STEPHEN P. FREIDBERG

Member of the Official Spokesman's Group
Commission of the European Communities

Mr. Freidberg was born in Topeka, Kansas in 1939. He studied International Relations at Stanford University and received his A.B. degree in 1961. He was elected to Phi Beta Kappa and also served as editor of the Stanford Daily and chairman of the Stanford Model United Nations delegation.

From 1961-62, Mr. Freidberg studied political science at the Free University of Berlin, Germany on a Stanford-Berlin exchange scholarship. He obtained the M.A. in 1963 in International Relations at the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy which he attended with a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship. In 1963, he began work toward the Ph. D. in International Economics at the Graduate Institute of International Studies in Geneva, Switzerland and is now completing research on his thesis.

Mr. Freidberg joined the staff of the European Community Information Service bureau in Washington D.C. in 1965. Since 1967, he has been a member of the Official Spokesman's Group of the Commission of the European Communities in Brussels.

He is the author of a number of articles on European integration affairs and has lectured on Common Market subjects in the United States, Canada and Europe.

Mr. Freidberg is married, has one child, and resides in Brussels, Belgium.
