On 15 October 1984, the Committee on Budgetary Control appointed Mr Peter Price rapporteur.

At its meetings on 19/20/21 March 1985 and 26/27 March 1985, the Committee on Budgetary Control considered the grant of discharge for the implementation of the second, third, fourth and fifth European Development Funds for the 1983 financial year. At the latter meeting the Committee unanimously adopted the attached motion for a resolution.

The Committee on Budgetary Control hereby submits to the European Parliament the following motion for a resolution

MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

on the deferral of the decisions on the grant of discharge to the Commission in respect of the second, third, fourth and fifth European Development Funds for the 1983 financial year.

The European Parliament,

- having regard to the report of the Committee on Budgetary Control (Doc. A 2-8/85),

1. Notes that the Council has not, as yet, transmitted to Parliament the recommendations in respect of the European Development Funds for the 1983 financial year;
2. Considers that, for procedural and political reasons, careful deliberation on these recommendations is an essential prerequisite to the taking of the discharge decisions for the 1983 financial year;
3. Defers, therefore, the discharge decisions for these Funds until the relevant recommendations have been received or, at the latest, until the June part-session;
4. Asks its President to transmit this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the Court of Auditors.
