MOTION FOR A RESOLUTION

## THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT,

- concerned at the revival of activity by extreme right wing terrorist groups,
- concerned also at the resurgence of racist and anti-Semitic ideologies in various Community countries,
- considering that the numerous outrages perpetrated in recent months clearly show where incitement to racial hatred leads,
- noting with indignation the attempts by individuals or groups of
  Fascist persuasion to play down the seriousness of Nazis' crimes;
- Strongly opposes the moves being made with a view to the release of Rudolf Hess, taking the view that such moves, ostensibly motivated by humanitarian considerations and grounds of cost, constitute a provocation and an insult to the memory of the Nazis' victims;
- 2. Calls on the Member States instead to adopt, or comprehensively tighten up, legislation laying down penal sanctions for racist offences, racial discrimination and incitement to racial hatred:
- 3. Therefore requests the Commission to submit to the Council and Parliament a draft directive harmonizing anti-racist legislation in the Member States of the Community on the basis of the most effective provisions adopted by the various countries;
- 4. Requests its President to forward this resolution to the President of the Commission of the European Communities.
