DR. SCHILLER (GERMANY) ELECTED PRESIDENT
OF THE OECD COUNCIL

Dr. Karl Schiller, German Federal Minister of Economic Affairs, was today elected Chairman of the OECD Council at Ministerial level in 1968.

Denmark and Italy will provide the two Vice-Presidents.

The Council has also named the following countries as members of the Executive Committee : Belgium, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany (FR), Italy, Japan, Spain, Switzerland, United Kingdom, United States.

Ambassador Roger Ockrent, Head of the Permanent Belgian delegation to OECD, and Ambassador François Valéry, Head of the Permanent French delegation to OECD, have been re-elected respectively President and Vice-President of the Executive Committee.
