Derwent Renshaw was born in Hull, Yorkshire in 1930. After being educated at Ackworth School he served for 2 years in the army before joining the British civil service.

Between 1951 and 1974 he was with the U.K. Ministry of Agriculture where he worked in a number of divisions including the National Food Survey and Cereals Division, where he was concerned with the International Wheat Council and with the U.K.'s accession negotiations.

In 1974, he joined the Commission of the European Communities where he has served in the Cereals Division as principal administrator.
