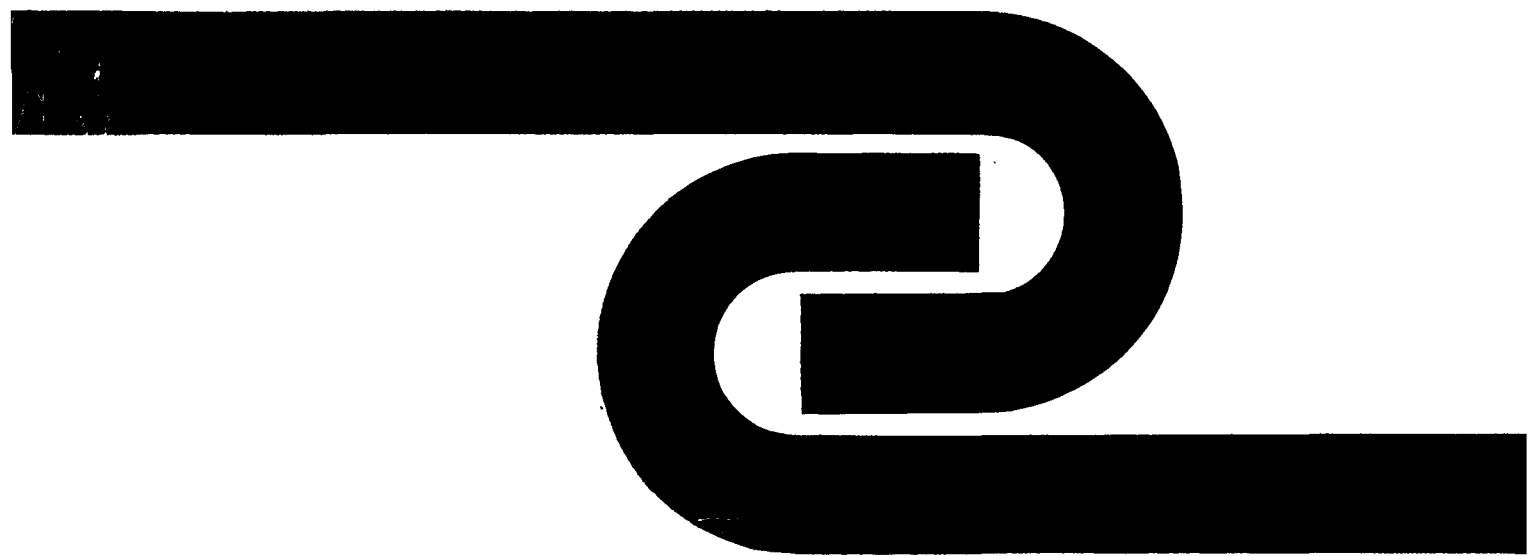

INTRODUCTION

August, coinciding as it does with the summer holidays, is always a slack period for the Economic and Social Committee. In 1974 this period ran on into September - the members' term of office expired on 23 July and there was a slight delay before new appointments could be made on the basis of proposals by the member governments. There are grounds for saying that the delays that occurred - particularly in Italy - testify to the importance attached to the Committee by the various interest groups, which pressed for the maximum number of representatives.

We publish here the lists of members as received from the Council of Ministers, classified according to their country and interests. 133 of the 144 seats have been filled, 22 by new members and 111 by returning members. The reason why the full complement of 144 has not yet been reached is that the United Kingdom Government has, for political reasons, only taken 13 of its allotment of 24 seats.

The next plenary session of the Committee - its inaugural session - will be held on 7 - 9 October instead of in late September. During this session the Chairman, the two Vice-Chairmen and the other 18 Bureau members will be elected.

In addition the members will divide up into the three Committee groups (employers, workers, various interests) and appoint the members and chairmen of the Sections. There are nine Sections which are similar to parliamentary committees and responsible for preparing Committee Opinions.

The inaugural meeting of the Committee is awaited with interest since it will decide how the Committee's future work is organised in the next four years.
