EEC COMMISSION BEGINS EXPLORATORY TALKS WITH  
TANGANYIKA, UGANDA AND KENYA

WASHINGTON, D.C., February 10 --- The EEC Commission began formal exploratory discussions today in Brussels with ministers from Tanganyika, Uganda and Kenya, member of the East African Common Services Organization.

Representing the three states were: C. G. Kahama, Tanganyika minister for commerce and industry; J. S. Mayanjankangi, Uganda minister for commerce; and Dr. J. G. Kiano, Kenya minister for commerce and industry.

The first working sessions, under the chairmanship of EEC Commissioners Henri Rochereau and Jean Rey, will continue until February 14.

On March 14-15, 1963, the EEC Commission discussed, with a ministerial delegation from the three states, provisions of the new EEC convention of association with the African and Malagasy states and possible forms of economic cooperation with the EEC.
