Draft COUNCIL REGULATION

amending Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75 on the importation free of Common Customs Tariff duties of educational, scientific and cultural materials

(submitted to the Council by the Commission)

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

The Agreement on the importation of educational, scientific and cultural materials, adopted by the General Conference of UNESCO at its fifth session, held in Florence in July 1950, provides for the granting, under certain conditions, of duty-free entry for a number of articles (including articles for the blind) which serve as a medium for the free exchange of ideas and knowledge.

These provisions are currently included in Council Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75 of 10 July 1975 on the importation free of Common Customs Tariff duties of educational, scientific and cultural materials (1).

At its nineteenth session, held in Nairobi in November 1976, the General Conference of UNESCO adopted a protocol to the Florence Agreement which extends the relief from customs duties provided for in that Agreement to other educational, scientific and cultural materials.

Under point 14(a) of Title VIII of the Protocol, the European Economic Community has been admitted as a contracting party to the Protocol provided that all the Member States constituting it are also parties thereto.

On , the Council, on a proposal from the Commission, decided to conclude this Protocol on behalf of the Community (2).

The purpose of this proposal for a regulation is therefore to give effect at Community level to the provisions of this Protocol with the exception of those contained in Annex E (ii) thereto on the importation of materials specially designed for the education, employment and social advancement of physically or mentally handicapped persons, which are dealt with in a separate proposal (3).

In giving effect at Community level to the provisions of this Protocol, due regard must be had for the reservation expressed by the European Economic Community when signing the Protocol with regard to relief from customs duties. The result of these reservations as they affect relief from customs duties is that the European Economic Community:

- i) is bound by Annex C.1 to the Protocol only as regards those contracting states that have accepted it themselves;
- ii) is not bound by Annexes F, G or H to the Protocol.

The measures contained in this proposal take account of all these provisions. They are given effect by the substitution of new annexes for the present annexes to Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75.

Since this proposal is based on Article 28 of the EEC Treaty, it would not normally require the opinion of the European Parliament. In view of the subject of the proposal, however, the Commission considers it desirable to seek the opinion of the European Parliament as well as that of the Economic and Social Committee.

Draft Council Regulation

amending Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75 on the importation free of Common Customs Tariff duties of educational, scientific and cultural materials

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 28 thereof,

Having regard to the draft Regulation submitted by the Commission,

Having regard to the Opinion of the European Parliament,

Having regard to the Opinion of the Economic and Social Committee,

Whereas the Council, in its Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75 of 10 July 1975 (1), laid down the conditions governing the importation free of Common Customs Tariff duties of educational, scientific and cultural materials;

Whereas the provisions of this Regulation are essentially based on those of the Agreement on the importation of educational, scientific and cultural materials drawn up under the auspices of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO);

Whereas on 26 November 1976 the nineteenth General Conference of UNESCO adopted a Protocol to that Agreement with a view to extending relief from customs duties to certain products hitherto excluded from such relief; whereas the European Economic Community and its Member States are contracting parties to that Protocol;

Whereas it is necessary to amend Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75 in order to take account of the provisions of that Protocol,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

Regulation (EEC) No 1798/75 is amended as follows:

- 1. Article 3 is replaced by the following:
- "1. Scientific instruments and apparatus not included in Article 2 imported exclusively for non-commercial purposes may be admitted free of Common Customs Tariff duties provided:
 - (a) they are intended for :
 - either public establishments principally engaged in education or scientific research, including those departments of public establishments which are principally engaged in education or scientific research;
 - or private scientific or educational establishments authorized by the competent authorities of the Member States to receive articles duty-free

and provided:

- (b) instruments or apparatus of equivalent scientific value are not being manufactured in the Community.
- 2. The duty-free admission referred to in paragraph 1 shall be applicable to:
 - (a) spare parts, components or accessories specifically matching scientific instruments or apparatus, provided that these spare parts, components or accessories are imported at the same time as such instruments and apparatus, or, if imported subsequently, that they are identifiable as intended for instruments or apparatus previously admitted duty-free or entitled to duty-free entry;

- (b) tools to be used for the maintenance, checking, gauging or repair of scientific instruments or apparatus, provided that:
 - these tools are imported at the same time as such instruments and apparatus or, if imported subsequently, that they are identifiable as intended for the specific instruments or apparatus previously admitted duty-free or entitled to duty-free entry, and further provided that
 - tools of equivalent scientific value are not being manufactured in the Community.

3. For the purposes of this Article:

- "equivalent scientific value" shall be assessed by comparing the characteristics and specifications of the instrument, apparatus, or, tool for which application is made for the exemption referred to in Article 4 with those of the corresponding instrument, apparatus, or tool manufactured in the Community to determine whether the latter could be used for the same scientific purposes as those for which the instrument, apparatus or tool for which the application for exemption is intended and whether its performance would be comparable to that expected of the latter;
- a scientific instrument or apparatus or one of the tools referred to in paragraph 2 (b) shall be regarded as being manufactured in the Community where its delivery period from the time of the order is not, account being taken of commercial practices in the manufacturing sector under consideration, appreciably longer than the delivery period of the instrument, apparatus, or tool for which application is made for the exemption referred to in Article 4,or where this period does not exceed the latter to such an extent that the intended purpose or use for which the instrument or apparatus was initially intended would be appreciably affected thereby".

- 2. The third subparagraph of Article 6(2) is hereby repealed.
- 3. A new Article 6 a is added as follows:

'The second paragraph of Article 4 and of Articles 5 and 6 shall apply, <u>mutatis mutandis</u>, to the tools referred to in Article 3(2)(b)."

- 4. Annex I is replaced by Annex I to this Regulation.
- 5. Annex II is replaced by Annex II to this Regulation.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on 1 January 1979.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

Instruments, apparatus or models, designed solely for demonstrational purposes (for example, in education or exhibition), unsuitable for other uses:

- maps and charts in relief, of interest in scientific fields such as geology; zoology, botany, mineralogy, palaeontology, archaeology, ethnology, meteorology, climatology, hydrography and geophysics.
- (1) The exemption shall not, however, apply to articles in which the advertising matter covers more than 25% of the surface. In the case of publications and posters for the promotion of tourism, this percentage applies only to private commercial publicity.

B. Visual and auditory materials

BE: Exemption from import duties applicable to the goods listed below shall be granted in request of products originating in third countries which have accepted Annex C.1 to the Protocol to the Agreement on the importation of educational, scientific and cultural materials.

In the case of goods falling within tariff headingd 37.04 A II, 37.05, 37.07 B II or 92.12 B II, however, exemption from import duties shall be granted to goods irrespective of the country of origin, provided that they are of an educational, scientific or cultural character and have been produced by the United Nations or any of its Specialized Agencies.

- visual and auditory recordings (with the exception of materials for the promotion of even those produced by private concerns, designed to encourage the public to travel outside the territory of the European Communities) produced by or for private commercial enterprise, essentially for advertising purposes;
- visual and auditory recordings in which the advertising matter is in excess of 25 per cent by time. In the case of the materials for the promotion of tourism (including those produced by private concerns), this percentage applies only to private commercial publicity.

- 2. <u>Title of the action</u>: Proposal for a regulation of the Council modifying Regulation (EEC) 1798/75, on the importation free of the duties of the Common Customs Tariff of educational scientific or cultural objects
- 3. Legal basis: Article 28 of the EEC Treaty

5. Financial implications

Not quantifiable. Although the Protocol extends the scope of the duty free admission, it does not seem that the Community's resources will be seriously affected, the additional quantities of products likely to be imported free of duty being relatively limited. At the same time, in the framework of this Protocol, exportations from the Community to third countries with the benefit of duty free importation ought to be fairly significant.
