MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

tabled by Mr ROMUALDI, Mr ALMIRANTE, Mr BUTTAFUOCO
and Mr PETRONIO

pursuant to Rule 47 of the Rules of Procedure
on the crisis in the sugar-beet sector

The European Parliament,

- A. whereas the problems of the sugar-beet sector, which has already been in crisis for some time, have intensified as a result of international circumstances, Community policy and also the simultaneous decision by sugar-beet groups to proceed unilaterally with plant closures without heed to the production and employment requirements of the region of Ferrara and other provinces,
- B. whereas there is currently a danger that the crop structure of farms will be disturbed, with disastrous consequences for the economy and employment,
- C. whereas the Provincial Council of Ferrara, in its unanimously adopted motion of 7 March 1983, expressed its deep concern at the decision by the Eridania company to proceed with a restructuring plan without waiting for the establishment of a national sugar-beet plan, on which discussions had begun at ministerial level,
1. Calls for
- (a) concrete steps to promote the definition of a sugar-beet plan at EEC level, including measures to safeguard the 40 ha sugar-beet growing area in Ferrara;
- (b) the allocation by the EEC of a share of the A sugar quota (equal to 16 m quintals);
- (c) the implementation of measures to persuade the Eridania and Assozuccheri companies to keep open the plants threatened with closure, to ensure the normal functioning of the 1983 sugar-beet year and the withdrawal of redundancy notices;
- (d) provisions to restructure the Maraldi group in order to restore its credibility in the eyes of producers, who should be given guarantees concerning compliance with inter-professional agreements;
- (e) a 30% increase in the quota of the CO.TRO.A sugar cooperative of Ostellato;
2. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and the Commission.
