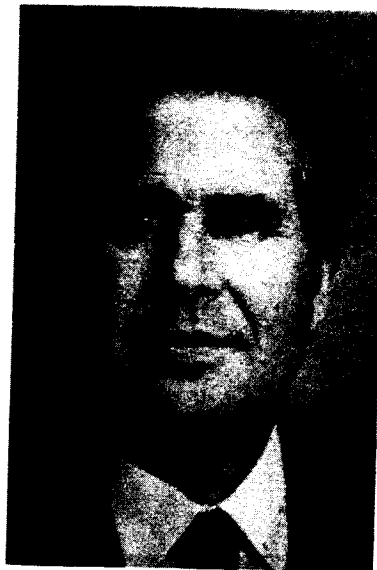


ANTONIO CARDOSO E CUNHA
Member of the Commission



Born on January 28, 1934, in Leira, Portugal. Married, with four children. Attended Universities of Coimbra and Lisbon. Master's degree in chemical engineering with highest honors.

Has worked in the industrial sector (plastics, synthetics, high pressure, and fertilizers). In 1965, moved to Angola, where he was Managing Director of a private economic group with interests in agriculture, fishing, commerce, industry, tourism, and real estate. Member of the Angola Legislative Assembly.

Since 1977, active in consulting and management of projects in Portugal and several African countries. Director of mining, industrial, and civil engineering companies.

In 1979, elected Social Democrat member of Parliament. Re-elected in 1980 and 1985. Holds seat for the constituency of Santarém. Chairman of Parliamentary Agriculture Committee.

In 1978, Secretary of State for Foreign Trade. In 1979, Secretary of State for Industry. In 1980-1981, Minister for Agriculture and Fisheries. Headed government negotiation teams for large investment projects in Portugal.

Appointed Member of the Commission of the European Communities for the period January 1, 1986, to January 5, 1989.

CURRICULUM VITAEANTONIO JOSE BAPTISTA CARDOSO E CUNHA

Mr Cardoso e Cunha was born in Leiria on 28 January 1934. He finished his secondary education in Coimbra, where he was given the national award for the highest marks in Portuguese high schools. He attended Coimbra and Lisboa (IST) universities. In 1957 he obtained an M.Sc. degree in Chemical Engineering with honours, being awarded the "IST" prize for best final average.

Professional life was started in Portugal in the chemical industry - high pressure, synthesis, fertilizers, plastics. From 1965 onwards he lived in Angola, where he was managing-director of a private economic group with interests in agriculture, fishing, commerce, industry, tourism and real estate. Non-professional duties included the presidency of the local Chamber of Commerce and a seat in the Angola Legislative Assembly.

In 1977 he came back to Portugal and embarked on a broad spectrum of activities ranging from direct production to consultancy/management of projects in Portugal and several African countries. He is also a director of mining, industrial and civil construction companies.

On three occasions he was elected Social Democrat Member of Parliament, in the general elections of 1979, 1980 and 1985. At present he holds a seat for the constituency of Santarém and is Chairman of the Parliamentary Agriculture Committee.

He has held the Government posts of Secretary of State for Foreign Trade (1978), Secretary of State for Industry (1979) and Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries (1980/1981).

On several occasions he has headed Government negotiation teams for large foreign investment projects in Portugal.

Mr Cardoso e Cunha is married and has four sons, aged 26, 25, 21 and 17.
