DANISH GOVERNMENT DELEGATION VISITS EURATOM

WASHINGTON, D.C., Nov. 15 -- Officials of the Danish Government and the Danish Atomic Energy Commission today began an official four-day visit at headquarters of the Commission of the European Atomic Energy Community (Euratom) in Brussels. The visiting group is led by Julius Bomholt, Minister for Cultural Affairs. Professor Niels Bohr, Chairman of the Danish Atomic Energy Commission; H. H. Koch, Permanent Under Secretary of State; and members and officials of the Atomic Energy Commission are also participating in the meetings.

The afternoon of the first day of the visit is being devoted to an exchange of views and information on peaceful applications of atomic energy, and in the evening M. Cooremans, Mayor of Brussels, is holding a reception in honor of the visitors. On November 16 the Danish delegation will visit Euratom's Central Nuclear Measurements Bureau at Mol and installations of the C.E.N. (Centre d'Étude de l'Énergie Nucléaire). The party will visit the Euratom Joint Research Center at Ispra, as well as the Metallurgy Laboratories at Sallugia which are part of the Ispra establishment, November 17-18.

The Danish mission is returning the visit of a Euratom Commission delegation to Copenhagen in February of this year. On August 10 the Danish Government declared its intention to undertake negotiations for membership in the European Economic Community (Common Market). Denmark is also expected to apply eventually for membership in Euratom and the European Coal and Steel Community.
