HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION :

Article 1

From the date of entry into force of this Regulation until 31 December 1976, the autonomous duties on preserved beans in pod falling within Common Customs Tariff subheading ex 20.02 G shall be suspended at the level of 16 %.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day following that of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

temporarily and partially suspending the autonomous Common Customs Tariff duties on preserved beans in pod

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 103 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Whereas the drought during 1976 and the consequent reduction in the supply of beans in pod to the processing industry have led to a considerable decline in the production of preserves of this product; whereas this situation endangers the supply of these preserves in the Community; whereas in view of the risk of the increase in the cost of living to which this situation may give rise, the autonomous Common Customs Tariff duties on the preserves in question should be partially suspended for a limited period;

Whereas the suddenness of the situation with which the Community is confronted, the urgency of the measures to be taken and their temporary nature and the absence of any provisions in the rules on the common organization of the market in processed fruit and vegetables for dealing with such a situation with the necessary speed may be taken to justify recourse to Article 103 of the Treaty as an exceptional measure, subject to its later integration into the common agricultural policy,

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This year's drought has led, through a reduced offer of fresh beans to the processing industries, to a significant reduction in production of the tinned product. This situation could create supply problems and lead to high prices for consumers.

In these conditions the Council has agreed to a reduction of the customs duty from 24 to 16 % until 31 December 1976.

The draft regulation has been elaborated by virtue of the Council decision.
