GRANTS OF £226m UNDER SOCIAL FUND

## Fourth allocation for 1983

The European Commission announced an allocation early this year of £226 704 140 for training and retraining schemes in the United Kingdom under the European Social Fund, representing the final allocation for 1983 and bringing total Social Fund payments to the United Kingdom to about £320m for the year. This press release provides a detailed breakdown of the funds provided.

Nearly £200m of the total allocation is devoted to major national training schemes in the United Kingdom, but this list also indicates the extent to which local authorities have been taking advantage of Social Fund assistance for their training programmes.

Training schemes for the handicapped are a particular feature of this allocation. More than £llm is set aside for a variety of training schemes specifically for handicapped people, ranging from major national programmes set up by the Manpower Services Commission, to a scheme by the Liverpool Society for Mentally Handicapped Children for vocational preparation for 10 young people.

## How the Social Fund works

A training scheme must have financial support from a public authority, in order to be eligible for assistance from the Social Fund. For schemes run by public authorities themselves, the Commission will meet up to half the cost of the project, while for schemes run by private organisations the Commission may match public authority support.

In the UK, most applications for assistance from the Fund are made by the Manpower Services Commission, which has had support for the Youth Opportunities Programme, Training Opportunities Programme (TOPS) and a number of other schemes concerned with helping the unemployed and young people entering the job market, especially in poorer regions. Grants are also requested by other public bodies such as the Industrial Training Boards and local authorities. However, applications have increasingly come from private companies and voluntary bodies supporting local unemployment and training initiatives.
