PRESS RELEASECommunity Experts Study Conventional Trainingin British Coal Mines

The 18 Community experts, employers and workers, who form the High Authority's subcommittee on conventional training in coal mining are spending a ten-day study session in Great Britain from November 25 to December 4, on the invitation of the National Coal Board.

This study session which was organized on the initiative of the High Authority, is aimed at supplementing the information which the subcommittee has already collected in the six Community countries on the training of young miners, of underground electricians and mechanics, and of foremen and managers.

On its arrival in Great Britain, the subcommittee was welcomed by Sir James Bowman, President of the National Coal Board, together with members of the Board and representatives of British trade unions. Also present were M. Paul Finet, Member of the High Authority and H.E. Jonkheer H.L.F.K. van Vredenburg, Head of the High Authority's Delegation in the United Kingdom.
