

Jean-Marie CADIOU graduated from the Ecole Polytechnique in Paris in 1962 and from the Ecole des Mines de Paris in 1966. He began his career as a civil servant in the French Ministry of Industry, working on environmental issues.

He then switched to computers and went to Stanford University where he received his Ph.D in Computer Science in 1972, and then returned to France to become Scientific Director at INRIA.

In 1975, he joined IBM in the San Jose Research Laboratory, working in the area of relational data bases and natural language translation. In 1977 he was appointed manager of the IBM France Scientific Centre in Paris and returned to California in 1979 to take responsibility for Programming Technology Research at the IBM San Jose Laboratory.

In 1981, Dr. CADIOU left IBM to become Director of New Information Technologies in the Commission of the European Communities. His current position there is Director of Information Technologies and ESPRIT.
