## The European Parliament,

- having regard to the declaration of the Nine on democratic principles,
- considering the proposed cooperation agreement between the EEC and Yugoslavia and the agreement concluded by the Member States of the European Coal and Steel Community with Yugoslavia,
- considering that the accession of Greece to the Community will necessitate greater ties between Yugoslavia and the EEC,
- considering the vast number of Yugoslavian migrant workers residing on Community territory,
- considering the need to establish closer links between the European Parliament and the Yugoslavian Assembly,
- 1. Expresses its profound sympathy with the people of Yugoslavia on the death of their esteemed President, Mr Josip Broz TITO;
- 2. Urges the Governments of the Nine Member States to reiterate to the Government of Yugoslavia their profound concern for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Yugoslavia;
- 3. Stresses that economic and social cooperation between the European Economic Community and Yugoslavia would be severely jeopardized if instability was to set in in the region;
- 4. Condemns Soviet hegemony and expansionism;
- 5. Calls on all countries to refrain from increasing tension in the area and to continue to pursue a policy of détente;
- 6. Notes that Yugoslavia, apart from being a Mediterranean country with all the political and economic problems characteristic of that region, is also a non-aligned country which skilfully balances its domestic and foreign policies;
- 7. Instructs its President to forward this resolution to the Council, the Commission and the Foreign Ministers meeting in political cooperation.

## **JUSTIFICATION**

Urgency is justified by the critical situation due to uncertainties and tensions in the region following the death of President Tito.
