## Foreword

### 1. Introduction

The monthly bulletin on external trade, published by Eurostat in the B series, Short-term trends, sets out to provide within the shortest possible deadlines data on short-term trends in the European Union's external trade. In particular, it contains data on the European Union's trade flows with its trading partners and the various economic areas and a breakdown of this data by major product group. The bulletin also provides an overview, based on data from various international sources, of the place occupied by the European Union in the external trade of its main trading partners and of third countries. Trade flows between Member States are recorded under the Intrastat system and will be published at a later date.

The European Union's external trade statistics at the most detailed classification level are published monthly on CD-ROM (B series: Intra and extra-EU trade).

Trends in external trade since 1958 and a comparison with world trade are contained in the publication "*External Trade Statistical Yearbook (Series A)*".

External trade statistics are also available on line via the Eurostat data banks (Comext).

The catalogue of Eurostat publications and a detailed methodological description can be found in "*External Trade Statistics User's Guide*" published in all languages of the European Union .

### 2. Sources

Since 1978, the Member States have transmitted European Union external trade statistics according to a uniform methodology laid down by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1736/75. This regulation was amended to take account of the new developments in 1988, i.e. the introduction of the new external trade classification entitled "Combined Nomenclature" (CN) and the new "Single Administrative Document".

The tables in this bulletin are compiled by Eurostat from the detailed data transmitted on magnetic tape by the Member States; these data are broken down according to the eight-digit subheadings of the Combined Nomenclature.

Eurostat wishes to take this opportunity of thanking the relevant departments in the Member States for their cooperation, which enables it to compile these harmonized European Union statistics and to ensure their quality.

### 3. Coverage

The results of the European Union statistics relate to special trade. This comprises:

- 1) imports of goods placed in free circulation on their arrival at or on leaving warehouses, imports for inward processing and imports after outward processing (customs procedures);
- 2) exports of European Union goods, exports after inward processing and exports for outward processing (customs procedures).

Transit and warehousing traffic are not covered by European Union statistics.

### 4. Statistical territory

The statistical territory of the European Union comprises the customs territory of the European Union excluding the French overseas departments. Thus Greenland, the Canary Islands and Ceuta and Melilla are not covered, while the Azores and Madeira for Portugal and the Balearics for Spain are.

From October 1990, the external trade data of the Federal Republic of Germany, the other Member States and EUR 12 relate to the Federal Republic of Germany in its borders after 3 October 1990.

## 5. *Goods classification*

In this publication the results are broken down by the sections and divisions of the UN Standard International Trade Classification (SITC Rev. 3 since 1988) by means of correspondence tables drawn up by Eurostat on the basis of the Combined Nomenclature (CN).

## 6. *Trading partners: countries and economic areas*

The results of the European Union are broken down by country of origin, country of consignment and country of destination in accordance with the "Country nomenclature for statistics on European Union external trade and trade between its Member States", referred to as the Geonomenclature (Geonom).

When goods that originate in third countries and are not in free circulation in the European Union are imported, EU statistics state the country of origin. When such goods are exported, the country of destination is specified.

## 7. *Units*

### *Values*

The statistical value of goods on import is equal to the customs valuation or to a value determined by reference to the concept of customs valuation (in the case, for example, of imports from other Member States). It is the CIF value (cost, insurance, and freight).

The statistical value of goods on export is equal to their value at the place and time at which they leave the statistical territory of the exporting Member State. It is the FOB value (free on board).

The value is expressed in European units of account (ecus). The ecu is a "basket" currency unit based on the market exchange rates of a certain quantity of each European Union currency according to a weighting system involving the five-year average of each Member State's gross national product and intra-EU trade balance. The rates used in this bulletin are averages of daily rates. The bulletin contains a table showing the conversion rates used.

### *Quantity*

The statistics give the net weight of the goods.

## 8. *Confidentiality*

Most Member States take measures to guarantee the confidentiality of certain flows of goods. The relevant legislation, the procedures for implementing it and the range of goods subject to secrecy vary from one Member State to another.

This confidentiality applies to the most detailed level of the classification used for collecting the data; it may therefore refer to all or only part of a subheading of the Combined Nomenclature. Similarly, confidentiality may apply to imports only or to exports only and to only some of the variables recorded (value, statistical procedure, quantities, country, partner, etc.).

Measures are taken during collection and during processing by Eurostat to minimise the effect of these headings on the results for the European Union as a whole; in particular, trade data on these headings are included at higher levels of aggregation and in the totals.

On the other hand, the statistics are supplied on the strength of customs documents and do not take account of any amendments made by some Member States at the end of the year in drawing up accounts on intergovernmental trade. In view of this, drawing up a trade balance may produce figures that vary sometimes considerably from the official national figures.

## 9. *Corrections*

Every month the Member States send Eurostat a magnetic tape containing the results for the current month.

In order to correct these results, the Member States also send every month a magnetic tape containing monthly corrections covering the previous 24-month period.



# Indices

## 1. Introduction

Changes over time in the value of trade are influenced by variations in prices and the quantities marketed. Indices are used to measure these two effects. In general, a system of indices is chosen so that the product of the volume index and the price index expresses the value index. Several systems of indices meeting this requirement may be regularly used. The results obtained by using one system will generally be different from those obtained by using another. For various reasons the Member States do not use a common system, and the level of breakdown of their indices by product group and by partner area also varies. Eurostat has therefore devised its own external trade indices which enable it to calculate, for each Member State, European Union indices on a strictly comparable basis. These indices may be consulted on the Trend database developed by Eurostat.

## 2. Sources of data

There are basically two ways of obtaining information on prices: conducting price surveys by directly approaching importers and exporters and using data collected by the customs authorities. At present only customs data are available in all the Member States. Eurostat therefore calculates indices of unit values (values divided by quantities) and uses them as price variation indicators. The computing programs contain a system for automatically identifying extreme unit values pointing to unlikely price movements.

## 3. Extreme values

To avoid a number of restrictions involved in using customs data, Eurostat decided to adopt two basic principles in calculating unit value indices: using the most detailed data possible and always bearing in mind that the object of the exercise is to break down variations in value into a "price" component and a "volume" component. Two rules are applied in order to exclude unlikely price movements. The first is that, given the general level of inflation, the price of a product should not be very different from its level a year ago. Any variation of five or more points is regarded as suspect. The second – more restrictive – rule is that the variation in the price of a product in relation to the most recent month for which data are available should not be very different from the average price variation for similar products. Applying these rules prevents extreme variations due to factors that are unconnected with prices and would otherwise distort the unit value index. For products whose unit values are rejected, the variations are taken to be the same as those for similar products.

## 4. Classification used

The United Nations Standard International Trade Classification (SITC), revised for the third time in 1988, was drawn up on the basis of the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS). Using tables of correspondence between the various classifications (Nimexe, Combined Nomenclature and SITC), Eurostat has been able to publish an uninterrupted time series of external trade indices from 1979 to the present.

From 1994 onwards, external trade publications will give indices calculated from 1989 on the basis of the following SITC Rev. 3 aggregates:

TOTAL: all commodities;  
0+1: foods, beverages and tobacco;  
2+4: crude materials, except fuels;  
3: fuels  
5+6+7+8: manufactured goods.

By compiling other correspondence tables, Eurostat is able to supply complete time series based on other classifications.

### 5. *Types of indices and rebasing*

Eurostat calculates Fisher's "ideal" annual chain indices. Since the "basket of goods" marketed at international level varies rapidly over time, the annual chain permits the updating of the index weightings. Each month the changes in unit values in the product groups at detailed level are weighted in order to obtain the changes in unit values in the various major product categories. Since these changes are based on the previous year, a chain of unit values is obtained. The corresponding volume index chain is the ratio of the unit value variation to the variation in value for the month in question compared with the monthly average for the previous year. The indices published each month are calculated by multiplying the above-mentioned chains by the annual indices for the previous year, a fixed reference period having been chosen (at present 1990). The annual unit value chains are obtained by weighting the monthly chains by the volumes, while the annual volume chains are calculated by dividing the annual value variations by the unit value chains.

### 6. *General comments*

- Only data on normal trade (statistical procedure 1) are used to calculate the unit value indices; however, data on total trade (covering all the statistical procedures) are used to calculate the value indices from which the volume indices are obtained.
- The unit value indices are calculated on the basis of values expressed in ecus.
- For any further information on the methods used to calculate the indices, please refer to Eurostat's specialised publications.

## Seasonal Adjustments: Results

Following a period of relative stability which began in mid-1991, the European Union's seasonally adjusted exports to the rest of the world have been rising strongly since the beginning of 1993 (+8.9% for the first ten months of the year compared with the same period in 1992). The figure for October 1993 was up by 0.6% on the September figure. For unadjusted data, exports reached a record total of ECU 44.2 billion.

Following the considerable fluctuations which marked the first months of 1993, recent seasonally adjusted data for the

European Union's imports from the rest of the world seem to indicate a downward trend from the maximum of August 1993. In October, imports from the rest of the world declined by 0.9% compared with the previous month.

The EU's seasonally adjusted trade balance with the rest of the world has been improving since the beginning of 1992. In October 1993, it was in surplus (+ ECU 0.8 billion) for the fifth time that year. For unadjusted data, the commercial surplus was + ECU 2.9 billion, the best result since December 1986.

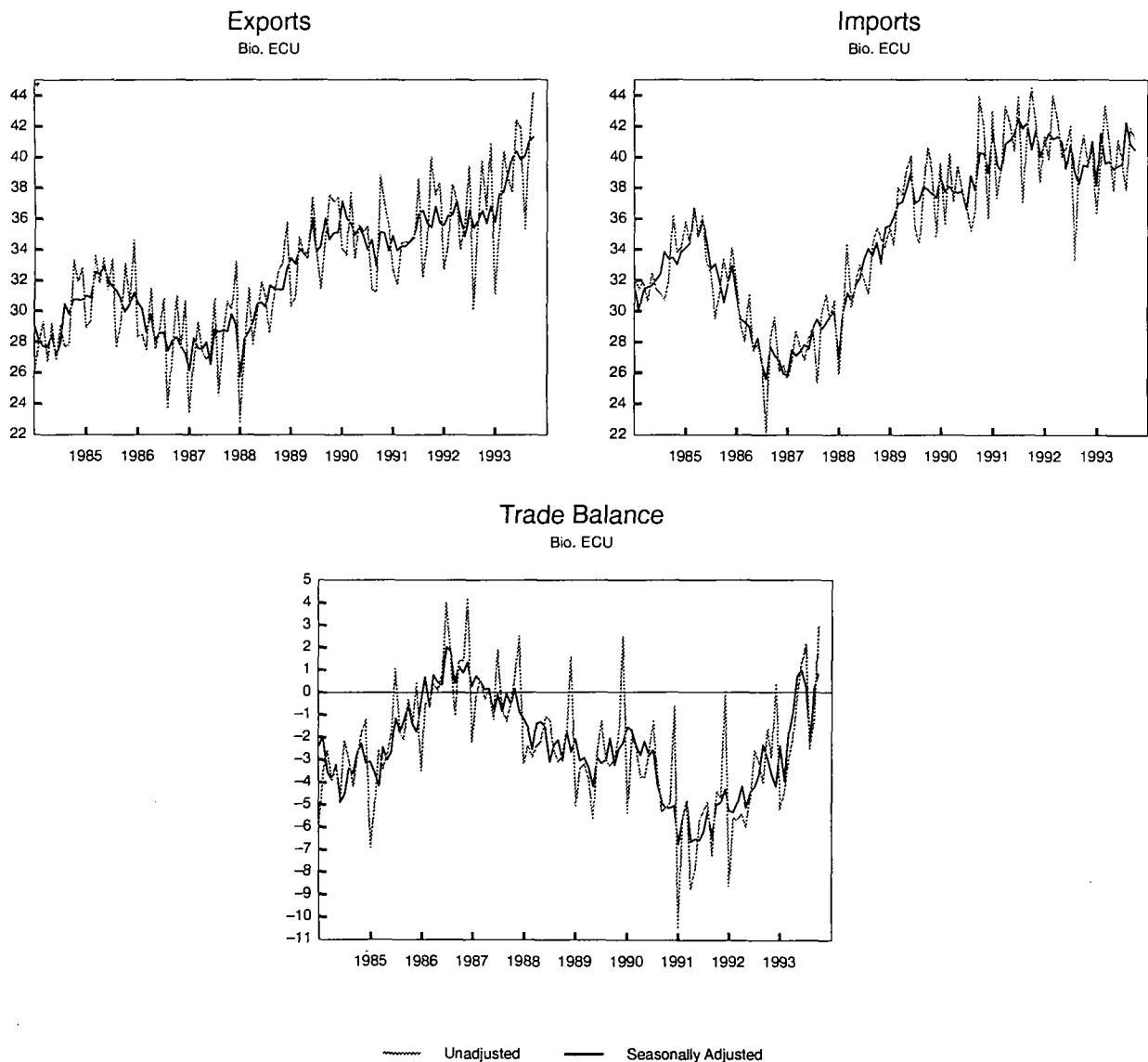

## GLOBAL TRENDS IN EXTERNAL TRADE

### EUROPEAN UNION EXTERNAL TRADE: Results for October 1993.

**For the first ten months of 1993 the United States trade deficit was ECU 99 billion and that of the European Union 11 billion; the Japanese surplus exceeded ECU 84 billion.**

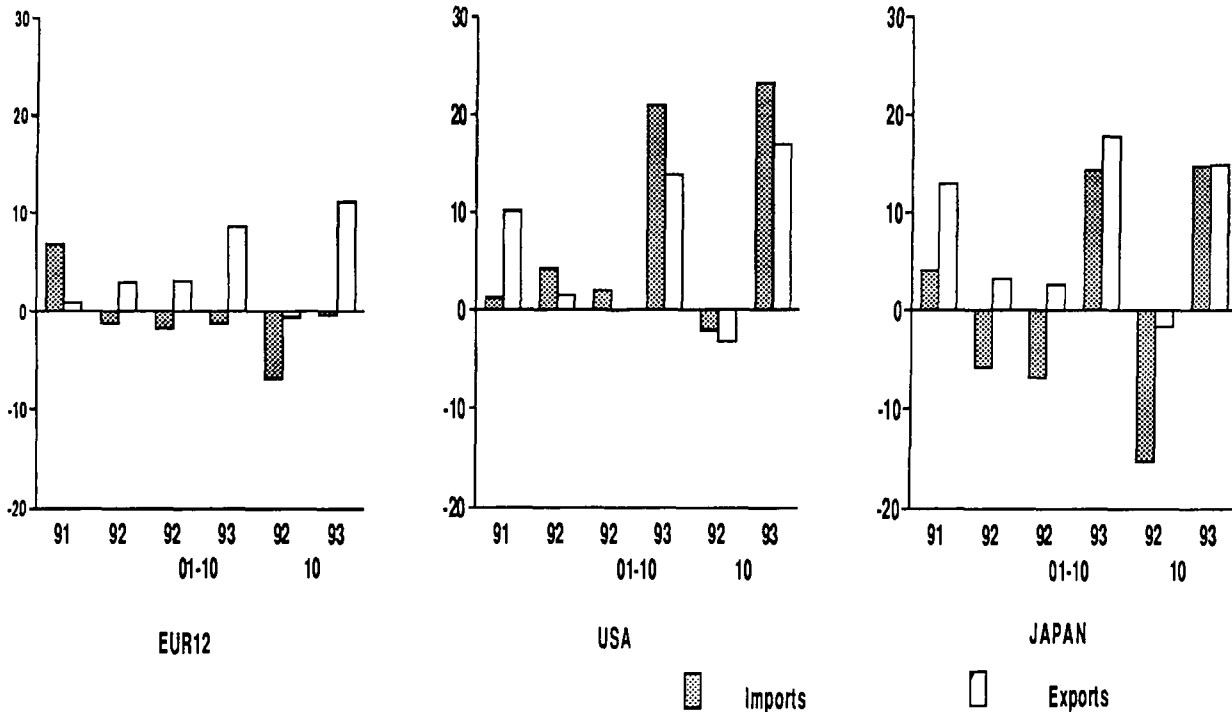
The **European Union's** external trade deficit for the first ten months of 1993 was almost ECU 11 billion compared with 47.5 billion for the same period in 1992. There was a significant rise in European Union exports between January-October 1992 and the same period in 1993 (8.6%). Imports fell slightly (-1.3%).

Between the first ten months of 1992 and the same period in 1993, the **United States** deficit increased by some ECU 34 billion to reach almost ECU 100 billion.

Imports to the United States rose by 21% in ecus and 9% in dollars. Exports rose, but less steeply: 13.8% in ecus and 3% in dollars.

The **Japanese trade surplus** for January-October 1993 was ECU 84.4 billion, 17 billion up on the corresponding period in 1992. Japan's exports increased by 17.7% in ecus and 6% in dollars but fell by 4% in yen. Imports were up by 14.3% in ecus but were down by 9% in yen.

## GLOBAL TRENDS IN EXTERNAL TRADE

### MEMBER STATES' EXTERNAL TRADE: Results for October 1993.

**Italy, Germany, Spain, the Netherlands and the BLEU recorded considerable increases in their extra-EU trade balances between the first ten months of 1992 and the same period in 1993.**

In the first ten months of 1993, **Germany and Italy** had the largest external trade surpluses: ECU 14 billion and ECU 7.5 billion respectively, representing increases of ECU 8 billion and 10 billion. Italy's exports outside the EU rose by 14.2% between January-October 1992 and the same period in 1993, while imports fell by 6.4%. German exports rose by 5.5%, while there was a slight fall in imports (-0.7%).

**Spain, the Netherlands, and the BLEU** recorded considerable reductions in the size of their extra-EU deficits between the first ten months of 1992 and the same period in 1993 (ECU 6 billion, 5.2 billion and 4.4 billion respectively). These countries' exports showed marked increases: 12% for Spain, 15% for the Netherlands and 19% for the BLEU. Spain's imports fell sharply (-17.4%), while those of the Netherlands and the BLEU fell by 5.2% and 3.6%.

**France, the United Kingdom and Denmark** improved their balances by almost a billion ecus each compared with January-October 1992. French imports fell by 2.4% and exports by only 0.2%. In the United Kingdom both imports and exports increased (8.4% and 13.1% respectively). Danish exports were 4% up on the first ten months of 1992, while imports were 2.2% down.

The extra-EU trade balances of **Portugal, Ireland and Greece** for January-October 1993 were close to their levels for the same period in 1992. Portugal's exports fell by 14.8% and imports by 13.1%. There were steep rises in the trade figures for Ireland and Greece. Irish imports rose by 37% and exports by 33%. Greek exports were up by 21% and imports by 15%.

(BN ECU)**

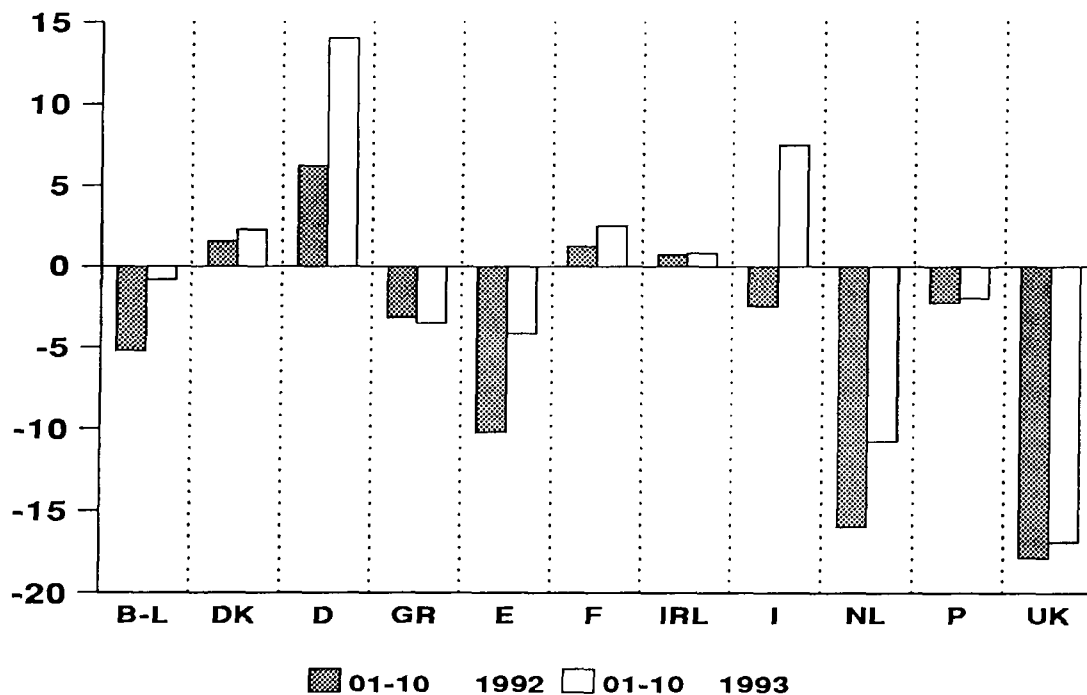

## EUROPEAN UNION EXTERNAL TRADE BY PARTNER COUNTRY

### TRADE IN VALUE: Results for October 1993.

**In the first ten months of 1993 trade with the industrialized countries showed a deficit of ECU 22 billion, which was partly offset by the ECU 17 billion surplus in trade with the developing countries. The deficit with China was almost ECU 7 billion.**

The European Union's accumulated deficit in trade with the **industrialized countries** between January and October 1993 was almost ECU 22 billion. Compared with the first ten months of 1992, this was an improvement of some ECU 20 billion, half of which was accounted for by the improvement in the balance with the United States and Canada, with which the deficit was ECU 3.3 billion for the first ten months of 1993. The trade deficit with Japan stood at ECU 21 billion, five billion less than in January-October 1992. The trade surplus with the other Western European countries was ECU 5.8 billion for the first ten months of 1992 compared with 2 billion for the same period in 1993. The trade balance with the EFTA countries remained stable, with a deficit of ECU 2.8 billion.

Imports from the industrialized countries in the first ten months of 1993 were some 5% down on the same period in 1992. The value of imports from the United States and Japan increased between these two periods (+11% and +26.4% respectively) as a result of the dollar-ecu and yen-ecu exchange rates. Imports from the United States and Canada fell by 3.9%. Imports from Japan and the EFTA countries fell by almost 3%.

Exports to the industrialized countries were up by 3.9%, boosted mainly by exports to the United States and Canada (+9.4%) and to a lesser extent by exports to Japan (+6%). Exports to the EFTA countries fell by 3.4%.

Trade with the **developing countries** showed a surplus of 16.7 billion in January-October 1993 compared with ECU 4.2 billion for the same months in 1992. The European Union's trade surplus with the Mediterranean countries was ECU 10.6 billion, representing an increase of ECU 8 billion. The balances with the Latin-American and ACP countries, in deficit in the first ten months of 1992, became positive in January-October 1993: +ECU 0.9 billion and +ECU 1.8 billion, representing an improvement of ECU

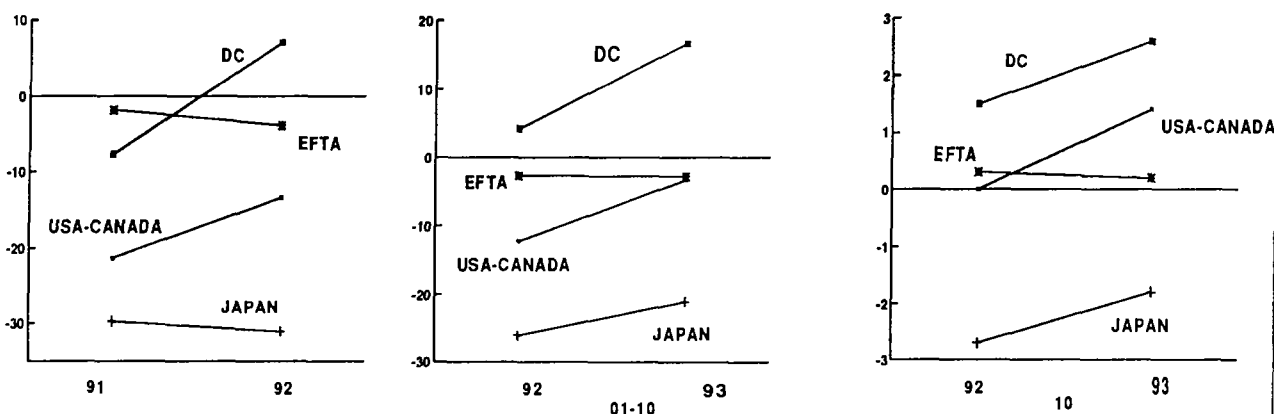
5 billion and 3 billion respectively. The trade deficit with the OPEC countries improved by ECU 1.2 billion, standing at -ECU 0.2 billion. The trade balance with the Asian NICs, ECU 1.7 billion in deficit in January-October 1992, was in surplus by the same amount in the same period in 1993.

Imports from the developing countries fell by 1.8% between January-October 1992 and the same period in 1993. Imports from the OPEC countries were down by 7% following the fall in the second and third quarters of 1993 in the cost of the European Union's crude oil supplies expressed in ecus per barrel. Imports from the Mediterranean countries fell by 8% and those from the Latin-American countries by 11.4%. There was a very marked decrease in imports from the ACP countries between the first ten months of 1992 and the same period in 1993: -21.8%. The only increase was in imports from the Asian NICs (+4.9%). Exports to the developing countries were up by 8.2% overall, but the trends differed from one country grouping to another: exports to the Asian NICs, the Mediterranean countries and the Latin-American countries showed a marked increase: 20%, 15% and 16% respectively, while European Union exports to the OPEC countries and the ACP countries were down by 3.9% and 2.7%.

The trade balance with the **countries of Central and Eastern Europe**, ECU 1.6 billion in deficit in the first ten months of 1992, recovered in the same period in 1993 to reach +ECU 1.5 billion. Imports from these countries rose by 6.7% while exports to them increased by considerably more than this: 18%.

Trade with **China** was ECU 7.2 billion in deficit in January-October 1993, an improvement of ECU 1.5 billion on the same period in 1992. European Union trade with China increased between these two periods: EU imports from and exports to China rose by 16.5% and 71% respectively.

## EUROPEAN UNION EXTERNAL TRADE BY PARTNER COUNTRY

### TRADE IN VOLUME: Results for the third quarter of 1993.

**In the first three quarters of 1993 the volumes imported from the industrialized countries decreased more than those from the developing countries. The volumes exported to the developing countries rose more sharply than those to the industrialized countries.**

The volume of imports in the first three quarters of 1993 fell by about 5% in relation to the same period in 1992. After stagnating in the first quarter of 1993, exports rose by some 10% in the second quarter.

In the first three quarters of 1993 imports from the industrialized countries fell more than those from the developing countries in comparison with the same quarters of 1992 (-10% and -5% respectively). Imports from the United States and Japan were down by almost 12% and 20% as a result of the increased value of the dollar and the yen in ecu terms. Imports from the EFTA countries were down on the three first quarters of 1992. After a more marked decrease in the first quarter of 1993 (-10%), the second and third quarters of 1993 saw a decrease of almost 4%.

The volume of exports to the industrialized countries, down by 7% in the first quarter, rose by some 3% in the following quarter. Exports to the developing countries rose by about 10% over the entire period. Those to the United States fell by 5% in the first quarter before increasing by 10% in the second and third quarters. Exports to Japan followed a more subdued version of the same pattern (-10%, +2%). Exports to the EFTA countries fell by 10% in the first quarter of 1993 and then by 5% in the second and third quarters of 1993.

The volume of imports from the OPEC countries was down by 8% in the first quarter of 1993 and by 4% in the third quarter. Imports from the ACP and the Asian NICs also followed a downward trend. The former dropped by a quarter in the first quarter of 1993 and then by 12% in the third quarter. The latter fell by 9% in the first quarter of 1993, by 4% in the second and by 8% in the third. The only increase was in imports from the Mediterranean countries, which rose by 7% in the first quarter of 1993 and then more markedly in the second and third quarters (12% then 14%).

The volume of exports to the Mediterranean countries rose steeply: 12% in the first quarter of 1993, 25% in the second and 29% in the third. Exports to the Asian NICs also increased considerably between the first three quarters of 1992 and the same period in 1993 (8%, 20% and 18%). There was a relatively small decrease of less than 5% in the volume of exports to the OPEC countries. Exports to the ACP countries rose by 3% in the first quarter of 1993, fell by 2% in the second quarter and then fell sharply by 15% in the third.

(% change on the corresponding period of the previous year)

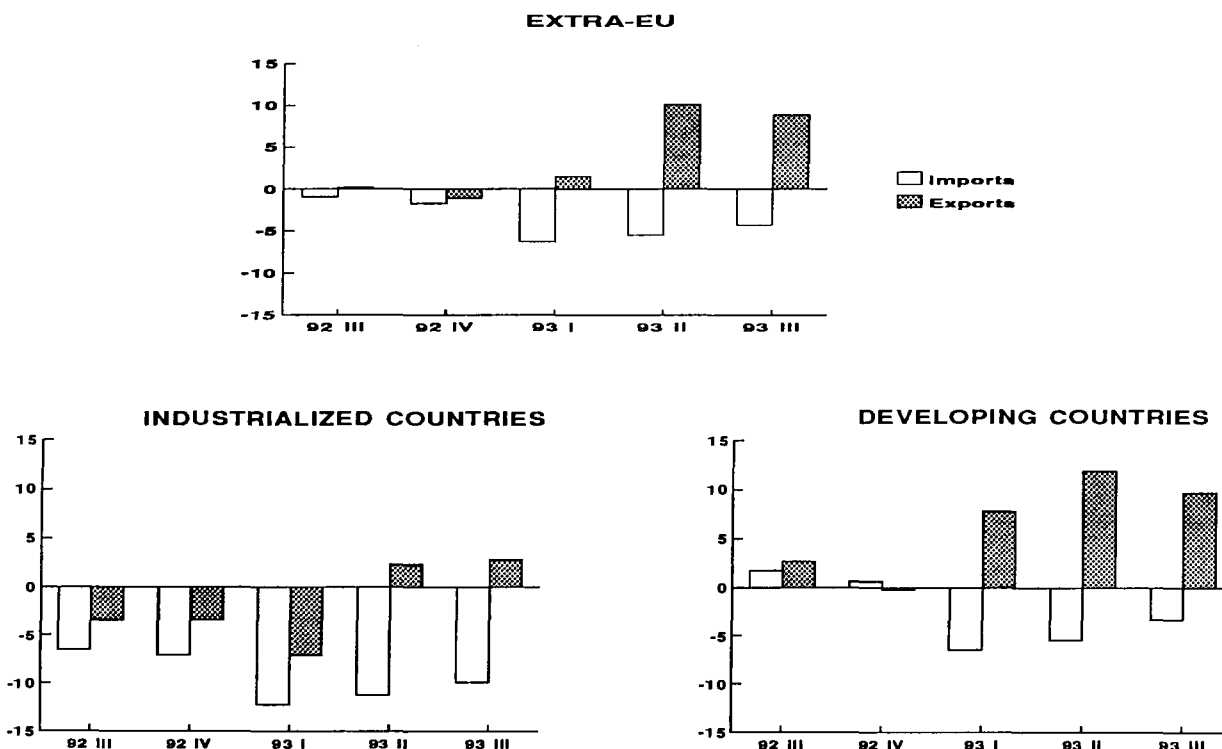

## EUROPEAN UNION EXTERNAL TRADE BY PRODUCTS

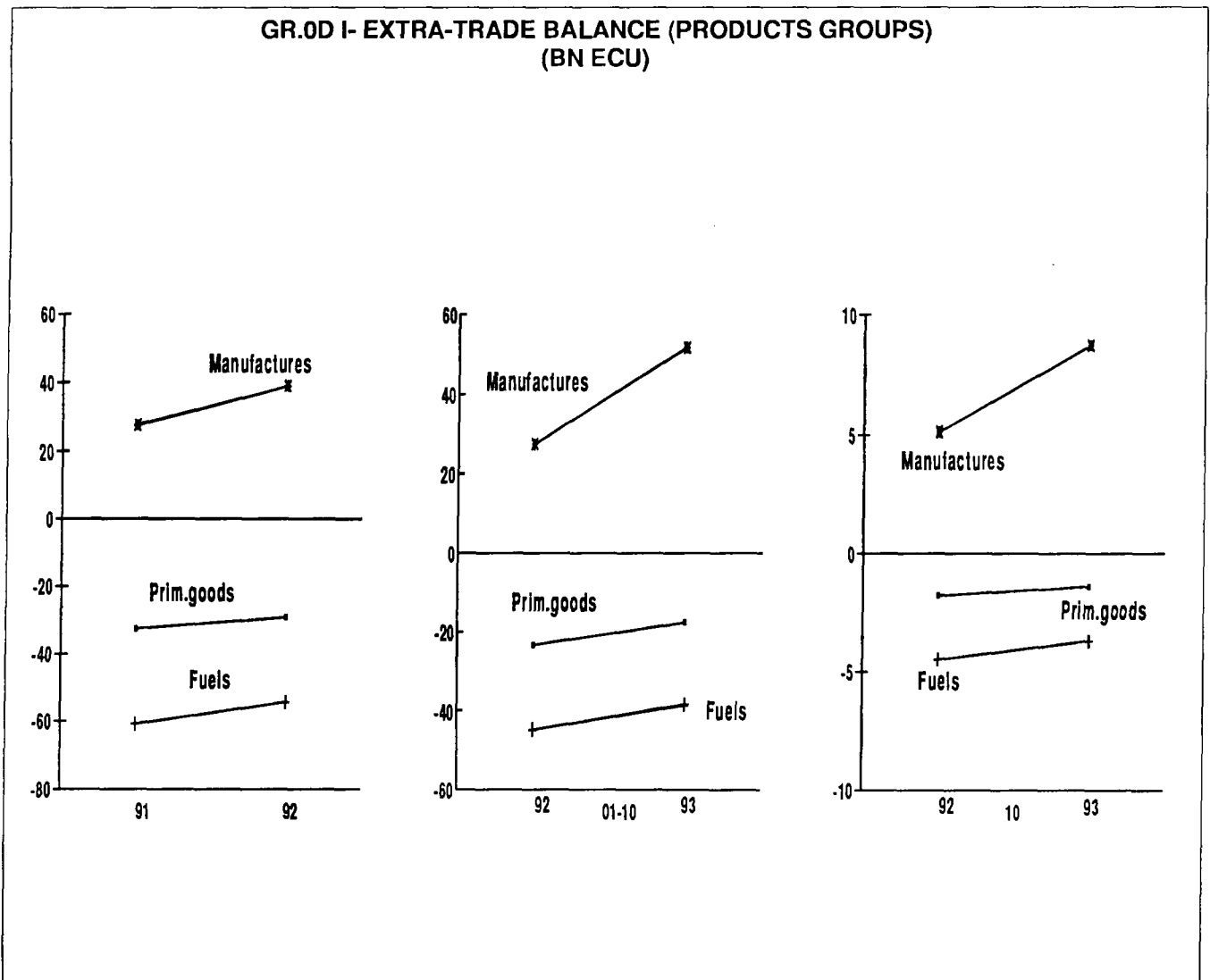
**TRADE IN VALUE: Results for October 1993.**  
**Exports of machinery and transport equipment (SITC 7) increased by a healthy 11% between January-October 1992 and the same period in 1993.**

In the first ten months of 1993, the surplus of trade in **machinery and transport equipment** (SITC 7) exceeded ECU 40 billion, which was almost ECU 16 billion more than in the corresponding period of 1992. The balance of trade in **chemicals** (SITC 5) was + ECU 23.5 billion, an increase of 6.6 billion. "Other manufactured goods" (SITC 6+8) still showed a deficit in January-October 1993 of almost ECU 13 billion, an improvement of ECU 1.6 billion. The deficit in fuel products (SITC 3) was ECU 38.6 billion, compared with ECU 45 billion in the first ten months of 1992. The balance of trade in crude materials (SITC 2+4) was - ECU 17.4 billion in January-October 1993, an improvement of ECU 2.8 billion. An improvement of ECU 3 billion meant that trade in food products was again almost in balance: - ECU 0.3 billion.

The only imports that increased between the first ten months of 1992 and the same period in 1993 were those of manufactured goods. Machinery and transport equipment increased slightly: 0.3%. Imports of "other manufactured goods" increased by 5.4%, while those of chemicals remained the same. Imports of fuel products fell by 4.1%, and there was a sharper drop in crude materials: - 8.3%. The value of food imports fell by 5.2%.

Exports of **machinery and transport equipment** rose considerably between the first ten months of 1992 and the same period in 1993: 11%. There was a similar trend in exports of chemicals (+14.5%). Exports of "other manufactured goods" were 7.7% up on January-October 1992. Food exports increased by 5% between January-October 1992 and the same period in 1993.

## EUROPEAN UNION EXTERNAL TRADE BY PRODUCT

**TRADE IN VOLUME: Results for the third quarter of 1993. In the third quarter of 1993 exports of manufactured goods increased by some 10% in volume compared with the same quarters of 1992.**

The volume of imports of **machinery and transport equipment** (SITC 7) fell by approximately 10% between the first three quarters of 1992 and the same period in 1993. European Union imports of "other manufactured goods" (SITC 6+8) remained at the same level in the first quarter of 1993 and increased slightly in the third quarter (2.2%). There was a downward trend in imports of chemicals: almost -7% between January-September 1992 and the same period in 1993. Imports of fuel products fell by some 6% in volume terms in the first quarter of 1993, after which they remained at much the same level in the third quarter of 1993 (-0.8%). There was a drop of almost

7% in imports of crude materials. Imports of food products followed the same pattern, although the decrease in the third quarter of 1993 was less pronounced (-4%).

After a sluggish first quarter, the volume of exports of **manufactured goods** increased by almost 10% in the second and third quarters of 1993. Exports of machinery and transport equipment decreased by 2% between the first quarter of 1992 and the same period in 1993, while those of chemicals and "other manufactured goods" increased by some 3%. Exports of food products increased by 7% between January-September 1992 and the same period in 1993.

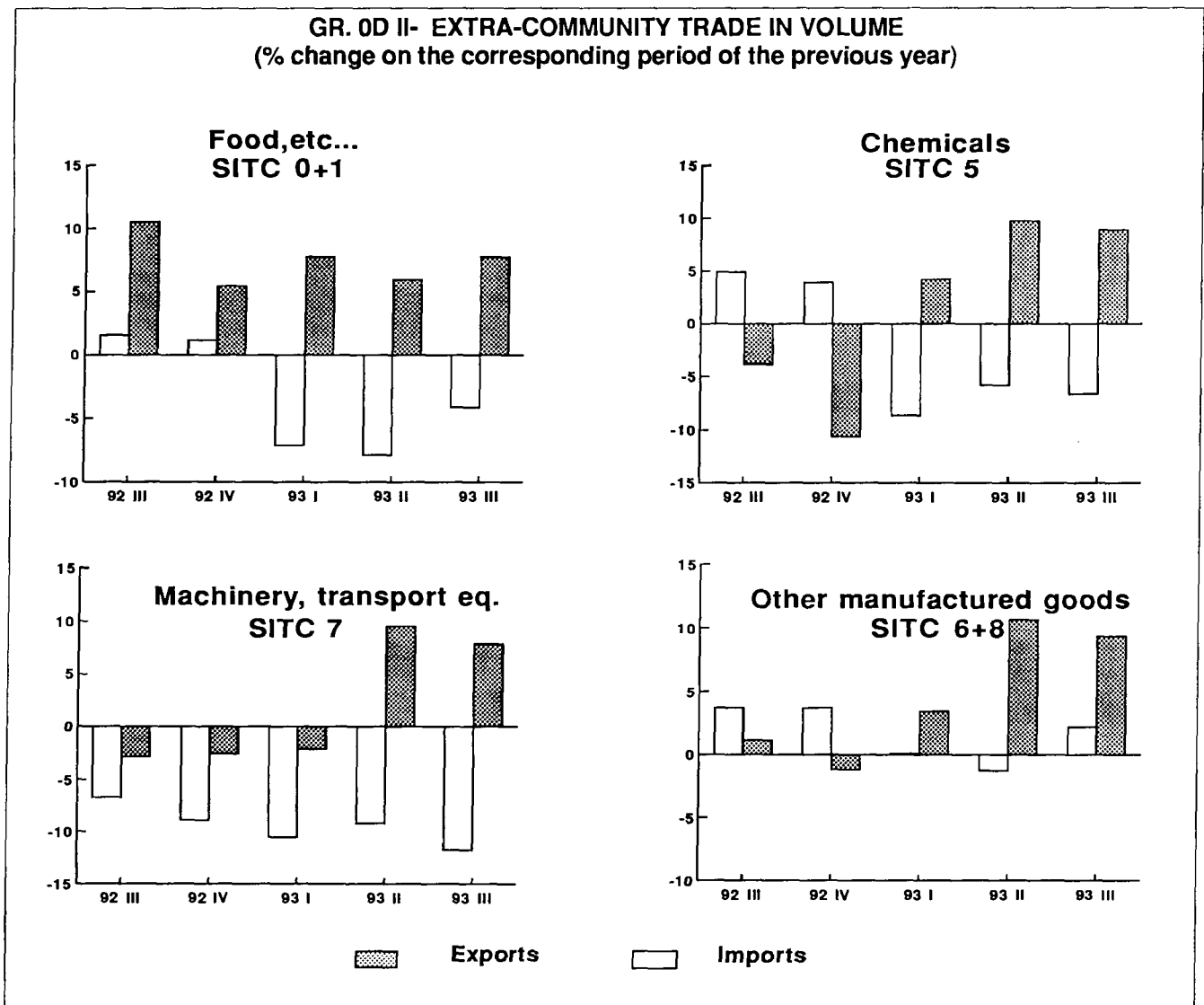

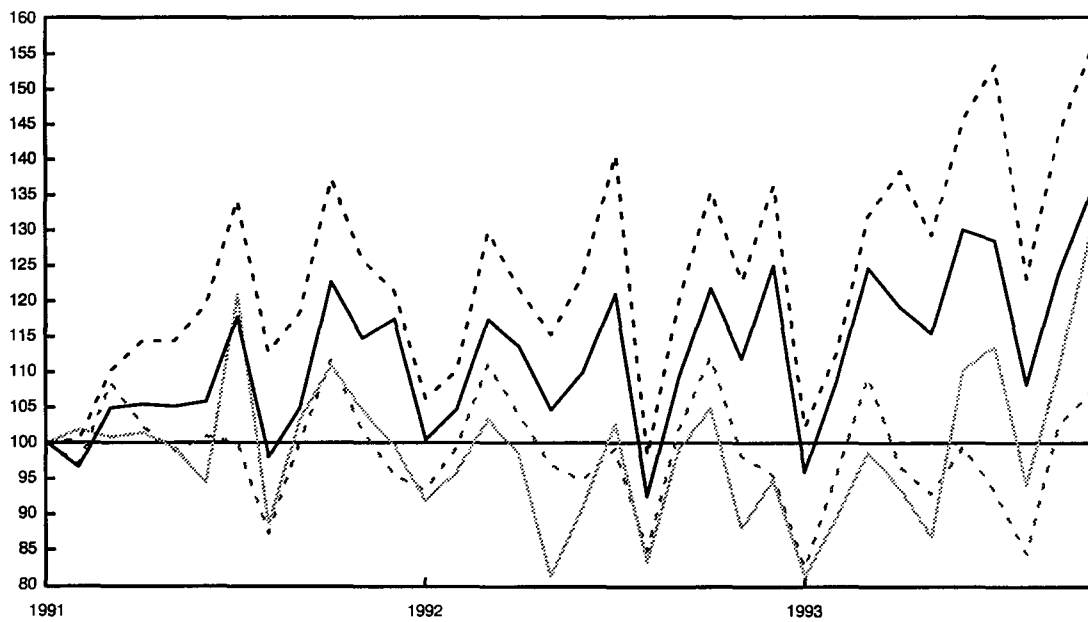

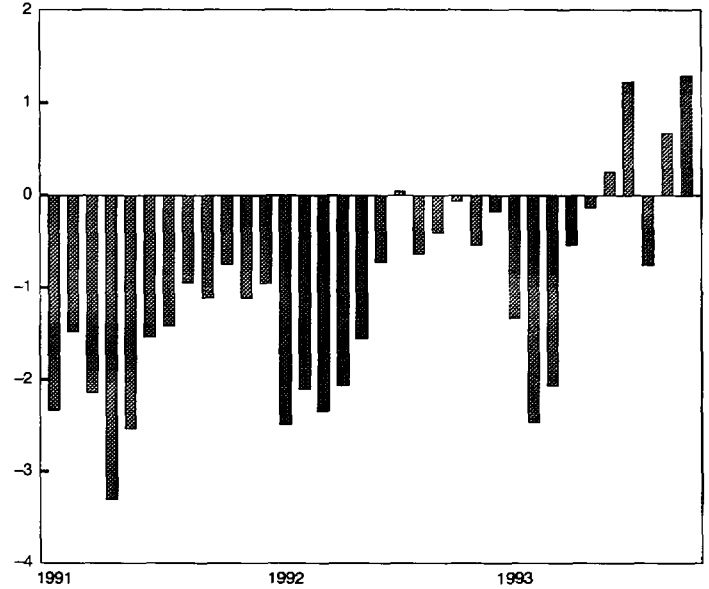
### Extra-EU Trade Balance

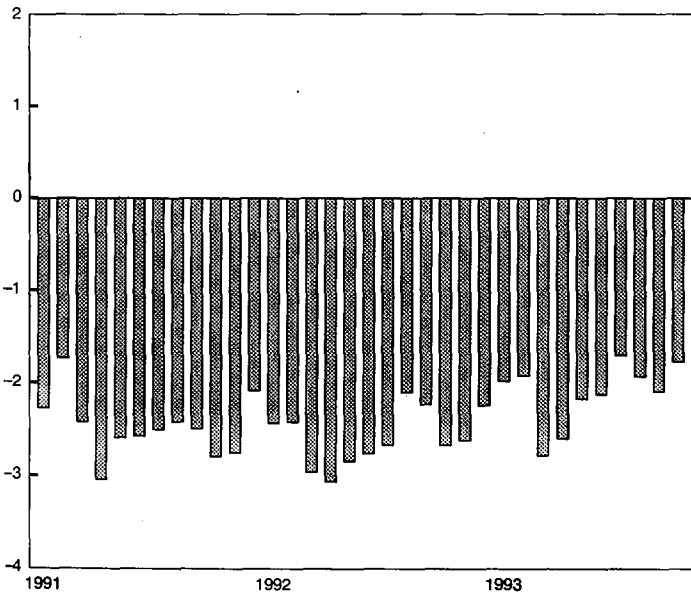
### Trade Balance with USA

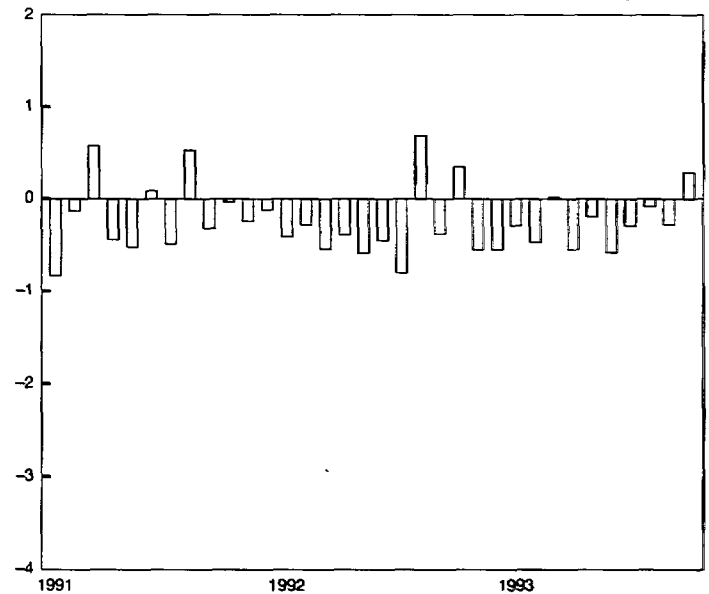
### Trade Balance with Japan
