

Highlights of EIB Activities in 1993 UNICE - Main report Findings 1.

I. EIC ACTIVITIES

FR-275 Poitiers

On 7 March, the EIC - in partnership with the Ecole Supérieure de Commerce - organized an information meeting on influence networks and lobbying for enterprises comprising the Groupement des Industriels du Châtelleraudais. Some 40 business leaders were able to use this occasion to gain a better understanding of the role played by EICs in seeking out the strategic information which is essential for any lobbying action. They did this by studying a true case scenario.

An information meeting on Structural Funds was held on 11 March in Angoulême. This session, organized by the EIC, was aimed at the various departments of the chambers of commerce in the Poitou-Charentes region. The ACFCI (Assemblée des Chambres Françaises de Commerce et d'Industrie) based in Brussels, and the SGAR (Secrétariat Général aux Affaires Régionales) based in Poitou-Charentes, contributed their expertise.

II. EU NEWS

1. ENLARGEMENT-SWEDEN

Leaders of all Sweden's political parties, at a meeting in Stockholm on Friday, decided to propose Sunday November 13 as the date for the country's referendum on EU membership. At the start of this month Sweden negotiated an accession agreement with the European Union as one of four countries hoping to become members from January 1, 1995. "The decisive factors were finding a date for a referendum which would both make possible membership from January 1, 1995 and give all room for the campaigns and information activity they consider they need," Prime Mininster Carl Bildt said in a statement. Although he acknowleged that he had wanted to hold the referendum in June, before the general election planned for September 18, Bildt said he had taken into account the strong wishes of the opposition Social Democrats for a later date. The proposal will now be put to parliament.

2. ENLARGEMENT CURRENCY

The four countries which this month signed deals to join the European Union have also agreed to join the European Monetary System (EMS) once they have merged with the 12 nation bloc, the EU said on Thursday. But Sweden, Finland, Norway and Austria -- which are due to join the EU from January 1 -- did not set any date for joining either the EMS or its core currency grid, the Exchange Rate Mechanism. All three of the Nordic countries were forced one by one to abandon unilateral links to the European currency unit during the monetary crisis that erupted in September 1992 and ended 11 months later with the forced decision by EU finance ministers to effectively let their currencies float. Alone of the four applicants -- whose accession deals still have to gain European Parliament approval, national referendums and formal ratification by the 12 -- Austria has pledged to keep its schilling

stable on the way to the creation of a single EU currency later this century. "Austria obtained the inclusion in the Accession Act of unilateral declaration stating their committment to maintain the stability of the schilling as a way of contributing to the achievement of Economic and Monetary Union," an EU report on the talks said. The schilling already shadows the German mark and is generally expected to be the first of the four applicants to join the ERM after Austria formally links up with the Union. Belgian Finance Minister Philippe Maystadt said last month that he saw no reason why the accession of the schilling to the ERM should not be simultaneous with that of Austria to the EU. All 12 EU states are members of the EMS, but Greece has never joined the ERM and both Britain and Italy were forced to leave the grid at the start of the currency crisis. One of the key criteria for joining an eventual single EU currency -- due under the Maastricht treaty to start either in 1997 or by 1999 -- is membership over the previous two years of the "normal" band of the ERM. Before August last year when the grid's fluctuation bands were blown open to 15 percent either side of central rates, the normal bands were plus or minus 2.25 or six percent. Only Germany and the Netherlands struck an informal deal to keep with the 2.25 limit relative to each other. With all FRM member currencies now back within or close to their former bands, there is now some debate over whether the current wide band could be considered as "normal" for single currency purposes or if there has to be a move back towards a narrower limit. In either case, if the January 1, 1997 target is to upheld, a formal decision must be made by the end of this year.

3. AUTOMOBILE STRATEGY

As part of the goal to improve the international competitiveness of the automobile industry, the Commission has proposed a strategy and action proposals in its

communication to the Council and the Laropean Parliament on the European Union at tomobile industry. While conceding that the primary responsibility to effect the changes to improve its competitiveness remains with the industry itself, the Commission recommends that structural policy instruments be used to facilitate adaptation of enterprises and markets with high growth potential worldwide. It also suggests that the industry take advantage of joint research and development programmes under the Fourth Framework Programme, and remove market access barriers in principal markets and markets with high growth potential worldwide.

4. COMMISSION REPORT ON GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS

The first evaluation of existing national programmes under the monitoring mechanism of Community CO2 and other greenhouse gas emissions has been published by the Commission. The major conclusion from the evaluation is that at this stage of implementing the monitoring mechanism, concrete measures based on complementary national programmes

are unlikely to be sufficient to reach the stabilisation target. The Commission says "more consideration should be given to other parts of the Community strategy, in particular the CO2/energy tax proposal, which is more cost effective". The Commission recommends that each Member State provide it with a national programme based on a more detailed and harmonised format as the ultimate goal of this exercise will be "to develop national programmes that will become comprehensive strategies for the control of CO2 and other greenhouse gases, instead of mere lists of measures to be taken".

PAN-EUROPEAN FORUM ON SUBCONTRACTING IN THE CONSTRUCTION SECTOR BORDEAUX, 26 AND 27 MAY 1994

The main task which the Commission is currently pursuing under its enterprise policy is to help improve the competitiveness of companies.

Competitiveness is first and foremost a challenge to each individual company. Fostering co-operation between firms at European level is an appropriate way of reinforcing European competitiveness and promoting the resumption of growth in general. Within the framework of its co-operation projects, the European Union has recently taken a particular interest in a specific aspect of co-operation: subcontracting.

In the context of the promotion of transnational subcontracting, five key sectors for which collaboration between the Commission (in particular DG III (Industry), DG XXIII (Enterprise Policy) and Eurostat as well as the qualified economic partners has been launched, have been identified.

The construction sector is one of the most important sectors with a major potential for development at transnational level and a significant capacity to support the economy. The turnover of building and construction in the Union accounts for more than 500 billion ECU when the EFTA countries are included.

The Pan-European forum on subcontracting in the construction sector aims to respond to the need for a dialogue between the various organisations of this sector. The Forum, which is organised by Cobaty International, with the active support of the Directorates General III and XXIII, will take place on 26 and 27 May 94 in Bordeaux and will revolve around three round tables covering all the problems of the sector:

- a. the specificity of subcontracting in the construction industry
- b. the conditions of access to the construction market
- c. Europe, growth, subcontracting

These round tables will enable representatives of the Commission responsible for the construction sector and representatives of the major European organisations to express their views and will be followed by debates with the participants.

IV. QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Question:

We would be grateful for further information on the follow-up given by the Commission to the conclusions and recommendations presented by the Ruding Committee, responsible for the evaluation of the need for greater harmonisation of corporate taxation within the EC:

Answer:

Following your telefax dated 07.03.94 in which you requested information on the follow-up given by the Commission to the conclusions and recommendations presented by the Ruding Committee, responsible for the evaluation of the need for greater harmonisation of corporate taxation within the EC, please note as follows:

As you recalled in your correspondence the Committee suggested three phases to introduce new legislative measures. It recommended bringing corporate tax rates across the EC within a band of 30 % to 40 %, to extend the existing "Losses" Directive to require the full vertical and horizontal offset of profits and losses of companies within domestic and EC groups, and proposed uniform tax depreciation for intangibles.

The Commission responded to the Committee's report at the end of June 1992 when it submitted to the Council a Communication on guidelines on company taxation in the context of the further development of the internal market after 1992.

Although it stressed that the Commission would launch a comprehensive consultation process in all of the twelve Member States, it promised immediate action.

In this regard the Commission submitted in July 1993 (OJ C 225 1993) two proposals for Directives:

The first would extend the scope of the parent companies (subsidiaries Directive) on the double taxation of profits distributed in the form of dividends from a subsidiary in one Member State to its parent in another to cover all parent companies subject to corporation tax, irrespective of their legal form.

The second proposal would extend the scope of the "mergers" Directive to cover all types of companies, including sole proprietorship in respect of those operations which concern them, namely transfers of assets.

Furthermore, the Commission also considered that the 1990 Arbitration Convention on the elimination of double taxation in connection with the adjustment of the profits of associated enterprises should be supplemented by a consultation procedure between national authorities prior to the adjustment of transfer prices.

Other issues identified by the Committee on which the Commission intends to initiate discussion with Member States, and, where appropriate, produce new proposals concern:

- a common approach to the definition and treatment of thin capitalization
- common rules on the allocation of headquarters' costs
- * the completion of the network of treaties concluded between Member States in order to settle certain double taxation difficulties
- * neutrality of treatment as between foreign-source and domestic-source dividends with a view to preventing the former from being taxed more heavily than the latter.

The Ecofin Council's response to the Commission's communication was given in

November 1992. It noted with satisfaction that both the Commission and the Ruding Committee had recognised the importance of taxation for Member States' sovereignty and had accepted that, in line with the subsidiarity principle, Community action on business taxation should be limited to the minimum necessary to ensure the smooth functioning of the Internal Market.

The Council called for an urgent consideration of possible remedies to the risk that special tax arrangements designed to attract internationally mobile capital and other tax incentives might lead to a loss of revenue to other Member States and to unfair competition.

Furthermore, the Commission is considering the possibility of EC legislation in the field of taxation of company transfer. The Commissioner for the Internal Market, Mr R. Vanni d' Archirafi, explained that the very high differences in the tax applied to the transfer of a company between the Member States, may constitute barriers to cross-border transfers of companies and reduce the economic potential of the Internal Market.

We would like to remind you that given that a unanimous decision is required at Council level on this issue, such a proposal, if presented by the Commission might be the subject of lengthy negotiations between the Member States.

Question:

We are turning to you following a question put to us by a lawyer in our region. This lawyer asked us whether a Russian citizen who has a visa allowing him to move freely throughout Belgium can also move freely throughout the European Union, without having to apply for a visa from each Member State he wishes to visit.

This Russian citizen wants to develop economic activities which will require him to make many trips to EU countries. It is therefore understandable that he should be concerned about having to repeat the application procedures for obtaining several visas, fearing that possible administrative sluggishness will hinder his professional development.

We know that the Member States are finalizing a "Convention on external frontiers", which will serve as the basis for the common policy on visas. This could include, among other things, the recognition of visas granted by other Member States. As our search of the data bases has failed to yield anything, can you tell us whether the convention has been adopted? If so, what are its publication reference numbers? If it has not yet been published, could you please give us the references for the draft convention, or a copy of this draft?

Answer:

Following your fax of 16 February 1994 in which you ask us for information on the convention regarding checks on people when crossing external frontiers as well as on the common policy regarding visas, please note the following:

On 10 December 1993 (OJ C 11 of 15.01.94), the Commission presented two proposals concerning:

- * the approval of the convention regarding checks on people when crossing external frontiers (OJ C 11 of 15.01.94);
- * the rule establishing the list of third countries whose nationals must bear a visa when crossing the external frontiers of Member States (OJ C 11 of 15.01.94).

These two proposals, which are to be followed by a proposal aimed at establishing a uniform visa model, serve as the basis for the subsequent elimination of checks on people at intra-Community frontiers. It would actually be impossible to eliminate these checks if the principles and methods of the checks at the external frontiers were not uniform. The interest of these two proposals lies in the transfer to Community level of what used to be the province of intergovernmental agreements, as a result of the new powers resulting from the Treaty of Maastricht.

The aim of the proposal for a decision establishing the <u>Convention on crossing external frontiers</u> is to establish effective checks on people carried out in accordance with common standards at external frontiers, as well as more advanced cooperation for the implementation of a common policy on visas.

The proposal for a regulation on visas takes up the list of third countries whose nationals must have a visa to enter the Community, as had already been drawn up by the nine Schengen countries.

These two proposals are currently before the Council, which has asked the European Parliament to issue an opinion. According to our expert at DG XV (Internal Market and Financial Services), the European Parliament should issue its opinion in May.

The third proposal, regarding the <u>uniform visa</u> <u>model</u>, will be formally presented by the Commission in the near future. This proposal is part of the third pillar, and is based on Article 100c.

The proposal will take up the uniform visa model as set out in the Schengen Convention. This proposal is linked to the convention on external frontiers, because the conditions under which the common visa is issued are found in the convention.

Once this series of measures has been adopted, the Union will then boast a genuine common policy on visas.

We would remind you, however, that the entry into force of the Schengen Convention before the summer would partially resolve the problem you mentioned, at least as far as the nine states involved are concerned.

Question:

We are looking for information on the followup to the NOW, HORIZON, YOUTHSTART and ADAPT programmes, as well as on the new programme for SMEs, if possible.

Answer:

Pursuant to your fax in which you ask us for information on the follow-up to the NOW, HORIZON, YOUTHSTART and ADAPT programmes, as well as on the new programme for SMEs, if possible, you should note the following:

On 16 February, the Commission adopted its global approach to Community initiatives for the period 1994-1999. It proposed nine themes for Community initiatives, with one in reserve. The common concern running through all nine themes chosen by the Commission is to give priority to the issue of employment.

The "employment and human resources development" initiative is based on an integrated approach bringing together various measures aimed at groups facing difficulties on the employment market. Three trends are included in this initiative. The first one, "Emploi-Now," aims to develop equal opportunities for women on the labour market (as called for in NOW I); the second one (Emploi-Horizon) is intended primarily for disadvantaged and handicapped people (thanks to the positive results from Horizon I); the third direction, "Emploi-Youthstart", reflects a proposal contained in the White Paper on growth, competitiveness and employment. It is aimed at unemployed young people and those who do not have suitable qualifications to confront long-term unemployment. initiative will aim to help promote access to work or recognize a form of education or training for young people under 20 years of age. The amount allocated to these three subinitiatives is ECU 1.4 billion.

In the framework of industrial change, the Commission proposed three types of initiative concerning the following three aspects:

first initiative, entitled ADAPT-The Emploi/industrial change is an initiative aimed at setting up a programme of transnational actions linked to Objective 4 and taking as a reference the White Paper on growth, employment. and competitiveness initiative aims to: help workers - and more specifically those who are threatened with unemployment due to industrial change; to adapt employment organization and structures to the changes; to help enterprises enhance their competitiveness, especially by encouraging changes in their organization and non-physical investments; and to prevent unemployment by improving the qualifications of the workforce and by facilitating the development of new jobs and new activities.

These objectives will require major efforts in order to develop and set up training structures, to identify and develop new qualifications, to boost the level of skills and to develop innovative approaches aimed at creating networks between enterprises and promoting the dissemination of R&D results. The amount allocated for ADAPT is ECU 1.4 billion.

The SME initiative, which is also included in the framework of industrial change, aims primarily to stimulate SMEs in regions where development is lagging behind so that they can adapt to the requirements of the single market and international competition. This is part of an approach recommended by the White Paper on growth, competitiveness and employment, and promotes, notably, the mastery of modern technologies, new methods of organization and access to innovative financial products. The amount allocated to this initiative is ECU 1 billion.

All the initiatives will be submitted in the coming days and months to the European Parliament, which is to issue an opinion before the European elections; to the Committee of the Regions, which will hold its first meeting on 9 and 10 March, and which will issue an opinion in April; and to the Management Committee (as set out in last July's regulations), which will comprise representatives of the Member States. These initiatives should be adopted by June. Once adopted, they will be published in the Official Journal and the Member States will be asked to submit their operational programmes for these initiatives or request subsidies for cofinancing.
