MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

on behalf of the European People's Party

on aid to the German rescue vessel 'Cap Anamur'

The European Parliament,

- whereas the refugees from Vietnam are fleeing from a regime characterized by the denial of liberty, oppression, tyranny and corruption,
- convinced that every human being has a right to freedom,
- aware that as many as 50% of the Boat People do not survive their flight and that countless others are attacked and ill-treated by pirates or flung into prison camps by the Communist regime,
- whereas the 'Deutsche Komitee not-Arzte e.V.' (German Committee of Emergency Doctors) is a politically independent movement serving solely humanitarian ends and the only organization in the world operating a rescue vessel whose doctors and nurses work without remuneration.
- believing that political declarations alone are pointless unless practical steps are taken to help the people afflicted,
- recalling that the Commission last year provided aid amounting to 200,000 EUA for the 'Cap Anamur',
- aware that reception problems in the Federal Republic of Germany have been solved by the acceptance guarantees received by the Laender of Lower Saxony, Schleswig-Holstein, Rhineland-Palatinate, Baden-Würtemberg and Berlin, among others,
- Instructs the Commission to provide 200,000 EUA by the way of emergency aid to the 'Cap Anamur' for refugee relief in 1981;
- 2. Further calls on the Commission to earmark 400,000 EUA for the 'Cap Anamur' in 1982;
- 3. Recommends that the appropriations in both cases be taken from the funds set aside for disaster relief;
- Asks the Commission to report to Parliament on this matter by the November 1981 part-session in Strasbourg;
- 5. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Commission of the European Communities.
