# Proposal for a COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC)

amending Regulation (EEC) No 2764/75 laying down the rules for calculating a component of the levy on pig carcases and (EEC) No 950/68 on the Common Customs Tariff

#### Explanatory memorandum


The import arrangements provided for in Regulation (EEC) No 2759/75 on the common organization of the market in pigmeat have given satisfactory results in the pasts. However, it has been decided that some minor amended would make them easier to apply.

As a first step, the Common Customs Tariff will be adjusted in so far as it applies to pigmeat. The wording of some subheadings will be made more precise, while other subheadings which have proved to be of little practical use will be deleted. These changes will not have any major economical implications. At the same time, definitions of the principal products in the sector will be inserted as Additional Notes to the Common Customs Tariff, as has already been done for the beef and yeal and sheepmeat and goatmeat sectors.

The purpose of this proposal for a Regulation is to lay down a definition of "pig carcases" which will be inserted in Chapter 2 of the CCT as an Additional Note. The other products in the sector will be adjusted in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 24 of Regulation (EEC) No 2759/75 on the basis of Article 10(4) of that Regulation.

Implementation of the Gommon Customs Tariff thus amended will require, at a later stage, adjustments to two other Council Regulations which incorporate part of the CCT: Regulation (EEC) No 2766/75 establishing the list of products for which sluice-gate prices are to be fixed and laying down the rules for fixing the sluice-gate price for pig carcases, and Regulation (EEC) No 2767/75 laying down general rules for the system of "pilot products and derived products" enabling additional amounts to be fixed for pigmeat.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

of 29 October 1975 on Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No. 2759/75 the common organization of the market in pigmeat, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No. 2966/80 2, and in particular Article 9(2) thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas Articles 8 and 9 of Regulation (EEC) No 2759/75 provide for the basic rules for fixing the levy applicable on imports of pig carcases; whereas it seems appropriate to introduce a definition of this product into Council Regulation (EEC) No  $2764/75^3$ , as amended by Regulation (EEC) No  $370/76^4$ , in order to facilitate the correct application of the levy on pig carcases within subheading 02.01 A III a) 1 of the Common Customs Tariff, and to amend Council Regulation (EEC) No 950/68<sup>5</sup>, as last amended by Regulation (EEC) No /82<sup>6</sup>, accordingly,

#### HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

#### Article 1

The following Article 3a is hereby inserted into Regulation (EEC) No 2764/75:

### "<u>Article 3a</u>

"Pig carcases" shall be taken to mean carcases or half-carcases of domestic swine which have been bled and eviscerated and from which the bristles and hooves have been removed. Half-carcases are derived from whole carcases by symmetrical division through the centre of each cervical, dorsal, lumbar and sacral vertebra and through the centre of the sternum and the ischio-pubic symphysis. These carcases and half-carcases may be with or without head, feet, flare fat, kidneys, tail or diaphragm. Half-carcases may be with or without spinal cord, brain or tongue. Carcases and half-carcases of sows may be with or without udders (mammary glands).

Where the head or feet are removed, the head is removed from the carcase at the first cervical vertebra (atlas) by a straight cut parallel to the cranium and the feet are removed at the wrist or ankle-joint (carpo-metacarpal or tarso-metatarsal joint)."

#### Article 2

The Common Customs Tariff annexed to Regulation (EEC) No. 950/68 is hereby amended as follows:

1. The following text is inserted as Additional Note No. 3.E. to Chapter 2:

"E. For the purposes of subheading 02.01 A III a) 1, "carcases or half carcases shall be taken to mean slaughtered pigs in the form of carcases of domestic swine which have been bled and eviscerated and from which the bristles and hooves have been removed. Half-carcases are derived from whole carcases by symmetrical division through the centre of each cervical, dorsal, lumbar and sacral vertebra and through the centre of the sternum and the ischio-pubic symphysis.

These carcases and half-carcases may be with or without head, feet, flare fat, kidneys, tail or diaphragm. Half-carcases may be with or without spinal cord, brain or tongue. Carcases and half-carcases of sows may be with or without udders (mammary glands).

Where the head or feet are removed, the head is removed from the carcase at the first cervical vertebra (atlas) by a straight cut parallel to the cranium and the feet are removed at the wrist or ankle-joint (carpo-metacarpal or tarso-metatarsal joint)."

2. Subheading 02.01 A III a) 1 is replaced by the following:
