BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Bruno Julien was born on the north coast of Algeria in 1943, where his father was a wine grower. In 1962, back in France, he studied agriculture and graduated from the French National School of Agronomy in Nancy.

In 1969 he joined the survey department of the French Board of Trade where he spent two years analyzing foreign markets. In 1972 he was appointed economist and became later senior economist in the office of the U.S. Agricultural Attache in Paris.

In 1976 he joined the UNDP and was sent as agricultural economist to the Sahelian Drought Committee to Ouagadougou (Upper Volta). From 1978 to 1980 he was Associate Professor in the International Institute for Food Management (IGIA). In 1980 Bruno Julien joined the staff of the Commission of the European Communities; he was appointed to the General Directorate for agriculture. From 80 to 82 he was in the department of elaboration of structural policies. From 82 to 83 he was desk officer for agriculture for North America, Australia and New Zealand. Then, he was posted to Washington in July 1983 where he now serves in the EEC Delegation and is responsible for agricultural trade matters.

Mr. Julien and his wife Monique have three children, Charles, Guillaume and Marie.
