

Massimo PILOTTI

President of the Court of Justice

---

Born Rome 1879. A judge since 1909 he has represented Italy at all the important international conferences since the Peace Conference of 1919, including the Locarno conference (1925), the naval conference in London (1930), the Hague Conference of 1929-30, and the Disarmament Conference of 1932. He was President of the Inter-Allied Arbitration Commission in the Rhineland appointed to establish occupation costs from 1925 - 30. He became first President of the Italian Court of Appeal in 1930 and Assistant-Secretary-General of the League of Nations from 1932 - 37. From 1944 - 48 he was Advocate-General at the Supreme Court of Appeal of Italy, and in the same year that he became First Honorary President of this Court (in 1949), he was also designated as a Member of the Permanent Court of Arbitration at The Hague.

Massimo Pilotti:

Mr. Pilotti, 75, is the Rome-born President of the High Court of Justice, a magistrate, judge and diplomat in the Italian government service since 1901. Served on international conferences (including the Peace Conference 1919-20) as legal counsellor to Italian delegation; President of the Italian Court of Appeal (1930); Assistant Secretary-General of the League of Nations (1932-37); Attorney-General to the Italian Supreme Court of Appeal (1944-48); Member of the International Court of Justice of the Hague (1949) and honorary President of the Italian High Court of Appeal; appointed President of the High Court of Justice of the European Coal and Steel Community 1952.
