

1. Maastricht European Council

1.1.1. On 23 and 24 March the European Council met in Maastricht, in the Dutch province of Limburg, with Mr van Agt, Prime Minister of the Netherlands and President of the Council and of political cooperation, in the chair. The Commission was represented by Mr Thorn and Mr Ortoli.

This was the first European Council formally attended by the Heads of State or of Government of the now ten Member States, since Greece had joined the Community on 1 January and took part in the proceedings on the same footing as the other Member States. The Greek Prime Minister had in fact attended the Luxembourg European Council on 1 and 2 December 1980, but with observer status only when specifically Community matters were discussed.¹

In Maastricht, Community problems dominated the discussions, reflecting the desire to give a political fillip to the search for agreement on a number of difficult issues, such as fisheries, steel and certain aspects of the 1981/82 farm price review, and raising hopes which subsequent Council meetings often failed to fulfil. International affairs were also to the fore, under the 'political cooperation' head, and these were, as expected, the subject of a number of declarations: on Poland, Afghanistan and the Middle East.

The Commission had made its usual contribution to the preparations by providing the European Council with a series of papers to facilitate or guide its discussions. Major papers covered the economic, social and financial situation, preparations for a joint meeting of Finance and Social Affairs Ministers, commercial relations between the Community and the United States and Japan, and the North-South Dialogue. In addition, the scene was set for this Maastricht European Council by several bilateral meetings between Heads of Government of Community countries, visits to the United States by representatives of four Member States, the talks that Mr Genscher, the German Foreign Minister, had in Moscow, and the circuit of the Community's capitals made by Mr Thorn, President of the Commission, on taking office.

The participants were not of one mind as to the interpretation to be put on the outcome of this European Council; at all events the uncompromising attitude of the British Prime Minister seems to have provoked a degree of irritation and misgivings for the future in some of the delegations.

Results

1.1.2. The Community topics dealt with at the Maastricht meeting and the outcome of the discussions are set out in a summary issued by the Presidency; this is accompanied by the political cooperation declarations.

Community matters: the Presidency's summary

1.1.3. The following is the full text of the summary issued by the Presidency to the national delegations and made public after the meeting. It deals primarily with various aspects of the economic and social situation and the prospects for the future on that front.

Economic and social situation

1.1.4. The European Council devoted a considerable part of its meeting to a detailed and searching review of the present state of the European Community.

There was unanimous agreement that in the present difficult economic conditions the Community remains an essential achievement and an indispensable instrument for limiting the effects of the recession and bringing about the return, on a sound and stable basis, of sustained economic growth and satisfactory levels of employment. To achieve this purpose and reduce the level of inflation the European Council concluded that the continuation of prudent monetary policies, a healthy budgetary management, and the reorientation of public and private expenditure in the direction of productive investment are major elements. The European Council expressed the view that the reinforcement of the economic structure of the Member States requires an effort that must be

maintained over a number of years and that shortterm demand stimuli will turn out to be ineffective.

The European Council welcomed the recent economic measures taken by the Governments of some member countries.

In the field of monetary policy, an intensification of the dialogue with the United States of America is desirable, in particular with a view to achieving a concerted attitude on monetary policy and interest rates. The European Council requested the Council (Ministers of Finance) to act accordingly and also to pursue its work with a view to making the best possible use of the mechanisms of the European Monetary System.

High and divergent inflation rates are a threat both to the prospects of growth and to the economic and monetary cohesion of the Community. In this context the European Council also discussed the effects caused by rigid systems of indexation of incomes and expressed the opinion that an adjustment of such mechanisms should be considered.

The high and rising rates of unemployment, especially among youth, are a cause of deep concern to the European Council. It was agreed that the fight against this evil should be conducted, not only by the Member States, but also at the Community level. The basic requirement for a general turn for the better lies in the recovery of the employment situation in the private sector. A lasting improvement in this situation requires a structural reinforcement of the European economy through cost restraint and a rise in productive investments and productivity. The European Council considers that in the present situation intensive consultation with the social partners is of vital importance.

In this context the European Council recalled its earlier conclusion with regard to the joint Council of Ministers of Economic Affairs, Finance, Social Affairs and Employment to consider general economic and social problems and in particular unemployment. It stressed its conviction that a thorough preparation of such a Council meeting is of the highest importance.

The pursuit of a coherent energy policy remains of great importance for the reinforcement of the European economy. Reduction of dependence on imported oil and the utilization of alternative fuels are vital to employment and the balance of payments.

With regard to the future development of the Community, proposals on the restructuring of Community policies in accordance with the decisions taken on 30 May 1980¹ will be presented in time for consideration at the European Council's next meeting.

The European Council has discussed the problems of fisheries. It expressed concern at the failure to reach agreement because of its effects on European integration and on those who work in the fisheries sector. It therefore invited the Council (Ministers of Fisheries) to meet this week to resolve the problems.

The European Council requested the Council (Ministers of Agriculture) to continue and to intensify its discussions on the proposals on agricultural prices and economies for $1981/82^2$ with the will to reach agreement by 1 April 1981.³

The development of other Community policies remains an urgent task if the Community's viability is to be assured in the longer term and if the goals of economic convergence are to be reached.

With regard to industry, coordinated efforts should be made to foster the development of hightechnology and innovative enterprises in order to increase the competitive strength of the European economy. Restructuring of industries should be allowed to proceed in an orderly fashion with due regard to the maintenance of conditions of fair competition and to the social aspects.

Member States should refrain from engaging in a competitive escalation of State aid to industry which would, in the end, be self-defeating and destructive. In particular, the restructuring of the steel industry is a priority objective.⁴ The European Council supports all the elements of the conclusions of the Council (Industry) on 3 March.⁵ It stresses particularly the need to maintain the unity of the market, by scaling down and gradually eliminating the State aid and by reducing less competitive capacities.

The Community can further contribute to economic recovery by fully utilizing existing mechanisms for policy coordination and by ensuring that the existing funds and financial mechanisms contribute as much as possible to agreed social and economic objectives and the reduction of unemployment. Particular attention should be given in this context to the possibilities of providing advanced technological training and education for youth.

The European Council believes that in so doing the European Community can successfully traverse the period of economic recession and contribute significantly to the return of more favourable conditions.

Spain

1.1.5. The European Council expressed its great satisfaction at the reaction of the King, Government and people of Spain in the face of the attacks recently made against the democratic system of their country.

This reaction strengthens the political structures which will enable a democratic Spain to accede to the democratic community represented by the European Community.

North-South relations

1.1.6. The European Council stressed and reconfirmed the advantage of the opening of concrete negotiations between the industrialized countries and the developing countries with regard to serious international economic problems. With an eye to this and to the international conferences foreseen, the European Council instructed the General Affairs Council to examine the Commission proposals on Community policy in the North-South Dialogue¹ and to report to it at its next meeting in June.

European passport

1.1.7. The European Council expressed its satisfaction with the substantial progress recently made with regard to the introduction of a European passport.

Seat of the institutions

1.1.8. The Heads of State and of Government decided unanimously to confirm the *status quo* in regard to the provisional places of work of the European institutions.'

Political cooperation: declarations

1.1.9. The European Council adopted the following declarations on international matters discussed in the political cooperation context.

Middle East

Middle East mission which he is at present carrying out on behalf of the Ten on the basis of the Venice Declaration of 13 June 1980² and the Luxembourg Declaration of 2 December 1980.³ The Council noted with satisfaction the welcome given to the mission to date and considered as encouraging the attention and interest with which the parties so far consulted viewed the European efforts.

In the light of the consultations Mr van der Klaauw will hold during the weeks to come, a final report will be presented to the meeting of the European Council on 20 and 30 June 1981.'

Lebanon

1.1.11. 'The European Council notes with great concern the latest developments in southern Lebanon, which have led to the tragic deaths of three Nigerian UNIFIL soldiers stationed there in the cause of re-establishing peace and security in the region.

As the European Council has stated on many occasions, the independence, sovereignty and territorial integrity of Lebanon must be fully respected.

The European Council considers that only the complete implementation of UNIFIL's mandate can create the conditions necessary for a progressive return of the south of the country to Lebanese sovereignty.

In order to enable UNIFIL to carry out its mandate in its entire area of operations up to the internationally recognized boundaries, the ten Member States of the European Community, some of which contribute troops to UNIFIL, call for the immediate and full cooperation of all interested parties.

In this connection, the European Council supports the statement made on 20 March 1981 by the current President of the Security Council warning against the placing of any obstacle in the way of the efforts of UNIFIL to discharge its mandate in full.'

Afghanistan

1.1.12. 'The European Council notes with grave concern that the military operations by Soviet troops against the Afghan people, who are resisting this external interference, continue without interruption. The tragic course of events in Afghanistan constitutes a severe ordeal for the Afghan people and expresses itself in the form of a massive flood of refugees who are a heavy burden

for neighbouring countries, in particular for Pakistan. The developments in Afghanistan remain a threat to the stability of relations in the region and worldwide.

In face of the situation resulting from the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan, the European Council has called many times, and in particular at its meeting in Venice in June 1980,¹ for respect for the sovereignty and territorial integrity of Afghanistan and for an end to all interference in the internal affairs of that country. The Council has stated on many occasions the need for a solution which entails the withdrawal of foreign troops from Afghanistan and which permits the Afghan people to exercise freely their right to self-determination, and for Afghanistan thus to return to its traditional status as an independent State, neutral and non-aligned.

The European Council supports any initiative which could lead to the desired result and welcomes in particular the initiative which was the subject of the resolution of the United Nations of 20 November 1980, and that put forward recently by France.'

Poland

1.1.13. 'The European Council reaffirms its position on Poland as expressed in its statement of 2 December 1980.² This statement is as valid today as it was then.

The Council notes that Poland has shown that she is capable of facing her internal problems herself in a spirit of reason and responsibility. It is in the interest of the Polish people that Poland should continue to do so in a peaceful manner and without outside interference. It is also in the interest of stability in Europe.

The Council is following recent developments in Poland with great concern. It underlines the obligation of all States signatory to the Helsinki Final Act to base their relations with Poland on the strict application of the Charter of the United Nations and the principles of the Final Act.

It emphasizes that any other attitude would have very serious consequences for the future of international relations in Europe and throughout the world.

The European Council heard a report by Mr Genscher on his recent visit to Poland.

The European Council recalls that the Ten have already responded, both individually and in the Community framework, to the Polish request for economic support.³ They are disposed, within the limits of their means and in collaboration with others, to continue their contribution to the recovery of the Polish economy so as to complement the efforts of the Polish people itself. Having regard to the present situation, the European Council expressed understanding for the Polish wishes for extra food supplies. It requested the Commission and the Council, in agreement with the partner countries which are already taking part in the Paris discussions, to examine these wishes as soon as possible. It called on the Council, the Commission and the Member States to decide on their participation in this action as a matter of urgency.'

Reaction of the Commission

1.1.14. The outcome of the Maastricht European Council was reviewed at the Commission meeting on 25 March, and at a press conference given by Mr Thorn on 27 March.

Statements by the President

1.1.15. At his press conference in Brussels, Mr Thorn stated that this Council had given the Ten an opportunity to reflect and had enabled them to have serious discussions and a valuable exchange of ideas, although no spectacular decisions had been reached.

Mr Thorn felt that discussions on the economic, social and financial situation had proved particularly helpful; the Commission's background document had been very useful and appreciated by all the delegations.

On fisheries, the President explained that he had failed in his efforts at Maastricht to separate the issues of the external agreement and a common fisheries policy; the Council meeting on 27 March had also rejected the idea, so the problems remained linked. Nevertheless, he felt that the atmosphere had been much more relaxed than at the previous Council meeting, no doubt because it had been recognized at Maastricht that this matter had to be resolved as quickly as possible. Current expectations were for a general arrangement being agreed in the late spring.

As regards the seat of the Community institutions, and particularly Parliament, Mr Thorn referred to the resolutions adopted by the House in November 1980 and to the conclu-

sions of the Maastricht Council. He stressed that his duty as President of the Commission was clear-cut: the Commission was the guardian of the Treaties, and as its President he would see that they were honoured. Mr Thorn added that in this particularly difficult time for the Community the question of its seat was important enough, but that there were much more vital matters to be attended to.

As for the declaration on Poland, the Commission saw it as its number one priority to give effect to the European Council's intentions as regards food aid for Poland. On 27 March Mr Thorn had therefore met the economics attaché of the Polish Embassy, who had explained his country's needs. These were being examined by the Commission, with a view to proposals for decision being put to the Council.¹

2. The Community's policy in the North-South Dialogue

1.2.1. On 23 March the Commission sent the Council a communication attempting to outline the policy which the Community should adopt in the North-South Dialogue, due to enter an important phase in 1981 with the UN global negotiations, the Ottawa economic summit and the North-South summit in Mexico. The Commission is proposing a number of measures and negotiating positions in the various areas of economic relations between industrialized and developing countries: energy, development financing, food, trade and commodities.

After looking at some of the major factors in the crisis besetting the world economy, the Commission stresses the Community's specific responsibilities, outlines its objectives in the North-South Dialogue, and proposes a Community platform for the negotiations.

The crisis, the Community and the North-South Dialogue

1.2.2. The first section of the communication highlights various aspects of the current situation, in which political conflict areas are proliferating and there is increasingly close interpenetration between economic developments in the industrialized countries and the Third World, with the developing countries emerging as markets and competitors and constraints arising from food and energy shortages.

The problems are mainly affecting the Third World, but solving them would improve the Community's own prospects of pulling out of recession. Europe must therefore stress the link which exists between the economic and political security of the West and a new form of international economic relations offering the developing countries a satisfactory outlook.

The Commission therefore considers that the Community's broad aim should be to seek ways of ensuring the security of its own international environment and achieving more predictable patterns of behaviour all round. It also has specific objectives to aim for on energy, food and financing and the restructuring of its own productive sectors.

Community platform for the North-South negotiations

1.2.3. In the following section the Commission goes on to suggest lines of approach to the various problems considered.

Energy

1.2.4. Here, the emphasis is placed on the following points:

(a) the need for internal action by the main energy consumers to reduce consumption and develop alternative sources;

(b) external, the need for all parties to cooperate on financing energy development in the developing countries, with industrialized countries and oil exporters sharing the costs in ways to be determined. In this connection the Commission supports the idea of a new World Bank energy affiliate. Further, the interests of the oil producers as a whole---safeguarding their assets and broadening their economic base-must be taken into account. There should be permanent facilities for multilateral consultations on issues not coming within the scope of bilateral or regional relations, to allow the exchange of information on energy development and encourage technical cooperation between industrialized and developing countries.

Finance

1.2.5. In this field several types of action would be required:

(a) the financing of deficits and growth in the non-oil developing countries, by keeping up bank lending, encouraging other forms of transfer, improving public financing machinery by means of increased allocations and adjustments in the terms offered and instruments used, making full use of the existing institutions and setting up a World Bank energy affiliate;

(b) the investment of oil surpluses;

(c) various measures to strengthen financial cooperation between the industrialized countries and OPEC surplus countries and improve the stability of the financial system.

Food and agriculture

1.2.6. The stress in this field is placed on:

(a) the need for coordinated action by all exporting countries to boost supply and production in shortfall countries through pricing, credit, storage, transport and other policies;

(b) efforts to stabilize world markets for foodstuffs, including the negotiation of new agreements (e.g. wheat) and the provision of bulk storage facilities in the developing countries;

(c) the formulation of a Community export policy (security of supply for the developing countries);

(d) access to the Community market for developing country agricultural exports;

(e) more and better-adjusted food aid.

Industrial restructuring and the Community's trade relations

1.2.7. The Commission takes the view that the main task in the coming years is to adjust production structures. The communication deals mainly with the external side of such adjustment—the importance of trade relations, particularly with the developing countries, and the opening-up of markets to developing countries, leading to genuine industrial cooperation, with consultations, coordinated action, codes of conduct, etc.

Commodities

1.2.8. The Commission emphasizes the importance of effective action on investments, particularly in the mining sector. Among other things, there is a need to ensure price stability at levels which offer adequate returns to producers and are equitable for consumers, and to step up scientific and technical cooperation, promote mining investment and encourage local processing of primary products.

Negotiations on the fisheries policy 3.

1.3.1. Although the fisheries problem was discussed by the European Council at Maastricht on 23 March and although the Fisheries Ministers held two Council meetings, on 9-11 March and on 27 March, no decision has been taken on the new common policy, which, according to the declaration of 30 May,¹ should have been introduced at the beginning of this year.

The March negotiations confirmed that the principal obstacle is still that of access to fishing-grounds. Other important points, including TACs for 1981 and allocation of quotas, also remain outstanding.

Agreement on access is difficult because this is an area in which the interests of the Member States, particularly those of the United Kingdom and France, are sharply opposed. Large parts of the fishing-grounds of France and other continental Member States are located in British waters, in some cases inside the 12-mile limit and in some cases outside.

As a compromise between the United Kingdom's claim for preferential treatment for its fishermen and the position of other Member States more in favour of the principle of equality of access deriving from the Treaty, the Commission proposed the following for a period of ten years:

the right of the Member States to reserve fishing exclusively to their own nationals to be extended to the entire 12-mile limit provided that the historic rights mentioned in the 1972 Act of Accession (Articles 100 and 101) are respected and that other Member States are allowed to continue their normal fishing practices between the 6-mile and 12-mile limits:

possible institution beyond the 12-mile limit in the sensitive area north of Scotland of a non-discriminatory licence system so that the amount of fishing done can be more closely monitored.

The Commission's proposals were supported by the majority of the delegations but not by the United Kingdom, which maintained its position that the exercise of the other Member States' historic rights in the 6 to 12mile zone should be reduced and fishing by vessels of more than 80 feet should be prohibited in a number of sensitive areas extending well beyond the 12-mile limit, in particular around the Shetlands and the Orkneys.

In the absence of general agreement the United Kingdom maintained its refusal to approve the agreement with Canada and the arrangements with The Faroes and with Sweden, which were due to enter into force on 1 January 1981.

Explaining its position with regard to the agreement with Canada, the United Kingdom delegation pointed to the effects that the tariff concessions involved would have on its already disturbed market, while no compensation was offered to British fishermen in the form of a satisfactory internal Comunity policy. In view of the increasingly harmful consequences of the lack of agreement with Canada for the German distant-water fleet. which was losing large catches, the Council sought a minimum approach to enable the agreement to be concluded. The Commission proposed special measures for supporting the market, particularly that of the United Kingdom, but this did not meet with success, even at the European Council.

The Council meeting of 27 March, which was held at the European Council's request, found that it could not resolve the difficulties, particularly that of access, without more thorough preparation. The Council reaffirmed its intention to take definitive decisions on a common fisheries policy during the spring.

The Council extended until 30 June next² the Regulation on technical conservation measures due to expire at the end of March.³ It noted the Member States' usual agreement to keep their fishing activities to a level corresponding to that of the previous year until that date.

4. Introduction to the 1980 Social Report¹

1.4.1. Economic activity in the Community suffered a serious crisis during 1980. Growth-rates sagged, while unemployment swelled in all Member States, particularly in the last six months.

The number of registered unemployed on 31 December was 8 million, an increase of 29% over end 1979. The situation is especially serious for women and for young people under 25, who make up respectively 43% and 40% of the total unemployed.

1.4.2. The rate of inflation in 1980 remained both a problem in itself, and an obstacle to the re-establishment of a higher level of employment. It became apparent that current anti-inflation policies, in so far as they have relied heavily on demand deflation and a restrictive monetary approach, were adversely affecting employment, in the public sector through expenditure cutbacks, and in the private sector through the compression of demand.

1.4.3. The crisis was most severe in certain industrial branches, especially the iron and steel industry, where a state of manifest crisis was declared and Community production quotas imposed on enterprises. Restructuring of this sector boiled down in particular to significant reductions in the numbers employed to 600 000 persons at the end of 1980 although the figure had been more than 700 000 in 1978. The situation was particularly severe in regions where traditional industries now in decline are predominant.

1.4.4. These difficulties caused the Commission and other Community institutions to intensify direct intervention to help workers face up to these problems. An examination of how to develop policies for the labour market and the adaptation of working time over the medium term took place; great efforts were made to get to grips with the problems which will be created for workers by the introduction of new technologies, from the viewpoint of employment and vocational training as well as working conditions.

1.4.5. As regards action in the short term, the Commission considerably developed Social Fund aid for young people.

For 1980, 250 million EUA from the Social Fund were devoted to the vocational training of young people, and another 108 million EUA went on incentives to take on or employ them; in other words a quarter of all Social Fund intervention in 1980.

To help workers in the iron and steel industry, the Commission asked the Council for an exceptional budgetary aid as part of the ECSC appropriation. It would imply the Council releasing new resources — 157 million EUA, of which 112 million EUA would be for 1981 (the rest being spread over 1982 and 1983). This extra budget would enable iron and steel workers to take early retirement or receive benefits in case of short-time work. The Council was unable to take a decision on this point in 1980. Discussions have continued in the Council at the beginning of 1981.

1.4.6. Anxious about the longer-term problems in the labour market, economic prospects and the effects of the introduction of new technologies, the Commission sent several communications in 1980 to the Council of Ministers for Social Affairs and to the Standing Committee on Employment. Some of them deserve special attention in the light of the conclusions which have been drawn from them.

These communications concerned:

• employment and the new microelectronic technology;²

• Community guidelines for a labour market policy;³

- temporary work;⁴
- part-time work;⁵
- flexible retirement.⁵

1.4.7. As regards the impact on employment of the introduction of new microelectronic technology, the Commission's main concern—shared by the Standing Committee on Employment—is to do all that is necessary to prevent this new technology from aggravating the employment situation; rather the contrary, that it should help improve the situation both quantitatively and qualitatively.

Although the two sides of industry are not wholly unanimous in their overall analysis of this problem and the solutions to it, the Standing Committee on Employment agreed to request the implementation of a certain number of priority activities in the field of either general education and vocational training or working conditions.

Over the next few months the Commission intends to submit proposals firstly concerning the implementation of a vocational training policy at Community level capable of resolving the training problems associated with the introduction of these new technologies, and secondly comments and suggestions on the possible effects of these new technologies on the organization of work and on living and working conditions.

1.4.8. In respect of the Community guidelines for labour market policy it should be stressed that the Standing Committee on Employment attached great importance to the setting up of permanent consultation procedures between the public authorities, worker and employer representatives with the aim of drawing up and implementing a labour market policy which would be instrumental in developing a management forecast of the labour market at local and regional level. The purpose would be to draw up such a policy within an adequate frame of reference, ensuring the coordinated development of national and Community financial instruments with a view to assisting and encouraging operations designed to ensure longer-term employment, particularly in small and medium-sized undertakings.

1.4.9. In order to improve the quality of the labour force such a policy needs to be underpinned by the development of a policy cover-

ing education and vocational training, job placement and labour force mobility and which takes account of the demands made by introducing new technologies and of the growth of a small and medium-sized undertakings. Here the role of employment agencies should be strengthened.

The Commission will continue its work on improving the organization of the labour market by submitting a communication on employment to the Council and the Standing Committee on Employment in the first half of 1981.

1.4.10. The Commission and the Standing Committee on Employment examined together the problems involved with temporary work, part-time work and the introduction of flexible retirement as part of the implementation of the Council's Resolution on the adaptation of working time.

1.4.11. Discussions on 'Community guidelines on temporary work' resulted in a broad convergence of opinions on the need to protect the legitimate interests of temporary workers as regards improved employment conditions and social protection while maintaining employers' operational flexibility; in respect of transfrontier temporary employment, stress was laid on the need for close and effective cooperation between the competent public authorities of the Member States.

1.4.12. In connection with voluntary parttime work, the Committee agreed broadly on the principles set out by the Council, in particular that part-time work should be voluntary, and any discrimination as regards remuneration between part-time and full-time workers should be eliminated. The Committee invited the Commission to incorporate these guidelines in proposals for appropriate Community instruments.

1.4.13. In respect of flexible retirement, a broad consensus emerged in favour of acknowledging that all workers should gradually be given the right, as from a certain age, to choose when they want to retire. The Commission will follow through on this basis and submit appropriate proposals in due course. 1.4.14. In view of the disturbing trend in health costs, particularly the costs of medical and hospital treatment and medicines, the Commission intends to submit proposals to the Council aimed at intensifying the Community's activities in the field of public health. Further, it believes it should pursue the implementation of the Community programme of health and safety at work. In an effort to strengthen Community cooperation on social security matters, it might also submit a memorandum on the problems arising from the development of social security systems in Member States.

1.4.15. In conformity with the instructions received from the European Council in Ven-

ice on 12 and 13 June,¹ the Commission intends to pursue an in-depth examination of the comments and proposals likely to strengthen concerted action on employment policies and to combat worsening unemployment. It will carry this out in close cooperation with the Standing Committee on Employment, which will remain the Community's main instrument for promoting a consensus between the two sides of industry on these matters.

1. Building the Community

Economic and monetary policy

European Monetary System

Operation of the EMS

Devaluation of the lira and changes in central rates

2.1.1. On 22 March, applying a joint procedure in which the Commission took part, and after consulting the Monetary Committee,¹ Ministers and Central Bank Governors of the Member States agreed to adjust central rates within the EMS. The following changes in bilateral central rates were made:

(a) with effect from 23 March, the Italian lira was devalued by 6% against all other EMS currencies;

(b) the bilateral central rates of all other currencies remain unchanged.

The new central rates against the ECU are as follows:

The devaluation followed a period of concealed speculation against the lira, aggravated recently by a worsening current payments deficit and by the persistence of inflationary pressures and imbalances in the public finances.

The devaluation of the lira was accompanied by other monetary measures: the discount rate was raised from 16.5 to 19% and banks' compulsory reserves increased from 15.75 to 20%. The Italian Government also proposed certain measures to reduce public spending on current account, increase public service charges, and moderate wage demands.

Community loans

Community loans to provide balance-of-payments support

2.1.2. On 16 March the Council formally adopted the Regulation adjusting the Community loan mechanism designed to support the balances of payments of Community Member States,² on which it had reached agreement in February.³

Community assistance for disaster areas in southern Italy

2.1.3. On 20 January the Council had adopted a Decision on exceptional Community aid for the reconstruction of the areas devastated by the Italian earthquake in November 1980.⁴ Rules on the implementation of the Decision have now been laid down in a trilateral agreement which defines the procedure for the grant of the assistance, set at 1 000 million ECU. The agreement was signed on 16 March by Mr Andreatta, Treasury Minister, on behalf of Italy, Mr Ortoli on behalf of the Commission, and Mr Le Portz, Chairman, on behalf of the European Investment Bank.

Under the scheme, the proceeds of loans contracted by the Commission on behalf of the Community will be on-lent for the purpose of financing investments for the reconstruction of the means of production and the economic and social infrastructure in the areas affected. Loans will be granted either from the European Investment Bank's own resources or from resources available under the New Community Instrument.

The rates of interest on the loans will be reduced by interest rebates of 3% par annum, over 12 years, chargeable to the Community budget.

Economic situation

First quarterly examination

2.1.4. At its meeting on 16 March the Council (economic and financial affairs) conducted its first quarterly examination of the economic situation in the Community, on the basis of a Commission communication, in accordance with Article 2 of the Council Decision of 18 February 1974 on the attainment of a high degree of convergence between the Member States' economic policies.

The Council expressed agreement with the Commission's opinion that for the time being the economic policy guidelines for the current year, which the Council adopted on 15 December 1980,¹ should not be altered.

As regards Greece, which joined the Community after the annual report was approved in December, the Council, after expressing a favourable view, transmitted the economic policy guidelines which the Commission communication formulates to Parliament and the Economic and Social Committee for their opinion.

2.1.5. The European Council held on 23 and 24 March spent a large part of its time discussing the economic and social situation in the Community. The results of these deliberations figure prominently in the summary issued by the Presidency.²

Monetary Committee

2.1.6. The Monetary Committee held its 269th meeting in Brussels on 4 March, with Mr Dini, Vice-Chairman, in the chair. It discussed international monetary problems and the conduct of exchange-rate policy towards non-Community currencies.

On 22 March it was informed of the Italian authorities' intention to change the central rates for the lira; by expedited procedure it adopted an opinion to the Council and the Commission on the same day; the opinion was one of the factors on the basis of which Ministers took the decision to make adjustments within the EMS.³

Economic Policy Committee

2.1.7. The Economic Policy Committee held two meetings in March:

(a) at the first, held on 17 and 18 March in the reduced 'medium-term' composition, it heard members' views on the forthcoming Fifth Medium-term Economic Policy Programme;

(b) at the second, a plenary meeting held on 31 March, it considered the Fifth Programme and defined the content and function of quantitative projections and scenarios.

Internal market and industrial affairs

Free movement of goods

Removal of technical barriers to trade

Industrial products

2.1.8. On 26 March the Council decided⁴ to postpone the date by which effect is to be given to its Directive of 26 June 1978⁵ relating to the classification, packaging and labelling of dangerous preparations (pesticides), which was initially set at 1 January 1981, pending the drafting of Annex IIII (List of active substances) and the updating of Annex II (Classification by calculation) to the Directive.

2.1.9. On 31 March the Commission transmitted to the Council a proposal to amend, by adapting to technical progress the methods for determining the biodegradability of surfactants used in detergents, the Council Directive of 22 November 1973 relating to methods of testing the biodegradability of anionic surfactants.⁶

Business law

Economic and commercial law

2.1.10. On 19 March the Commission transmitted to the Council a proposal for a Directive concerning the annual accounts of banks and other financial institutions.¹

Small businesses. Business cooperation. Distributive trades

Business Cooperation Centre

2.1.11. In pursuance of its new guidelines laid down by the Commission,² the Business Cooperation Centre, in conjunction with the Athens Chamber of Commerce and Industry, held a meeting in Brussels on 19 March on the subject of industrial investment and cooperation in Greece. The 250 participants considered the contacts they made at the meeting profitable and likely to lead to agreements for cooperation.

Free movement of persons and freedom to provide services

Mutual recognition of diplomas. Access to occupations

Doctors

2.1.12. Meeting on 10 March, the Advisory Committee on Medical Training adopted an opinion on the mutual recognition of periods of training completed in another Member State in the context of specialized training, together with a report and recommendations on the problems of the balance between the number of medical students and the resources needed for training them. The Committee also heard reports on examination methods and the assessment of results of medical training in Ireland.

2.1.13. As in previous years, the Committee of Senior Officials on Public Health took stock of the migration of doctors in the Community. Table 1 shows the number of doctors who are nationals of Member States and who in 1979 were given an authorization to practise in a Member State other than that in which they obtained their qualification. For the first time, too, statistics relating to the migration of nurses responsible for general care were compiled (Table 2).

Special rights of citizens and passport union

Uniform passport

2.1.14. Considerable progress was made towards the introduction of a uniform passport in the Community, notably at the Council meeting of 16-17 March. Only certain technical problems remain to be solved, which raises expectations of a prompt decision—awaited ever since the Heads of State and of Government agreed that a uniform passport should be introduced at the European Council meeting in Rome in December 1975.³

Industry

Steel

2.1.15. The Council met twice in March to discuss the restructuring of the steel industry. These two meetings led to an agreement on new ground rules—drawn up by the Commission in its February communications⁴ —which should enable the Member States to continue to employ their combined forces in tackling the 'manifest crisis' facing the European steel industry. A resolution⁵—which incorporates and in a number of respects amplifies the terms of a resolution adopted on 3 March—was adopted at the meeting of 26-27 March which calls on the Member States progressively to remove State aids and on the producers themselves to exercise strict discipline and to reduce capacities.

2.1.16. The problems raised by the restructuring of the steel industry were also discussed at the 6 and 19 March meetings of the ECSC Consultative Committee,¹ which on 6 March had reviewed the results of the application of production quotas.

2.1.17. On 13 March the Commission fixed the rates of abatement for steel production for the second quarter of $1981.^2$ These are as follows, broken down by groups of rolled products:

2.1.18. By a Decision adopted on 3 March³ the Commission extended, for the duration of the production quota system, its powers to obtain information and make checks under Article 47 of the ECSC Treaty to include undertakings using high-grade and special steels and stockholders of those products as a means of verifying that producers of high-grade and special steels are complying with the special provisions in force in respect of alloy steels of a certains quality and the price level under which quotas may be exceeded.

2.1.19. The Commission transmitted to the Council, for assent, and to the ECSC Consultative Committee, for consultation, memorandum on the implementation of an iron and steel research programme under which a total of 71 projects will receive financial assistance from the Community amounting to more than 19 million ECU.

Industrial innovation and the information market

Euronet

2.1.20. The results obtained since the recent inauguration of Euronet show that the potential information market in Europe will very largely depend on the degree of assistance afforded end users by the information specialists whose task it will be to make the basic computer output more readily accessible. The Commission therefore intends to hold a conference in October 1981 on the role of intermediaries in the information sector.

A study has been carried on the parameters governing the opening or extension of regional centres to provide the with patent information. The results of this study, which will be communicated to interested parties in the Member States, will be one of the items for discussion at the conference.

Customs union

Economic tariff matters

Tariff quotas

2.1.21. On 27 March the Council adopted two regulations opening, allocating and providing for the administration of Community tariff quotas for carrots and new potatoes originating in Cyprus (1981).¹

Customs procedures with economic impact

Outward processing

2.1.22. On 17 March the Commission sent the Council a proposal for a Regulation establishing economic outward processing arrangements applicable to certain textile and clothing products reimported into the Community after working or processing in certain non-member countries. This measure was included in the 1981 programme for the attainment of customs union and is one of a series of Commission initiatives on textile trade policy.

The proposed Regulation would provide the Community with a means of securing both internal convergence, to the benefit of the Community industry, and access for and industrial cooperation with the developing countries.

General legislation

Procedures for release of goods for free circulation

2.1.23. On 11 March the Commission sent the Council a proposal² to specify the date (1 April 1982) by which Member States must give effect to the Directive of 24 July 1979³ on the harmonization of procedures for the release of goods for free circulation.

Competition

Restrictive practices, mergers and dominant positions: specific cases

Permissible forms of cooperation

Formation of 'Pôle des Indépendants'

2.1.24. On 31 March the Commission granted authorization under Article 65 of the

ECSC Treaty to three medium-sized Belgian companies, Usines Gustave Boël SA, Forges de Clabecq SA and Fabrique de Fer de Charleroi SA, to form an association to be known as 'Pôle des Indépendants'. The object of the association is that the members should devise a joint steel-making strategy through rationalization of production, optimum utilization of plant and the coordination of social, commercial and investment policies.

With regard to specialization, each member undertakes not to manufacture in its plant finished or semi-finished products with could be manufactured under more favourable conditions by another member. In situations of this kind the parties will exchange or transfer the products in question. As far as sales are concerned, they undertake to pool orders in order to optimize production costs. The three companies in question account for approximately 1.8% of the Community's crude-steel output. In 1979 they produced together, under their joint production programme, approximately 1 million tonnes of hot-rolled sheet of a thickness of more than 3 mm. This ranks them, with an 8.3% market share: fifth among Community producers.

Cooperation of this type between mediumsized firms can play a significant role in the current restructuring of the Community steel industry by enabling production to be concentrated on the most efficient plant, thus facilitating better utilization of capacity. Consultations between members prior to any investment will prevent the industry being over-equipped. The operation will thus enable firms of this size to contend better with competition from large groups.

Abuse of dominant positions

Restrictions on trade in sound recordings terminated

2.1.25. GEMA, the German copyright protection society, has given the Commission an undertaking that, when sound recordings are imported from other Member States where they have been lawfully marketed, it will henceforth no longer charge the difference between the royalty paid in the exporting Member State and the royalty ordinarily paid in the Federal Republic of Germany.

Until now, when importing gramophone records into the Federal Republic of Germany, importers have had to pay to GEMA the difference between the royalty ordinarily paid in the Federal Republic of Germany and the generally lower royalty already paid abroad. This practice led to a complaint to the Commission by a record manufacturer and also to proceedings before the Court of Justice, which gave judgment on 20 January affirming the Commission's view that charging the additional royalty constituted an infringement of the Treaty provisions on the free movement of goods.¹

GEMA's undertaking that in future it will no longer impede intra-Community trade in sound recordings removes a further barrier to the establishment of a common market. This should also have a beneficial effect on consumer prices.

State aids

Regional aids

France

2.1.26. On 18 March the Commission decided, pending the comprehensive review of the French regional development aids scheme which it is to carry out before the end of the year, not to raise any objections to the introduction of two measures notified to it by the French Government pursuant to Article 93(3) of the EEC Treaty.

The first measure is for the extension until 31 December 1981 of a number of schemes which are then to undergo comprehensive review by the French authorities. The schemes in question are the regional development premium (PDR),² the service industries location premium (PLAT),³ the research

activities location premium (PLAR) and special rural aid.¹

The object of the second measure is to extend the Special Industrial Conversion Fund (FSAI)² to the Nord/Pas-de-Calais mining area, i.e. the Douai, Béthune and Lens PDRdesignated employment areas. In view of the social and economic situation in those areas, the Commission authorized extension of FSAI aid to them until 31 December 1981.

The Commission will state its views on the reformed schemes after that date.

United Kingdom

2.1.27. The Commission stated its views on one of the most important aids granted under the United Kingdom's regional aid scheme,³ the regional development grant (RDG), in the context of the constant review of systems of aid provided for in Article 93(1) of the EEC Treaty and in accordance with the principles of coordination of regional aid systems.⁴ The RDG, an investment subsidy, possesses features that are characteristic of operational aid in that it is granted in respect of all investments (including the routine replacement of capital goods), virtually automatically on the basis of expenditure incurred, and has been introduced for an unlimited period.

The Commission has always made clear its objection in principle to operational aids on the grounds that they do not promote or facilitate the economic development of regions as provided in Article 92(3)(a) or Article 92(3)(c) of the EEC Treaty. If granted to cover a firm's production costs (and not to create, extend or launch an activity which would bring about a fundamental change), they do not, in a given region, increase income or reduce unemployment. By favouring certain firms, aids of this type are consequently liable to distort competition in intra-Community trade without contributing to the development of the region.

In discussions between the relevant British Government and Commission departments the United Kingdom has agreed—as an appropriate measure required by the functioning of the common market pursuant to Article 93(1) of the EEC Treaty—to alter the RDG by ridding it of its operational aid aspects and making it compatible with the common market. This operation, begun in 1981, must be completed not later than 1984.

The Commission, for its part, decided not to object to the maintenance of United Kingdom regional aids at their existing overall volume, in view of the changes notified to it in 1979,³ provided the aid ceilings laid down in the principles of coordination are observed and the relative socio-economic situation of assisted areas in the United Kingdom shows no significant improvement.

Industry aids

Belgium

2.1.28. The Commission decided on 6 March to initiate the procedure under Article 93(2) of the EEC Treaty in respect of Belgian Government aid for a paper-manufacturing company under Section 75 of the Economic and Budgetary Reform Act of 5 August 1978.

The aid in question had been decided on and approved by the Belgian Government in mid-1980 but was not notified officially to the Commission until February 1981. It would appear therefore that the Belgian Government is in breach of Article 93(3) of the EEC Treaty.

The Commission is of the opinion moreover that aid for investment in an industry in a difficult market situation is liable to alter the conditions of trade between Member States to an extent that is against the common interest.

Netherlands

2.1.29. On 20 March the Commission took two decisions requiring the Netherlands Government to refrain from granting the additional premium for large scale projects (GPT)

to investments made by a photographic products manufacturer and by a chemicals firm.¹

The GPT was introduced by the Investment Account Act (WIR) of 29 June 1978.² It is granted for planned investments that exceed HLF 30 million. Eligible projects must be notified to the Commission pursuant to Article 93(3) of the EEC Treaty.

The Dutch Government informed the Commission under that provision of its intention to grant the GPT for projects:

(a) to increase the production capacity of a photographic products manufacturer; the amount of investment eligible for aid is HFL 67.8 million and the proposed GPT is HFL 2.7 million; a further grant of HFL 9 million could also be made under the Dutch regional aid system (*Investeringspremieregeling*);

(b) to create polypropylene production capacity at a chemicals firm located in the Europoort area; the amount of the investment eligible for additional aid is HFL 74 million and the GPT is HFL 1.5 million.

The Commission's two adverse decisions are in keeping with a similar decision taken on 27 July 1979 in connection with the grant of the GPT in respect of investment by a cigarette manufacturer.³ On that occasion the Commission had pointed out that State aids may be considered to be compatible with the common market only if they are justified in the common interest on the ground that they cause recipient firms to take action that will resolve certain structural problems, especially those that are specific to a given region or industry.

After examining the two cases at issue, the Commission felt compelled to observe that no such justification existed here and that normal market forces alone should be adequate, without public intervention, to ensure the normal development of the operations in question. The Commission also noted that a significant proportion of the photographic products being manufactured by the company was intended for the Community market, and that in the case of polypropylene the planned increase in production would probably be exported to other Member States against a background of excess capacity for some years to come. The Commission decided therefore that the projects were likely to alter trading conditions to an extent contrary to the common interest and did not qualify for any of the derogations in Article 92(3) of the EEC Treaty.

Financial institutions and taxation

Financial institutions

Insurance

Indemnity insurance

2.1.30. At its meeting on 16 March the Council had a policy debate on the main problems hampering adoption of the Second Directive on direct insurance other than life assurance, initially proposed by the Commission in 1975 and amended by it in 1978.⁴

The Council reaffirmed the importance it attached to the principle of achieving the effective exercise of freedom to provide services in this area. It asked its competent bodies to concentrate on seeking a compromise solution to the matter of authorization.

Banks

Annual accounts

2.1.31. On 19 March the Commission sent the Council a proposal for a Directive concerning the annual accounts of banks and other financial institutions.⁵ From the viewpoint of harmonization, this Directive will be an important complement to the Fourth Council Directive of 25 July 1978⁵ on the annual accounts of certain types of com-

panies, which, pending subsequent coordination, left Member States free not to apply its provisions to banks and other financial institutions.

The proposal adapts the provisions of the 1978 Directive to the particular characteristics of banks and other financial institutions. However, in order to prevent distortions of competition in the credit sector, it has been given a wider scope than the earlier Directive, to include undertakings with a legal structure not covered by the latter.

The proposal is important in that credit institutions are not at present required in all Member States to publish detailed balancesheets and profit-and-loss accounts. All banks and all other financial institutions doing business in the Community will, once the Directive has been adopted, be obliged to publish comparable annual accounts.

For the rest, the proposal contains only such provisions as deviate from the 1978 Directive. In essence, these are concerned with balance-sheet structure and with the profitand-loss account. Due regard has also been had to the fact that, because of their special features, banks and other financial institutions in virtually all the Member States must exercise a greater degree of caution when valuing assets and liabilities and, within certain limits, making or cancelling value adjustments in respect of risks inherent in banking without this showing up in the accounts.

Employment, education and social policy

1980 Social Report

2.1.32. On 23 March the Commission approved the Report on Social Developments, 1980, to be published in conjunction with the Fourteenth General Report on the Activities of the European Communities.¹

Employment

2.1.33. Employment problems were again a matter for Community concern in March. In

particular, the European Council, meeting at Maastricht, devoted part of its discussions to these questions, which were referred to in the summary of the proceedings issued by the presidency at the close of the meeting.²

Free movement of workers

2.1.34. Since 1973 the Commission has been organizing exchanges between officials of the employment services of the Member States under the 1968 Regulation on the free movement of workers, so as to promote better mutual knowledge of the working methods of placement departments and the rules applied in the field of freedom of movement.

These exchanges have been so successful that the employment departments have decided to continue and expand them. Thus, on 16 March, meetings initiating the first exchanges between the Federal Republic of Germany and Belgium and the Federal Republic of Germany and France were held in Brussels, attended by the heads of the relevant national departments. The Commission also organized meetings in Rome on 3, 4 and 5 March to confirm the continuation of the exchanges between Italy and Belgium, the Federal Republic of Germany and France.

2.1.35. On 13 March Parliament adopted a resolution on linked work and training for young people in the Community.³

European Social Fund

Fund Committee

2.1.36. The Social Fund Committee, meeting in plenary session in Brussels from 13 February to 6 March, examined 220 applications from the Member States for assistance by the Fund. It also gave its opinion on 26 study projects and pilot schemes and discus-

sed guidelines for the management of the Fund during the years 1982 to 1985, for which it proposed that the guidelines at present in force be maintained.

Aid for workers in the ECSC industries

2.1.37. In March, acting under Article 56(2)(b) of the ECSC Treaty, the Commission decided to contribute a total of 15 947 500 ECU towards readaptation aid for 8 124 workers affected by steel industry closures and cutbacks in the United Kingdom.

Education and vocational training

Education Committee

2.1.38. On 3 and 4 March the Education Committee studied the topics on the agenda for the meeting of the Council and the Ministers of Education scheduled for 22 June. The matters to be examined by the Ministers are: the economic and social situation; the effects of economic, social and demographic changes; recognition of academic titles and diplomas and the length of higher-education courses; the integration of handicapped persons into society.

Handicapped persons

2.1.39. On 11 March Parliament adopted a resolution on the economic, social and occupational integration of handicapped persons.¹

2.1.40. The Commission, meanwhile, is promoting the use of new technologies on behalf of handicapped persons. The draft of a handbook for rehabilitation and teaching staff was studied at a seminar on autonomy and communication among handicapped persons and technical aids to communication, held in Luxembourg from 16 to 18 March.

2.1.41. The Education Committee too examined a series of measures concerned with the education and vocational training of handicapped persons which the Commission intends to propose as the Community's contribution to the International Year for Disabled Persons.

Eurydice

2.1.42. On 9 March the Commission convened a meeting in Brussels of the unit heads of Eurydice, the Community's educational information network. A major point for discussion was the implementation of the agreement between the Commission and the Council of Europe—which was also represented —on the joint financing and management of Eudised, the automated multilingual thesaurus, which in time is meant to cover the four priority areas assigned to Eurydice² for the whole Community.

Education and new information technologies

2.1.43. The first of a series of meetings of experts appointed by the Member States, organized by the Commission, was held in Brussels on 26 and 27 March. The meetings are to continue throughout the year with a view to drafting proposals to the Council on education in relation to the new information technologies.

Exchanges of young workers

2.1.44. On 24 March the Commission organized a joint meeting in Brussels of national officials responsible for coordinating exchanges of young workers under the second joint programme³ and of representatives of the bodies promoting these exchanges with a view to examining what was achieved in 1979 and 1980 and the prospects for 1981.

2.1.45. The Commission took part in the ministerial-level meeting held in Athens from 17 to 20 March on technical and vocational training in a Community context, organized by the Greek Ministry of Education.

Health and safety

2.1.46. On 13 March the Commission transmitted to the Council a preliminary

report on the implementation of the Council Directive of 29 March 1977 on biological screening of the population for lead.¹ Exami-

nations have been carried out on nearly 18 000 persons throughout the Community. In general, the results have shown that, while the population exposure level is below the reference levels laid down in the Directive, isolated problems nevertheless exist.

2.1.47. In the context of cooperation between the Commission and Canada a technical meeting was held from 23 to 25 March on methods of measuring asbestos at work. with a view to developing a programme to improve these methods.

2.1.48. At a plenary session held on 25 and 26 March² the Economic and Social Committee delivered its opinion on the proposal for a Directive laying down basic standards for the health protection of workers and the general public against the dangers of microwave radiation.3

Regional policy

Supplementary measures in favour of the United Kingdom

2.1.49. In March the Commission adopted five decisions⁴ implementing the supplementary measures in favour of the United Kingdom.⁵ They are the sequel to the decisions taken in December 1980 and January 1981,6 and authorize a Community contribution of 564.4 million ECU (about UKL 306.8 million) to special infrastructure investment programmes in five United Kingdom regions: the North, Scotland, the South-West, Yorkshire and Humberside, and Northern Ireland. The supported programmes submitted by the United Kingdom Government are multiannual; the Commission has selected from them the categories of infrastructure investment that will make the greatest contribution to the economic development of the regions concerned.

Coordination and programmes

Assessment of the regional impact of other Community policies

2.1.50. A study on the regional impact of the common agricultural policy was delivered to the Commission in March. It was prepared by a group of independent experts in reponse to the Council's resolution concerning the guidelines for regional policy, adopted on 6 February 1979,⁷ which provide that the Commission will take into account the regional impact of Community policies in order to correct any harmful effects they might have on the regions. The study reveals that the farm prices and markets policy must bear part of the responsibility for aggravating the regional disparities in the Community, and throws some light on the regional impact of the possible main reforms of the CAP.

Regional Policy Committee

2.1.51. At its meeting on 4 and 5 March the Regional Policy Committee⁸ took note of the study on the regional impact of the common agricultural policy.9 It heard statements on the preliminary draft of the fifth mediumterm economic policy programme (particularly the regional aspects) and on the regional aspects of the common transport policy.

The Committee also met on 31 March for an exchange of views on a draft memorandum from the Commission on regional policy guidelines and priorities.

Financial instruments

Conversion loans

2.1.52. A conversion loan (Article 56 of the ECSC Treaty) of 3.37 million ECU was paid out by the Commission in March.¹

Environment and consumers

Environment

Cooperation with Switzerland

2.1.53. On 13 March a meeting was held in Brussels²—under the cooperation arrangements between the Commission and Switzerland instituted by an exchange of letters in December 1975³---to discuss various bilateral matters and a number of international matters of interest to both parties.

Prevention and reduction of pollution and nuisances

Freshwater and marine pollution

Oil spills at sea

2.1.54. The Advisory Committee on the Control and Reduction of Pollution caused by Hydrocarbons Discharged at Sea will be operative shortly. On 30 March the Commission appointed the members of the Committee, which was set up by the Decision of 25 June 1980.4

2.1.55. The plenary session of the Economic and Social Committee held on 25 and 26 March delivered opinions on two Commission proposals, one establishing a Community information system for preventing and combating hydrocarbon pollution of the sea⁵ and the other concerning the enforcement, in respect of shipping using Community ports, of international standards for shipping safety and pollution prevention.⁶

Protection of the Mediterranean against pollution

2.1.56. The Community took part in two meetings held in Cannes from 2 to 7 March, viz a further meeting of the contracting parties to the Convention on the Protection of the Mediterranean against Pollution (the Barcelona Convention and protocols) and an intergovernmental meeting of the Mediterranean States to review progress with the Action Plan adopted in Barcelona in 1975.

Agreement was reached on the headquarters of the Action Plan Secretariat (Athens), the budget for 1981-82 and the budget estimates for 1983. The appropriations, which exceed those for 1980, will be used to implement further the various elements of the Action Plan for the Mediterranean, notably the Blue Plan for developing the resources and potential of the Mediterranean; the Priority Action Programme-for aquaculture and new sources of energy, among others things; and the coordinated programme of permanent pollution monitoring and research in the Mediterranean.

2.1.57. Prior to these meetings the Commission sent the Council and Parliament a communication on participation by the European Economic Community in the Action Plan for the Mediterranean. The document reviews the Community's participation in the Plan and sets out the Commission's views on the role which the Community should play in the next few years in matters scientific (research and monitoring), structural (more cooperation between Commission departments and the Action Plan Secretariat, e.g. on energy and marine biological resources) and financial (significant increase in the Action Plan budget and in the Community's annual contribution from 1982).

Implementation of the Oslo and Paris Conventions

2.1.58. From 10 to 12 March the Commission took part in a further meeting—held in Lisbon—of the joint group on permanent monitoring and surveillance set up under the Oslo and Paris Conventions. The main purposes of the meeting were to examine the date on mercury and cadmium concentrations in seawater and living organisms, and to draw conclusions from the surveillance programme.

Protection of groundwater

2.1.59. The Commission was represented at the international symposium on groundwater held in Noordwijkerhout, Netherlands, from 23 to 27 March. The discussions showed clearly that the public must be better informed, that protection zones must be instituted and that discharges of pollutants must be cut down if groundwaters, the chief source of drinking-water, are to be adequately protected. The Commission representative's paper took stock of the Community's work on the subject, notably the Council Directive of 17 December 1979 concerning the protection of groundwater against pollution caused by certain dangerous substances.¹

Chemicals

Chlorofluorocarbons in the environment

2.1.60. The national experts who met in Brussels from 17 to 19 March concentrated on carrying on the work of drawing up Community rules on the use of chlorofluorocarbons (CFCs).² The Commission arranged this meeting to discuss three industries where the amounts of CFCs used tend to increase steadily—the plastic foam, refrigeration and solvents industries. To judge from the information currently available, a standstill within the Community seemed desirable—as did international action. A work plan was drawn up; the main aim is to develop clean technologies in the industries mentioned.

Protection and rational use of land, the environment and natural resources

Flora and fauna

2.1.61. The Commission had observer status at the third conference of the parties to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (the Washington Convention), which was held in New Delhi from 25 February to 8 March. Representatives of 50 of the 67 signatories (including five Community countries) attended, together with a large number of representatives from non-governmental organizations and business.

The Commission representative described progress towards the harmonized application of the Convention throughout the Community. He also announced that the Commission intended to ask for a new clause to be inserted in the Convention enabling the Community as such to be a party alongside its Member States.

Natural resources

2.1.62. Problems with waste treatment and disposal were discussed at two international meetings during the month. An international conference of local authorities (Rome, 10-13 March) saw the Commission present the Community's policy for the collection, treatment and utilization of municipal refuse; an exchange of views took place on the problems facing local authorities and on relevant experiments by them.

2.1.63. From 25 to 27 March some hundred delegates representing government, local authorities and industry in all parts of the Community assembled in Copenhagen for an international meeting on the treatment and disposal of dangerous wastes. This was the first meeting of its kind at European level. The delegates exchanged information and experience about the Member States' present systems for the treatment and disposal of

over 20 million tonnes of dangerous wastes a year (approximately 15% of all industrial waste). In view of the outcome of this meeting, the Commission may have to supplement the Council Directive of 20 March 1978 on toxic and dangerous waste,¹ particularly in view of the serious shortage and uneven regional distribution of treatment capacity in the Community.

Agriculture

Council agreement on prices

2.1.64. At its meeting on 30-31 March and 1-2 April the Council reached overall agreement, not only on agricultural prices for 1981/82 and related measures, but also on a further package of measures, mainly concerning structural policy.

Mr Dalsager, the Commission Member with special responsibility for agricultural policy, said after the meeting that the agreement was of tremendous importance to the Community as a whole as well as to the rural population of some 40 million who would be most directly affected; the Commission had contributed actively by its compromise proposals to the final agreement.

This is the first time since 1974 that the new prices have been available for application from the start of the marketing year.

2.1.65. The agricultural prices for 1981/82are given in Table 3. The average increase is of the order of 11%, including monetary adjustments: the Council made some changes in the exchange rates to be applied in the agricultural sector.² It also extended the use of the ECU under the common agricultural policy until the end of $1981.^3$ The average level of price increase agreed is thus close to the figure advocated by Parliament.⁴ The Economic and Social Committee also took the view that an increase higher than that proposed by the Commission was needed.⁵

The relative levels of prices as between the various sectors have been kept in line with the Commission's original proposals, involving a larger increase in prices for crop products, especially those from the southern parts of the Community.

Main features

2.1.66. The main features of the Council agreement⁶ are summarized below, in the terms of the press release issued after the meeting.

'Milk and milk products

2.1.67. The increase in the target and guide prices will take place from the start of the 1981/82 marketing year, and not in two stages; they will be as follows:

• the target price for milk will go up to 24.26 ECU/100 kg (+ 9%);

• the increase in the intervention price for butter and skimmed-milk powder will be accompanied by a similar rise in the contribution to processing costs, such that the intervention price for butter will rise to 317.84 ECU/100 kg (+ 9%) and the intervention price for skimmed-milk powder will rise to 132.45 ECU/100 kg (+ 9%);

• the contribution to the processing costs for Italian cheeses will rise to 12%, such that the intervention price for 30 to 60-day-old Grana padano will rise to 317.20 ECU/100 kg (+ 9.52%), the intervention price for six-month-old Grana padano will rise to 384.27 ECU/100 kg (+ 9.83%) and the intervention price for six-months-old Parmigiana-Reggiano will rise to 418.87 ECU/100 kg (+ 10.01%).

2.1.68. The co-responsibility levy for 1981/82 is set at 2.5% of the target price, under the same conditions as the current basic co-responsibility levy. Conscious of the need to avoid an increase in milk surpluses and to ensure that the appropriations opened in the 1981 budget for milk are not exceeded, the Council has decided that it will take the necessary measures to ensure a better balance on the market so that budgetary costs can be limited.

If extra costs arise following an increase in milk supplied of more than 1% in 1981 over 1980, the Council will take steps to offset these extra costs by means of appropriate decisions (for example, levy on the increased production, partial suspension of intervention, alteration of the intervention price, application of a progressive basic levy or other appropriate means).

The Council took note of a Commission statement to the effect that the Commission would study in depth the question of an additional coresponsibility levy and the proposal for applying a co-responsibility levy at a higher rate to milk supplied by farmers producing more than 15 000 kg of milk per hectare of forage area. The Council will take a decision on this matter in the light of that study and the progress made in the talks with third countries which supply additional feedingstuffs.

2.1.69. The Council decided that as from 1 January 1982 the rate of the aids for butter would be adjusted as follows: general aid for butter (Regulation (EEC) No 1269/79)—the Community contribution will not exceed 75% of the aid paid and will not exceed 40 ECU/100 kg; general aid for butter payable in the United Kingdom (Regulation (EEC) No 1269/79)—the Community contribution will not exceed 45.94 ECU/100 kg.

The Council took note of a second statement by the Commission that as from 1 October 1981 aid for concentrated butter (Regulation (EEC) No 649/78) will be suspended.

The Council took note of a statement by the Commission to the effect that the Commission would continue to ensure rigorously that other aids and subsidies applicable to butterfat, skimmed-milk powder, liquid skimmed milk and casein were set at the lowest effective level.

The Council agreed to a change in the bracket within which the Commission sets the amount of the aid for skimmed-milk powder, raising it to 50 to 64 ECU instead of 52 to 64 ECU. The Council also agreed to an adjustment of the aids for school milk following the increase in the target price for milk.

Pending the legal finalization of the texts relating to the milk sector, the Council agreed to extend the current year until 6 April 1981.

2.1.70. The Council agreed to the Regulation on the import of New Zealand butter into the Community under special conditions. The import arrangement concerns 70 250 tonnes for the period from 1 April to 31 December 1981 (94 000 tonnes for the whole of 1981) and 92 000 tonnes for 1982. Acting on a proposal from the Commission, the Council will determine before 1 October 1982 the quantity which the United Kingdom will be authorized to import during the 1983 calendar year, taking account among other things of trends in the situation on the Community butter market and trends in the world butter market. Before 1 August 1983 the Council will review, on the basis of a report and a proposal from the Commission, the operation of this arrangement with a view to taking a decision on the arrangement for the import of New Zealand butter after 1 January 1984.

Cereals

2.1.71. The Council agreed in principle to the application of co-responsibility measures in the cereals sector. It decided however that any adjustment to the intervention and reference prices in the context of co-responsibility would not apply during the current marketing year but would be carried over to 1982/83. It will review the matter in greater detail when the prices for 1982/83 are fixed.

The Council invited the Commission to submit as soon as possible its report on durum wheat, particularly as regards the criteria for and the level of direct aid, so that it could examine these criteria in greater depth before the price decisions for 1982/83 were taken.

2.1.72. The Council took note of a Commission statement to the effect that, as regards starch products, the Commission intended to submit by 1 June new proposals aimed not only at improving the economic viability of the system but also at ensuring the expenditure earmarked for this purpose in the Community budget was reduced.

2.1.73. The target and intervention prices for rice are fixed as follows: target price (husked rice) 450.50 ECU/t (+ 10.37%), intervention price (paddy rice) 259.42 ECU/t (+ 11%).

Beef and veal

2.1.74. The guide and intervention prices will be increased by 10%, 7.5% at the beginning of the marketing year 1981/82 and 2.5% from 7 December.

2.1.75. The Council signified its agreement on the Community grading scale for carcases which will be applied to the determination of market prices and to intervention buying from a date to be decided before 31 March 1982 on the basis of a report and a proposal to be submitted before 31 December 1981. It took note of a Commission statement that it would adjust the coefficients applicable to the buying-in prices in Belgium for the interim period before the Community scale was introduced.

2.1.76. It also took note of a Commission statement that the Commission would continue, within the limits of its powers, to decide on the issue of the admission to intervention of the meat from male or female bovine animals in accordance with its assessment of the market situation.

The Council took note in addition of a Commission statement that, in view of the level of market prices for beef and veal in Ireland, it did not intend to suspend intervention for certain categories of beef and veal as long as the average market price in that Member State remained below 85% of the guide price. 2.1.77. The premium for suckler cows remains at 40 ECU per suckler cow, with 20 ECU being borne by the EAGGF. The Council decided that as from the marketing year 1982/83 the Community contribution to the premium would be limited to 75% of the expenditure relating to the basic premium. In this connection, the Council took note of a Commission statement that the Commission intended to replace the 'positive' list of proposed breeds by a 'negative' list of breeds which could not qualify for the premium, and to take a decision on this list in the near future.

The calving premium (Regulation (EEC) No 1667/80) is maintained in Italy at 32 ECU per calf during the marketing year 1981/82.

On a proposal from the Commission and subject to the opinion of Parliament, the Council expressed a favourable opinion on the retention of the slaughter premium (Regulation (EEC) No 1666/80) during the marketing year 1981/82. The Council took note of a Commission statement that this premium would apply to the whole of the United Kingdom and that a separate rate would not be fixed for Northern Ireland.

2.1.78. Furthermore, the Council signified its agreement on the estimate concerning $60\ 000$ tonnes of beef and veal for processing and 235 000 head of young bovine animals. In accordance with the undertakings entered into in the context of GATT, it also agreed on the Regulation opening a Community tariff quota of 50 000 tonnes of frozen beef and veal falling under subheading 02.01 A II b) for 1981.

Pigmeat

2.1.79. The basic price of pigmeat is increased by 11%. The Council took note of a Commission statement that it would endeavour, through instruments available in the context of market organization, to manage the pigmeat market in such a way that the increase in the approved basic price would have a corresponding effect on the market price.

Sheepmeat

2.1.80. In view of the larger increases in the support price applicable to beef and veal and pigmeat, the basic price and the central reference price will be increased by 7.5%.

The Council took note of a Commission statement that, pending decisions on the arrangements applicable to Community exports — decisions which may be taken during the 1981/82 marketing year—it would maintain during the 1981/82 marketing year the transitional measure whereby the 'clawback' system (recovery of the premium on exports) would not apply to exports to third countries from the Member States in which a slaughter premium was paid, subject to the same conditions relating to the observance of the traditional pattern of trade applicable to the current Regulation (Regulation (EEC) No 3191/80).

Sugar

2.1.81. The Council, taking into consideration the opinion of Parliament, adopted the regulations on the new common organization of the market in sugar.

This new market organization, which will be applied for a five-year period from 1 July 1981, essentially makes provision for a production quota system with modulated guarantees and financial participation by producers in the costs of absorbing any surpluses.

The allocation and alteration of quotas are carried out by the Member States for the undertakings situated within their territory in accordance with Community criteria.

The envisaged 10% limit for the reserve quantity does not apply to either Italy or to the French overseas departments in the case of restructuring plans (such as already provided for in the present regulations); however, the transfers of quotas (A + B) from the French overseas departments to metropolitan France may not exceed 30 000 tonnes.

Possibility of a revision of the A and B quotas for the marketing years 1984/85 and 1985/86.

2.1.82. Financial participation of the producers. Basic production levy (A and B sugar) with a maximum of 2%. Levy on B sugar with a maximum of 30% (total maximum charge for B sugar: 2% + 30%). In accordance with the principle already adopted by the Council as regards the financial participation of producers and if there were a balance of financial losses not covered by the product of the levy, the levy on the B quota would be revised for the following year by an additional percentage of up to 7.5%.

2.1.83. National aid is maintained in the French overseas departments and in Italy. As far as Italy is

concerned, aid may be applied to the quantity covered by the present maximum quota (1 568 000 tonnes). However, in northern Italy, national aid will be reduced by an amount corresponding to 2% of the intervention price for each marketing year.

2.1.84. International Sugar Agreement (ISA). Adherence to the procedure laid down in the event of the Community's accession to the ISA, as proposed by the Commission, but deletion in Article 26 of the provisions proposed with a view to accession to the ISA.

2.1.85. Regionalization. Storage costs. Differential levy. Continuing regionalization for deficit regions. Retention of the present arrangements for refunding storage costs but the amount for 1981/82 will be determined on the basis of an interest rate of at least 13%. Maintenance of the differential levy for 1981/82 at its 1980/81 level. Reduction by one-third for each of the following three marketing years by comparison with the 1981/82 level. For 1981/82 and the following marketing years, the Commission is prepared to propose that a quantity of up to 150 000 tonnes be exempted from the differential levy.

(...)

Honey

2.1.86. The Council signified its agreement on the introduction of a system of aid for beekeeping for the marketing years 1981/82 to 1983/84. The aid, which is fixed at 1 ECU per hive in production and per marketing year, may be used through recognized associations of beekeepers for the purchase of reduced-price feed sugar or for general programmes for the improvement of honey production, technology and marketing.

Wine and spirituous beverages

2.1.87. The Council signified its agreement on a 10% increase in the guide price for table wines, with the exception of the guide price for table wines, with the exception of the guide price for white wines of the AI type, for which the increase is fixed at 8.5%.

Continuing its discussions of 16 March 1981, the Council also agreed on the Regulation laying down general rules for applying the minimum price to table wines. These general rules, which will apply temporarily for one marketing year until 15 December 1981, govern the mechanisms for monitoring and the measures for limiting the marketing of wines the price of which is below the minimum price; these rules also determine all the procedures concerning distillation and the mechanism for the termination of the application of the minimum price... 2.1.88. The Council signified its agreement on the basic features of regulations for the encouragement of the use of Community cereals in the manufacture of exported spirituous beverages, and in particular whisky. This agreement constitutes the implementation of Protocol No 19 to the Act of Accession of the United Kingdom to the European Communities; it concerns an amendment of the basic cereals Regulation which provides the legal basis for the payment of refunds for Community cereals used in this way; and general rules concerning the granting of such refunds, in particular their scope, the annual relationship between the quantities of beverages exported and the total quantities marketed, the monitoring procedures and the rights and obligations of operators.

Flax and hemp

2.1.89. The Council agreed on an increase of 12% in the flat-rate aid per hectare by fixing the level for flax at 296.48 ECU (59.30 ECU for Greece) and that for hemp at 269.26 ECU (53.85 ECU for Greece).

Silkworms

2.1.90. The Council agreed on an increase in aid, which it fixed at 85.00 ECU per box (64.03 ECU for Greece).

Soya beans, linseed and castor seeds

2.1.91. The Council agreed on an increase in the guide price for soya to 46.26 ECU/100 kg (+ 10%) and on the fixing of the minimum price at 41.63 ECU/100 kg (90% of the guide price rather than 92% as in 1980/81). The Council also agreed on an increase of 10% in the guide price for linseed, which is fixed at 46.40 ECU/100 kg. The Council further agreed on increases of 10% in the guide price and the minimum price for castor seeds which it fixed at 59.81 and 56.96 ECU/100 kg respectively.

Olive oil

2.1.92. The Council agreed on an increase of 9% in the intervention price for olive oil. When fixing that price the Council did not set an upper limit for guaranteed production, originally planned at 700 000 tonnes, nor did it accept the Commission's original proposals concerning coresponsibility for regional promotion measures in this sector.

Colza and rape seeds

2.1.93. The Council agreed on increase of 10% in the target price and of 8% in the intervention

price. It also agreed on eight monthly increases (instead of seven) and on retention of the daily aid provisions for the 1981/82 marketing year.

It also approved the application of a special subsidy to the price of type 00 seeds offered for intervention buying.

Seeds

2.1.94. The Council agreed on the differential increases of 8, 10 and 15% proposed by the Commission for the three major groups of seeds with the exception of the *phleum pratense* variety (+ 10% instead of + 15%) and *vicia faba* (no increase).

The Council noted a Commission statement to the effect that the Commission planned to propose the addition of *Triticum spelta* to the list of seeds eligible for aid and to propose an appropriate figure.

Cotton

2.1.95. The Council agreed to study the Commission proposal regarding cotton in greater detail and to act on it at the earliest opportunity.

Peas and field beans

2.1.96. The Council agreed on an increase of 8% in the minimum price (244.70 ECU/tonne) and 11% in the activating price (418.30 ECU/tonne). In addition the Council noted the Commission's intention of urgently seeking measures to remedy the difficulty of marketing peas intended for human consumption and possibly submitting appropriate proposals to the Council.

Dried fodder

2.1.97. The Council agreed on:

• an increase of 8% in the flat-rate aid (7.03 ECU/tonne);

• an increase of 10% in the guide price (148.08 ECU/tonne);

• an increase in the difference between the guide price and the world market price, which difference fixes the variable supplementary aid at 80% for dehydrated fodder and protein concentrates, 45% for fodder dried by other means;

• the fixing of aid of 13.41 ECU/tonne (+ 8%) for dehydrated potatoes for the 1981/82 market-ing year.

In addition the Council agreed to resume its examination of the proposal for a Regulation on the common organization of the markets in potatoes before 30 September 1981 with a view to reaching a conclusion before 31 December 1981.

Fruit and vegetables

2.1.98. The basic buying-in prices for cauliflowers, peaches, lemons, pears, table grapes, mandarins and sweet oranges are increased by 11%, those for tomatoes by 8% and those for apples by 9%.

The marketing premiums for oranges, mandarins, clementines and lemons were increased by similar amounts.

The Council noted a statement to the effect that when the 1981/82 aids were fixed for processed fruit and vegetables in accordance with basic Regulation (EEC) No 516/77, the Commission would apply the criteria laid down in these rules in such a way as to achieve economies equivalent to those which would result from applying the proposals it had submitted.

Tobacco

(...)

2.1.99. The Commission proposal for a general reduction in the intervention price to 85% of the norm price will not be applied to the 1981 harvest. On the basis of Article 13 of Regulation (EEC) No 727/70 a reduction in the intervention price to 80% of the norm price for oriental and Kentucky varieties will be applied starting with the 1981 harvest.

Structures policy

2.1.100. The Council adopted a series of measures concerning structures, comprising:

• an amendment of Directive 72/159/EEC on the modernization of farms;

special aid for young farmers;

• a common measure to adapt and modernize beef and veal, sheepmeat and goatmeat production structures in Italy;

• integrated development programmes for the Western Isles (Scotland), the department of Lozère and south-east Belgium;

• an amendment of Directive 72/161/EEC on socio-economic information and the professional qualification of those employed in agriculture;

• the acceleration of agricultural development in the less-favoured areas of Northern Ireland;

• a common measure to improve processing and marketing conditions in the animal feedingstuffs sector in Northern Ireland;

• agricultural development in the French overseas departments;

• a common measure to accelerate infrastructure improvement in certain less-favoured agricultural areas of the Federal Republic of Germany; • the extension until 31 December 1981 of Decision 76/402/EEC on the amount of the interestrate subsidy provided for by Directive 72/159/EEC on the modernization of farms, to be applied in Italy.

In addition the Council agreed in principle on the Commission's proposals for the improvement of agriculture in Ireland and in Northern Ireland (development aid for the production of beef cattle; financial aid for pre-movement tuberculin testing and brucellosis blood-sampling of cattle; an additional premium for maintaining sucker cows) and it agreed to take a decision as soon as it had received the opinion of Parliament.

2.1.101. The Council expressed its intention of approving the Commission's proposals for aiding the farming industry in Ireland and

• noted the Commission's statement that it would consider other methods of helping to resolve the social difficulties and other problems resulting from the reduction of income in the farming industry, which was of particular importance to the Irish economy, and

• invited the Commission to study methods of mitigating further the serious income problems being experienced by the Irish farming industry at present, in particular the cattle breeding sector, and to submit proposals so that the Council could take decisions before 15 July 1981.

2.1.102. Investment aid in pigmeat production is forbidden except for that granted towards the amount of investment required to create 550 pig places per farm.

The Commission may authorize a Member State to alter the number fixed in the preceding paragraph as part of a farm development plan in specific cases where 550 pig places do not ensure comparable income for 1.5 MPU. Even in those cases, however, no aid may be granted for the part of the investment increasing the number of pig places pver 1 000.

The Council agreed to ban investment aid for milk production with the exception of that granted to farmers carrying out development plans under Directive 72/159/EEC or farm improvement plans under common measures. In connection with a development plan, aid will be limited to that part of the investment making it possible to achieve the comparable level of income defined in Article 4 (2) of Directive 72/159/EEC for a maximum number of 1.5 MPU per farm, and made subject to the condition that that part of the investment must not increase the number of cows to more than 40 per MPU on completion of the plan.

As regards farms worth more than 1.5 MPU, however, aid will be restricted to that part of the investment making it possible to increase by up to 15% the dairy herd on completion of the plan. The Member States are authorized to grant investment aid to farmers who do not submit development plans provided that the investments involved do not increase the number of dairy cows to more than 40 per farm.

2.1.103. The Council took note of a Commission statement to the effect that the Commission would make a study of the cost effectiveness of certain aids and other measures, including aids not directly linked to the actual organization of markets and possible new measures to make intervention more flexible and to link it more directly to market requirements, and would submit this report to the Council.

Budgetary implications

2.1.104. The Commission estimated the additional expenditure resulting from the agricultural price-fixing decisions and the related measures at 1 096 million ECU over 12 months, including 343 millions ECU in 1981.

The Council took note of the Commission's statement that the cost of the decisions on price increases and economy measures could be financed within the existing EAGGF appropriations in the 1981 budget, thereby avoiding the need for a supplementary budget due to agricultural expenditure. For 1982 the Council took note that, on present provisions and without taking into account the possible cost in 1982 of the 1982/83 prices and related measures proposals, the decisions were consistent with ensuring that the rate of increase of agricultural expenditure remain close to or, if possible, below the rate of increase in the Community's own resources. The Council undertook to adopt in good time any further measures that might be needed to this end. The Commission stated that in this way it would be possible to keep the 1982 budget within the present own resources ceiling applied by the Community while permitting the development of non-agricultural policies.'

Economic aspects of the common agricultural policy

Agri-monetary measures

2.1.105. Changes were made on 23 March in the central rates of the currencies in the European Monetary System (EMS), for the third time since the introduction of the EMS on 13 March 1979. The Following measures were taken:

(a) a 6% devaluation of the lira central rate against all the other currencies in the EMS;

(b) a 22.74% revaluation of the theoretical central rate of sterling against all the other currencies in the EMS except the lira.

The net result is a revaluation of the ECU against the currencies making up the ECU by 2.536%. This in turn entails changes in monetary compensatory amounts (MCAs), since they are calculated in relation to the central rates of the currencies fully under EMS rules. In principle these changes would have to operate from 30 March in line with the system of fixing MCAs. However, to avoid increasing or reintroducing negative MCAs for some Member States, the Commission decided in accordance with the 1979 gentlemen's agreement on dismantling MCASs¹ to freeze MCAs until 5 April in anticipation of a Council decision on 30 March to adjust green rates.²

At its 1 April sitting the Council decided, on a proposal from the Commission, to align green rates with central rates for the currencies of Benelux, France, Denmark and Ireland. The representative rate of the lira was only partially aligned with its central rate so that a gap of -1 remains after deducting the 'neutral margin' (*franchise*). These decisions are effective from 6 April.

The monetary adjustments on 23 March narrowed the German monetary gap from 8.8 to 6.5; the Council also decided to reduce the German MCA by 3.313 points with effect either from 6 April or the start of the 1981/82 marketing year of the products concerned.³

The monetary gap applying to the United Kingdom has gone down from 14.1 to 12.9, and the representative rate has remained unchanged.

Table 4 summarizes the monetary decisions and their impact on price levels expressed in national currencies.

2.1.106. Movements in the market rate of sterling caused the Commission to adjust British MCAs several times during March.⁴ This also involved the reintroduction of MCAs for certain processed agricultural products not covered by Annex II to the EEC Treaty.⁵

2.1.107. On 24 March the Commission started a continuous information service⁶ with daily quotations for the monetary gaps and the specific rates used for converting world market rates to ECUs.

Market organizations

Specific measures and prices

Pigmeat

2.1.108. The Commission adopted exceptional measures on 27 March to support the French pigmeat market,² under which it granted private storage aid from 30 March to 1 May for pigmeat originating in areas where pigmeat shipment has been suspended owing to outbreaks of foot-and-mouth disease.

Fruit and vegetables

2.1.109. On 20 March the Commission fixed reference prices for tomatoes for the 1981 marketing year.⁷ The new prices represent an average increase of approximately 9% compared with the previous year.

2.1.110. Parliament adopted a resolution on 13 March on the disturbances in the Community apple market.⁸

Beef and veal

2.1.111. The Commission has extended until 30 June 1981^9 the additional special detailed rules governing the issue of export licences in the beef and veal sector.

Sheepmeat

2.1.112. Voluntary restraint agreements with the main non-Community exporting countries (Argentina, Australia, New Zealand, Uruguay) were negotiated in 1980 and came into effect when the common organization for sheepmeat and goatmeat began operation. Other agreements have been negotiated with Austria, Iceland, Poland, Romania and Yugoslavia. Bulgaria, Hungary and Czechoslovakia have undertaken to limit their exports unilaterally to the quantities negotiated with the Commission, pending the final conclusion of these arrangements; the Commission in fact sent a proposal to the Council on 11 March concerning the agreement with Hungary.

As for the few non-member countries which export sheepmeat and goatmeat but have not yet been able to give any undertaking on voluntary restraint, the Commission sent a proposal to the Council on 5 March which would allow them in 1981 to export certain quantities to the Community on terms similar to those applying to other non-member countries.

Olive oil

2.1.113. On 10 March the Council fixed the intervention price to apply in Greece from 1 January 1981 at 170.80 ECU/100 kg;¹ this level will enable Greek olive-growers to earn as much as they did before Greece joined the Community.

Products processed from fruit and vegetables

2.1.114. On 4 March the Commission amended the rules for the application of the system of aid for certain products processed from fruit and vegetables.² The aim is to give concerns located in Italy the option, in the 1980/81 marketing year, of submitting to subsequent market preparation up to 50% of the total quantity of tomato concentrate and tomato juice obtained.

2.1.115. In order to deal with difficulties on the preserved mushroom market, the Commission has extended the safeguard measures against imports to 30 June 1981³ pending adoption by the Council of permanent arrangements; the Commission adopted a proposal for such arrangements on 26 March for transmission to the Council.

Structural policy

New proposals and amendments to the Directives

2.1.116. On 11 March the Commission sent proposals to the Council on a series of measures to help agriculture in Ireland overcome current difficulties. The measures relate to livestock farming, which makes up 80% of agricultural output in Ireland. The main features are:

(a) a common measure for the development of beef cattle production;

(b) temporary financial aid for tuberculin testing and brucellosis blood sampling;

(c) an additional premium for maintaining herds of suckler cows.

The Council gave its agreement in principle to these proposals at its meeting on 30-31 March and 1-2 April.⁴

2.1.117. The Commission also sent a proposal to the Council laying down the conditions on which Greece may maintain, on a transitional basis, a number of national aid measures falling within the scope of the socio-structural Directives.

2.1.118. On 30 March the Commission sent a proposal to the Council designed to give certain communes in Italy affected by natural disasters the same status as designated mountain areas.

Agricultural legislation

Veterinary legislation

2.1.119. On 19 March the Commission sent the Council a proposal to amend the

Directive of 15 February 1971 on fresh poultrymeat¹ to include a number of principles and criteria governing health controls and inspections.

2.1.120. The Commission also proposed to the Council an amendment to its regulation laying down common standards for the water content of frozen and deep-frozen chickens, hens and cocks.²

Conditions of competition

2.1.121. In the context of Articles 92 to 94 of the EEC Treaty, the Commission decided to initiate proceeding under Article 93(2) in respect of draft measures notified by Belgium aimed at encouraging fuel savings in hothouse horticulture. The aid concerned consists mainly in interest-free loans, and the Commission regards it as operating assistance imposing no special constraint on the beneficiaries, and as such incompatible with the common market.

2.1.122. Under the same review procedure, the Commission has decided for the moment not to comment on the application of measures notified by:

(a) France: a reimbursable loan for the storage of fattened ducks and geese to assist cooperatives with cash-flow problems resulting from market over-supply in these products;

(b) Denmark: State guarantees and interestrate subsidies to consolidate short-term debt contracted by certain farmers (either to buy or ensure proper operation of their farms or to undertake investment) who are having to face sharp increases in borrowing costs (interest rates); interest-rate subsidies for farmers who have contracted loans to invest in farm buildings and may be forced out of business because of the increases referred to above; adjustment of an existing measure aimed primarily at raising the ceiling on loans bearing no interest during the first five years for young farmers to encourage them to take over or buy into a farm; changes to an existing measure aimed at supporting production, . employment and environmental improvement in private forestry; adjustment of an aid system for farmers aimed, first, at increasing

State guarantees for loans to convert hothouse operations to growing sapling trees and mushrooms and, secondly, at prolonging State guarantees and interest subsidies on loans for energy-saving investment in hothouse horticulture;

(c) Netherlands malting sector aid for the purchase of new equipment to improve health protection measures in beer brewing and reduce energy consumption;

(d) Italy (Molise): a bill introducing special measures to support milk production, designed mainly to grant subsidies to livestock cooperatives and cooperative associations so as to encourage them to organize programmes for collecting, processing and marketing milk; in practice the assistance is meant to cover increases occurring between the ordering and final installation of new plant; however, the aid is granted only if beneficiaries pay a minimum price to milk producers.

In its decision the Commission took account of the exceptional circumstances that had made the aid necessary and of an undertaking given by the Italian authorities to discontinue the measure from the end of 1980. The Commission reminded them of their duty to notify draft aid measures in good time.

European Agricultural Guidance and Guarantee Fund

Guidance Section

2.1.123. In the first quarter of 1981 the Guidance Section reimbursed some 12.3 million ECU to the Federal Republic of Germany, Italy, Ireland and the United Kingdom for spending on indirect schemes between 1977 and 1979, including 8.8 million ECU under the Directive on the modernization of farms.

Fisheries

2.1.124. Despite four attempts during March to resolve the stalemate (a Council meeting (fisheries) on 10 and 11, a Council meeting (general affairs) on 16 and 17, a European Council on 23 and 24 and a Council meeting (fisheries) on 27), no agreement on a new policy was reached. However, when the Ministers met on 27 March they stated that although more thorough preparation was required before agreement could be reached, they intended to take final decisions during the spring.¹

Resources

Internal aspects

2.1.125. On 17 March the Council, being unable to reach a general agreement, decided to extend until 30 June² the Regulation on technical conservation measures due to expire at the end of March.³

2.1.126. On the same day the Commission approved an Irish measure extending until 31 March the prohibition on herring fishing in ICES Division VIa (West of Scotland), this being consistent with the Commission's general fisheries conservation policy and its intention to propose a nil total allowable catch (TAC) for this area for 1981. The Commission reminded the Irish Government, however, that, in accordance with its TAC proposals for 1981, fishing for the other herring stocks should also be prohibited.

2.1.127. The Commission also noted that the British prohibition on fishing for the Mourne stock in 1981 complied with the proposed TAC regulation for 1981.

2.1.128. On 20 March the Commission noted four Netherlands measures establishing a temporary catch quota arrangement and raised no objection to their application. In order, however, to make an overall assessment of the compatibility of the measures with its TAC proposals for 1981, the Commission asked the Netherlands Government to send it, in due course, estimates of the

quantitative effects of the measures for 1981. The Commission also made final approval of the measures conditional on the compatibility of the proposed catch quotas for the different species with the shares to be allocated to the Netherlands when the 1981 TACs are distributed among the Member States.

External aspects

Bilateral relations

2.1.129. On 20 March representatives of the Commission and of the Swedish Government initialled an agreement concerning mutual fisheries arrangements for 1981. The agreement provides for reciprocal access to each other's zones in the Baltic Sea and the Kattegat and for fishing by Swedish vessels in the North Sea. It also lays down the total catches which each party will allow on joint stocks in the Kattegat. However, at a meeting held on 27 March the Council was unable to endorse the agreement.

2.1.130. On 22 March the Council adopted a Decision approving an agreement, in the form of an exchange of letters, establishing fishing arrangements between the Community and Norway for 1981.⁴ This agreement lays down the reciprocal fishing rights which the parties grant each other as well as the total catches which the parties will allow on joint fish stocks in the North Sea. The Council also authorized Norwegian vessels to fish in the Community's fishing zone in accordance with the agreement. On 26 March Parliament gave its opinion⁵ on the relevant Commission proposals.

2.1.131. The Council was unable to approve the agreement on reciprocal fishing which the Commission had negotiated with The Faroe Islands in February.6 in this situation, fishing by Member States' vessels in Swedish and Faroese waters and fishing by Swedish and Faroese vessels in Community

waters are not allowed, with the exception that Swedish vessels may fish in the Kattegat and the Skagerrak.

2.1.132. However, the Council formally adopted the Regulation laying down certain measures—applicable to vessels flying the flag of certain non-member countries—for the conservation and management of fishery resources in the 200-nautical-mile zone off the coast of French Guiana.¹ Parliament gave its Opinion on this text on 26 March.²

Multilateral relations

2.1.133. On 10 March the Council amended³ its Regulation of 28 December 1978 concerning the conclusion by the European Economic Community of the Convention on Future Multilateral Cooperation in the Northwest Atlantic Fisheries.⁴ The amendment was necessitated by changes made in the Annex to the Convention concerning the plotting of the boundaries between the statistical sub-areas covering the waters between the west coast of Greenland and the coast of Canada.

2.1.134. On 26 March Parliament gave its opinion² on another Commission proposal on the allocation and monitoring of certain catch quotas allocated for 1981 to vessels flying the flag of a Member State fishing in the NAFO Convention Area.

Markets and structures

Common organization of the market

2.1.135. In the context of the Council's efforts to achieve a consensus on various problems connected with the implementation of the long-term agreement with Canada, the Commission sent the Council on 20 March a communication on certain special measures to support the market in fishery products.

The Commission proposed an additional increase in the guide price for certain species and stated its intention of adopting, as part of its management of the common organization of the market in fishery products, measures following up the adoption by the Council of its proposal regarding guide prices (increase of the withdrawal price and the reference prices) and certain supplementary measures on imports and exports of the products in question.

Structures

2.1.136. Under the Council Regulation of 25 July 1978 on an interim common measure for restructuring the fishing industry,⁵ as last amended on 27 June 1980,⁶ the Commission decided on 31 March to finance 86 projects for constructing fishing vessels, 64 projects for modernizing fishing vessels and 22 aquaculture projects.

In the selection of these projects, for which a total of 20 million ECU was granted from the EAGGF (Table 5), priority was given to coastal areas where the population is particularly dependent on fishing, i.e. Greenland, the Mezzogiorno, Ireland, Northern Ireland and the French overseas departments, and to other parts of the Community where circumstances permit the development of inshore fishing or conditions are particularly suitable for aquaculture.

2.1.137. Towards the end of March the Commission sent to the Council a proposal for extending until 31 December the interim common measure introduced by a Council Regulation of 25 July 1978. The estimated cost of this measure, 25 million ECU for 1981, takes account of the accession of Greece.

2.1.138. With regard to State aids, the Commission initiated the procedure laid down in Article 93(2) of the EEC Treaty with respect to a draft Belgian ministerial decree setting up a scheme to encourage fuel economy in sea-fishing. The Commission maintains its previous position on fuel subsidies in the fisheries sector.⁷ The aid in ques-

tion is not directly linked to investment by the beneficiaries, and its main effect would be to reduce the cost of the fuel actually used by them. It would not secure any durable improvement in fuel consumption figures by the Belgian fishing fleet and would not by itself have any effect on the long-term situation of the beneficiaries.

Transport

Council meeting

2.1.139. The Council meeting of Transport Ministers in Brussels on 26 March produced a number of concrete results. In particular, the Council approved the following list of main topics to be given priority during the period to the end of 1983:

(a) improving the situation of railways;

(b) continuing measures to harmonize conditions of competition;

(c) implementing measures in the field of transport infrastructure;

(d) developing combined forms of transport;

(e) facilitating frontier crossing;

(f) improving the operation of the transport market, in particular international transport;(g) improving the efficiency and safety of transport;

(h) bettering social conditions in the transport field;

(i) continuing the work in hand on sea and air transport in accordance with the conclu-

sions reached by the Council at its previous meetings;

(j) solving the problems likely to arise in connection with intra-Community transit via non-member countries.

Parliament had given its Opinion on the proposal concerning these priorities on 13 March.¹

2.1.140. The Council requested the Commission to report before the end of 1981 on measures likely to reduce waiting times at frontier crossing-points, taking account of the necessary controls. Mr Contogeorgis said that the Commission intended to present a proposed Directive on this in the near future.

2.1.141. The Council adopted two Decisions:

(a) one on the opening of negotiations between the Community and non-member countries on arrangements for certain types of international combined road/rail carriage of goods;² and

(b) one on the detailed arrangements for the collection of information concerning the activities of carriers participating in cargo liner traffic between the Member States and the Far East.³

2.1.142. A draft resolution on Community railway policy and the proposal on financial

support for infrastructure projects of Community interest were also discussed. The Council stressed the need for more detailed examination of these two subjects. The Council re-examined the problems raised by a possible increase in the Community quota for the carriage of goods by road between Member States.

Some delegations pointed to the need to make substantial progress in Community railway policy and in the harmonization of conditions of competition.

Inland transport

Infrastructures

2.1.143. The Committee on Transport Infrastructures met in Brussels on 13 March. The main points dealt with were consultation on the motorway plans submitted by Luxembourg and the assessment of Community interest.

Approximation of structures

Technical aspects

2.1.144. On 23 March the Commission notified the Irish Government of its opinion (favourable, subject to a number of observations) concerning Ireland's planned legislation on the technical inspection of vehicles.

2.1.145. On 5 March, in connection with its proposal on the weight of commercial vehicles,¹ the Commission convened the first meeting of government experts responsible for examining the problems of tandem and triaxle loadings and of wheelbase in relation to total weight. These consultations should produce conclusions on the advisability of amplifying the proposal.

2.1.146. On 11 March the Commission held the first meeting of government experts to draft a standard multilingual form for applications and authorizations for the carriage of abnormal indivisible loads. The discussion showed that the idea of having such a form was welcomed; the specific problems arising are to be discussed in greater detail. over the next few months.

Summer time

2.1.147. The ten Member States of the Community simultaneously went over to summer time at 0100 hrs GMT on 29 March. This is the first time that the Member States have acted together on summer time. Almost every other Western European country and several Eastern-bloc countries (a total of 22 countries) did the same.

2.1.148. This harmonization, pursuant to the Council Directive of 22 July 1980,² covers only 1981 and 1982. The Commission has already adopted a proposal for a Second Council Directive,³ whereby from 1983 onwards summer time would begin on the last Sunday in March unless that day is Easter Day in one or more Member States, in which case summer time would start on the previous Sunday. The Commission proposes the second Sunday in October for the end of summer time (the Directive of 22 July 1980 having been silent on this).

Multimodal transport

Combined road/rail transport

2.1.149. On 26 March the Council adopted a Decision on the opening of negotiations between the Community and non-member countries on arrangements for certain types of combined road/rail carriage of goods. The object of this Decision is to extend to these non-Community countries the present liberalization of combined road/rail transport of goods between the Member States.⁴ This system frees combined transport from quota or authorization arrangements.

Differences between the Community system and the systems applicable to transport operations between Member States and nonmember countries raise economic problems

and even problems of practical application. Furthermore, differences in the degree of liberalization of this type of carriage curb the development of a form of operation which is economically beneficial, and preclude the optimum utilization of terminals, whose capital cost is relatively high.

The mandate which this Decision gives to the Commission will enable it to open negotiations with those non-member countries with which combined transport links already exist, in particular Finland, Sweden, Norway, Switzerland, Austria, Yugoslavia and Spain.

Energy

Formulating and implementing a Community energy policy

Council meeting

2.1.150. At its meeting of 3 March the Council reviewed the oil supply situation.¹ It also held an exchange of views on the Commission's first report analysing the progress made in pursuing the Community's energy policy objectives for 1990 and in Member States' investment programmes.²

The following conclusions were reached:

(a) Some progress is to be noted in the pursuit of the objectives which the Council adopted in its Resolution of 9 June 1980.

(b) However, the actual achievement of these objectives will require several Member States to intensify their efforts in the power-station sector, with more rapid substitution of solid fuels for oil and/or by stepping up nuclear programmes; and in the field of energy saving, whether in the domestic sector, industry or transport.

• The Council emphasized the importance in the short and medium term of indigenous primary sources of energy, including oil, gas, coal and nuclear energy, for the overall balance of payments of the Community.

• The Council also emphasized the need to prepare for the period beyond 1990 by actively developing renewable energy sources.

• The Council invited the Commission to examine the possible need to go further than the investment levels currently fixed in order to achieve the common objectives, and, if necessary, to propose the measures to be taken to attain them, including informing the public of the likely economic benefits of such investments.

• The Council confirmed the leading role of energy price transparency and emphasized the importance it attached to the communication which the Commission intends to submit to it shortly on pricing policy geared to the energy objectives.'

Specific problems

Oil and natural gas

2.1.151. Also on 3 March the Council reviewed the oil supply situation in the light of the measures agreed upon at the 27 November 1980 meeting,³ including the drawdown of stocks. This review led to the following conclusions:

'The Council noted that these measures, the measures taken by Member States, the reduction of consumption, and the oil production levels achieved by the OPEC producing countries have led to a significant improvement in Community oil markets. Nevertheless, in view of continuing uncertainties the situation must be kept under close review.

The Council agreed that:

• the measures established on 27 November 1980 will remain in operation;

• the time is now opportune to examine which specific and efficient actions could be taken if supply problems recur. They invited the Commission in particular to study further the possibilities of mutual aid in oil stocks at times of market tension, and to report to the Council at their June meeting.'

Coal

National financial measures

2.1.152. In 1980 the total quantity of coal sold in the Community stabilized at a high level. The competitiveness of Community coal stayed much the same as before, so the financial results of the Community mining undertakings and the rates of aid altered only slightly. In the Community as a whole, the amount of aid for current production rose only slightly, from 2 076.8 million ECU in

1979 to 2 154.7 million ECU in 1980; the Community average for aid per tonne of production rose from 8.70 to 8.87 ECU. The differences between the aid sums granted by the coal-producing Member States have diminished. These are the main conclusions drawn by the Commission in the Memorandum it adopted on 10 March on Member States' financial aid to the coal industry.

The Commission also emphasizes that the Member States' aids serve not only to solve national problems of energy supply and employment but also to stabilize coal production, so promoting the security of the Community's energy supplies.

The Commission drew up this Memorandum and sent it to the Council under the consultation procedure provided for by Decision 528/76/ECSC of 25 February 1976.¹

Production aids for coking coal and coke for the iron and steel industry

2.1.153. In accordance with its Decision of 25 July 1973 concerning coking coal and coke for the iron and steel industry, the Commission authorized the following rates of national aid:

(a) Belgium (Kempen coalfield): BFR 1707/tonne (for 1980);

(b) Federal Republic of Germany (all coalfields): DM 45/tonne for the final quarter of 1979 and DM 53/tonne for 1980;

(c) United Kingdom: aid ranging from UKL 3.38/tonne to UKL 17.20/tonne depending on the coalfield (financial year 1980/81).

The Commission also decided that, for the production of coking coal in 1980, the French Government could be authorized to grant aid amounting to FF 72/tonne for the Lorraine coalfield, FF 303/tonne for the Nord/Pas-de-Calais coalfield and FF 103/tonne for the Centre/Midi coalfield.

Technical coal research

2.1.154. On 10 March the Commission referred 37 research projects—totalling 16 million ECU—to the Council for assent and to the ECSC Consultative Committee for consultation. These projects make up two

major programmes dealing with mining engineering and coal beneficiation.

2.1.155. On 6 March the ECSC Consultative Committee met and examined a Commission study on the Community coal market in 1980 and prospects for 1981.²

Research and development

Development of the common policy

European Research and Development Committee

2.1.156. The European Research and Development Committee (CERD) devoted its meeting in Brussels on 11 March to a discussion of the development of the common R&D policy during the period 1981-86, stressing Europe's need for a powerful and innovative R&D system. This objective would be attained by giving incentives to public authorities, which should develop new activities (bioengineering and new information technologies, for example) on the basis of achievements to date, ensure that a social consensus is reached on the subject and afford small and medium-sized businesses a large measure of access to available knowhow.

CERD also underlined the need for interaction between research activities conducted in different fields (the developing countries and energy being one example and medical research and the environment another) and once again emphasized the necessity for measures to rationalize Community research and to stimulate the national research systems. In addition, the Committee discussed experiments conducted by the Commission on the evaluation of Community research programmes and—while stressing the value and the quality of the studies performed—recommended that the terms of reference of the

evaluation be widened to include an examination of the socio-economic impact of the results of R&D and an estimate of the advantages that the research being undertaken holds out for the future.

European cooperation in the field of scientific and technical research (COST)

2.1.157. At its meeting on 12 and 13 March the COST Committee of Senior Officials continued its examination of new projects and decided to set up an *ad hoc* working party with the task of reviewing the various research proposals and suggesting the action to be taken on them. The Committee also held an exchange of views on the participation in COST activities of countries that are not members of COST.

Multiannual research programmes

Joint Research Centre

Direct action

Sensitivity of simulation models

2.1.158. The problem inherent in the analysis of the sensitivity of large simulation models was studied from the standpoint of nuclear safety codes—and in particular those relating to severe fuel damage—during a seminar held at Ispra on 9 March. The concepts, methods and scope of sensitivity analysis were discussed from the point of view of model analysis. Three stages were identified in the evaluation of the accuracy of large simulation models such as nuclear safety codes: code verification, model analysis and model validation.

As regards complex computer applications such as nuclear safety codes, the participants focused their attention on the subdivision of models into submodels of manageable size; submodel sensitivity could prove to be an important factor in overall analysis of codes. Methods for the analysis by approximation of the sensitivity of whole models were also presented and discussed in detail.

Reliability and risk evaluation

2.1.159. The JRC's activities in the field of reliability and risk evaluation, whether on the design and setting-up of the European Reliability Data System (ERDS) or on the development of risk evaluation methods, were the subject of a wide-ranging discussion during a meeting held at Ispra on 19 and 20 March by the Advisory Committee on Programme Management (ACPM) for Reactor Safety. The Committee expressed its satisfaction at the results achieved by the JRC in these areas.

The ACPM also took note of the status of the LOBI (Loop for Blowdown Investigation) project—an experiment simulating loss-of-coolant accidents conducted in cooperation with the German Government. The projects has aroused keen interest in other countries, which would like to take part in it and benefit from its results.

Contract research and coordination

Indirect and concerted action

Environment

2.1.160. On 3 March the Council adopted a new multiannual (1981-85) R&D programme on the environment and climatology.¹ It is a sectoral programme and groups together, in response to the Council's recommendations on the rationalization and concentration of the Community's R&D activities, all the indirect and concertedaction projects on the subject. The funds allocated to the implementation of this programme amount to 43 million ECU.

Radionuclides

2.1.161. A conference on the transport and renewal of radionuclides in the North Sea and the Baltic was held in Hamburg on 5 and 6 March and attended by 27 experts from nine European countries and the Commission. The experts considered that radionuclides produced by the nuclear industry could

find their way into the North Sea and migrate into the Baltic through the Kattegat. They nevertheless underlined the need for increased cooperation in a number of areas, and in particular with regard to radiological impacts.

Scientific and technical training

2.1.162. On 17 March the Council adopted a four-year programme¹ consisting in the continuation of earlier programmes, which is allocated a total appropriation of 8.8 million ECU. Apart from organizing advanced training courses, the aim of this programme is to give young scientists and engineers the opportunity of taking part in all the scientific and technical research programmes, provided that the work is carried out in a Member State other than that of which the grantholder is a national. This programme was the subject of a proposal transmitted by the Commission to the Council on 21 May 1980.²

2. Enlargement and external relations

Enlargement and bilateral relations with applicant countries

Portugal

Accession negotiations

2.2.1. A second round of meetings was held to examine Community secondary legislation on the right of establishment, social affairs and external relations.

Pre-accession aid

2.2.2. On 25 March the Commission transmitted to the Council a proposal for a financial regulation on the application of the Agreement in the form of an exchange of letters between the EEC and the Portuguese Republic concerning the implementation of pre-accession aid for Portugal. This Agreement,¹ which was signed in December last year,² entered into force on 1 January.³

Spain

Accession negotiations

2.2.3. The seventh ministerial-level meeting of the accession negotiations between Spain

and the Community was held in Brussels on 16 March and was given over to a review of the progress of the negotiations. The Community delegation, led by Mr C.A. van der Klaauw, President of the Council, presented statements on secondary legislation, right of establishment and freedom to provide services, and transport. The Spanish delegation, led by Mr Pérez-Llorca, the newly appointed Minister of Foreign Affairs, presented statements on the customs union, external relations, transport, own resources and agriculture.

Spanish Foreign Minister has talks at the Commission

2.2.4. Following the ministerial-level meeting of the accession negotiations, Mr Pérez-Llorca, the Spanish Minister of Foreign Affairs, had talks with Mr Thorn and Mr Natali on 17 March and with Mr Haferkamp on 18 March on various questions relating to the negotiations.

Financial cooperation

2.2.5. On 6 March the Commission sent the Council a communication proposing that the Council agree to the Spanish Government's request of 15 October last year for financial cooperation between the Community and Spain.

This would take the form of operations by the European Investment Bank in Spain in the run-up to accession. The Commission considered that priority should go to projects designed to pave the way for Spain's entry into the Community, aimed at fostering regional development, improving the communications infrastructure linking Spain with the Community, assisting small and mediumsized firms and supporting energy-saving measures.

At the ministerial meeting on 16 March the President of the Council informed the Spanish delegation that the Council had decided to recommend the EIB to institute financial cooperation along these lines.

Commercial policy

implementing the common commercial policy

Import arrangements

Easing of restrictive measures

2.2.6. Under the Council Regulation of 4 December 1980 on import arrangements in respect of State-trading countries,¹ the Commission decided on the exceptional opening of import quotas for the following products: Italy-China: shirts, etc.;²

Italy-Bulgaria/USSR: aluminium alloy waste, recast into ingots, with an aluminium content not exceeding 97%;

Italy-China: non-motorized cycles;²

Italy-Poland: regenerated textile fibres of discontinuous, carded casein, not or combed;²

Benelux-Poland: shoes for cyclists;

Italy-Hungary: glass in sheets.

Trade protection

Anti-dumping measures

2.2.7. The Commission decided to initiate anti-dumping procedures concerning imports of phenol and its salts originating in the United States of America,³ and of codeine and its salts originating in Poland, Czechoslovakia, Hungary and Yugoslavia.4

2.2.8. On 17 March the Council extended⁵ the provisional anti-dumping duty on vinyl acetate monomer originating in the United States which was established by the Commission on 20 November last year.⁶

Treaties and trade agreements: extension or automatic renewal

2.2.9. On 17 March the Council authorized extension or automatic renewal of certain trade agreements between Member States and non-member countries (first batch for 1981).⁷ The agreements in question were due to expire or be terminated between 1 February and 30 April.

Sectoral commercial policy measures

Iron and steel products

Arrangements with non-member countries

2.2.10. During March a successful conclusion was reached in practically every case in the negotiations with a number of steelsupplying countries initiated by the Commission-on the basis of directives adopted by the Council at its meeting on 24 and 25 November last year-with a view to extend-

ing for a year the bilateral arrangements entered into in previous years.

Accordingly, there were exchanges of letters with Finland (2 March), Norway (3 March), Austria (12 March), South Korea (18 March) and Spain (23 March) and with Czechoslovakia (11 March), Bulgaria (12 March) and Poland (13 March). Negotiations were concluded with Brazil, Hungary and Romania but the formal signing of the texts is scheduled for April.

The 1981 arrangements are broadly similar to those for 1980 but make allowance, as far as quantities are concerned, for the foreseeable reduction in Community consumption in 1981 and for the measures adopted by the Commission on the basis of Article 58. The Commission undertook to examine the possibility of increasing the quantities for the second half of the year if the market situation so permits.

2.2.11. The Commission extended¹ until 31 December 1981 its Decision of March 1978,² as amended,³ prohibiting Community firms from aligning their prices on the more advantageous offers of iron and steel products from certain non-member suppliers. The Commission Decision specifies the products covered by the prohibition.

Textiles

Agreements and arrangements with non-member countries

2.2.12. The Commission sent to the Council two proposals concerning relations with preferential agreement countries and outward processing. The purpose of the former is to permit the introduction of a system maintaining the principle of genuine preferential treatment for those countries while introducing reliable machinery to ensure an orderly development of trade. The second proposal aims to ensure that Community industry is able to benefit from the outward processing arrangements while maintaining existing trade flows.

2.2.13. Consultations were held with India with a view to removing difficulties arising

under the bilateral agreement. These relate to the recording of imports from India and the interpretation of the list of folklore products admitted into the Community by way of derogation from the relevant quantitative restrictions.

2.2.14. At the end of the month a delegation visited Thailand and the Philippines to reach agreement with those countries on quantitative limits for imports of certain products into the Community.

Jute and coir

2.2.15. The new Agreement between the Community and Bangladesh on trade in jute products,⁴ signed in Brussels on 20 November 1980,⁵ came into force on 1 March.⁶ This follows on from an earlier agreement, which expired at the end of December, and is to apply for four years (1980-83).

Development

North-South relations

2.2.16. The problems raised by North-South relations will loom large on the international scene this year, and preparations for the forthcoming rounds of talks have already started at Community level and in other forums. There have also been bilateral discussions on the subject.

In March the Commission sent the Council a communication on Community policy in the North-South Dialogue,⁷ proposing a 'Community platform' and making proposals for future discussions. At its Maastricht meeting the European Council stressed that it was important that actual negotiations should be opened between industrialized and develop-

ing countries,¹ and instructed the Council (general affairs) to examine the Commission's proposals by June.

On 13 March a second international meeting was held in Vienna to prepare the summit of Heads of State or Government which is to take place in Mexico City on 22 and 23 October. At this summit, which is to be informal, the 22 States invited will primarily discuss the developing countries' economic situation, energy, food, and economic and financial questions (the agenda is to be finalized at the beginning of August). The North-South Dialogue will also be raised at the Western Economic Summit in Ottawa; and the United Nations global negotiations are yet to come.

Other international developments in March were the meeting of the UNCTAD Board,² the GATT Committee on Trade and Development discussions³ and various contacts in connection with commercial policy.⁴

Commodities and world agreements

Cocoa

2.2.17. On 30 March 1981 the Council decided, on a proposal from the Commission, that the Community should sign the International Cocoa Agreement, subject to its subsequent conclusion. It was in fact signed by the ten Member States on the same day under an arrangement between the Council and the Commission for future EEC participation in international activities in connection with commodities.

According to the formula chosen, all international commodity agreements will be signed simultaneously by the Community and the Member States, which will be parties to such agreements. The negotiations will be conducted by a single delegation; as a general rule the Community's position will be expressed by the Commission representative.

Cereals

2.2.18. On 26 March the Council formally concluded⁵ two protocols on behalf of the Community extending until the end of June 1979 and 1980 the International Wheat

Agreement, 1971 (Wheat Trade Convention and Food Aid Convention), since ratification had been completed by all the Member States.

Commercial, industrial, financial and technical cooperation

Opportunities for co-financing

2.2.19. During February and March Commission staff carried on discussing cofinancing possibilities with a number of current or potential partners.

Exploratory visits were made to Trinidad and Tobago, Venezuela and Mexico to discuss possible joint operations to be funded through these countries' oil facilities or other instruments, as appropriate.

A further procedural harmonization meeting was held with the Arab Funds in Kuwait to attempt to arrive at possible ways of cofinancing projects going beyond the usual parallel arrangement. The Kuwait, Abu Dhabi and Saudi Funds and the Islamic Development Bank were also sounded out separately on this.

In addition, there were contacts with the United Nations Development Programme, the US Agency for International Development and the World Bank.

Aid to non-associated developing countries

2.2.20. On 20 March the Commission took a further series of decisions on aid to nonassociated developing countries totalling 14.5 million ECU. Zimbabwe, the country benefiting, is eligible for this aid, which will give a new impetus to its agricultural sector, because its accession to the Lomé Convention will not take effect until the Convention has been ratified.

On 26 March the Council formally agreed to aid proposals for the reclamation of abandoned land and an intensive colonization programme, the provision of support for national advisory services, a rural training programme, rural health units, studies for rural projects and a technical assistance programme.

Food aid, emergency aid and exceptional aid

Food aid

Annual programmes

2.2.21. In view of the critical food situation in a number of African countries, on 27 March the Council decided to authorize the Commission to mobilize in advance about 50% of the volume of cereals earmarked for 27 countries under the Community's 1981 cereals food aid programme proposed by the Commission in February.¹

Emergency aid

2.2.22. On 17 March the Council endorsed certain Commission decisions by ruling that the Commission could supply Salvadorian refugees with an initial emergency food aid consignment of 1 050 tonnes of cereals equivalent in the form of maize and rice, without prejudice to the provision of further aid in the form of skimmed-milk powder (200 tonnes) and butteroil (120 tonnes).

2.2.23. The Council also approved a Commission proposal that Somalia be supplied with emergency food aid of 11 000 tonnes of cereals (valued at some 2 million ECU).

2.2.24. The Commission also proposed to the Council that China be supplied with colza oil and skimmed-milk powder worth 6.2 million ECU as emergency food aid.

Exceptional aid

Emergency aid

2.2.25. On 17 March, following additional assurances from Mr Cheysson that the prop-

osed aid would be allocated impartially and efficiently, the Council agreed that the Commission should grant the Salvadorian people 400 000 ECU as humanitarian emergency aid for the purchase of medicines and other items. The Commission had agreed to the principle of this aid in February.²

Relations with non-governmental organizations

2.2.26. As regards the co-financing of projects in developing countries, the Commission committed for the period from 1 January to 31 March 1 277 290 ECU for 12 projects submitted by nine NGOs, and a total of 664 431 ECU was committed for 12 other projects.

The Commission also contributed 58 240 ECU towards two development education campaigns aimed at the European public, one of them run by the NGO Liaison Committee.

International organizations and conferences

United Nations

Economic and Social Council

Economic Commission for Europe

2.2.27. The Community took part with observer status at the meeting of the Committee on Agricultural Problems of the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe held in Geneva from 9 to 13 March. The Community representative addressed the Committee on the main agricultural developments in 1980, dealing in turn with developments in the EEC's agricultural policy (notably in the various market organizations) and the Community's relations with non-member countries (enlargement, with the entry of Greece; negotiations with the applicant coun-

tries; bilateral and multilateral relations; food aid; relations with State-trading countries).

United Nations Conference on Trade and Development

Trade and Development Board

2.2.28. A notable feature of the session of the Trade and Development Board, held in Geneva from 9 to 21 March, was the renewed consideration given to the location of the sixth conference. It was clear that certain countries would not be able to participate in the conference if it were held in Havana. The Community spokesman urged all delegations to reflect seriously on the prejudicial effects that a decision to hold UNCTAD VI in a place which did not command the assent of all the UNCTAD member States could have not only on the conference but also on the organization itself.

It was decided that this question would be reconsidered by the Board at its autumn meeting.

A formal decision was taken, however, to carry out an annual review of the patterns of production and trade in the world economy — covering long-term trends, significant changes in the global patterns of trade and production and related questions (general problem of protectionism). The Community and other participants insisted that the annual review must take place on the basis of the comprehensive factual and analytical study to be prepared by the Secretariat and updated each year.

The Board also adopted by consensus a resolution concerning the rationalization of UNCTAD which should make a significant contribution towards a more effective organization and discharge of work. Among other decisions, it decided to set up a special intergovernmental group to monitor the application of the recently agreed Code of Conduct Restrictive Business Practices.¹ The on spokesman for the industrialized countries made it clear, on behalf of the Community, that intergovernmental organizations as well as States should be able to participate in its work.

United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea

2.2.29. The tenth session of the third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea opened in New York on 9 March.

International Atomic Energy Agency

2.2.30. On 26 March the Council approved the extension, until September 1983, of the interim arrangement adopted on 20 September 1977 concerning Euratom-IAEA relations with regard to sensitive facilities and light-water reactors.

General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade

GATT Council

2.2.31. Meeting on 10 March, the GATT Council² adopted a report on the work of the panel which had examined the Community's export refunds on sugar.3 It did not, however, adopt a draft decision put forward by Australia to limit the subsidies granted by the Community on sugar exports. At the conclusion of its discussions, the Council decided that the Australian complaints would be maintained; it also noted the Community's intention to notify the new sugar regulations to GATT as soon as they were adopted as well as the intervention price for the sugar year 1981/82. It would re-examine the situation in the light of the information supplied. Lastly, the Council instructed a working group to consider in greater depth the technical aspects of an Australian request that steps be taken to determine, in the context of Greece's accession to the Community, how the incidence of variable levies applied under the Community's common agricultural policy should be calculated. The Australian request arose in the context of discussions in the working group currently looking into the GATT implications of the enlargement of the Community.⁴

Committee on Trade and Development

2.2.32. The Committee on Trade and Development¹ met on 24 March. In addition to carrying out a general review of developments in world trade in 1980 the Committee took note of the report on structural adjustment recently finalized by a special working group.² The Committee also pursued its work on trade liberalization, particularly with regard to tropical products.

Committee on Trade in Civil Aircraft

2.2.33. The Committee on Trade in Civil Aircraft met on 25 and 26 March and examined various questions relating to the implementation of the Agreement on Trade in Civil Aircraft concluded under the MTN, with particular respect to licences and information on State aids. The Committee noted in particular the progress accomplished with a view to a possible extension of the list of products covered by the Agreement.

Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe

2.2.34. The second phase of the Madrid Conference³ has been in progress since January⁴ and is now concerned with the negotiation and drafting of a final document. At the present stage it is difficult to foresee when the Conference will end and what the results will be.

Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development

Committee for Agriculture

2.2.35. The Working Party on Agricultural Policies of the OECD Committee for Agriculture met in Paris from 2 to 5 March and carried out an initial examination of a draft study on the implications of the various methods of agricultural income support. The draft study sets out to analyse the effects of support measures on agriculture itself, on the economy as a whole and on international trade in agricultural products.

Committee for Scientific and Technological Policy

2.2.36. The Community was represented at the ministerial-level meeting of the OECD Committee for Scientific and Technological Policy in Paris on 19 and 20 March. The discussions were on the general theme of science, technology and innovation in the 1980s—national and international prospects.

The Ministers reviewed the situation of science and technology policy in the OECD member States in the light of the numerous economic and social challenges facing them. They exchanged views on the national and international approaches that were necessary to meet those challenges through research, development and innovation. They identified ways in which rapid breakthroughs in many fields of scientific and technological research may open up new prospects for the decade and beyond. Lastly, they discussed ways of strengthening national R & D efforts by means of increased cooperation between the member States.

At the conclusion of the meeting the Ministers adopted a declaration on future science and technology policies in which they stressed the need to dovetail those policies with the other aspects of government action and identified the main guidelines to be followed in the decade at national and international level to derive maximum benefit from the research and innovation capacity of the Member States.

Industrialized countries

EFTA countries

Exchange of information on State aid

2.2.37. The Commission organized a round of meetings with the EFTA countries to study problems arising from the increasingly fre-

quent recourse to State aids to combat mounting difficulties in various industries. The ECSC and EEC Treaties and the EFTA-Community free-trade agreements prohibit any State aid which distorts or threatens to distort competition.

Since the purpose of the meetings was to allow a general exchange of information, no specific cases were discussed. The Commission set out its policy, which is based on the principles in the Treaty, while the EFTA countries described their own national aid systems.

Switzerland

2.2.38. Under the cooperation arrangements between the Commission and Switzerland on environmental matters, based on an exchange of letters dated 12 December 1975,¹ there was a meeting in Brussels on 13 March to exchange views on the state of the environment in the Community and Switzerland and the policies being followed on either side. A report on chemicals and one on air pollution and noise were presented and discussed, and the participants reviewed international issues of joint interest, such as action to combat pollution in the Mediterranean, the coordinated application of the Washington Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Flora and Fauna, and preparation for forthcoming UN and **OECD** meetings.

Austria

2.2.39. At Austria's request the EEC-Austria and ECSC-Austria Joint Committees held extraordinary meetings on 20 March, when Italy's restriction on the number of customs posts authorized to clear imports of textiles and iron and steel products was discussed.

United States

Council statement on relations with the United States

2.2.40. A report on the problems caused by certain imports from the United States, which

a Commission delegation raised with the American authorities in Washington on 9 and 10 February,² was submitted by the Commission to the Council on 12 March and discussed at the Council meeting on 16 and 17 March. The Council's conclusions form a sequel to its major statement on EEC-US trade relations issued on 16 December last year.³

The press release issued following the Council's March discussions—based on the Commission report—of the problems, caused mainly by US petrochemical and synthetic textile exports to the Community, stated:

'The Council took note of the report and of the views expressed by delegations regarding the urgent and serious nature of these problems. It asked the Commission, as a matter of urgency, to continue its talks with the United States authorities on the liberalization of the price of natural gas and of the high level of penetration of United States exports of certain textile products in certain areas of the Community. It called upon the Commission to continue giving high priority to these issues and to report back at the earliest opportunity.'

2.2.41. The EEC-US Study Group on Petrochemicals⁴ held its second meeting in Brussels on 18 and 19 March, with experts from the industry taking part. Subjects covered included the effects of the deregulation of US oil prices on 28 January, prospects for the deregulation of US natural gas prices, and the current Department of Commerce proposal to liberalize US exports of paraffinic naphthas. The Group also discussed the method to be used for estimating the cost advantage derived by US petrochemicals manufacturers from oil and gas price controls.

Japan

2.2.42. On 17 March the Council had a brief exchange of views on the present state of EEC-Japan relations. The Commission is to report in June on general developments following further contacts with the Japanese authorities and the latest round of high-level consultations.

2.2.43. The Commission Regulations adopted in February¹ introducing Commun-ity surveillance of imports from Japan of motor vehicles, television receivers and tubes and certain machine tools came into force on 1 March, relating to imports effected from 1 January. The Commission will report to the Council on their implementation once returns for the first quarter are available.

Australia

2.2.44. At a further round of negotiations on the Euratom-Australia safeguards agreement, which took place in Canberra from 21 to 27 March, the two delegations reached agreement on a text which will be submitted to the appropriate authorities on either side.

New Zealand

2.2.45. At its 30 March-2 April meeting the Council formally adopted the Regulation on the import of New Zealand butter into the United Kingdom under special conditions.² The new arrangement provides for importation of 70250 tonnes for the period 1 April-31 December 1981 (94000 tonnes for the whole of 1981) and 92 000 tonnes for 1982.

Acting on a proposal from the Commission, the Council will determine before 1 October 1982 the quantity which the United Kingdom will be authorized to import during the 1983 calendar year, taking account among other things of trends in the situation on the Community butter market and in the world butter market. Before 1 August 1983 the Council will review, on the basis of a report and a proposal from the Commission, the operation of this arrangement with a view to taking a decision on the arrangement for the import of New Zealand butter after 1 January 1984.

Mediterranean countries

Cyprus

2.2.46. The Protocol concerning the arrangements to be applied during 1981,³ in the framework of the Decision adopted by the Association Council on 24 November

1980⁴ establishing the process into the second stage of the EEC-Cyprus Association Agreement, was signed on 18 March. The Protocol, which constitutes the first step in that process, extends once again,⁵ until the end of 1981, the trade arrangements applying in EEC-Cyprus relations in 1980.

Yugoslavia

2.2.47. Pending the conclusion of a protocol to adapt the EEC-Yugoslavia agreement in the light of the accession of Greece, the Council extended for two months the autonomous arrangements⁶ applying to imports of products originating in Yugoslavia. Work is continuing on the directives to be given to the Commission for the negotiation of a protocol.

Maghreb

Morocco

2.2.48. The first meeting between European and Moroccan Members of Parliament under the EEC-Morocco Cooperation Agreement took place in Strasbourg from 10 to 12 March.

The participants reviewed the Cooperation Agreement and its future in the light of Spain's prospective entry into the Community. Much discussion was devoted to agricultural questions in general (erosion of preferences, fears of Spanish competition, etc.) and to the problems of individual products (citrus fruit, fresh and preserved tomatoes, early fruit and vegetables, etc.).

Israel

2.2.49. The second Additional Protocol to the EEC-Israel Agreement was signed in Brussels on 18 March.

This Protocol provides for a two-year deferment of the timetable for tariff dismantling by Israel with respect to certain industrial products from the Community and of the date of expiry of the clause on Israel's new industries (this will now expire in 1985 instead of 1983).

Developing countries

ACP States and OCT

ACP-EEC Convention

Accessions

2.2.50. The Republic of Vanuatu acceded to the ACP-EEC Convention on 18 March¹ and thus became an ACP State for purposes of the Convention (Lomé II) with effect from that date.

Trade cooperation

2.2.51. The Community has made a contribution to promote commercial training in a number of developing countries (three ACP States, three non-associated developing countries and the ASEAN countries).

2.2.52. It also provided technical and financial assistance for the Berlin international tourism fair (28 February-6 March), in which 20 ACP States, three non-associated developing countries, five OCT and three islands of the Netherlands Antilles took part.

European Development Fund

2.2.53. In March the Commission decided to finance projects from the resources of the third, fourth and fifth EDFs, at a total cost of 16 550 000 ECU, as follows:

Asia

Pakistan

2.2.54. At its fifth meeting, held in Islamabad on 28 and 29 March, the EEC-Pakistan Joint Commission looked at the development of trade between the two sides. It also reviewed the trade promotion programme for 1980 and discussed priorities for the 1981 programme.

The Joint Commission agreed to hold a seminar in Pakistan in 1981 on the Community's new generalized scheme of preferences, which came into force on 1 January, and also exchanged views on the EEC-Pakistan textile agreement. The Commission delegation pointed out that the 1981 aid programme for Pakistan included aid to the refugees from Afghanistan.

Latin America

Mexico

2.2.55. On 16 March the Mexican Foreign Minister, Mr Castañeda, paid an official visit to the Commission, where he was received by Mr Thorn, Mr Haferkamp and Mr Cheysson. Discussion centered on bilateral relations between the EEC and Mexico, North-South relations, the situation in Central America and cooperation with the Caribbean countries.

State-trading countries

Romania

2.2.56. On 13 March Parliament adopted a resolution on relations between the EEC and Romania,² with particular reference to the Agreement establishing an EEC-Romania Joint Committee and the EEC-Romania Agreement on trade in industrial products, which were signed in Bucharest on 28 July

last year.¹ Parliament welcomed the conclusion of the two Agreements.

Council for Mutual Economic Assistance (CMEA)

2.2.57. On 20 March Mr Haferkamp replied to the letter sent to the President of the Council last November by Mr Lukanov, Chairman of the CMEA Executive Committee. The reply—which had been discussed by the appropriate Council bodies—is concerned, like Mr Lukanov's letter, with the follow-up to the deliberations of the committee of experts set up to negotiate an agreement between the two organizations which last met in October.²

Diplomatic relations

2.2.58. The President of the Council and the President of the Commission received His Excellency Mr Petrus Hendrik Meyer, who presented his letters of credence as Head of the Mission of the Republic of South Africa to the European Communities with effect from 17 March.³

The new ambassador succeeds Mr Albertus B.F. Burger.

European political cooperation

European Council

2.2.59. Meeting in Maastricht on 23 and 24 March,⁴ the European Council adopted a number of declarations in the political cooperation context—concerning the Middle East, Lebanon, Afghanistan and Poland.⁵

2.2.60. During its part-session in Strasbourg from 9 to 13 March Parliament passed three resolutions on political cooperation issues—the attempted *coup* in Spain, compensation for the victims of violence, and Western Sahara.⁶

3. Institutional and political matters

Institutional developments and European policy

Powers of the Community and of the Member States

2.3.1. The Council adopted a decision authorizing signature of the International Cocoa Agreement;¹ the Community and the Member States signed the Agreement in New York on 30 March.

At the same time the Council approved an internal arrangement in respect of participa-

tion by the Community and the Member States in international work on commodities. This agreed formula will strengthen the Community's cohesion *vis-à-vis* non-member countries and will enable it to speak with a single voice in negotiating such agreements.¹

Seat of the institutions

2.3.2. At the Maastricht European Council² the Heads of State or Government decided

unanimously to confirm the *status quo* as regards the provisional places of work of the Community institutions.

Composition of the Court of Justice

2.3.3. On 30 March the Council decided to increase the number of Judges at the Court of Justice to 11 and the number of Advocates-General to $5.^{1}$

The eleventh Judge will be of French nationality until 6 October 1982 and the fifth Advocate-General will be of Dutch nationality until 6 October 1985. Their successors will be appointed in alphabetical order of country: the Judge will come from one of the larger of the present member countries (when Spain joins the Community he will possibly be Spanish), the Advocate-General will be a national of one of the six smaller countries.

The new Judge and the new Advocate-General were appointed by decision of the Representatives of the Governments of the Member States on 30 March.²

Interinstitutional relations

2.3.4. On 26 March Parliament decided to amend its Rules of Procedure.³ The purpose of the changes is to lighten the agenda of the plenary sittings and enable proceedings to run more smoothly. But the major innovation lies in strengthening Parliament's role in the legislative process by altering the consultation procedure.

Institutions and organs of the Communities

Parliament⁴

2.3.5. The annual session of Parliament opened in Strasbourg on 10 March. Parliament met twice this month: it held its regular part-session from 9 to 13 March and special sittings from 23 to 26 March which were mainly devoted to the farm price proposals for 1981/82.

Revision of the Rules of Procedure

2.3.6. On a report by Mr Luster (*EPP/D*) Parliament adopted a general revision of its Rules of Procedure, the result of a compromise between most of the political groups in the House.

The changes were approved by a very large majority; only certain Independents or non-affiliated members resisted them, like Mr Pannella (*Ind/*I), who likened the new Rules to a 'bad settling of accounts'.

The changes made bear mainly on the following points:

• Lightening of the agenda. Parliament may now refer to committee any Commission proposals of a technical nature which have no general impact. The committee's views will be sent direct, as Parliament's opinion, to the other institutions.

The draft agenda will be agreed between the President and the chairmen of the political groups.

• Consultation procedure. Under the new Rules, Parliament, before adopting an opinion, will be able the ascertain the Commission's position on any proposals for amendments, and the Council will be able to state its reasons when it does not intend to act upon Parliament's opinion. One provision stipulates that a negative vote on a Commis-

sion proposal is not to be taken as constituting Parliament's opinion: the matter is then deemed to be referred back to committee, unless the Commission withdraws its proposals.

2.3.7. On 11 March Parliament extended the membership of its committees.

Regular part-session — Strasbourg: 9 to 13 March

2.3.8. Parliament held a preliminary debate on budgetary questions, after which it set out in a resolution its guidelines for the 1982 budget. The House made a point of contributing to the International Year for Disabled Persons by a searching debate, during which many suggestions were made for improving the situation of disabled people in the Community. In a resolution on democracy in Spain Parliament called for speedier negotiations with that country.

Guidelines for the 1982 budget

(11 and 12 March)

2.3.9. The rapporteur, Mr Spinelli (Com/I), represented Parliament's guidelines for the 1982 budget. Reminding the House that on budgetary issues Parliament shared in the decision-making power and that the Commission would have to present several instruments before its preliminary draft, Mr Spinelli urged the Commission to state its priorities in good time and indicate what they would cost.

For the Socialists, Mr Arndt (D) felt that the first priority for the Community was to redress the employment situation. Like the rapporteur before him, he emphasized the need to include Community lending and borrowing operations in the budget.

With some qualifications the EPP Group, in the person of Mr Notenboom (NL), endorsed the demand for a clear-cut definition of the expenditure transfers which would have to be made from national to Community level. Community policies must not supplement national policies but replace them wherever this was desirable. Mr Notenboom expressed full support for the spirit of the Spinelli resolution, while pointing out that for the EPP Group there was no question of regarding the points in it as the basis for eventual rejection of the 1982 budget.

Speaking for his Group, Mr Taylor (*ED*/UK) approved the Spinelli report. The European Democrats regretted the way that each of the political groups, during the first reading of the budget, supported its own amendments without showing any concern for real priorities.

Mr Gouthier (Com/I) linked the problem of the 1982 budget to that of own resources, where he found that the Commission was still being timid. Considering the urgency of the material problems involved, the lending and borrowing operations were of crucial importance. Furthermore, they had to be fitted into a suitable budgetary framework and must be subject to Parliamentary control.

For the Liberal Group, Mrs Pruvot (F) had some misgivings about the Spinelli report: though the House ought to state its major priorities, it should not in so doing usurp the role of the Commission.

For the EPD Group, Mr Ansquer (F) contended that in the present economic circumstances the dual keynotes of the 1982 budget must be moderation and efficacity. Priority must be given to policies based on coordination of national policies.

Mr Pannella (Ind/I) supported Mr Spinelli's resolution; he particularly approved its tone, even if in content it was still too timid.

Replying for the Commission, Mr Tugendhat recognized the crucial importance of the Spinelli report. On agriculture, the Commission shared Parliament's concern not only to reduce surpluses but also to cut costs; it was therefore laying considerable emphasis on the principle of co-responsibility.

Turning to own resources, Mr Tugendhat took the view that the development of the Community could not be artificially held back; this problem could not be dissociated from that of the policies to be conducted and the expenditure to be committed.

Winding up the debate, the rapporteur, Mr Spinelli, declared that they had to break the vicious circle of refusing to introduce new policies for want of adequate funds and refusing to supply funds on the ground that the policies were not there to justify them.

Parliament adopted, with some minor amendments, the resolution contained in the report despite the fact that the French Communists and the Liberal Group voted against it.

Disabled people

(10 and 11 March)

2.3.10. In connection with the International Year for Disabled Persons Mrs Clwyd (Soc/UK) had compiled a report on the economic, social and vocational integration of disabled people in the European Community in 1981.

Mrs Clwyd contended that the first thing to do was to harmonize the provisions concerning disabled persons in the Community countries. These covered allowances, income guarantees, adaptation of housing, allocation of job quotas, aid to families, transport facilities, a European card for disabled persons, and so on. The operations of the European Social Fund were not enough.

Mrs Clwyd highlighted the social distress of the disabled person who could not find a job. She also stressed that attitudes in society towards disabled people must change.

All the speakers in the debate stressed the need for measures to help the disabled. Mrs Cassanmagnago Cerretti (*EPP*/I) emphasized the value of pre-school training for handicapped children. Mrs De March (*Com*/F) recommended that a 10% quota of jobs be reserved for disabled people. Alluding to industrial and road accidents, Mr Vié (*EPD*/F) suggested that the people responsible for health and safety, particularly works doctors, should have wider powers.

Some members, Mr Vandemeulebroucke (*Ind/B*) among them, complained that Mrs Clwyd's report was not bold enough.

For the Commission, Mr Richard pointed to the very broad approach Parliament was taking. The Community must nevertheless do more than make statements of intent, of which disabled people had had their fill. The Commission was undertaking to focus its efforts on the problems of employment and social protection.

The resources of the Social Fund were indeed inadequate and many obstacles still stood in the way of using them. Mr Richard undertook to find remedies. The quota system did not, as he saw it, offer the best answer. Mr Richard also undertook to present a special action programme targeted according to Parliament's conclusion.

After the debate Parliament approved Mrs Clwyd's report, making a number of amendments, one of which urged the Commission to report on the economic and social situation of disabled persons in each of the Member States so that common standards and criteria for their rights and duties could be established.

Furthermore, the Social Fund must be able to assist pilot schemes intended to adapt transport infrastructures for the use of disabled people. As the main needs of disabled people in respect of transport arose at local level, the House urged local authorities and bodies responsible for local transport to review their programmes in that light.

The Commission was asked to exempt from VAT, in all the Member States, the private organizations responsible for helping the disabled.

New organization of the market in sugar (11 and 12 March)

2.3.11. The proposal for a new common organization of the market in sugar¹ was considered in a report by Mr Bocklet (*EPP/D*), who was glad that the quota system was still the means of regulating the markets. His report nevertheless rejected direct allocation of quotas to companies and any abolition of the target price. The report also came out against levying 2.5% of the target price for the A and B quotas.

The report got a mixed reception in the debate: many amendments were tabled—and adopted by the House—by the Socialist Group, the Committee on Budgets and the Committee on Development and Cooperation. These amendments substantially altered Mr Bocklet's motion for a resolution, which was subsequently rejected in its entirety, mainly through the votes of the EPP Group.

Parliament's opinion on the proposal for a new organization of the sugar markets was consequently adopted at the second March part-session.¹

Democracy in Spain

(13 March)

2.3.12. A joint resolution was moved by five political groups (Soc., ED, EPP, Com. and Lib.) on the recent attempt at a *coup d'état* in Spain. The EPD Group was unable to support the resolution for various reasons, the main one being that it could not accept the points concerning the speeding-up of the accession negotiations with Spain.

The House adopted the joint resolution despite the opposition of the French Communists and certain Socialist members. Two of the points in the resolution declare that Parliament 'stresses the political importance of enlargement both for the applicant countries and for the Community, and for the search for economic and social equilibrium between countries and regions' and 'underlines the Community's responsibilities as regards the preservation and stengthening of democracy in Spain and calls on the relevant authorities to take the necessary measures to speed up the negotiations for Spain's accession.'

2.3.13. On 13 March Parliament approved the proposal² for a resolution on the priorities and timetable for decisions to be taken by the Council in the transport sector during the period up to end of 1983: the House nevertheless considered that some of the proposals had become obsolete or ought to be reviewed, while other specific priorities could be added to the programme. 2.3.14. Parliament also passed resolutions on:

• linking work and training for young persons in the Community: the House deplored the way in which the Council was neglecting the Commission's proposals and stressed the need for a significant increase in the appropriations for training;

• youth activities: the House wanted to see an expanded role for the European Youth Forum, a long-term strategy for education and training and more intra-Community exchanges for young people;

• disturbance of the Community apple market: Parliament urged the Commission to study the operation of the market and adapt the rules accordingly;

• the Commission's communications on the operation of STABEX³ in 1977 and 1978: the Commission was asked, in the light of experience, to make a number of arrangements to improve the system;

• EEC-Romania relations.

2.3.15. Parliament also gave its opinion on establishing minimum Community criteria for compensation for victims of acts of violence.

2.3.16. After a sometimes heated debate Parliament passed a resolution on the Western Sahara, urging the Moroccan Government not to invoke the right of pursuit and requesting the Governments of the Member States to endeavour to mediate between Morocco and Algeria with a view to maintaining peace and stability in the area.

Special sittings — Strasbourg 23 to 26 March

2.3.17. Besides the adoption of new Rules of procedure, the main object of the second part-session was to debate the agricultural prices. In contrast to last year,⁴ Parliament was able to take a clear position on an aver-

age price increase of 12%. But the arguments had lost none of their edge, as many members still felt that such increases would produce serious budgetary problems and consequently hamper spending on the other Community policies.

Agricultural prices

(25 and 26 March)

2.3.18. In his report Mr Ligios (EPP/I) wanted an average increase of 12%, a substantial reduction in the monetary compensatory amounts and no general application of the co-responsibility levy.

The debate saw two approaches emerge: one which favoured a price increase which would compensate the losses in farmer's incomes; the other, 'budgetary', which sought to curb the growth of agricultural spending.

The 'budgetary' position was defended notably by Mr Notenboom (*EPP*/NL), who reminded the House that it must be consistent and not swell the budget by spending more on agriculture. Miss Hooper (*ED*/UK) took a similar view, maintaining that a price increase higher than that recommended by the Commission would be unacceptable for the consumer.

This attitude was very soon seen to be in a minority: many speakers held that an increase in agricultural prices had very little impact on consumer prices and that there would be no need to fall back on a supplementary budget to finance such an increase.

In point of fact the debate very quickly shifted from the problem of the price increase to focus on the matter of changing the agricultural policy, which would be hamstrung by general application of the coresponsibility levy. Many members were fiercely opposed to general application of the levy, including Mr Notenboom (*EPP*/NL), who doubted whether such a levy was effective, Mr Wettig (*Soc*/D), who claimed that it perpetuated rigid structures and complex administration, and Mr Sutra (*Soc*/F), who felt that it actually induced surpluses.

Replying for the Commission, Mr Dalsager first pointed out that the average increase of

agricultural prices was a fairly meaningless notion. If the price of milk or the price of cereals were not to be raised, should the prices for other products be raised disproportionately? Unfortunately, the increase in surplus produce was occurring most frequently in the regions where farms were small.

The amended resolution moved by Mr Ligios was adopted by 107 votes to 53. As amended, it reiterated that a supplementary budget for 1981 would not be needed to finance the increase in agricultural prices and called for the harmonization of national aids.

Most of the French members voted against the resolution, mainly on the ground that an average increase of 12% was inadequate.

2.3.19. During the 26 March sitting Parliament adopted a number of opinions on Commission proposals concerning fisheries policy, including the proposal for a Decision on the conclusion of the Convention on Future Multilateral Cooperation in the North-East Atlantic Fisheries.¹

2.3.20. The House also gave its opinion, which it had been unable to do earlier in the month,² on the proposal for a new common organization of the market for sugar:³ it rejected several points in the proposal, notably the level of the basic production levy and abolition of national production quotas and the guide price.

Council

2.3.21. The Council held ten meetings in March. The table below lists the number, place and date of each meeting, the names of the Council President and the Commission representatives and the main items of business. The footnotes refer to the points in the Bulletin where a more detailed account is given of decisions taken, agreements reached, positions adopted and questions discussed (Table 6).

Commission

2.3.22. The Commission held five meetings in March, the last of which was continued on 1 April. As usual since the new Commission took office, each meeting lasted for several sittings.

Decisions, communications and proposals

2.3.23. Continuing to prepare for the Maastricht European Council, the Commission adopted communications on the economic and social situation, relations with the industrialized countries and the North-South Dialogue.¹

It also adopted proposals and communications in other areas: the search for a compromise on farm prices and related measures for 1981/82, financial cooperation between the Community and Spain,² trade in textile products,³ the supply of foodstuffs to Poland⁴ and the adjustment of the 'green rates'.⁵

The Commission also adopted decisions concerning the steel industry.⁶

Discussions, policy debates and work in hand

2.3.24. The Commission devoted much of its time and thought to preparing for the many Council meetings held in March—especially the search for compromise solutions for agricultural prices and in respect of fisheries.⁷ It held an initial policy debate on regional policy, the purpose of which was to work out eventual proposals for revising the Regulation establishing the Regional Fund and to prepare recommendations which the Commission can present under the head of re-

gional policy in its report on the structural changes to be made to Community policies.

Emergency aid to Member States

2.3.25. An agreement setting out the practicalities involved in Community aid for reconstruction in the areas ravaged by the earthquake in Italy last November was signed in Brussels on 16 March. Aid will be in the form of loans for projects to rebuild production facilities and restore infrastructures.

The loans will be made either out of the EIB's own resources or from the resources availables under the New Community Instrument. They will carry a 3% interest subsidy financed out of the Community budget.

Relations with workers' and employers' organizations

2.3.26. During a series of preliminary consultations, European Trade Union Confederation experts discussed frontier workers and the common agricultural policy. Experts from the European Metalworkers' Federation, the ICFTU-ECSC Liaison Office and the European Trade Union Committee of Food and Allied Workers discussed arms exports, the situation of the coal industry and the problem of milk surpluses, respectively.

The European Trade Union Confederation also held an exchange of views with the Commission on the energy programme drawn up by ETUC.

2.3.27. Mr Davignon and Mr Haferkamp met representatives of the textile and clothing unions and employers' organizations to discuss the industry's current difficulties. Topics covered included outward processing traffic, the Multifibre Arrangement, employment and relations between industrialized and developing countries.

Court of Justice¹

Composition of the Court

2.3.28. On 3 March,² by decision of the Representatives of the Governments of the Member States, Mrs Simone Rozès was appointed Advocate-General at the Court of Justice to replace Mr Mayras, following his resignation.

Mrs Rozès took the oath before the Court on 18 March.³

2.3.29. On 30 March,⁴ by decision of the Representatives of the Governments of the Member States:

Mr Fernand Grévisse was appointed Judge at the Court for the period from 1 April 1981 to 6 October 1982;

Mr P. VerLoren van Themaat was • appointed Advocate-General at the Court for the period from 1 April 1981 to 6 October 1985.

By its decisions of 30 March the Council increased the number of Judges to 11 and the number of Advocates-General to five.⁵

Economic and Social Committee

2.3.32. The 186th plenary session of the Economic and Social Committee was held on 25 and 26 March with Mr Roseingrave in the chair. Mr Thorn, President of the Commission, attended part of the proceedings, which were preceded by a formal ceremony during which the 12 new Greek members were installed in office.¹

Opinions

Health protection

2.3.33. The Committee unanimously adopted an opinion on the proposal for a Directive laying down basic standards for the health protection of workers and the general public against the dangers of microwave radiation.²

The Committee called for an adequately funded research programme to encourage national and Community research projects in this field. In order to provide such a research programme with an information base, the Committee proposed that the Directive include an obligation to supply information on the effects of any substantial exposure to microwave radiation which has damaged health.

The Committee argued that the nonprofessional who uses a microwave system (e.g. a microwave oven) should also be protected. The Committee felt that the most effective way of achieving this would be to ensure, by means of appropriate design or

type-approval tests, that emission values are low enough for the equipment to be used by the non-professional.

Combating marine pollution

2.3.34. Two opinions on marine pollution were adopted: one on a proposal for a Directive concerning the enforcement, in respect of shipping using Community ports, of international standards for shipping safety and pollution prevention,¹ the other on a proposal for a Decision establishing a Community information system for preventing and combating hydrocarbon pollution of the sea.²

In both opinions, considered together, the Committee endorsed the Commission's proposals but urged that inspections be also made in the near future on vessels of under 500 tonnes and that new measures be implemented for combating pollution.

Agricultural prices and related measures

2.3.35. The Committee adopted by 48 votes to 27, with 11 abstentions, an opinion on the Commission proposal on the fixing of prices for certain agricultural products and certain related measures for $1981/82.^3$

The Committee felt that a larger increase in prices than that advocated by the Commission would not be incompatible with the justifiable restraints imposed by the budget. In fact a substantial reduction in European Agricultural Guidance and Guarantee Fund expenditure can be expected on account of the probable trend of the agricultural markets as analysed by the Commission and the expected streamlining of expenditure, especially in the sugar and milk products sectors.

On the question of co-responsibility the Committee, as previously, stated its support for some financial participation on the part of the producers but recognized that for lack of time it was not for the moment able to reach any conclusions on the various forms of co-responsibility envisaged by the Commission. 2.3.36. With some reservations the Committee unanimously approved the proposal for a Council Regulation on the common organization of the market in fishery products.⁴

The Committee welcomed the fact that, in determining the guide price, which forms the basis for all other price fixing and compensatory payments under the fisheries market regime, new criteria such as the need to stabilize prices, safeguard producers' income and consider the interests of the consumer are to be applied in addition to the existing yardstick (prices in the three previous fishing years).

As regards the method of calculating the withdrawal price, the Committee welcomed the fact that, in contrast to the present rigid adherence to the official withdrawal price, it is now planned to allow the producers' organizations to make a reduction of up to 10% on the official withdrawal price without losing their right to reimbursement. It felt, however, that in the interests of better adjustment to the market, it would be preferable to permit the producers' organizations to deviate from the official withdrawal price by up to 10% upwards or downwards.

The Committee felt that the free-at-frontier price is no protection for producers and that a minimum import price below which fish would not be allowed to enter the Community would be more effective and, above all, significantly clearer.

2.3.37. The Committee also approved the Commission's proposals to the Council concerning:

(a) a procedure for the provision of information in the field of technical standards and regulations;⁵

(b) the amendment of two Directives on tax-free allowances applied in international travel and to imports of goods in small consignments of a non-commercial character;¹

(c) reform of the network for the collection of accountancy data on the income and business operation of agricultural holdings in the Community.²

ECSC Consultative Committee

215th meeting

2.3.38. On 6 March the ECSC Consultative Committee held an ordinary meeting in Luxembourg. Mr Coosemans was in the chair, and the meeting was attended by a number of senior Commission officials.

Changes were made to the Rules of Procedure, agreement was reached on 70 steel research projects and two coal research programmes (mining techniques and product beneficiation). Most of the time, however. was spent on the steel industry (implementation of production quotas and restructuring) and on the coal market and its prospects.

Application of Article 58 of the ECSC Treaty

2.3.39. The Committee discussed the recent meeting between Mr Davignon and a delegation from the Committee which had insisted that quotas should be fixed as rapidly as possible and has asked that information should be clear and readily accessible and that the three-monthly forecasts be maintained.

A member of the Committee summarized the previous day's discussions with a Commission representative. These had highlighted the seriousness of the market situation, which in the Commission's view would deteriorate during the second half of the year. Imports of steel products had not disturbed the Community market, but exports had declined because of difficulties in penetrating the American market. Members of the Committee accepted this analysis but pointed to gaps or anomalies in the Commission's policy: a production increase in the first half of the year despite a reduction in quotas, excessive imports from outside the Community and insufficiently vigorous action by the Commission on cases of dumping reported to it.

A Commission representative confirmed that, despite the forecast at the beginning of the year, production would decline slightly. Article 58 should have had more effect on product prices; the Commission now intended to ensure that Article 60 (unfair and discriminatory practices) was respected, and instructions would be given to examine dumping practices without delay.

Restructuring of the steel industry

2.3.40. Through its representative, the Commission agreed that the pace of restructuring in the steel industry was unsatisfactory. Uncompetitive plant had to be taken out of service, and the system of aids to the industry needed to be reviewed. The Commission has decided to use all the means provided in the ECSC Treaty to stimulate restructuring---something which also involves conversion aids and social policy. The Council agreed to take a policy decision on this matter at its 26 March meeting.

The Community coal market

2.3.41. The Commission document on the coal market in 1980 and the prospects for 1981 met with the approval of most members of the Committee. The Commission representative emphasized that investment in the coal industry in 1981 would be even higher than the record figure achieved in 1980. He regretted that the present recession and high interest rates were delaying investments which would later prove to be economically viable. At the end of the discussion the Committee agreed that the Commission paper gave a

satisfactory analysis of the situation and likely developments. A number of members would have liked the Commission to go into greater detail on its recommendations for speeding up the changeover from oil to coal.

216th meeting

2.3.42. On 19 March the ECSC Consultative Committee held a special meeting in Luxembourg to discuss restructuring of the steel industry and adopted an Opinion on this matter by a large majority (62 votes to 6).

The Opinion was based on reports by the appropriate subcommittees on two documents sent by the Commission to the Council in February.²

In subcommittee, Commission representatives had emphasized the need to take further restructuring measures to reduce excess productive capacity (estimated at 25 million tonnes) and to grant aid only to projects which would contribute to restructuring.

Committee members placed particular stress on the need to adopt a firm stance on investment without losing sight of long-term prospects. Imports from Japan were also discussed. Some British members hoped that other Member States would carry out restructuring on the scale on which it had been done in the United Kingdom.

Members of the Committee attached great importance to restructuring so as to increase the industry's profitability and achieve a balance between supply and demand. They were concerned about the quantity of imports from outside the Community (sometimes from countries which had themselves taken protectionist measures), and they endorsed the proposed investment policy and measures designed to improve information and ensure market transparency.

Concerning the social aspect of restructuring, the Committee rapporteur drew attention to the following points:

(a) Member States must take measures to stimulate economic growth;

(b) decisions should be taken on financing early retirement and short-time working for economic reasons; (c) conversion measures are inseparable from social measures;

(d) the appropriate financial resources must be made available;

(e) decisions on the social aspects of steel industry policy should be taken at the Council meeting on 26 March.

The Commission representative announced that the Commission would propose that a new *ad hoc* committee consisting of representatives of the Commission and the Member States be set up to monitor and ensure the transparency of State aids. He thought the figure for excess capacity was understated at 25 million tonnes and pointed out that the present market situation was a result of the very low level of prices within the Community as well as the volume of imports.

After a wide-ranging debate, the Committee adopted with some amendments the opinion which had been submitted to it and attached an extract from the minutes of the meeting.

European Investment Bank

Operations in March

2.3.43. In March the European Investment Bank announced loans totalling 15.9 million units of account² for investments in the Community, 10.9 million u.a. going to the United Kingdom and 5 million u.a. to France. Outside the Community the Bank lent 15 million u.a. to Israel and 100 000 u.a. to Lesotho, an ACP country.

Community

United Kingdom

2.3.44. In the United Kingdom the Bank lent UKL 5 million towards the cost of carrying out 17 improvement schemes on trunk

roads in Northern Ireland and improving communications with several industrial estates and the ports of Belfast and Londonderry. In February 1979 the Bank made a first loan of UKL 15 million towards the cost of these schemes. A further loan of UKL 1 million will help finance 18 000 new subscriber connections to the Kingston-upon-Hull telecommunications network, helping to adapt it to changes in the pattern of demand due largely to the creation of several industrial estates on the outskirts of the city.

France

2.3.45. In France a loan of FF 29.8 million has been granted towards completion of a 66.5 km section of the A 63 motorway along the Basque coast between St-Geours-de-Maremne and the Spanish border, with interchanges serving Hendaye, St-Jean-de-Luz, Biarritz, Bayonne and Capbreton. The Bank granted FF 55 million in 1974 for the initial phase of the project. The A 63 will provide one of the two motorway links with the applicant countries Spain and Portugal. It will also help to improve conditions for regional development in Aquitaine.

Outside the Community

Israel

2.3.46. In its first operation in Israel the Bank granted a global loan of 15 million u.a. to the Industrial Development Bank of Israel under the terms of the Financial Protocol to the 1975 Cooperation Agreement. The proceeds will be onlent to help finance 14 small and medium-scale ventures in the woodworking, agricultural and building materials industries, among others.

Altogether more than 700 jobs should be created.

The EEC-Israel Financial Protocol forms part of the Community's Mediterranean cooperation policy, under which the Community has made agreements with thirteen Mediterranean countries: five European countries (Cyprus, Malta, Portugal, Turkey and Yugoslavia), Israel, the Maghreb countries (Algeria, Morocco and Tunisia) and the Mashreq countries (Egypt, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria).

ACP States

2.3.47. As part of its operations in the African, Caribbean and Pacific signatories of the Lomé Conventions, the EIB has granted 100 000 u.a. drawn from risk capital managed by the EIB under the European Development Fund for feasibility studies in Lesotho on the development of tourism and the construction of a ceramics factory.

Financing Community activities

2.3.48. On 12 March Parliament adopted a resolution on its guidelines for the financial and budgetary policy of the European Communities for $1982.^{1}$

Financial operations

ECSC

Loans paid out

2.3.49. Acting under Articles 54 and 56 of the ECSC Treaty, the Commission made loans in March amounting to 52 130 000 ECU (industrial and conversion loans).

Industrial loans

2.3.50. Industrial loans (Article 54) totalling 48 760 000 ECU were paid out to Community firms to finance the following projects:



4. Recovery of the steel industry

Resolution on steel recovery policy, adopted at Council meeting on 26-27 March 1981

3.4.1. Following its Resolution of 3 March 1981, the Council confirms the undertakings outlined therein and agrees on the following measures to be taken to deal with the crisis facing the European steel industry.

The Council considers that it will only be possible to give lasting security to the European steel industry if strict discipline among producers enables prices to be substantially increased as soon as possible and if restructuring measures involving reductions in capacity are implemented at the same time by undertakings.

1. Objective and measures to be implemented

The objective to be achieved is the restoration in the medium term of normal market conditions in which undertakings are profitable, i.e. they cover by the proceeds from production, without any State aid, the costs of the factors of production including a normal level of depreciation and a reasonable rate of financing costs.

If this objective is to be attained, the Council considers that:

• aid to steel undertakings should be gradually phased out, within a specified period of time, and all distortion of competition avoided;

• overall production capacity should be reduced within the Community;

• the production capacity for the various categories of product should not be increased. Consequently, the creation of any new production units should be offset by the simultaneous closure of equivalent capacities by the undertaking or group of undertakings concerned;

• aid should be confined to those undertakings or groups of undertakings engaged in restructuring programmes which comply with the above objective and whose overall results include a reduction in production capacity.

All restructuring decisions should be based on this main objective.

The Community urges the European steel industry to intensify its efforts to restructure and to phase out non-competitive plant.

2. Information

The Council considers that a more comprehensive information system should be introduced to ensure genuine transparency with regard to restructuring projects, including their funding and State aid, and with regard to measures by the Member States and authorities to fund public undertakings. Such a system will enable the Commission to determine and to evaluate all aid factors more satisfactorily.

The Council notes that the Commission will duly:

• collect from Member States and undertakings the necessary data for the conduct of its aids policy;

use its powers to ensure that undertakings inform it of their restructuring plans in the framework of the objectives and timetable set out;
continually complete and update, as necessary, the general objectives for steel, covering a wider range of products.

3. Investment policy

This improved information, and in particular the restructuring plans, will provide the basis for a more systematic relationship between the restructuring objective mentioned in point 1 and investment policy (investment opinions and Community lending) and for State aid decisions.

The Council notes that the Commission will use its discretionary powers under Article 54 of the ECSC Treaty to grant loans for investment programmes only where projects achieve a satisfactory degree of retructuring.

4. Competition policy

(a) Aid

In its Resolution of 3 March 1981, the Council agreed on the following:

• To restore competitiveness, degressive public aids will be accepted only as a transitional measure, and on condition that they contribute directly to the restructuring of the sector;

• The Commission will confirm its requirement that Governments notify in advance all public aids, specific or not;

• The Council takes note that the Commission will apply strictly the provisions of its Decision 80/257/ECSC and ensure, in particular, that no aid will be granted to preserve non-competitive capacities or to undertakings which do not make the necessary efforts to restructure in accordance with the principles mentioned above;

• The Commission will ensure full transparency in all public aid funding granted to steel undertakings by the Community and the Member States and present a new report within two months;

• The Council is of the opinion that no further public aid schemes in favour of the steel industry should be introduced after 1 July 1983.

In view of these principles the Council and the Commission consider that:

• only those applications for State aid can be taken into account which are for undertakings or

groups of undertakings which have drawn up systematic and specific recovery plans covering the various aspects of restructuring (modernization, reduction in capacity, and where necessary financial restructuring) and ensuring that they become competitive again as quickly as possible;

• the Commission will examine these recovery plans together with their financing, particularly applications for State aid, on the basis of the objective in point 1.

Aid proposed for undertakings or groups of undertakings can be approved only if it contributes to the realization of the objective referred to in point 1, including the overall reduction of production capacity;¹

• no aid can be approved for undertakings or groups of undertakings which would be responsible for a net increase in the production capacity for a product for which there is not a growth market.

The Council therefore requests the Commission to replace, as quickly as possible and in any case before 30 June 1981, Decision 80/257/ECSC by a new Decision based on the principles set out in this Resolution and on the experience gained in implementing Decision 80/275/ECSC.

The Commission is requested to report on other measures which distort competition between undertakings operating within the common market and to consider what measures can be taken.

The Council notes, that the Commission confirms that it will make every effort to ensure, in accordance with the Treaties, that undertakings are not injured by competition distortions resulting from the aid granted and that fundamental and persistent disorders in the economy of the Member States are avoided.

(b) Cooperation between firms

The Council notes that the Commission will give, within the bounds of the Treaties, favourable consideration to cooperation between firms and concentrations of undertakings which facilitate the creation of the capacity necessary for genuine restructuring, while at the same time ensuring that in the long term there will be enough independent firms to ensure proper competition.

Discipline, freely agreed to by producers, is the best solution to permit prices to be increased in the short term and avoid the payment of aids creating distortions of competition.

The Council notes that it behoves in the first place undertakings to take, under the Commission's supervision, in accordance with the obligations laid down in the ECSC Treaty, the measures necessary to ensure that the rationalization of the market accomplished over the last few months is not endangered.

While noting the Commission report on the progress made by producers in negotiating the conditions for such discipline both at production and delivery level, the Council asks producers to specify these conditions, before 1 April 1981, in order to permit the necessary recovery of market prices to take place.

In order to be effective, the agreement between producers must be accompanied by strict Commission surveillance of imports from third countries, in order that the latter take place under conditions compatible with market recovery and the commitments entered into in the framework of the OECD Steel Committee.

5. Prices

The Council takes note that the Commission will ensure that steel prices are not adversely affected by unfair or discriminatory practices prohibited by Article 60 of the ECSC Treaty and will use existing powers to roll back such practices by applying the appropriate sanctions, in particular by applying the measures provided for in Articles 63, 64 and 67 of the ECSC Treaty without delay.

The Council notes with satisfaction that the Commission has listed the main measures it intends to take with respect to prices.

These measures will be finalized, as soon as possible, once the Council and the Consultative Committee have been consulted pursuant to Article 60 of the ECSC Treaty.

6. Social measures

Where unjustifiable burdens would be imposed on certain groups of workers, the appropriate social measures will have to be introduced to mitigate the effects of capacity reductions resulting from restructuring.

To this end, the Council will examine in detail as soon as possible the appropriate social measures to be taken by the Community with a view to reaching the necessary decisions in parallel with decisions on further restructuring and the aids code.

7. Procedure

Proposed measures of State aid will be examined with regard to the degree of restructuring and net capacity reduction involved in relation to the Community's general restructuring objectives by a working party under the aegis of the Commission.

The Council ECSC Working Party will examine on a regular basis how this Resolution is being implemented, in particular the progress in restructuring, capacity reduction and phasing-out of aids.'

¹ When deciding on aid applications submitted to it as part of restructuring plans, the Commission will take account of the special position of Member States which only have a single steel undertaking, with a very slight impact on the Community market.

Introductory note

This catalogue includes the newly published monographs and series issued during the period to which it relates by the Institutions of the European Communities, and also their current periodicals.

Arrangement. The catalogue is divided into three parts as follows:

Part I - The classified list provides a subject classification of the titles included under 20 headings (see below). Under each subject-heading monographs and series are listed first, alphabetically by title in mixed language order; there then follows a similar list of periodical titles. Full entries for monographs and series appear only once; otherwise cross-references are given to the full entries, identifying them by the sequence numbers appearing in the left-hand margins. (Those numbers should not be used for ordering purposes.) Periodical titles only appear in the classified list as cross-reference entries, full entries being found in Part II.

Part II - The list of periodicals presents full details of each current Community periodical listed alphabetically in mixed language order.

Part III - The indexes of titles and series, presented in separate sequences for each language, provide alphabetical keys to the monographs and series included in Part I, identifying them by the sequence numbers already described. These indexes cumulate throughout the year.

How to obtain publications. Publications may be priced for sale, gratis, or of limited distribution. Those of the last two classes may be obtained from the issuing Institutions, or, where they are published by the Information Offices of the Commission, from those Offices, whose addresses are given in the lists on pp. 10 and 11. Publications of limited distribution are however generally only for the attention of governments of Member States, Community departments and other authorities concerned.

Orders for priced publications should be directed to the Sales Offices listed on the last page.

All orders should quote the full title, as well as the ISBN or ISSN where such a number precedes the prices in the catalogue.

Inleiding
