Born in Rome. Married. Doctor of Philosophy.

1938-46: Assistant at the Institute of Philosophy, Rome University, in charge of certain courses.

1947: Entered the Cabinet of the Italian Foreign Minister.

1949: Joined the staff of the Council of Europe, becoming Head of its Paris Office.

1952: Director of the Secretariat of the Constitutional Commission for the draft Treaty for a European Political Community.

1953-58: Director of the Secretariat of the Council of Ministers of the European Coal and Steel Community.

1953-55: Director of the Secretariat of the Foreign Ministers' Conference for a European Political Community.

June 1955: Director of the Secretariat of the Intergovernmental Committee set up by the Messina Conference.

June 1956: Director of the Secretariat of the Intergovernmental Committee for the Common Market and Euratom.

March 1957: Director of the Secretariat of the Interim Committee for the Common Market and Euratom.
