

## EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Following the extension of the Danish fishing zone off the east coast of Greenland to the north of 67° N on 1 June 1980, consultations were held between the Community and Iceland on 15 July 1980, at the request of the Icelandic authorities, on fishing relations between the two parties.

The Icelandic Delegation requested that fishing rights should be granted to Icelandic fishermen to fish for capelin in the waters referred to above. The Icelandic Delegation also proposed that negotiations should be opened between the Community and Iceland with a view to concluding a fisheries agreement.

The Community Delegation agreed to recommend its authorities to grant Iceland the fishing rights which it requested; for the remainder of the current year, with a view to all fishing relations between the parties being regulated from next year by a Fisheries Agreement.

To implement the conclusions of these consultations, and since it was important to Icelandic fishermen to be able to fish for capelin in August and September 1980, the Council, by Regulation (EEC) No 2167/80 of 11 August 1980<sup>1</sup>, established an interim regime under which Icelandic vessels are at present authorized to fish for capelin in the Community fishing zone.

The purpose of the Regulation now being proposed is to replace the interim regime referred to above by arrangements based on Article 43 of the Treaty.

The Council is invited to adopt this draft Regulation after consultation of the European Parliament.

## COUNCIL REGULATION (EEC)

laying down certain measures for the conservation and management of fishery resources applicable to vessels flying the flag of Iceland

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community, and in particular Article 43 thereof,

Having regard to the proposal from the Commission,

Having regard to the opinion of the European Parliament (1),

Whereas, following the decision of the Danish Government to extend the fishing zone off the east coast of Greenland to the north of 67° N, fishing activities in those waters shall be subject to the relevant Community rules;

Whereas, at the request of the Icelandic authorities, consultations were held between the Community and Iceland with a view to determining the conditions under which certain Icelandic fishing activities could be carried out in those waters

Whereas, in the course of those consultations, the Icelandic authorities requested the opening of negotiations with the Communities in order to conclude an Agreement on fishing;

Whereas the continuance of fishing activities by Icelandic vessels in those waters should be authorized during an interim period in order to avoid an interruption of the 1980 fishing season during the course of the negotiations for the conclusion of a Framework Agreement establishing the mutual fishing relations between the two Parties;

Whereas, to prevent an interruption in the fishing season starting in August 1980 for Icelandic fishermen in the Community fishing zone, the Council, by Regulation (EEC) No 2167/80<sup>2</sup>, adopted interim arrangements, and whereas these should be replaced by arrangements forming part of the common fisheries policy,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

### Article 1

1. During the period 1 August to 31 December 1980, vessels flying the flag of Iceland shall be authorized to fish in the fisheries zones of Member States only for captain and only within the part of the said fishing zones situated off the East Greenland coast north of 67° N and seawards of 12 nautical miles from the baselines from which territorial waters are measured.

2. The total volume of catches may not exceed 120 000 tonnes.

### Article 2

1. Vessels fishing under the quota established in Article 1 shall comply with the conservation and control measures provided for in this Regulation and all other provisions governing fishing in the zone defined in Article 1.

2. Vessels referred to in paragraph 1 shall keep a log-book in which the information specified in the Annex shall be entered.

3. The registration letters and numbers of the vessels referred to in paragraph 1 must be clearly marked on the bow of the vessel on both sides and on each side of the vessel's superstructure in the most clearly visible position.

### Article 3

1. As from 1 October 1980 fishing referred to in Article 1 shall be permitted only where a licence issued by the Commission on behalf of the Community at the request of the Icelandic authorities is held on board and where the conditions set out in the licence are observed.

2. The number of licences which may be issued shall not exceed 60.

3. When an application for a licence is submitted to the Commission, the following information shall be supplied:

- (a) name of the vessel;
- (b) registration number;
- (c) external identification letters and numbers;
- (d) port of registration;
- (e) name and address of the owner or charterer;
- (f) gross tonnage and overall length;
- (g) engine power;
- (h) call sign and radio frequency;
- (i) intended method of fishing;
- (j) intended area of fishing;
- (k) species for which it is intended to fish;
- (l) period for which a licence is requested.

4. Each licence shall be valid for one vessel only. Where several vessels are taking part in the same fishing operation, each vessel shall be in possession of a licence.

5. Licences may be cancelled with a view to issuing new licences. Cancellation shall take effect from the

date of the surrender of the licence to the Commission.

*Article 4*

The competent authorities of the Member States shall take appropriate steps, including the regular inspection of vessels, to ensure the observance of this Regulation.

*Article 5*

Where an infringement has been duly established, the Member States shall, without delay, inform the Commission of the name of the vessel involved and of any action they have taken.

*Article 6*

Regulation (EEC) No 2167/80 is hereby repealed.

*Article 7*

This Regulation shall enter into force on the third day following its publication in the *Official Journal of the European Communities*.

It shall apply from 1 August until 31 December 1980.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.

The following details are to be entered in the log-book after each haul :

1. the quantity (in kg) of each species caught;
  2. the date and the time of the haul;
  3. the geographical position in which the catches were made;
  4. the fishing method used.
