been received and referred to the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection as the committee responsible and to the Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs and Industrial Policy for its opinion.

At its meeting of 29 June 1990 the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection appointed Mr Iversen rapporteur.

At its meetings of 16 October and 28 November 1990 it considered the common position and the draft recommendation.

At the latter meeting it adopted the following recommendation unanimously, with 1 abstention.

The explanatory statement will be presented orally in plenary sitting.

The recommendation was tabled on 29 November 1990.

The deadline for tabling amendments to the common position or proposals to reject it will appear on the draft agenda for the part-session at which the recommendation is to be considered.

RECOMMENDATION

(Cooperation procedure: second reading)

on the common position established by the Council with a view to the adoption of a directive on batteries and accumulators containing certain dangerous substances

(COM(88) 672 final and COM(89) 454 final 2)

The Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Consumer Protection

- having regard to the common position of the Council (C 3-311/90 - SYN 170),

Recommends that the European Parliament amend the common position as follows:

Common position of the Council

Amendments

(Amendment No. 1)

Article 3(1)

Alkaline manganese button cells and batteries composed of button cells shall be exempted from this prohibition.

Alkaline manganese button cells and batteries composed of <u>these</u> button cells shall be exempted from this prohibition.

(Amendment No. 2)

Article 4(2), second subparagraph

The marking must include indications as to the following points:

Marking <u>shall</u> take the form of a symbol (Annex III)

Article 9, new paragraph

By way of derogation from Article 11 of Directive 75/442/EEC, Member States shall take measures to ensure that the cost of disposing of batteries and accumulators, less any proceeds from recycling, shall be borne by the importer into the Community of the batteries and accumulators or by the manufacturer. Such levies must be notified to the Commission with a view to ensuring that they do not contain any element likely to distort trade.

Article 11(1)

- 1. Member States shall take the measures necessary to comply with this Directive before 18 months after the adoption of this Directive. They shall forthwith inform the Commission thereof.
- 1. Member States shall take the measures necessary to comply with this Directive before 1 January 1992. They shall forthwith inform the Commission thereof.

Annex II, final paragraph

Those appliances the batteries and accumulators of which cannot be readily replaced by the user, in accordance with this Annex, shall be accompanied by instructions informing the user of the content of environmentally hazardous batteries and accumulators and showing how they can be removed safely.

Those appliances the batteries and accumulators of which cannot be readily replaced by the user, in accordance with this Annex, shall be accompanied by instructions informing the user of the content of environmentally hazardous batteries and accumulators and stating where the user can dispose of used appliances.
