Ambassador Philip K. Crowe

Born on January 7, 1908, in New York City, Ambassador Crowe was educated at St. Paul's School and the University of Virginia.

A former Lieutenant-Colonel in the United States Air Force, Ambassador Crowe served with the Office of Strategic Services in the China-Burma-India Theatre during World War II. In 1953, he was appointed United States Ambassador to Ceylon and served there for four years. He also served as Special Assistant for Press Relations to Secretary of State Dulles, and, during 1959-61, he was United States Ambassador to the Union of South Africa.



In the ensuing period until his appointment as Ambassador to Norway, where he served from 1969 to 1973, he served as Director of the World Wildlife Fund. He presented his credentials to the Queen of Denmark on September 13, 1973.

Ambassador Crowe is married to the former Irene Pettus and has three daughters.
