BIOGRAPHICAL DATA: LESLIE J. GOLDMAN
PRINCIPAL DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY
FOR POLICY AND EVALUATION

Leslie J. Goldman is principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Policy and Evaluation, Department of Energy.

Prior to the creation of DOE in October 1977, Mr. Goldman served as Assistant Administrator for Energy Resource Development of the Federal Energy Administration, one of DOE's predecessor agencies. He was appointed to that position by President Carter in April 1977. Earlier in the same year, Mr. Goldman served in the White House Office of Energy Policy and Planning, as a member of the team that helped formulate the National Energy Plan.

Mr. Goldman served as Special Counsel to United States Senator Adlai E. Stevenson from 1970 until January 1977, most recently in the capacity of Special Counsel to the Subcommittee on Oil and Natural Gas Production and Distribution of the Senate Commerce Committee. In that role he participated in the development and enactment of major energy legislation and programs that emerged as a result of the worsening energy crisis, including the Emergency Natural Gas Act of 1977. From 1970 until 1973, he was director of Senator Stevenson's State Projects Office.

Goldman was born in Chicago, Illinois, in 1945. He graduated from the University of Michigan in 1967 and from the University of Michigan Law School in 1970. He currently resides on Capitol Hill in Washington, D.C., with his wife Sue.
