The European Parliament,

- A. whereas the decision taken by the European Council in Stuttgart on 18 and 19 June 1983 provided for the opening of major negotiations to deal with the most urgent problems of the Community and to create a solid basis on which the Community might continue on a path of dynamic development for the rest of this decade,
- B. whereas the European Council indicated the following topics as the subjects for such negotiations : the future financing of the Community; the development of common policies; matters relating to enlargement; the special budgetary and other problems experienced by individual Member States; the need for greater budgetary discipline,
- C. whereas the Commission undertook, through its President, Mr Thorn, in his speech to Parliament on 29 June last, to associate Parliament with all the different phases of this procedure,
  1. Notes with regret that this association has not taken place except in the shape of the provision of formal information;
  2. Notes that, contrary to the commitments given when the documents were first submitted and in the course of the initial discussions, no account whatever has been taken of the proposals put forward by Parliament on the subject matter of the negotiations;
  3. Expresses its concern, given the disappointing start of these negotiations, that the failure of the Mandate of 30 May 1980 may be repeated on this occasion and affirms that it will not be a passive spectator at such a development;
  4. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council and Commission.
