#### EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

At its meeting in July 1981 the Advisory Committee for Fisheries Management of the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) revised its recommendations as to the total allowable catches in 1981 for certain fish stocks in the North Sea and in the waters West of Scotland.

In the light of these revised recommendations the Community and Norway held talks on 14 and 15 July 1981 in order to review their decisions on the management of the stocks in question. The delegations agreed to recommend to their authorities that the TACs for cod and haddock in the North Sea should be increased in accordance with the revised recommendations of the ICES; agreement was also reached on the sharing of the amended TACs between the two parties and on allocation of a herring quota to Norway in the waters West of Scotland. The delegations further agreed on a TAC for North sea herring.

At the conclusion of these consultations the heads of delegations initialled an exchange of letters modifying the Agreement establishing fishing arrangements between the Community and Norway for 1981.

The Commission proposes that the Council, after consultation of Parliament, approves the conclusions of these consultations by adopting the draft decision annexed hereto.

On the same occasion the Council is also invited to adopt the Regulation proposed hereby. The purpose of this Regulation is to implement provisionally the conclusions of these consultations by amending the quotas laid down in Council Regulation (EEC) No. 849/81 for Norwegian vessels in the fishing zones of the Member States of the Community.

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 43 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Having regard to the opinion of the European Parliament (1),

Whereas by Council decision 81/205/EEC of 27 March 1981, the Agreement in the form of an exchange of letters, establishing fishing arrangements between the European Economic Community and the Kingdom of Norway (2) has been approved;

Whereas in July 1981 the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) revised its recommendations on the total allowable catches for certain fish stocks in the North Sea;

Whereas the Community and Norway have held consultations in accordance with the procedure provided for by the Fisheries Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Kingdom of Norway and in particular Article 2 thereof, concerning the revision of the recommendations of the ICES; (3)

Whereas at the conclusion of these consultations the two delegations initialled an exchange of letters modifying the Agreement, approved by Council decision 81/205/EEC;

Whereas it is in the Community's interest to approve the initialled exchange of letters;

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS :

### Article 1

The Agreement, in the form of an exchange of letters modifying the Agreement establishing fishing arrangements between the European Economic Community and the Kingdom of Norway for 1981, is approved in the name of the Community.

The text of the Agreement is annexed to this Decision.

#### Article 2

The President of the Council is authorized to designate the persons empowered to sign the exchange of letters binding the Community.

- 1. A delegation from the EEC and a delegation from Norway met in Brussels on 14-15 July 1981 to consult, within the framework of the Agreement on Fisheries between the EEC and Norway, on certain matters concerning their mutual fishery relations.
- 2. The delegations examined the implications that recent ICES recommendations concerning the revision of TAC's for certain stocks of mutual interest might have for the fishery arrangements established in the Agreement, in the form of an exchange of letters, signed in Brussels on 11 May 1981.
- 3. The heads of delegations initialled the attached exchange of letters concerning the amendments to the fishery arrangements referred to in para 2. The Norwegian delegation pointed out that it is of the greatest importance that the fishery for herring in ICES division VIa be opened as soon as possible and in no case later than 28 July 1981.

The delegations therefore undertook to recommend to their respective authorities that they apply these amendments provisionally at the latest from 28 July 1981.

4. The delegations discussed whether the ACFM recommendation implies that the different components of North Sea herring populations should be considered for management purposes as one single stock or several separate stocks. The delegations were unable to reach a conclusion on this question but agreed that this matter should be reconsidered in future consultations if new scientific information becomes available.

The delegations further discussed the zonal attachments of these stocks but were unable to agree on this question.

In spite of these differences the delegations agreed on the TAC for North Sea herring set out in the tables attached to the initialled exchange of latters. The delegations further agreed that the provisions contained therein should be



without prejudice to future arrangements. The inclusion in these tables of a TAC for herring in ICES divisions IVc and VIId is without prejudice to the question whether North Sea herring should be considered for management purposes as one or several stocks.

5. The Norwegian delegation stated that the absence of a Norwegian quota of North Sea herring in ICES division IVc in 1981 follows from the way Norway plans to carry out its fishery in 1981 and that Norway consequently would not need a North Sea herring quota in that division for this year.



THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council regulation (EEC) no 2214/80 of 27 June 1980 (1) and to the annexed Agreement on Fisheries between the European Economic Community and the Kingdom of Norway and in particular to Article 2 paraph 1 thereof.

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas the Council adopted on 27 March 1981 Regulation (EEC) No. 849/81 laying down for 1981 certain measures for the conservation and management of fishery resources applicable to vessels flying the flag of Norway (2), as amended by Regulation (EEC) No. 1418/81 (3);

Whereas the Council has adopted on the basis of Article 103 of the Treaty Regulation (EEC)  $n^{\circ}$  1418/81 increasing the quota of blue whiting provided for in Regulation (EEC) No. 849/81 to 120.000 tonnes subject to its being included at a later date in the common agricultural policy;

Whereas in July 1981 the International Council for the Exploration of the Sea (ICES) revised its recommendations on the total allowable catches for certain fish stocks in the North Sea;

Whereas the Community and Norway have held consultations in accordance with the procedure provided for by the Fisheries Agreement between the European Economic Community and the Kingdom of Norway and in particular Article 2 thereof, concerning the revision of the recommendations of the ICES;

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Whereas at the conclusion of these consultations the two delegations initialled an exchange of letters modifying the Agreement, approved by Council decision 81/205/EEC;

Whereas the delegations agreed to recommend to their authorities that pending the formal entry into force of these modifications they should nevertheless apply at the latest from 28 July 1981;

Whereas it is therefore necessary to amend Regulation (EEC) nº 849/81 provisionally, subject to its later inclusion in a definitive system to be adopted under Article 43 of the Treaty,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

#### Article 1

Annex I of Regulation (EEC) no 849/81 shall be replaced by the Annex to this Regulation.

### Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall apply from 1 January until 31 December 1981.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
