COMMON TRANSPORT POLICY

DISCUSSED BY EEC GROUP

WASHINGTON, D.C., June 10 -- As part of the European Community's policy to integrate not only commercial but all aspects of the six nations' economies, the Common Market Transport Committee has just completed its sixth meeting called to discuss common rules for harmonizing international transportation.

According to Title IV of the Treaty of Rome establishing the European Economic Community, the Common Market will lay down common rules for international transport within the Community. In this connection, the Transport Committee was composed of a group of experts appointed by the member governments and having consultative status.

The latest meeting, held in Brussels, June 7 and 8, was called by the Common Market Commission and opened by Commissioner Lambert Schaus, President of the Working Group on Transportation. Transport Committee President Jean Vrebos presided. The next session was scheduled for July 15 when the Committee intends to draw up a report for presentation to the EEC Commission.
