# Structure of agricultural holdings in the UE

### Main results of the Community survey, 1999-2000

#### Hubert CHARLIER

The detailed results of the 1999-2000 Community survey on the structure of agricultural holdings (Farm Structure Survey, FSS) are now available for all EU Member States. Information is available for each holding on employment (number of persons in employment, working time, age, sex, status, level of training), on land use and on methods of cultivation (organic farming, areas under irrigation, areas covered by greenhouses) and on livestock numbers.

The 6.8 million agricultural holdings surveyed in the EU in 1999-2000

- made use of 6.3 million AWU (annual work units), that is, the equivalent of 6.3 million persons employed full time;
- used an area of 127 million hectares, that is, an area of 19 ha per agricultural holding on average.

Amongst these 6.8 million European holdings,

- 63% made use of less than one AWU, while 12% made use of 2 or more AWU's (30% of holdings in Luxembourg, 36% of holdings in the Netherlands);
- 58% used less than 5 ha (in Greece, Italy and Portugal more than 3 out of 4 holding used less than 5 ha), while 3% used more than 100 ha (17% of holdings in the United Kingdom):
- 17% are mixed holdings (mixed cropping, mixed livestock and crops and livestock combined), while 3% are specialised in horticulture, 36% in permanent crops (vineyards, olive groves, orchards), 21% field cropping (cereals, beet etc.), 22% grazing livestock (of which 7% specialised in dairy production), 1% animal production without land (pigs, poultry);
- 2% practise organic farming (9% of austrian holdings, 11% of swedish ones);
- 2% practise agriculture under glass (6% of Belgian holdings, 11% of Dutch ones).

Of all holdings, 3% were held by a legal person (company), 1% by a group of physical persons (partnership) in a group holding, and 96% by a sole holder.

53% of holdings and 51% of the agricultural area are localized in less favoured areas or mountain areas.

Amongst the 6.5 million sole holders,

- 24% are women;
- 52% are aged 55 or more;
- three quarter work part time on their holding;
- 26% have another gainful activity as main employment.

The FSS relates to agricultural holdings whose utilised agricultural area is one hectare or more and those whose area is less than one hectare if they produce a certain proportion for sale or if their production unit exceeds certain physical thresholds. Only the smallest holdings, which together contribute 1% or less of the total SGM of the country concerned, may be excluded.

#### **Definitions**

**A holding** is a single unit, both technically and economically, which has single management and which produces agricultural products.

**The holder of the holding** is that natural person, group of natural persons or the legal person on whose account and in whose name the holding is operated and who is legally and economically responsible for the holding, i.e. who takes the economic risks of the holding. All partners on a group holding who take part in the farm work on the holding are considered being holders.

Generally, the family members of the holder are the spouse, relatives in the ascending or descending line (including those by marriage and by adoption) and brothers and sisters of the holder or his/her spouse.

**Manager of the holding** is the natural person responsible for the normal daily financial and production routines of running the holding concerned.

**Farm labour force of the holding** includes all persons having completed their compulsory education (having reached school-leaving age) who carried out farm work on the holding under survey during the 12 months up to the survey day, including holders who do not carry out any work on the holding.

The amount of labour input is expressed in **Annual Work Units** (AWU). An AWU is the equivalent of one person working full time, that is, at least 1,800 hours of work per year.

**The utilised agricultural area** (UAA) is the total area taken up by arable land, permanent pasture and meadow, land used for permanent crops and kitchen gardens.

#### **Community typology of holdings**

The Community typology means a uniform classification of the holdings in the EU based on their technico-economic orientation and their economic size. The technico-economic orientation and economic size of the holding are determined on the basis of the standard gross margin.

For each crop or animal production, a standard gross margin is calculated as the difference between the standard value of the production and the standard amount of certain specific costs.

The technico-economic orientation is determined by the relative contribution of the different productions to the total standard gross margin of the holding.

**The less-favoured areas** shall include mountain areas, in which farming is necessary to protect the countryside, particularly for reasons of protection against erosion or in order to meet leisure needs; they shall also include other areas where the maintenance of a minimum population or the conservation of the countryside are not assured (OJ L142 of 2.6.97).
