MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

tabled by Mr CAPANNA and Mr VANDEMEULEBROUCKE

pursuant to Rule 47 of the Rules of Procedure

on the Super-Phénix reactor

## The European Parliament,

- A whereas the Super-Phénix reactor is ideally suited to the manufacture of virtually pure plutonium 239 whose isotopic quality makes it suitable for the production of atomic bombs currently under consideration in France,
- B whereas roughly 300 kg of PU<sup>239</sup> is produced in the blanket of the reactor core each year.
- C whereas the Super-Phénix reactor was a joint project involving France (38%), the FRG (16%) and Italy (33%), and whereas the latter two countries have signed the Non-Proliferation Treaty which provides for controls on civilian plants to ensure that no fissionable material is diverted for military purposes,
- D whereas when several countries take part in a joint project, it should comply with the provisions of the international treaties signed by each individual country,
- Calls on the French Government to ask the International Atomic Energy Agency based in Vienna to inspect the Super-Phénix reactor;
- 2. Invites all the countries concerned to respect the Non-Proliferation
  Treaty on all matters concerning the Super-Phénix reactor;
- 3. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the French, Italian and West German Governments.
