Proposal for a COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC)

amending Regulation (EEC) No 2915/86 laying down socio-structural provisions applicable to agriculture in the Canary Islands

Explanatory Memorandum


Under the 1985 Act of Accession (Article 25 (3)) the instruments of the institutions of the European Communities, in the context of the common agricultural policy, do not apply to the Canary Islands. However, the Council, acting by a qualified majority on a proposal from the Commission, lays down the socio-structural provisions which apply to agriculture in the Canary Islands, whilst ensuring that such provisions are compatible with the general objectives of the common agricultural policy.

On the basis of Article 25 of the Act of Accession, the Council, by means of Regulation (EEC) No 2915/86 of 16 September 1986, has made applicable to the Canary Islands the horizontal commom measures introduced by:

- Regulation (EEC) No 797/85 on improving the efficiency of agricultural structures,
- Regulation (EEC) No 355/77 on commom measures to improve the conditions under which agricultural and fishery products are processed and marketed,
- Regulation (EEC) No 1360/78 on producer groups and associations thereof.

In view of the particularly adverse production conditions and the inadequate production structures, the Commission takes the view that the following measures should also be made applicable to the Canary Islands:

- the Community scheme to encourage the cessation of farming adopted by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1096/88, and
- the Community system of aids to encourage the formation and facilitate the operation of producers' organizations in the fruit and vegetables sector provided for by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72.

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to the Act of Accession of Spain and Portugal, and in particular Article 25(3) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission (1),

Whereas Council Regulation (EEC) No 2915/87 (2) extended to the Canary Islands, with a view to contributing towards the development of their agricultural structures, a number of socio-structural measures applicable to all the regions of the Community;

Whereas, on account of their particularly inadequate agricultural structures, the following measures should also be made applicable to the Canary Islands: the scheme to encourage the cessation of farming adopted by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1096/88 (3) and the system of aids to encourage the formation and facilitate the operation of producers' organizations in the fruit and vegetables sector, provided for by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 (4), as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 2238/88 (5),

Whereas the application to the Canary Islands of the abovementioned socio-structural measures is compatible with the general objectives of the commom agricultural policy,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Article 1(1) of Regulation (EEC) No 2915/86 is hereby replaced by the following:

- "1. The common measures introduced by:
- Council Regulation (EEC) No 797/85 of 12 March 1985 on improving the efficiency of agricultural structures (3),
- Regulation (EEC) No 355/77,
- Council Regulation (EEC) No 1360/78 of 19 June 1978 on producer groups and associations thereof (4),
- Council Regulation (EEC) No 1096/88 of 25 April 1988 establishing a
 Community scheme to encourage the cessation of farming (5),
- and Articles 13, 14 and 36 of Council Regulation (EEC) No 1035/72 (6) introducing a Community system of aid to encourage the formation and facilitate the operation of producers' organizations,

shall apply to the Camary Islands.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.
