THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community; Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 805/68/EEC¹ of 27 June 1968 on the common organization of the market in beef and veal, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No 187/73², and in particular Article 19(1) thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission;

Whereas Article 19(1) of Regulation (EEC) No 805/68/EEC provides that to the extent necessary for the proper working of the common organization of the market in beef and veal, the use of inward processing arrangements may be prohibited in whole or in part in respect of products listed in Article 1 of that Regulation which are intended for the manufacture of products listed in that Article; whereas the Council Directive of 1 March 1969³, as last amended by the Council Directive of 27 June 1972⁴, harmonized the provisions laid down by law, regulation or administrative action in respect of inward processing;

Whereas there is a surplus of beef and veal at present in the Community; whereas there are few outlets on the world market, which considerably limits the possibility of exporting beef and veal; whereas all capacity for absorbing surpluses must therefore be devoted to Community production;

Whereas the world market does, however, offer some outlets for certain processed products; whereas the Community processing industries largely obtain their beef and veal for the manufacture of such products from third countries and process it under inward processing arrangements;

Whereas the Community surplus will enable those industries to obtain supplies of beef and veal of Community origin, thus relieving the Community market in those products; whereas the use of beef and veal from third countries is therefore liable to jeopardize gravely the proper working of the common organization of the market in beef and veal;

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

The use of inward processing arrangements is hereby prohibited in respect of products listed in Article 1 of Regulation (EEC) No 805/68 which are intended for the manufacture of products listed in that Article.

Article 2

- 1. This Regulation shall be without prejudice to authorizations in respect of inward processing operations relating to specified quantities and granted before 10 July 1974, provided that the conditions attached to such authorizations are complied with.
- 2. The Member States shall send the Commission a list of all authorizations granted.

Article 3

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 August 1974.

It shall apply until 1 April 1975.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

Having regard to Council Regulation No $121/67/\text{EEC}^1$ of 13 June 1967 on the common organization of the market in pigmeat, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No $1652/73^2$, and in particular Article 16(1) thereof;

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission:

Whereas Article 16(1) of Regulation No 121/67/EEC provides that to the extent necessary for the proper working of the common organization of the market in pigmeat, the use of inward processing arrangements may be prohibited in whole or in part in respect of products listed in Article 1(1) of that Regulation which are intended for the manufacture of products listed in that paragraph; whereas the Council Directive of 1 March 1969, as last amended by the Council Directive of 27 June 1972, harmonized the provisions laid down by law, regulation or administrative action in respect of inward processing;

Whereas there is a surplus of pigmeat at present in the Community; whereas there are few outlets on the world market, which considerably limits the possibility of exporting pigmeat; whereas all capacity for absorbing surpluses must therefore be devoted to Community production;

Whereas the world market does, however, offer some outlets for certain processed products; whereas the Community processing industries largely obtain their pigmeat for the manufacture of such products from third countries and process it under inward processing arrangements;
