EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

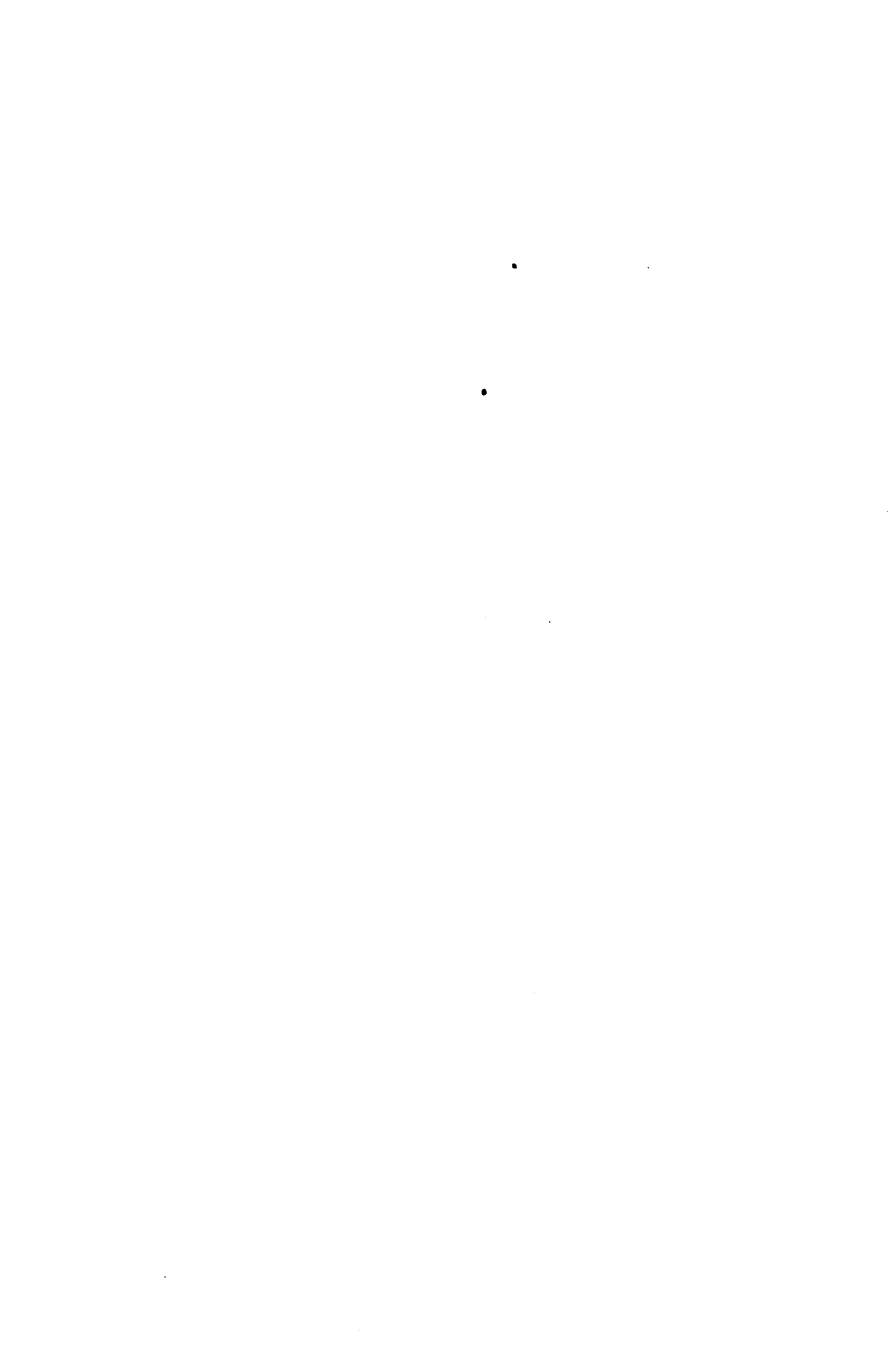
Council Regulation (EEC) No 789/82 of 2 April<sup>1</sup> imposed a definitive 12% anti-dumping duty on imports of certain cotton yarns originating in Turkey.

Since then the Commission and the Turkish Government and exporters have come to an arrangement whereby Turkey will introduce a system of minimum export prices for the products in question, and the Community and Turkey will set up a double-checking system to ensure that the new rules are complied with.

As the Commission regards this arrangement as sufficient to eliminate injury to the Community industry from imports of the Turkish cotton yarns, it proposes that Regulation No 789/82 imposing the definitive anti-dumping duty be repealed.

repealing the definitive anti-dumping duty on imports

THE COUNCIL OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITIES,

Having regard to the Treaty establishing the European Economic Community,

Having regard to Council Regulation (EEC) No 3017/79 of 20 December 1979,  
as amended by Council Regulation (EEC) No 1580/82 of 14 June 1982, on  
protection against dumped or subsidized imports from countries not members  
of the European Economic Community<sup>1</sup>, and in particular Articles 12 and  
16(1) thereof,

Having regard to the Additional Protocol<sup>2</sup> to the Agreement establishing  
an Association between the European Economic Community and Turkey,

Having regard to the proposal presented by the Commission after consultation  
within the Advisory Committee provided for by Article 6 of  
Regulation (EEC) No 3017/79,

Whereas Council Regulation (EEC) No 789/82 of 2 April 1982<sup>3</sup> imposed a  
definitive anti-dumping duty of 12% on imports of certain cotton yarns  
originating in Turkey;

Whereas an arrangement has since been worked out between the Commission  
and the Turkish Government and exporters; whereas under the said  
arrangement Turkey undertakes

to introduce a system of minimum export prices for  
these products and to set up, with the Community, a system of  
double checking to ensure that the terms of the arrangement are complied with;

Whereas the Commission considers that this arrangement should eliminate the  
injury to the Community industry from imports of certain cotton yarns  
originating in Turkey;

Whereas it is therefore no longer necessary to levy an anti-dumping duty on the imports in question, other than those which have previously been introduced into the customs territory of the Community, but have not been released into free circulation in the Community, and Council Regulation (EEC) No 789/82 should therefore be repealed,

HAS ADOPTED THIS REGULATION:

Article 1

Council Regulation (EEC) No 789/82 of 2 April 1982 is hereby repealed.

Article 2

This Regulation shall enter into force on the day of its publication in the Official Journal of the European Communities.

It shall not apply in respect of goods originating in Turkey which have previously been introduced into the customs territory of the Community, but which have not been released into free circulation in the Community, to which Regulation (EEC) No 789/82 in its unamended form shall continue to apply.

This Regulation shall be binding in its entirety and directly applicable in all Member States.
