Law degree from University of Oviedo, 1968; Doctor of Laws, Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, 1975. Assistant Professor of International Law, University of Oviedo, 1968-1969. Special Assistant, Public Law Institute, University of Freiburg (Breisgau), Germany, 1970-1972. From 1972 to 1974, Assistant in the Department of International Law, Universidad Autónoma de Madrid; from 1974 to 1977, Assistant in the Department of Public International Law, Universidad Complutense de Madrid. From 1977 to 1979, Assistant Professor, and from 1978 to 1982, Full Professor, in the Department of Public International Law, Universidad Complutense de Madrid. In October 1982, appointed Professor of Public International Law, University of Extremadura, following a general competition. Since October 1983, Professor of Public International Law, University of Granada.

Participated in numerous scholarly meetings and symposia; presented papers on the right of establishment of persons in the EEC, the adjustment of state monopolies (the Spanish Petroleum Monopoly), the direct effect of Community law in Spanish law, State monopolies and private undertakings, the legal status of foreigners under Spanish law, and the primacy of Community law in the Spanish legal order. Also participated in numerous seminars on various aspects of Community law at the Diplomatic School (at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs), the Center for Constitutional Studies, the Barcelona Bar Association, the National Institute of Industry, the University of the Basque Country, International University Menendez Pelayo, and other institutions.

Appointed Judge at the Court of Justice of the European Communities on January 15, 1986.
