COMMISSION COMMUNICATION TO THE COUNCIL CONCERNING THE SUPPLEMENTARY PROTOCOL TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY AND THE PORTUGUESE REPUBLIC

I. Provisions of the Supplementary Protocol

1. Article 4 of the Supplementary Protocol to the Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Portuguese Republic, which entered into force on 1 January 1980¹, stipulates that the Community and Portugal "shall, in accordance with the procedure adopted for negotiating the Agreement, examine from the beginning of 1982 the arrangements applicable to imports into Portugal as set out in Articles 2 and 3, in order to determine the arrangements which are to apply from 1 January 1983".

Under Article 2 of the Supplementary Protocol, Portugal may suspend, until 31 December 1982, the dismantling of tariffs vis-a-vis the Community at the level reached on 31 December 1979 in respect of six groups of products (two-year "tariff freeze").

Under Article 3 of the Supplementary Protocol, Portugal may, until 31 December 1982 and on the terms laid down in the Agreement (the "new industries clause"), introduce, increase or reintroduce ad valorem customs duties insofar as its industrialization and development necessitate protective measures.

2. Should negotiations not take place between the Community and Portugal in 1982, Portugal would be obliged to apply as from 1 January 1983 the tariff reductions planned for that date in respect of the six groups of products in question, i.e. it would have to make tariff adjustments and would, in addition, no longer be able to invoke the new industries clause from 1 January 1983 onwards.

II. Position of the Portuguese Government

3. The Portuguese authorities informed the Commission of their views on the Article 2 provisions on 4 March 1982.

4. Portugal has requested that the provisions of Article 2 of the Supplementary Protocol be extended until 31 December 1983, i.e. that the dismantling of tariffs via-a-vis the Community be suspended at the level reached on 31 December 1979 in respect of the six groups of products covered by the Article in question. In addition, it has requested the suspension, also until 31 December 1983, of the dismantling of tariffs vis-a-vis the Community at the level now reached (i.e. 70%) in respect of the products covered by Article 5 of the Additional Protocol and listed in Annex I to that Protocol.

With regard to completion of the dismantling of tariffs in respect of the products covered by the 1972 EEC-Portugal Agreement, Portugal has proposed duty-free entry from 1 January 1985 onwards, except for the three groups of products indicated below, for which the arrangements for the dismantling of the residual duties would be determined in the framework of the accession negotiations (chapter on the customs union):

- (i) products covered by Article 6 of the Additional Protocol and listed in Annex II thereto;
- (ii) products listed in Annex 1 to this communication, in respect of which Portugal has requested authorization to reintroduce or increase customs duties up to a limit of 20% ad valorem;
- (iii) products listed in Annex 2 to this communication, in respect of which Portugal has requested that tariff reductions be suspended at the level now reached.
- 5. The Portuguese authorities presented their views with regard to Article 3 of the Supplementary Protocol on 23 November 1981.

In their communication, the Portuguese authorities requested the opening of negotiations for the amendment of certain aspects of the provisions governing the new industries clause in the 1972 EEC and ECSC Agreements. The Portuguese requests may be summarized as follows:

(i) recourse to the new industries clause would normally be possible until 31 December 1984 (instead of 31 December 1982);

- (ii) customs duties introduced, increased or reintroduced up to 31 December 1984 under the new industries clause would be abolished not later than 1 January 1990 (instead of 1 January 1985):
- (iii) the timetable for the dismantling of these duties would be established in the negotiations, though the biggest reductions should take place at the end of the period (the framework for these "negotiations" is not specified);
- (iv) the other terms of the new industries clause contained in Article 6 of Protocol No 1 to the EEC-Portugal Agreement, Article 2 of Protocol No 1 to the ECSC-Portugal Agreement and Article 7 of the Additional Protocol would continue to apply.

Portugal notes, however, that should the accession instruments enter into force before 31 December 1984, the new industries clause could no longer be invoked as from the date of accession. The Portuguese authorities consider that the arrangements for the dismantling of tariffs to be carried out by Portugal after accession in respect of all the products for which the new industries clause was invoked prior to accession should be laid down in the accession instruments.

Lastly, the Portuguese authorities reaffirmed in their communication the principle that no new discrimination injurious to the Community would be introduced as regards imports into Portugal of products covered by the Agreements. Portugal would therefore introduce in the framework of EFTA a request similar to that made in its memo to the Community.

III. Position of the Commission

6. The Commission considers that in view of the efforts to be made by Portugal with a view to its economic development and industrial restructuring and also its progressive integration into the Community, the latter cannot remain indifferent to the requests presented by the Portuguese authorities.

The Commission presented a detailed sector-by-sector assessment of Portuguese industry in its communication of October 1980 on the customs union (industrial products), in the context of the accession negotiations.

- 7. The arrangements to be negotiated in the framework of the 1972 Agreement would have to apply from 1 January 1983 until 31 December 1984.
- 8. In examining the Portuguese authorities' requests concerning suspension of the dismantling of tariffs in respect of products covered by the Supplementary Protocol, and Portugal's new requests in the tariff field, the Commission has found in the case of a number of products either that Portugal grants more favourable treatment to the EFTA countries than to the Community or that some of the tariff concessions obtained by Portugal in the past, such as suspension of the dismantling of tariffs or increases in customs duties, have never been applied by Portugal. Consequently the Commission has eliminated the products in question, for which Portugal should henceforth apply the arrangements specified in the Agreement.

However, in the course of the negotiations the Community should obtain from the Portuguese authorities formal assurances that the arrangements adopted in the negotiations and to be applied from 1 January 1983 will not result in any discrimination vis-à-vis the Community by comparison with arrangements concluded by Portugal in the EFTA framework, and also that once the protocol to be negotiated is signed there will no longer be any discrimination in the tariff arrangements applicable to the Community and to EFTA respectively.

Portugal would consequently have to make certain efforts to remedy the situation once the protocol was signed.

- 9. Article 9 of the Protocol with Portugal consequent on the accession of Greece lays down arrangements for the abolition of customs duties on products from Greece whereby Portugal is to make cumulative tariff reductions amounting to 40% on 1 January 1983, 60% on 1 January 1984 and 80% on 1 January 1985, attaining complete abolition of duties on 1 January 1986; it also states that "in no case may products from Greece be imported into Portugal at rates of duty more favourable than those applied to products from the Community of Nine". As this Protocol (consequent on the accession of Greece) may not yet be in force at the end of this year because of the time required for ratification, it would be stipulated in the protocol to be negotiated with Portugal that the latter must ensure that the tariff treatment to be applied to Greece is not more favourable than that applied in respect of the Nine (the "butoir" rule).
- 10. If Portugal were to become a member of the Community before 31 December 1984, as may be hoped, all matters relating to the arrangements resulting from the 1972 Agreement and the Protocols thereto would have to be settled in the context of the accession negotiations. In particular, the date to be adopted in the accession negotiations context in connection with basic duties and arrangements for tariff adjustments after accession will have to be determined in the light of the solutions to be adopted shortly in the framework of the 1972 Agreement.
- 11. The Commission considers that Portugal could continue to have recourse to the new industries clause until 31 December 1984.

As Portugal's accession could well take place before that date, however, it will be essential to avoid any possibility of incompatibility during the "interim period" between the provisions of the 1972 Agreement and the customs duties provisions in the accession instruments. Consequently, it would be laid down as of now in the framework of the 1972 Agreement, by means of an exchange of letters to be negotiated parallel to the Protocol, that from the first day of the month preceding the signing of the accession instruments Portugal could no longer have recourse to the new industries clause. Not later than one month prior to the signing of the instruments, the list of products covered by the new industries

clause and the relevant rates of customs duties would have to be established and included in the accession instruments. The rate of dismantling of tariffs for the products in question during the transitional period and from accession onwards would have to be negotiated beforehand in the accession framework, given the specific nature of the products concerned.

12. The Commission sets out below proposals for the opening of negotiations in the framework of the 1972 Agreements with a view to the adoption of the proposals by the Council, so that the Commission can be empowered to open negotiations with Portugal as soon as possible, in view of the implications of the results of such negotiations for the progress of work in the customs union and ECSC chapters of the accession negotiations.

RECOMMENDATION FOR A COUNCIL DIRECTIVE CONCERNING THE NEGOTIATION OF A PROTOCOL AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE EUROPEAN ECONOMIC COMMUNITY AND PORTUGAL

1. The European Economic Community and Portugal would conclude a transitional protocol, which would enter into force on 1 January 1983, amending the provisions of the EEC-Portugal Agreement and the Additional and Supplementary Protocols to that Agreement.

The provisions set out below would apply until 31 December 1984. After that date the provisions of the Agreement and/or the Additional Protocol would re-enter into force unchanged provided that the contracting parties had not decided on other measures before the end of 1984.

- 2. Portugal would be authorized to suspend the dismantling of tariffs to be carried out <u>vis-à-vis</u> the Community pursuant to the Agreement and the Additional Protocol thereto at the level reached on 31 December 1979 in respect of the following:
 - (i) the parts falling within subheadings 87.07.02,.03 or .04 in List A of Annex II to the Agreement, as regards the fiscal component of the customs duties (see Annex A);
 - (ii) products included in List C of Annex II to the Agreement (see Annex B);
- (iii) certain products included in List A of Annex D to Protocol No 1 to the Agreement (see Annex C);
 - (iv) certain products included in List B of Annex D to Protocol No 1 to the Agreement (see Annex D);
 - (v) certain products included in Annex I to the Additional Protocol (see Annex E).

The suspension of the dismantling of tariffs in respect of the products specified above would apply until 31 December 1983. On 1 January 1984 Portugal would reduce by 50% the residual duties on all these products¹.

¹ Customs duties in respect of the products covered by these arrangements will be abolished on 1 January 1985 in compliance with the provisions of the Agreement (or, alternatively, in accordance with the accession instruments).

3. Portugal would be authorized to suspend the dismantling of tariffs to be carried out vis-a-vis the Community pursuant to the Agreement and the Additional Protocol thereto at the level reached on 1 January 1980 as regards certain products included in Annex II to the Additional Protocol (see Annex F).

The suspension of the dismantling of tariffs in respect of these products would apply until 31 December 1983. On 1 January 1984 Portugal would reduce by 10% the duty reintroduced pursuant to the Additional Protocol.

4. Portugal would be authorized to suspend the dismantling of tariffs to be carried out vis-à-vis the Community pursuant to the Agreement and the Additional Protocol thereto at the level reached on 31 December 1982 as regards the products listed in Annex G.

The suspension of the dismantling of tariffs in respect of these products would apply until 31 December 1983. On 1 January 1984 Portugal would reduce the residual duties by 10%.

5. By way of derogation from the Agreement and the Additional Protocol thereto, Portugal would be authorized to apply from 1 January 1983 onwards a customs duty not exceeding 20% ad valorem for the products listed in Annex H.

The customs duties thus introduced would be reduced by 10% on their introduction. On 1 January 1984 Portugal would make a further tariff reduction of 10%.

6. Portugal would be authorized, until 31 December 1984 and within the limits laid down by the Agreement and the Additional Protocol thereto, to introduce, increase or reintroduce ad valorem customs duties in so far as its industrialization and development necessitate protective measures.

It would be stated, however, in an exchange of letters between the Community and Portugal that Portugal would no longer have recourse to this faculty from the first day of the month preceding the signing of the instruments of accession to the Communities.

NB The tariff arrangements for the products listed in Annexes F, G and H and the arrangements for the products covered by paragraph 6 will have to be determined in the accession negotiations.

- 7. Portugal would ensure that at no time would the tariff treatment accorded to Greece be more favourable than that applied to the Community of Nine.
- 8. Portugal would guarantee the Community that as from the signing of the transitional protocol there will be no discrimination in the tariff arrangements applied by Portugal to the Community and the EFTA countries respectively and that the Community will be accorded treatment not less favourable than that applied by Portugal in respect of the most favoured third countries.
