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EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

In the background to the Second Letter of Amendment

1. The customary procedure

The Commission customarily proposes a Letter of Amendment to the Budgetary Anthority at the beginning of September, for the purpose of adjusting the estimates in the initial Preliminary Draft Budget in the light of changes on the agricultural markets and in response to any logislative decisions which the Council or the Commission may have taken meanwhile.

2. Dalays in decisions by the Council

The budgetary procedure has fallen considerably behind the customary timetable of the last few years. This year, however, has been exceptional, owing to the deferment of certain Council decisions:

- (a) the Council of Agriculture Ministers did not adopt its decisions for the marketing year 1979/80 until 22 June 1979, and this prompted the Commission to present a First Letter of Amendment to its Preliminary Braft Badget for 1980, on 6 July.
- (b) the Council meeting on Budget Affairs at which the Draft Budget for 1960 should have been adopted (23 July) did not take place until 11 September.
- 3. The position of the Council Committees in July and the Commission's stitude

When they considered the First Letter of Amendment of 6 July 1979 - which increased the total of agricultural expenditure by 1.300 m EUA actually as the result of the Council's decisions on agriculture of 22 June - the Council Committees wished to incorporate certain changes caused by recent cyclical developments. These changes took the form of a sharp reduction (- 365 m EUA) in the appropriations proposed in the

First Letter of Amendment:

- 265 m EUA for cereals, owing to an increase in world prices and therefore a reduction in refunds,
- 126,3 m EUA for compensatory amounts following the recovery of the pound sterling.
- + 26,3 m EUA for sugar.

However, the Commission advised that these changes should not be applied, since the data available at that time afforded only a partial view and a more complete picture of the situation could not be obtained until September.

4. The situation at the beginning of September

(a) Short-term developments

Since July the situation has evolved as regards both short-term market developments and certain legislative decisions. These changes are explained in Section II below.

Generally speaking, the tangible result is that the cuts in the figures of the First Letter of Amendment proposed by the Council in July have been almost entirely cancelled out by upward corrections. The statement made by the Commission's representative in July, to the effect that the reductions made by the Council could not be regarded as definitive, has therefore been berne out by the facts.

(b) The procedure

The Council nevertheless adopted, on 11 September, a Draft Budget on the basis of the position taken by its Committees in July.

The following consequences arise:

(i) The Commission is constrained to present a Second Letter of Amendment adjusting the estimates it had presented in the first.

This Letter of Amendment, in accordance with the principles applicable, amends the Preliminary Draft Budget;

- (ii) After receiving this Letter of Amendment, the Council will, in turn, have to amend the Draft Budget which it adopted on 11 September.
- II. The impact of the short-term market movements and legislative changes
- 1. The Second Letter of Amendment introduces cuts totalling 40,7 m EUA in the Preliminary Draft Budget as amended by the First Letter of Amendment. The total appropriations carmarked for the FEOCA Guarantee Section are reduced from 10.420.1 m EUA to 10.379.4 m EUA.

- 3. Changes to the appropriations in the Preliminary Draft are due to two sets of variables:
- (a) short-term movements on certain agricultural markets;
- (b) the adoption of legislation supplementing or altering the bases of calculation of the original Preliminary Braft Budget.
- A. Effect of short-term movements on the agricultural markets
 In accordance with normal procedure, the effect of the short-term
 situation was first studied in mid-July; this necessarily provided
 only a partial view of the situation. The survey was completed at
 the end of August; the trends observed in July continued.
- 1. Changes to the appropriations as estimated in July: maintenance of the trends
- (a) Market movements

CEREALS

- 265 m EUA

The recovery on the world markets which was already discernible in July was maintained. As a result, the estimated reduction in expenditure on refunds (265 m EUA) was definitively adopted.

MONETARY COMPRESSATORY AMOUNTS

- 126,3 m EUA

Currency trends in June and July had prempted the proposed cut in expenditure of 126,3 m EUA: the UK compensatory amounts were lower than had been estimated in the first Letter of Amendment. This decline has also continued.

SIJGAR

+ 26,3 m EUA

Since July the need for additional appropriations has been evident in this sector (26,3 m EUA):

- (a) Item 6400 (Refunds): + 18,6 m EUA, following an increase in the estimates, of exports;
- (b) Item 6412 (Reimbursement of storage costs): + 7,7 m EUA, following the setting of the rate of reimbursement at 3,7 ECU/t/month instead of 3,6 ECU/t/month as assumed.

SHORT-TERM MARKET REFECTS IN JULY: - 365 m EUA

(b) Change in co-responsibility expenditure:

- 31.2 m EUA

Expenditure on the co-responsibility levy for the marketing year 1979/80 was set at 93,2 m EUA in the First Letter of Amendment. In fact, as a result of the probable timehag in payments and possible savings under other Items, a cut of 31,2 m EUA has been made.

2. Changes to the appropriations as estimated in August: new short-term trends

Several significant changes occurred in August:

A. MILK AND MILK PRODUCTS

+ 3-8 m EUA

Amendments are needed to several Items in this Chapter, mainly because of the changes in the market situation and a recent Commission Decision on butter consumption aid.

(a) There are at present substantial outlets in non-member countries for milk products.

The exports which may result from this new state of affairs will give rise to an increase in refunds, but there will also be a reduction in stocks and hence in storage expenditure.

(i) Increase in expenditure on refunds

Item 6200: + 142.1 m EUA

(ii) Reduction in expenditure on storage

Powder: - 72.9 m EUA

of which Item 6216 (Financial costs): - 15,1 m EUA

Item 6217 (Technical costs): - 4,2 m EUA

(b) There are also changes in the Items concerning the use of milk as animal feed and for processing into casein, following the adjustment of rates and a change in quantities:

B. BEAF AND VEAL

+ 287,8 m EUA

(a) There is a marked deterioration in this sector, and this has already produced a sharp increase in exports in 1979, and a considerable increase in the quantities in public storage is expected by the end of 1979. This entails an upward adjustment of the estimates for expenditure on refunds and storage in 1980.

(i) Refunds: Item 6500:

+ 89,2 m EUA

(ii) Storage:

+ 184,3 m EUA

of which Item 6511: + 36,8 m EUA

Item 6512: + 52,3 m EUA

Item 6513: + 95,2 m EUA

(b) Also, as the number of calves qualifying for the calving premium is on the increase, Item 6522 should be increased by 14,3 m EUA.

Total increase in Chapter 65: + 287,8 m EUA.

C. FRUIT AND VEGETABLES

+ 48,8 m EUA

Processing subsidies for fruit and vegetables are having a greater effect than was estimated (+ 40 m EUA), as are refunds for processed products (+ 8,8 m EUA).

D. WINE

+ 42,3 m EUA

The 1979 yield is expected to be larger than was estimated, whence an increase in appropriations: + 10 m EUA for storage and + 32,3 m EUA for distillation.

E. MONETARY COMPENSATORY AMOUNTS

+ 20,9 m EUA

Exports of milk and beef and veal to non-member countries are larger than was estimated, thus reducing the savings expected due to the recovery of the pound sterling by 20,9 m EUA.

SHORT-TERM MARKET EFFECTS IN AUGUST: + 403,6 m EUA

B. Changes to legislation

1. MILK PRODUCTS: AID TO BUTTER CONSUMPTION (Item 6224)

On 10 August 1979 the Commission adopted Regulation (EEC) No 1785/79 setting out the quantities qualifying for a butter consumption aid; the quantities are slightly smaller than those on which the estimates used in the First Letter of Amendment were based.

Furthermore, it seemed preferable to transfer to Chapter 100 the appropriations to cover the expenditure on consumption aid for the 1980/81 marketing year if the measure is renewed. In the First Letter of Amendment these appropriations were included in the appropriations for Item 6224.

The total reduction compared with the First Letter of Amendment is 46 m HMA, and 235,9 m HMA are moved to Chapter 100.

Consequently, the Second Letter of Amendment differs from the First Letter of Amendment as follows:

2. OILS AND FATS: OLIVE OIL

- 2,1 m EUA

At its meeting on agriculture on 24 July 1979, the Council decided that the complementary financing of the drawing-up of the register of elive cultivation would take the form of deductions from production aid. This decision was the subject of Regulation No 1794/79 of 9 August 1979.

Deductions from the foreseeable payments in 1980 of production aids for the 1979/80 marketing year will thus amount to 140,9 m EUA x 1,47% = 2,1 m EUA. Consequently, it is necessary to reduce production aids by 2,1 m EUA.

III. Changes in the Food Aid appropriations

The total appropriations for Title 9 remain the same as in the first Letter of Amendment, but changes have been made within the Title:

(a) Effects on refunds

The recovery of world cereal prices has led to a considerable reduction in refund rates, particularly for common wheat.

In addition, a slight reduction in the refund rate for milk powder has also changed the amount of refunds in respect of this product.

The overall result is a reduction in the amount of Food Aid refunds of 14.927.000 EUA, which breaks down as follows:

(b) Effects on the value of the products

On the other hand, the value of these products (common wheat and milk powder) estimated on the basis of world prices will increase by an equivalent amount.

The Food Aid appropriations thus remain unchanged as a whole.

IV. Effects on own resources

The recent developments on the agricultural markets have fairly large repercussions on agricultural levies; but the effects on sugar production and storage levies may be regarded as negligible.

The changes in own resources and expenditure naturally affect the VAT rate, and thus the resources to be paid ever by the Member States under this head.

1. Agricultural levies

The recovery of prices on the world openeals market has reduced the difference between these prices and the Community's threshold prices; this reduction, in other words the cut in the rates of levies on cereal imports, leads to a fall in the revenue from these levies, if there are no changes in the assumptions concerning imports.

This drop affects all the Member States except the United Kingdom, where the trend in the exchange rate has considerably reduced the negative impact of the MCAs on the levies (in the case of those Member States with a depreciated currency, the MCAs granted in respect of imports from non-member countries are subtracted from the levies). The increase in the figure for the United Kingdom due to the currency trend is extimated to be higher than the drop caused by the recovery of cereal prices on the world market.

For all the Member States together, a drop of 76 m ENA is expected against the estimates in the First Letter of Amendment to the Preliminary Draft Budget.

2. Sugar levies

A slight increase in the estimates of quantities subject to sugar production and storage levies results in an increase - albeit negligible - in these resources.

4. VAT rate

Taking into account the changes in expenditure and revenue set out in this Letter of Amendment, the VAT rate rises from 0,8848% to 0,8866%. The amount to be financed from VAT revenue increases by 27,7 m EUA compared with the First Letter of Amendment.






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
